Following the very much forgettable affair on Saturday, a somewhat threadbare Aylesbury FC team arrived at the Harlow Arena for their FA Trophy replay with confidence after an uninspiring performance from the Bostik Premier side three days prior and the carrot of Dulwich Hamlet awaiting the victors.

Some notable names missing from the squad included Jordan Jenkins, Kieron Schmidt and Jeanmal Prosper, who were replaced by fringe players Derek Feyi, Kerran Lataille and Alfie Touceda. With manager Davis Haule stuck in major motorway traffic it was left in the capable hands of Ryan Collings and the rest of the coaching team to organise the team on our nemesis - a 3G pitch.

However, it didn't take long for the hosts to get going, taking full advantage of our Achilles Heel – defending low crosses. Just six minutes had past when Alex Read (not the cage fighter) reached the by-line ahead of Joe Fitzgerald, who fizzed a ball across goal, with Jared Small lurking unmarked at the back post to slot home.



The visitors almost hit back immediately, a somewhat out of sorts Shayne Almond tried one from distance, but Ben McNamara did well to scramble the ball behind for a corner.

On 12th minutes an unexpected equaliser arrived, a corner routine straight off the training ground saw Shayne Almond play short to Anthony Ball, who unleashed a rocket from 25 yards, low and hard through bodies into the bottom corner.

Parity didn't last long however, as on 27 minutes Harlow retook the lead, another low cross this time from the right-

hand side found its way to Alex Read (doesn't know Katie Price) in the box, his effort was spectacularly cleared off the line by Joe Fitzgerald however, the clearance fell to Reece Dobson who wasn't closed down and he stroked home.

On 33 minutes Harlow could have had another one, a carbon copy of the move leading to the home side's first goal again saw Small lingering at the back stick, this time Ash Jenkins was switched onto it and smothered his point-blank shot behind.

The pressure soon told though, as on 36 minutes following some good attacking play from

the hosts in the Moles final third, Alex Read received a killer pass and clattered home past a helpless Ash Jenkins who was getting very little protection from his back line.

Half Time: Harlow Town 3 Aylesbury FC 1

The Hawks started where they left off in the second period, as just two minutes in, a Jide Maduako defensive clearance took a vicious bounce off the artificial surface over substitute Ben Stevens' head into the path of Junior Dadson who took full advantage of the error and added another one to the scoreboard – cue the air-raid siren for the fourth time.

The hosts had taken their foot off the gas by this point, and the game entered a huge lull, Reece Dobson going close to making it five for the hosts when his free kick bounced off the underside of the crossbar.

There was a consolation goal late on for the travelling supporters to cheer about, as deep into a considerable amount of injury time following a facial injury to Garry Jones earlier in the half, Kerran Lataille threaded a deft ball through to Harry Scott who did what he does best – placing one past McNamara.

Thame United

We take a look at our opponents today from nearby Oxfordshire who have made the step up into the Evo-Stik South East this season.

Today we welcome near Oxfordshire neighbours Thame United in what will be our first meeting in two years, having played out a couple of pre-season victories previously. Last season Thame took it to the final day of the season, winning the Hellenic Premier League in fantastic fashion with a 7-0 away win at Henley Town, just about pipping Bracknell Town to gain promotion back the Southern League after a long absence.

Mark West in 2007 became manager of Thame after leaving Slough Town, given the task of returning to the Southern League by chairman Jake Collinge. Ten years later and the prize was delivered, helped along with the management team of Stuart Blaik and Hugh McCluskie.

Thame have adjusted well to life in the Southern League, mainly

with thanks to the goal scoring machines of Lynton Goss and managers son Dan West, with Goss scoring 16 goals in total so far this season. Though their inconsistency and defensive errors have been their downfall so far as they sit only one place above FC in 15th so far.

