### Report by Mike Farquharson

FC were again made to pay for not putting away the chances as AFC Dunstable left Haywood Way with all three points in a game where the home side deserved at least a point.

With Brian Haule unfit and Jordan Jenkins away Kurt Morlese made his first start of the season, Jeanmal Prosper switched to right back and Anthony Ball returned on the left side of defence. Shayne Almond was dropped to the bench.

It was Aylesbury that started the better of the two sides and two minutes in a free kick from Jeanmal Prosper found Captain Ben Stevens at the far post but his free header from six yards went wide. The home side were in the ascendancy with both Prosper down the right and



Aston Goss on the left both making raiding runs.

**Dunstables first** opportunity came on thirty one minutes when a ball from the right from Courtney Massey was headed wide by Rvan Frater. Ben Stevens then produced a seventy yard crossfield pass into the feet of Goss whose cross from the left evaded everyone and was eventually headed away for a corner. In an almost carbon copy move this time it was Craig Carby who found Goss with a raking pass, this

time his cross was met by Jonny Montgomery but his shot was saved at point blank range by Jamie Head, the ball popped up to Kurt Morlese who somehow blasted the ball over from a yard out, a miss that was eventually to cost the Moles dear.

Prosper then made a galloping run but his shot was dragged wide and in the resulting move
Dunstable took the lead. A ball in from the right found Jermaine Hall in the box and his shot which was goal bound was blocked

by the arm of Ben Stevens. Jermaine Hall put away the resulting penalty which took Dunstable into the break a goal up and Hall onto nine goals for the season.

Three minutes into the second half and Aylesbury got the equaliser that their play deserved, a ball into the box found Ty Deacon with his back to goal, he swivelled and got a left foot shot away which deflected into the goal past Head as reward for Aylesburys

determination and dominating play. Aylesbury could finally feel like a result could be taken here and spirits were lifted for the team. Prosper was continuing to cause problems down the away sided left hand side and another mazy run and cross found Shayne Almond outside the box but his shot bobbled past the post. On 84 minutes a free kick for Dunstable was played into the area and the ball fell to BJ Christie and he slipped the ball under the oncoming James Weatherill to claim all three points, very much against the run of play.

Cruelly the Moles were behind again after a lapse in concentration. The Moles continued to push for that equalising goal in the final ten minutes of play, with the pace of Scott and Prosper causing problems for the Dunstable defence, however ultimately



AFC Dunstable managed to hold on for their fifth win from seven to keep them at the top as early league leaders.

Aylesbury will be disappointed not to have taken at least the point, but this much improved performance will be encouragement for the team going into the next set of fixtures.

## **Marlow FC**

#### Our opponents today make the short trip over from Marlow in the south of Buckinghamshire to face FC. Always tough oposition, here we take a brief look at our opponents.

The Blues faced heartache in April after a fantastic season which saw them finish fourth in the Evo-Stik South East Division (formely Divison One Central) at the hands of Barton Rovers. After a late push in the season which saw them secure a play-off spot in fourth place, Marlow eventually lost out to the talented Barton Rovers 2-0 at Sharpenhoe Road.

Though the Blues, still under the management of Mark Bartley are back to take on the league again and with much of that strong squad still present at Marlow, they will surely once again be pushing for a play-off spot at the very least.

After a difficult year where the Blues were forced to play in the Evoo-Stik South West division, there return to the Central division reaped rewards with their playoff finish.

Marlow have always been a tricky team for FC to tackle, with Mark

Bartley having always assembled a talented bunch of players to pick from. Max Kilman, who played at left back in their play-off defeat last season, is now a first team regular at his parent club Maidenhead United in the National League after progressing from the Magpies Youth and Development team, testament to the time he had spent at Marlow.

Striker Allen Bossman is also already making an impression on the league, with his name appearing in the top scorers league table already. Definitely one of the dangermen for the FC defence to try and keep in check.

