FC boss Davis Haule had demanded victory at Northwood and it was a goal of exceptional quality by Brian Haule that met this requirement. There were times in the game where the Moles needed to exercise caution but to a man, they were never really in great danger from a misfiring Woods side.

The only goal of the game arrived on 11 minutes and what a goal it was. Ty Deacon attacked on the right and his lofted cross found Haule. With the ball almost behind him, Brian swivelled and shot in one fluid motion giving Brendan Hazlett no chance.

The Moles finished the half in the ascendency when a delicate cross into the Woods box saw Man of the Match Ben Stevens unfortunately

make just minimal contact as he came under pressure from the home defence.

Woods' Harry Newman caused Ash Jenkins to perform another valiant save at his feet before the home side's best chance of a leveller. Jordan Jenkins and partner Derek Feye had been masters of all they surveyed but a momentary lapse of concentration saw the ball fall to Newman yet with the goal at his mercy, the midfielder contrived to blast the ball over the bar when hitting the target appeared far simpler. A freekick deep in injury time from just outside the box had hearts fluttering but the wall held just in time to hear the referee's final whistle and to herald FC's celebrations.

FC ventured to the London suburbs for the second successive Saturday and once again, they returned to Buckinghamshire with all three points.

Charlie Mitchell is one to watch judging by today's performance. FC keeper Ashley Jenkins somehow prevented a Mitchell goal with his shins. There was nothing Jenkins could do to prevent the winger giving his side the lead a few minutes later, as the winger broke into the box before firing a rasping shot into the net.

In the 39th minute however, FC did receive their reward for their hard work. Ty Deacon was adjudged to have been tripped. A penalty was awarded and up stepped the ever

reliable Brian Haule to casually sweep home the equaliser.

Nevertheless when Ty Deacon scored a worldie of a goal. With his back to the goal, the striker swivelled and lifted the ball over the keeper from the outside of the box and into the net.

FC further extended their lead on 70 minutes. Hanwell had employed an offside trap to good effect but the trap was blown wide open as Brian Haule played an inch perfect pass to the galloping Aston Goss who slotted it past the oncoming Bunting.

A home free kick deep into the minimum of four minutes added time saw Ricky Pither rise at the far post to head past Jenkins and reduce the arrears.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to two seasons ago when the Moles and Diamonds faced off against each other in the league.

September 19th 2015

FC took time to settle and an early Diamonds corner bamboozled the whole FC defence before going to safety. Tom Lorraine forced James Weatherill into a smart save soon afterwards with the only goal of the game arriving a couple of minutes' later. Diamonds' Brad Harris had his shot blocked in the box and Lorraine was the most alert man on the field as he hit the rebound past FC's Weatherill.

FC's final chance fell to Brian Haule. As the powerful striker bore down on goal, an outstretched defender's boot blocked his route and the chance went begging. **FULL TIME 1-0 Diamonds**

January 23rd 2016

The Diamonds did though take the lead on 23 minutes, Andy Hall's shot from the edge of the box appeared at first glance to be tipped around the post by the FC Keeper but the immediate reaction of the away side soon indicated to everyone that the ball had in fact gone through a hole in the net. After some deliberation between the officials a goal was awarded.

The away side who extended their lead on 35 minutes when Jon Stevenson picked the ball up on the edge of the box and fired past the right hand of Weatherill. Soon after the ball fell to Rudd 25 yards out after a clearance and he smashed it into the top corner to reduce the arrears.

Diamonds restored their two goal lead on 51 minutes when James Dobson failed to clear the ball and it fell Shawn Richards 8 yards out and he fired home with his left foot.

On 89 minute the Aylesbury pressure paid off, A Rushden defender was robbed off the ball just outside the box by Lynton Goss who crossed for Brian Haule to prod home. Diamonds nerves were settled though when into injury time a poor back pass by Jeanmal Prosper was intercepted by substitute Claudie Hoban who scored easily to restore the two goal advantage.

THE MANAGER

Andy Peaks had joined Mark Starmar's management team in May 2012, bringing a wealth of UCL experience as well as his notable career history with Rushden & Diamonds FC where he was eighth in their all-time appearance list, having played 205 times for R&D FC between 1992 and 1997.