Thame come to The SRD Stadium after thrashing Wimborne Town 5-0 at the weekend, with the inevitable Goss hat-trick and the other goals coming from Mephram and West, all despite the Thame management team all being absent from the game, attending assistant manager Stuart Blaiks wedding! Striker Andy Gledhill stepped in as acting manager for a fine managerial debut.

Other notable players to look out for today are Craig Hill, who last year played in goal for Oxford City, also defensive centre back Ellis

Last time we met

The last time FC met Thame United on the pitch was in a pre-season game for the 2015/16 season, Steve Batemans last season in charge of Aylesbury. FC won 5-1 that day with ease, with Lynton Goss stealing the show getting himself hat-trick.

Once Lynton Goss had put the team ahead, the result never looked in doubt with the crowd were treated to goals of real quality.

The opening goal came from a cross on the right and Lynton, unmarked, headed past a hesitant Thame keeper after just five minutes. Johnny Montgomery was the next FC man on the attack. After breaking clear, he sidefooted the ball goalwards only to be denied by a low save. Thame equalised on 15 minutes. As the FC defence played a high line, the home attack broke clear with their man sliding the ball underneath an advancing James Weatherill.

FC regained the lead 8 minutes later when a series of intricate passes led to Lynton Goss stroking the ball home for his second goal of the game. 2-1 became 3-1 shortly afterwards as Lynton claimed his hat-trick. His clever run broke the offside trap and the young midfielder pounced to poke the ball underneath the advancing keeper.

After the break Gareth Price was introduced to the game and he looked very sharp. He forced the



Thame keeper into a smart save on 58 minutes and a couple of minutes later, a turn and shot found its target but lacked real power.

Thame responded to this with a cross shot that Weatherill tipped over the bar and as the clock ticked down, FC put the game beyond doubt. As defender and goalkeeper dithered, Gareth Price was decisive crashing a loose ball from 5 yards and on the stroke of full time Price scored the pick of the goals. A ball over the top was brought down expertly and in one fluid movement the striker swept the ball into the bottom corner from an acute angle to make the score 5-1.

The manager

Former manager and Wycombe Wanderers legend, Mark West, returned to the Club for his second spell as manager from Ryman Premier League outfit, Slough Town in 2007. West, who managed the Club when they were in the Southern League and took them on two memorable FA Cup runs, is assisted by Stuart Blaik and goalkeeping coach Hugh McCluskie. West finally led Thame to promotion back to Step 4 last year with an exciting final day win at Henley Town.

Versatile defender who can, and has, played in any position across the back four. Progressed from Thame United Reserves.



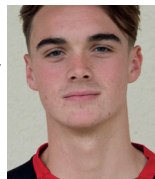
Tom Ashworth

Lynton Goss

Over the past few seasons, FC fans will have become familiar with the fast attacking pace of Lynton Goss. Brother of fellow FC midfielder Aston, Lynton made several appearances under Steve Bateman, with the former manager spotting the great potential in the young attacking forward, as he scored several goals for FC, mainly coming off the bench. As Bateman left and was replaced by Danny Gordon, Lynton joined Thame United and helped them clinch the Hellenic Premier League title last season, gaining the leagues golden boot in the process with a whopping 53 goals in total. Lynton is already showing he's fine to play at this level as well, having scored 8 goals in the league already, and a hat trick in the FA Trophy last weekend, to make it now 16 goals in competitions this season.



And they used to play for them!

A few players made the move all the way over from Thame to Aylesbury FC in the summer to play under Davis, that won the league with Thame last season. Keeping it in the family, the Feyi brothers, Derek (centre) and Ken (right) have played