The previous meeting between the two sides took place last season at Haywood Way. After the arrival of Davis Haule and the turn around in fortunes for FC, Marlow, who were gunning for that play-off spot, were an extremely tough ask to beat. However an 81st minute

winner from Ty Deacon (picture below) secured a huge victory for FC to put us 8 points clear of the drop and slow down Marlows playoff push. However Marlow were able to push onwards to the playoffs.

Marlow have had a good start to the season, however they have lost their last three including going out of the FA Cup to Ashford Town and now sit in thirteenth. After the defeat to Kempston on Saturday however, they will be looking to get back on track against FC this evening.



### **CLUB HISTORY**

It was on November 22nd 1870 at the Compleat Angler Hotel on the banks of the Thames that Great Marlow Football Club was formed and so began the history of one of the oldest clubs in the country. In the last century the Club was a major force in the game and as one of the original entrants in the first FA Cup competition in 1871/72 contributed a share of the £25 that bought the first trophy. In the very first year of the competition a certain Cuthbert Ottaway turned out for Marlow and just a year later he was to captain the national side against Scotland in the first ever officially recognised international match.

Marlow have the unique distinction of being the only club to have applied for entry to every competition since its inception although they were unable to compete once in the 1910/11 season. In 1882 they reached the semi-finals where they lost out to eventual winners Old Etonians 0-5 at the Oval. Two Amateur Cup semi-finals and a host of Berks & Bucks Senior Cup wins were among many honours won in this golden age. In 1894 Marlow rejected the opportunity to join the newly-formed Southern League in order to retain their amateur status and allowed Tottenham Hotspur to begin their climb to the top flight by taking their place.

The Club's ground until 1919 was Crown Meadow, now the Riley Recreational Ground. An enforced move to the Star Meadow (which was unfenced) and the worsening financial situation resulted in the need to play in a more local competition than the Great Western Suburban League and Marlow joined the Reading and District League. This was a dark period for the Club and worse was to come when the Club's long-serving Honorary Secretary Alfred Davis, who had held office at the Club since 1891, died in 1924. It was decided that a fitting memorial to him would be to provide a permanent home for Marlow F.C. An appeal proved to be very successful and the "Alfred Davis Memorial Ground" saw its first game in 1928. The picturesque grandstand dates from 1930's and followed the establishment of an Association who issued Share Certificates in connection with a Building Fund and was built to celebrate the Club's revival and the Spartan League Division Two championship.

Apart from a war-time break Marlow continued in the Spartan League until 1965 when entry was gained to the Athenian League Division Two. Promotion to Division One was secured in season 1970/71. Here Marlow remained until 1984 when they joined the Isthmian League. Having finished bottom of Division Two in 1985 the appointment of Mike Keen as Manager heralded a rapid rise in status. Promotion to Division One came the very next season and then after just one season in Division One the championship was won after a two horse race with Grays Athletic and along with it promotion to the Premier Division.

Here Marlow found things much tougher and Christmas arrived without a win and from a position at the foot of the table r however a late season Houdini act saw them escape and secure their new-found status. When Keen left his assistant Dave Russell took over and brought in Laurie Craker as Coach. Under them good times returned and the Berks & Bucks Senior Cup was won for the first time that century with a victory over local rivals Wycombe Wanderers and the F.A Cup First Round was reached, also for the first time that century, with an away tie at West Bromwich Albion the reward. Season 1992/93 saw even more F.A Cup success with progression this time to the Third Round and a tie with Tottenham Hotspur that was switched to White Hart Lane where almost 27000 saw the Blues give a very creditable performance. The Diadora (Isthmian) League Cup was won to finish the season on a high note by beating Molesev.

1993/94 must rate as the most successful ever with Marlow again reaching the First Round of the F.A Cup where a 0-2 home defeat against Plymouth Argyle was featured on T.V, while in the league a highest-ever position of third was achieved. The Berks & Bucks Senior

Cup was won again with a 1-0 win over local rivals Chesham Utd. to round off a highly memorable season.