He holds a UEFA B coaching license. He took over control of first-team affairs in a caretaker role following Mark Starmar's resignation on 19th March 2014, and was installed on a permanent basis a month later. In his first full season at the helm he took the club to a League and Cup Double in the United Counties League. He has since led them to the end of season playoffs in the past two seasons.

Scott joined the club in the summer of 2012, after leaving his post as Assistant Manager at Northampton Spencer. Scott, or Biff as he's more commonly known, brought a wealth of experience having worked with AFC R&D Manager Andy Peaks over the previous few seasons.



Ben Heath

21-year-old goalkeeper who joined the club at the end of October 2016. The young stopper had been with Rugby Town most recently, having also played at Step 4 level for Daventry Town.



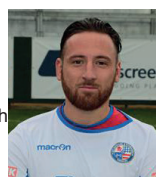
Blaize Punter

20-year-old Centre Back who joined the club in Summer 2017. He was a junior at Mansfield Town before joining Nuneaton Town Under-21 setup. He then played at Barwell before joining Rugby Town. He has played international football with Antigua & Barbuda.



Joe Curtis

23-year-old midfielder who joined the club before the start of the 2016-17 season. He graduated through the youth system at Southampton, having also been a junior with Leicester City before a serious injury saw his release.



Liam Dolman

30-year-old defender, who joined the club from Daventry Town during June 2014. He is from Northamptonshire, and started his career with Northampton Town, making over 50 appearances in League and FA Cup games for the Cobblers in the next two seasons.



Ben Farrell

31-year-old midfielder who joined the club from Bedford Town in December 2016. Ben has had several spells with Bedford Town, and earlier in his career made the step up from the Eagles to play Conference football with Cambridge United.



Joel Gyasi

23-year-old wide midfield / forward player who first joined the club in October 2014. He started his career with the MK Dons Academy, After playing 23 games for Kettering Town he joined Bedford Town in 2013.



Richard Bunting

36-year-old midfielder who joined the club from Kings Lynn Town in November 2013. He had captained the Linnets to the Northern Premier League Division One South title in the 2012-13 season. He missed the latter part of the 2015/16 season due to injury. In 2016/17 he returned to captain the club in 45 games.



Tom Lorraine

28-year-old striker who joined the club from Cogenhoe United at the end of March 2014, where he was registered with Daventry Town on a "dual-registration" basis. He became the club's overall top scorer during the 2016/17 season, passing his half-century of goals during his Diamonds' career.



Sam Brown

25-year-old defender who was a junior at the Centre of Excellence at Rushden & Diamonds FC. He joined AFC Kempston Rovers in 2009, aged 16, and helped them to reach the UCL Premier in 2010. He returned for the 2016/17 season, when he appeared in 49 matches.



Callum Westwood

19-year-old right back who signed for the club on dual registration terms with Kettering Town in January 2017. He was previously dual registered with the Poppies and Rugby Town. After an impressive debut was cut short by injury he was able to make 10 appearances for the club in 2016/17.



Cameron Gilchrist

Defender aged 20 who signed for the club in October 2017. He had played for the Diamonds in pre season, but then signed for Barwell, but moved to the Diamonds after finding his first team appearances were limited there.



Chief Boateng

23-year-old striker who joined the club in August 2017 after a successful trial during pre-season. He had played in local Northampton leagues previously. He is also dual registered with Northampton ON Chenecks of the UCL Premier.



Kyle Swailes

24-year-old goalkeeper who joined the club to provide cover in August 2017. He is also currently UCL-registered with Rushden & Higham United. He was part of the academy system at Nene Park with Rushden & Diamonds FC before joining Raunds Town.



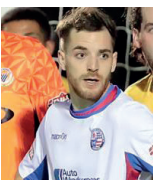
Adam North

17-year-old goalkeeper who joined the club in November 2017 on a Work Experience Loan basis from Northampton Town.



John Dean

23-year-old striker who joined the club on dual-registration terms with Desborough Town of the United Counties League in October 2017.