for Thame previously. Derek played in the FC Under 18's for a few years and had played at Thame for a couple of seasons. Ken Feyi played for the Under 18's under Paul Bonham and made the move up to first team football whilst Steve Bateman was manager. When Steve Bateman left the club, Ken moved over to Thame last season, helping them to win the league. 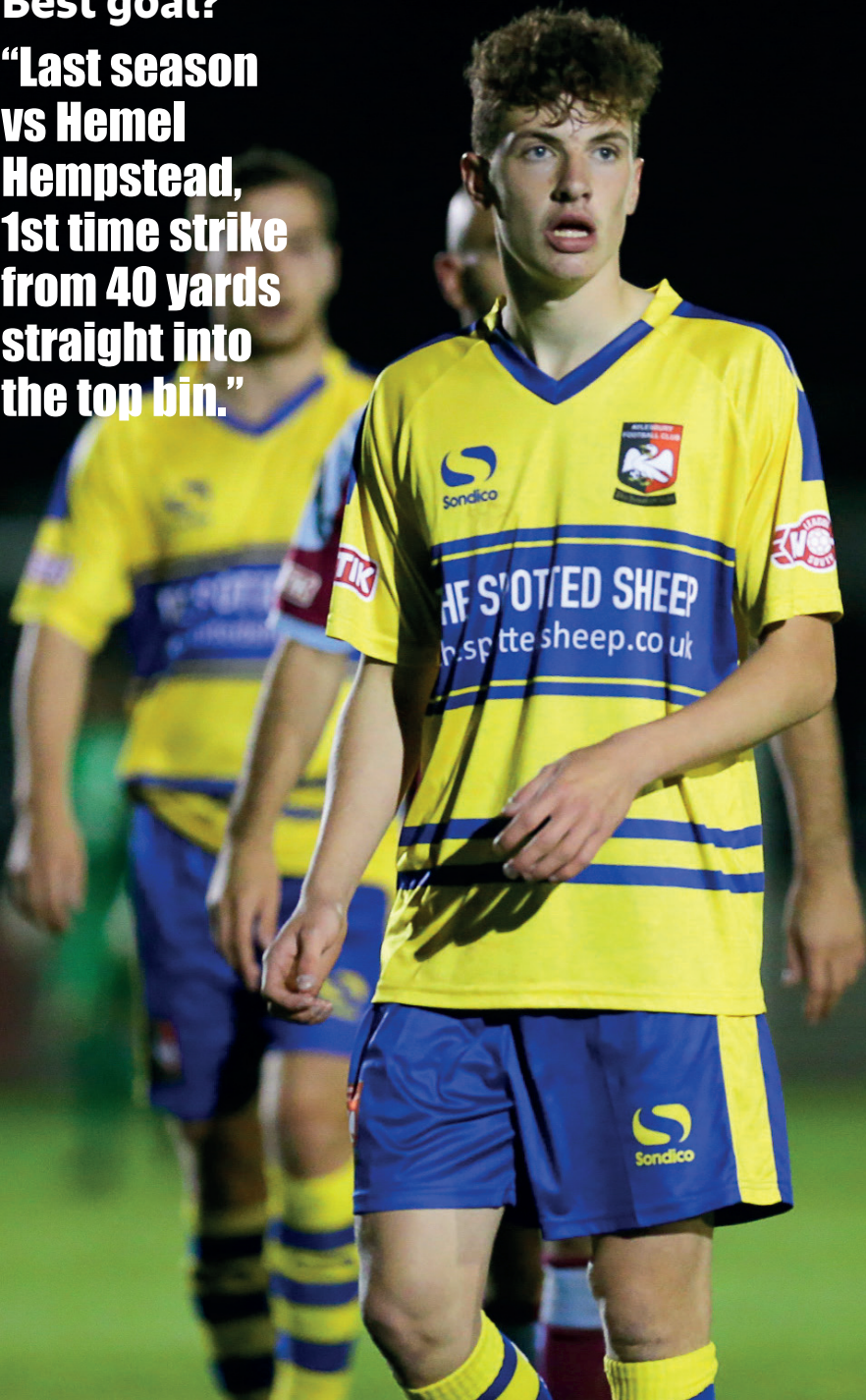

FA Trophy roundup

Aylesbury FC held Bostik Prem side Harlow Town to a stalemate 0-0 at The SRD Stadium on Saturday, and in the return fixture at Harlow, a much weakened Aylesbury side lost out 4-2 to drop out of the competition.

