
Our togetherness both in attack and especially in defence is improving game by game, a testament

Contact has been limited to pads use / driving over, but we have introduced the importance of wrapping and strong body positions. Later this season we may introduce tackling with support from coaches with tackle experience, so we get the basics right.

The "One Club" initiative is working well. U7's have co-trained with U8's and U9's on a number of occasions and enjoy the challenge. U7's will continue forging strong ties with U8's and will be inviting Year 1 Broncos to train with during the later part of the season to help prepare to become U7's next year.

They are starting to become more competitive and we're seeing them bring our club values to life through teamwork, respect, and passion for their club!

We've added 3 new coaches to the setup - Steve Hogg (Head Coach), Mike Lewis (Assistant) and Dave Rooke-Bates (Assistant). Oli has partially transitioned to the U8's to be with his son, Lewis and is dividing his time across both age groups. Oli is continuing to mentor the new U7's coaches and help integrate them into the wider club.



The children have enjoyed playing come rain or shine, through wind and rain and have been introduced to a number of basic rugby skills through games such as rob the nest and fox and hounds. Tug -of-war however against the coaches remains a firm favourite for all involved!