Ryan Robbins

29-year-old striker when joined from Gresley FC in November 2017, having previously played for Barwell, Stamford and Coalville in recent seasons, following earlier spells with Boston United and Kings Lynn Town. He is also a St Kitts & Nevis international.



Luke Fairlamb

Initially signed for AFC Rushden & Diamonds in January 2015 but moved on to Bedford Town without making a first team appearance. Luke is a 25 year-old midfield / forward player who was born in Northants and was on junior books with several local clubs, playing in various positions including left back and left midfield.



Ben Diamond

24-year-old attacking player who joined the club from Corby Town in November 2017, scoring on his debut for the club. Before joining the Steelmen he played at ON Chenecks, facing the Diamonds at both Youth and Senior level. In the 2016/17 season he scored 18 goals for Chenecks.



Ben Ford

22-year-old midfielder / utility player who joined the club at the end of October 2016. He was part of the Rushden & Diamonds FC youth setup before transferring across to the Kettering Town system, prior to getting first team experience at UCL level with Newport Pagnell.



Jack Ashton

26-year-old defender, who joined the Diamonds on a dual registration basis with Stamford AFC in March 2014. After a promising start to the 2016/17 campaign a further knee injury ended his season in November after just 13 appearances that campaign.



Claudiu Hoban

25-year-old Romanian-born midfield player (also known as Claudio), who often plays wide-left, but he can also play centrally or on the right.



Darryl Smith

25-year-old winger who played at Newport Pagnell in recent seasons, taking part in the Swans run to the quarter-finals of the FA Vase during the 2016/17 campaign. He joined the Swans in the 2014-15 season, and made 40 appearances for them last season, scoring 13 times.



DAN TURNERY

We spoke to the
U18's boss about
the season so far.



How have you found the season so far since we last spoke in pre-season? Are you happy with how the team has done so far?

I think in general we have been doing well. The improvement on last year is clear to see – we're one point shy of last season's points total already and are in the quarter finals of the County Cup so all in all I think we can be happy with the position we're in at the moment. Naturally we have nights where things don't go as well as we would like (who doesn't) but the important thing is the learning points from each and every game that we play that aids the development of these young lads.

Great news recently that Under 18's player Jamie Jellis joined the Wolverhampton Wanderers Academy, and now has joined Stevenage if I'm correct? How does it feel to see one of your players join a football league side?

It's a great feeling for all involved with the U18's, not least the player himself. It shows the potential reward for hard work, dedication and great application. As a coach/manager it's an honour to have been involved in the development of a player that has gone on to sign professional forms and certainly gives a feeling of great satisfaction for the job that you do.

A few players have made the step up to the first team this year, Isaac Richmond in goal got the teams first clean sheet, Alfie Touceda has made a couple of appearances and Harry Scott is now a first team regular, how did it feel to see them all progress from your team and adapt so easily?

For me there was no question that they would adapt to first team football, as all of the players have shown the right attitude and application with the U18's. I remember saying at the end of last season that there were a handful of players that I felt we would see in and around the first team this year and I'm delighted to see that come to fruition. You have to give credit to Davis for showing faith in the young players who are hungry for an opportunity to make the step up.

How much of a blow will it be that Alfie Touceda has joined Maidenhead United Under 18s?

Obviously it is unfortunate to lose a player of Alfie's ability and influence within the squad. He is a very good player and on top of that he's a great lad. The way that he handled the situation regarding the potential move to Maidenhead was commendable and showed real maturity. That being said we've got a squad full of quality, and I think results have shown that our squad

depth is more than capable of managing his departure.

You've had some good results this season, are you happy with how much the team has moved on from last season?

It's taken a lot of hard work, but the strides we have taken in the 15 months that I've been in charge is very pleasing and everyone involved can be proud of the work that we have done so far. I feel we've set a foundation for sustainability which will hopefully see us maintain a good level for seasons to come. Whilst we are pleased with the position we are now in we cannot rest on our laurels and we will be pushing for further progression and development before the season is over.

What's the atmosphere like in the dressing room and within the team at the moment?

We have a good bunch of lads here and the atmosphere in the dressing room is generally very good. They've become a really tight-knit group and I feel this transferred into performances on the pitch.