Beaconsfield Town won 2-0 away at Barking to progress, a free kick in the first half from Wes Daly put Beccy 1-0 up, and a goal from Aaron Minhas made it 2-0 to secure the win.

Hanwell Town lost 4-0 at Southern Prem side Bishops Stortford. Callum Duffy headed into his own net to make it 1-0 for the step 3 side. Dipo Akinyemi doubled the Blues lead after running through and slotting under Comes in the 78th minute. Ryan Richefond pounced on a goalkeeping error then after to make it 3-0. Jason Williams made it 4-0 in injury time.

Egham Town faced Bowers & Pitsea with the latter taking the lead in the 60th minute. Eghams Ryan Debattista levelled in the 82nd minute. The replay was called off however after some halloween intervention caused a floodlight failure.

After a goalless draw at Brentwood Town, it was back to Bedford Town on Tuesday for the replay, with Brentwood running out 4-2 winners. Young Josh Wiggins scored in the 27th minute. In the second half, a beautiful passing buildup led to Brentwoods second goal from Andrew Freeman. Wiggins poked in his second after a rebound to make it 3-0 and Brendon Cavalier made it 4 in the 65th minute. Dean Dummett pulled one back for Bedford and then Josh Oyibo got a late consolation in the 89th minute.

Diary of a Groundhopper

THERE'S another double header on offer today. Tring Town have a noon kick-off for their South Midlands Second Division game against Old Bradwell United. It's an entertaining 2-3 encounter to set me up for the 'main event' this afternoon.

Ten miles or so of backroads through Hertfordshire and Buckinghamshire sees me at 'Windsors', home of Risborough Rangers. Whenever Risborough are mentioned on Hopping forums, reactions are invariably very positive, so I have wanted to visit for a while to check for myself.

My welcome couldn't be bettered and a club official goes out of his way to make sure my visit is an enjoyable one. There is a relaxed atmosphere around the charming ground and I immediately feel at home.

The entrance shed is situated in one corner of the stadium. After paying £5 to get in and another £1 for the programme, I take my customary stroll around the ground. To the left of the entrance, there's a covered standing area interspersed with seats running down the left touchline. The clubhouse and tea bar can be found immediately behind this stand. There's a small covered area on the other side, apparently shipped in from Canada as a surprise present for Risborough's chairman!



Although it is a warm afternoon, autumn has definitely arrived: there is a carpet of dead leaves piled behind each goal, no doubt swept from the pitch by a hard-working volunteer. As soon as the whistle blows for kick off, it starts to rain. Eerily, this has happened to me several times recently, I am beginning to wonder if I have done something to upset the weather gods! I shelter in the wooden stand, which also serves as a base for the very busy ball 'boys' (the two gentlemen are much older than me!) but I soon have to leave thanks to a radio transmitting regular bouts of shouting from Premier League matches.

It is immediately obvious that this is a higher level than this morning's encounter; a division up, in fact. Brimsdown look particularly fast and skilful but cannot find the right pass in and around the box. An exciting to-and-fro half sees the sides level at

the break.

The entertainment continues into the second half. The visitors become distracted by internequine arguments and a lengthy injury stoppage and go behind once more. They manage to equalise and then bombard Rangers' goal for the winner. Somehow, the home side hold out to claim a share of the spoils.

As I am leaving the ground, the blue-lighted ambulance is arriving to whisk off the injured player to hospital to get his shoulder seen to. It just goes to show that a simple afternoon's football is potentially life-altering. Personally, the seriousness of my task extends to choosing my music for the journey home. Hmm, Nick Cave; that'll do nicely.

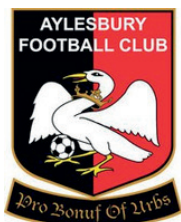