Season 1995/96 saw a finish in in eighth spot but the following one got off to a terrible start from which the Club was never able to recover - and despite victories over virtually all the top sides, relegation was confirmed on the last day of the season. Russell returned for the following season and with him high hopes but the season proved to be one of underachievement and a new team of Graham Pritchard and Derek Sweetman took over for 1998/99 and provided a period of stability which saw finishes in mid-table. Following the departure of Pritchard just before season 2001/02 Sweetman took over the reins and his first game in charge saw the capture of the Associate Members Trophy in a final held over from the previous season. The side finished the season in 9th position in the league - the highest for some time - before restructuring saw them move from Division Two to the newly-formed Division One North for season 2002/03 where an 11th place finish was achieved. In the F.A Trophy they progressed to the Third Round before going out at Dagenham & Redbridge.

For 2015/16 Marlow were moved once again – to the South & West division – which again meant increased travelling and associated costs and the loss of some key players and several local derbies, making life much more difficult than it really needed to be. In the circumstances a mid-table finish was achieved and a return to the Central Division for 2016/17 aided a finish in 4th place (on goal difference) and achieved a play-off place, with third-placed Barton Rovers running out 2-0 victors at their ground. Southern League where the next two seasons saw them consolidate with finishes in and 17th and 11th positions respectively.

## The Manager

Mark Bartley was a player at Hayes, Slough Town, Burnham and Thame United before taking over at Reading Town in the latter part of season 2011/2012 and guiding them to safety. Then went on to win the Hellenic Premier Division with Marlow in his first season here. Now into his sixth season.

Led Marlow to a fourth spot finish last season to enter the playoffs, losing out to Barton Rovers.

In second spell with the club having played at AFC Hayes, Holyport and Burnham before first joining. Moved on to Uxbridge and Beaconsfield (briefly) before returning this season. Debut 09/08/14.



#### **Curtis Chapple**

A quick and hard-tackling defender/wide player who was previously with Uxbridge before signing last season. Debut 29/08/16.



#### **Josh Francis**

A quick defender who likes to get forward. Signed for last season having previously been with Farnborough but missed much of the season through injury. Debut 06/08/16



#### Jack Kerrigan

Left-sided defender who was originally here a few seasons back before moving on to Gosport Borough. After a break from football last season has returned. Debut 09/11/13.



#### **Chris Ovenden**

Quick, right-sided defender or midfielder who was with Henley Town before joining and who has also played for Hartley Wintney. Consistent player who has scored some important goals. Season 2014-15 Manager's Player-Of-The-Year and last season's Supporters Player Of The Season.



#### **Ryan Parsons**

Made debut at 16 before quickly moving on to Wycombe Wanderers. From there has appeared for Maidenhead United, Slough Town and Hemel Hempstead among others before spending the last couple of seasons with Egham Town.

A spirited performance against the league leaders Dunstable a week prior was hoped to be replicated against the Tangerines, however, a lacklustre first half effectively put the game out of reach.

After a relatively cagey first five minutes, the game erupted into life, with Ashford looking the most lively of the two teams, it didn't take long for them to take the lead. Jack Beadle was given far too much space by the FC defenders on the edge of the box, and slotted a low driven shot to the right of James Weatherhill between the sticks. Ashford breaking the deadlock after only 7 minutes – this could prove to be a long afternoon.

Despite this early setback two minutes later FC almost found a quickfire equaliser. Aston Goss played an intelligent over the top through ball, picking out Jeanmal Prosper who had made a storming run from holding midfield – Prosper chipped the onrushing Ashford keeper Tyler Tobin, but agonisingly it was cleared off the line before it could trickle in.

Following this, Ashford bombarded the Aylesbury goal and the score line was only kept at 1-0 due to Weatherhill playing a blinder. However, the pressure finally took its toll and in the 27th minute Jeanmal Prosper unfortunately diverted an Alex Fisher corner into his own net at the back post – a thunderous finish – shame it was at



the wrong end.