What are your thoughts on the win over Marlow in the County Cup on sunday?

I'm glad to get the win and progress to the next round of the County Cup. We were far more dominant than the scoreline suggests, on a pitch that made it difficult for both teams to play.

We were bright from the outset, putting them under pressure immediately and getting an early goal really settled us down. We could have had much more in the first half, having hit the woodwork four times and the 'keeper made a couple of good one-on-one stops too.

The second half was a bit flat, much owing to the pitch, and we didn't adjust our game to match the increasingly difficult conditions. That was a bit of a leveller and brought Marlow into the game a little more. Still I felt we dealt with everything pretty well at the back and, although the second goal took a long time coming, we were fully deserving of the win.

We now move onto the quarter finals, with an away fixture to Harwell & Hendred on 21st January, as we look to achieve our pre-season aim of reaching the latter stages of the competition.

DRESSING AT THE MATCH

Just how cool were those guys? It must have been 1982 and I was still a little 12 year old in East Manchester. The lads: Adj, Rick and Paul all dressed in their full Sergio Tacchini and Fila tracksuits wearing Adidas Rom, Adidas Jeans and Diadora Borg Elites. Their clothes seemed to dazzle and then I looked at myself. I was wearing a pair of drainpipe jeans, Slazenger sweater and black Gola pumps.

Shopping for me was Mossley Sports or Ron Hill in Stalybridge. Clothes were a birthday or a christmas treat. Fun trips to the swimming baths in Oldham would involve a diversion to Romida Sports to gaze along with the multitudes at the Fila, Ellesse and Lacoste gear all locked in glass cabinets like jewellery (I later learned this was to deter gangs of 'steamers'.) Legends arose of infamous lightning raids of Moss side and Hulme gangs on Hurley's Sports in Picadilly.

At school, kids would turn up with the additions of Pringle sweaters, Farah trousers, Kickers or Pods. School trips became mini fashion shows. I remember being about 14 and turning up for a trip to an old coal mine in Longton dressed in a Cerruti sweater, Lois jumbo cords and a pair of lovely tan Adidas slip-on golf shoes.

Even though I looked the business, I wasn't going to league football regularly. My mum was scared because of the bad reputation of the game and I was always interested in the football rather than the bother. I preferred going to the Non-League; it was cheaper, a lot of my friends - and my dad - went and I could always have a cheeky beer in the clubhouse without

anyone being too bothered. My team was, and still is, Mossley AFC, my hometown club.

Whilst the early eighties saw trouble at league grounds, non-league had the reputations as a 'bit of a one man and his dog' pastime. And to an extent, that was and still is true. The only exceptions were cup matches, local derbies and games in dodgy towns. An FA Trophy quarter final at Bangor City in 1981 attended by some 2,500 saw running battles in the North Wales town, before and after the game. Also as the train pulled away from the station after the game the bricks came flying through the windows. An easter derby against local rivals Hyde United resulted in large scale fisticuffs once too. The other place where trouble was always guaranteed was South Liverpool FC, based in Garston, a tough old dockers area of Merseyside. Little wonder the club went out of business after vandals burnt down the clubhouse and trashed the rest of the place.

The high - or low - point was the Northern Premier League Cup final in 1989. The game was played at Maine Road, just days after the Hillsborough disaster and attracted a good non-league crowd of 2000. The plan was to split the main stand between Mossley and Fleetwood Town fans a couple of friendly bobbies to oversee events. Those two officers were quickly on their radios calling for backup as gangs of opposing fans faced off against each others and began rushing backwards and forwards throughout the game. ack up was called for from a United vs City reserves game. Those fans ejected continued the battles in the Moss Side streets. The result and goings on were front page



of the Manchester Evening News the next day, and Manchester City were banned from holding Non-League finals at Maine Road. A ban which has continued over to Eastlands, where the new stadium will never see a repeat of Mossleys 2-1 triumph that day.

My choice of clothes had changed by then. Favourite shops in Manchester were DeGuy and Voi in and around the royal exchange. Brands were C17, Radio, Ciao and Sonnetti. I also loved the Manchester music scene with the band t-shirts, Go Vicinity flares and multi-coloured Kickers.