The final chance of the half fell to the Moles when Mr. Consistent Jonny Montgomery picked out Kieron Schmidt who had broken away from the last man, however, he couldn't get the ball under his spell to get a meaningful shot away.

Half Time Ashford Town 2 FC 0

The second period was somewhat of a damp squib, and Ashford set out to protect their two-goal cushion – and succeeded.

The first chance of the half again fell to an Ashford player, with Romario Jonas heading one over the FC bar with the goal at his mercy.

From then onwards, the final 30 minutes saw a lot of FC possession and territory but no creativity which would lead to a goal opportunity.

A flurry of set pieces saw both Ty Deacon and Jeanmal Prosper have headers sail wide of the mark.

Hafid Bounyafe was introduced late on for his Aylesbury FC debut, playing with high tempo – and could be a reasonable prospect, however, was unable to get the Moles back into the game.

#### Round-up from around the league

But City quickly made it 3-0 by the 56th minute with a second for Sharman and once for Tom Knowles.

Jordan Gent added a fourth on 79 minutes and a Lewis Wilson penalty made it a nap hand 4 minutes later.

Aaron Berry netted a consolation for the Sarnies 4 minutes from time, although there was still time for new signing Brandon McCarthy to net a stoppage time sixth on debut.

Hayes & Yeading United found some form at the New Eyrie against Bedford Town, running out 3-0 winners with Manny Duku bagging a brace in the 3rd and 60th minutes, with Rohdell Gordon adding a third in the 2nd minute of stoppage time.

Kempston Rovers enjoyed a good 2-1 away win at Marlow, whose Kameron English broke the deadlock in the 65th minute.

Luke Heneghan responded within 2 minutes for Rovers, whose Ben Shepherd won it 9 minutes from time.

It was the same scoreline at Honeycroft as Uxbridge won the derby against Northwood, whose Mesach Williams had given the visitors the lead 3 minutes after half-time.

Dave Thomas equalised 15 minutes from time and Anthony Thomas kept his cool to net the winner from the spot a minute from the end of normal time.

Ashford Town (Middx) took a 7th minute lead through Jack Beadle at home against Aylesbury FC, whose sixth loss in seven games was confirmed when Romario Jonas added a second 20 minutes later.

It finished goalless at Holloways Park between Beaconsfield SYCOB and Barton Rovers, while Sam Pekun gave win-less Fleet Town an early 7th minute lead at Aylesbury United, whose Ollie Hogg rescued a point 20 minutes from time.



## 4 HENDON TOWN U18's 2 AYLESBURY FC U18's

After extra time

#### Report by Dan Turney

Aylesbury FC U18's continued their foray in the FA Youth Cup tie with a trip to Hendon FC on Wednesday night.

With only Anthony Woodley the only forced absentee through injury, Aylesbury were able to pick a strong squad for what they anticipated would be a tough game. However they were forced into a change right before the start of the game, as Kieran Chance had problems in the warm-up and wasn't deemed fit to start. Jacob Hutchinson came into the starting line-up as the only change from the previous game.

Playing on an artificial pitch, the Young Moles struggled early on as they were unable to judge passing power and distance. This lead to them regularly giving away possession cheaply and being caught out of shape as Hendon tried to counter attack into wide areas. They soon profited from Aylesbury's wastefulness in possession as a poorly hit Crossfield pass was easily intercepted and drifted into the channel, where the Hendon winger was able to play a ball inside for the striker to beat Isaac Richmond at his front post with a powerful strike.

Hendon continued to apply the pressure as Aylesbury were found to be rather sluggish early in the half, failing to get on the ball and secure possession. Hendon still persisted with their attacking methods, and Richmond had to be on hand to make a couple of saves to keep them at bay.

The Young Moles were slowly starting to wake up, becoming more eager to get on the ball and play some of the attacking football that has been on show in the opening two games of the season. However, they huffed and puffed but were unable to create anything of any real significance.