A return to my home town some three years ago after an absence has seen me renew my interest in football and in Mossley AFC. I've gone from a few games when I first returned, to most games home and away - my interest has been rekindled in my home town team. Ironically, there are a few lads my age who for various reasons don't go to City or United anymore; so you spot a few labels around Seel Park. The sight of Lacoste jackets, Fjallraven coats, and a vast number of Adidas eighties'-style is not uncommon amongst other brands. And a few nods are exchanged at the match when you see lads in similar garb from visiting teams.

The clothes are now back to the early eighties look of Fila trackies, Lyle & Scott polos, Levi's 501's and Adidas Stan Smith trainers for the younger element too.

A look at the Non-League scene still sees a very homely, some would say nerdy, view of football. Again this is not an unfair view, there are quite a few rather square chaps at games. That not to say there isn't trouble. Chalfont St Peter versus Glossop North End in the 2009 FA Vase Semi Final witnessed trouble. Though this was certainly due to drunken excesses, as opposed to any organised activities. Our old friends at Fleetwood Town have a reputation when travelling away and reading on the many non-league forums their reputation goes before them. FC United of Manchester, the breakaway club from the Glazer owned Manchester United, have attracted many hangers-on and I've witnessed personally local Mossley youths face off with their so-called support after a league game in 2008. For a regular game, there are no distractions from

Forward wind to 2009 when I moved to Aylesbury for work. I looked up FC on Google maps and eventually found myself to Haywood Way and knowing no one, took my spot in the stand. As it always the case, you get talking to folk. Mike, Mr Fish and Danny of course made me feel welcome. 10-0 and 9-0 wins in those first few games certainly meant I had timed my initial visits to the club well as the club won the Spartan League and promotion to the Southern League.

The next season, Danny "volunteered" me to write the match reports and I've been doing it ever since. Sometimes, it's a pleasure to write, other times you don't know what you're going to say. Whatever the outcome, I'm always grateful to FC for being so welcoming. Long may those days continue.

The truth being, there is not enough people to develop a scene as such. Not that I'd want a return to bygone days. Average crowds at Mossley are around the 200 mark and we are one of the better supported teams in our division, the Northern Premier League Division One North. Only I would rather watch non-league than any other form of football nowadays.

Nathan Frater made it 3-0 just 2 minutes after the break and Terry Griffiths on 58 minutes and BJ Christie 9 minutes later made it a nap hand. Things went from bad to worse for Arlessey as they had both Akti Krasniqi and Luke Abrahams sent-off for second yellow card offences.

Ricky Pither pulled one back on 88 minutes but Hanwell couldn't find a leveller.

Ben Sturgess was Thame United's hero as he bagged a brace in the 33rd and then 3 minutes from the end to beat Egham Town at the Runnymede Stadium, Callum Webb having equalised in the 81st minute.

Chalfont St Peter enjoyed a comfortable 3-0 home win over Marlow, taking an 11th minute lead through Alex Paine. Victor Osobu added a second 10 minutes later, with Jake Cass making it game over with a third goal on 68 minutes.

Fourth-bottom Barton Rovers' surprising struggles continue after last season's play-off finalists were beaten 2-1 at Sharpenhoe Road by Ashford Town (Middx). Jack Beadle gave the Ash Trees an 11th minute lead that Danny Jarvis cancelled out after 32 minutes. But Max Webb's goal 2 minutes after half-time in the end proved decisive for the visitors.


Kempston Rovers came back from two-down to share the points with Fleet Town at Calthorpe Park. Patrik Ruzicka on 55 minutes and Brad Wilson 3 minutes later gave Fleet their advantage. But Robbie Goodman on 71 minutes and Jake Newman 8 minutes later earned the Walnut Boys a point.

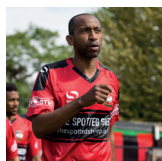
PREDICTION FOR RUSHDEN

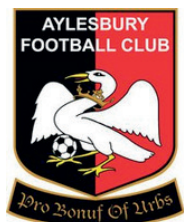