It was once again thanks to Jamie Jellis, who has been attracting interest from some top academies as of late, picking up the ball midway through the Hendon half and driving across the pitch before unleashing a shot from the edge of the area which the 'keeper was unable to hold before in spilled into the back of the net. A timely goal for FC at a time when they really needed a pick me up.

With ten minutes remaining of the half both sides were eager to get a grip on the game once more in the hope of sneaking ahead before the interval. This again lead to possession swapping hands time and time again as attacking moves broke down.

#### Half Time: Aylesbury FC 1-1 Hendon

The Young Moles could consider themselves a little lucky to be level at the break. Slow to start and generally playing within themselves, the half-time interval was an important time for the lads to regroup and refocus if they were

going to make an impression on the game.

As has been the case in the first two games of the season, Aylesbury started the second half very well. Getting on the ball early, moving it around quickly and pushing the Hendon backline further

back than they had been in the first half. A couple of early chances passed them by as they lacked the composure in and around the box to capitalise on their much improved build up play.

Hendon kept digging their heels in and were soon rewarded for their hardworking defending as they caught Aylesbury with a quick counter attack. FC grew inpatient in their build up play and in trying to force it gave away possession which triggered the counter attack which was executed perfectly as the Hendon forward found himself in space to finish easily past Richmond to put the hosts ahead again.

Aylesbury's reaction was brilliant as

they finally started to show the battling qualities we've become accustomed to in recent weeks. With a couple of substitutions clearly showing their intent as time ticked on you got the feeling that the pressure was mounting on the Hendon backline as chances were coming easier to find, although FC were unable to convert.

With the seconds ticking to the full-time whistle Harry Scott picked the ball up out wide and made a driving run towards the box, cutting inside between two defenders and being brought down for a penalty. Jamie Jellis showed great composure to step up and send the goalkeeper the wrong way to equalise with one of the last touches of the regulation 90 mins.

The Young Moles score a last minute equaliser to take the tie into extra time after a much improved second half performance...

With both teams visibly tired having played a hard 90 minutes on an unforgiving surface, there wasn't a lot of free-flowing football as extra time began. Both sides electing to play a longer passing game in the hope of carving out a chance.

This was suited more to the hosts, and they duly delivered as a long ball into the corner was crossed into the path of an onrushing midfielder, unmarked, who was afforded time and space in the Aylesbury box to chest down and volley into the bottom corner. A poor goal for AFC to concede from a defensive point of view.

Nevertheless they continued to battle hard as time was running out and managed to carve out one last great opportunity courtesy of the last of a handful of consecutive corners. A brilliant cross found skipper Alfi Touceda in space at the front post. He rose high only to see his header crash against the crossbar. Surely the last big chance for the Young Moles to square the tie again.

As they continued to press for the equaliser and with time running out, they again won a couple of consecutive corners which they opted to send goalkeeper Richmond up for as an added presence in the box. They would eventually be punished by the hosts as with the last kick of the game Hendon broke quickly from the corner to release the forward who was presented with an empty net to tap into to seal the win for Hendon and progression to the next round of the FA Youth Cup.

Both teams proved to be a credit to their respective clubs in this tie. The Young Moles will rue their lacklustre first half in which they were well off the pace but they did show character



to keep battling away and take the tie into extra time. Credit to Hendon who battled hard from the first to last whistle and just about edged it on the night.

Dan Turney: "Obviously we're disappointed to be out of the FA Youth Cup. I felt it was a disjointed performance from us on the whole. Whilst you can't deny that all the players put the effort in, it was very much in fits and starts on our part as we weren't that cohesive unit that we have been recently.

"I'm not sure if it was a little bit of nerves with it being FA Cup, or just one of those nights, but we weren't ourselves as a collective tonight both before and during the game. We lacked unity on the night and this heavily impacted on our game. That performance wasn't a reflection of our recent performances and the progress we've been making of late.

"Nevertheless we have to move on and show our learning from this experience as we aim to bounce back in the league on Monday away at Harefield United."




