

# AYLESBURY FOOTBALL CLUB GROUND REGULATIONS

Further, persons will not be allowed entry to Aylesbury Football Club if in the opinion of the gate-men, stewards or any member of the management committee if they are deemed to be intoxicated.

No responsibility is accepted for any mishap that may happen in the car park or for any goods that may be left in vehicles in the car park. ALL VEHICLES ARE PARKED AT THE OWNERS' RISK.

FC chalked up their first win of the season against a somewhat feisty Marlow side. The early signs were not great for the Moles as they showed their usual shyness in front of goal before predictably falling behind. However, unlike in recent weeks, FC continued to plug away and were rewarded with three goals of good quality to send their supporters home happy.

Ty Deacon showed everyone what he was capable of as early as the second minute with a strike that was just pushed to safety by keeper Simon Grant. Ty was then at again with a point blank shot that Grant again was equal to before the Marlow keeper flicked the ball away from the onrushing Brian Haule.

Brian hit another shot just wide of the post before Marlow threatened with



Anthony Ball cutting out a dangerous right field cross.

As has happened so often at the SRD Stadium this term, the away team took the lead without too much effort when on 19 minutes, Allen Bossman snatched at the ball from perhaps three yards giving Jenkins no chance. Luckily this lead lasted just a few minutes. Kieron Schmidt played in Shavne Almond who turned and crashed the ball home from a few yards much to the delight of his teammates.

Almond then had a half chance which the keeper just managed to hold on to and this was followed soon afterwards by a fierce Schmidt effort, which just cleared the far post with the keeper scrambling across his area. Junaid Bell and Chris Ovenden might have had a little more luck on another day to regain the lead for Marlow but it was FC captain Ben Stevens who had the best chance in those closing first half minutes, with a sliding shot which just cleared the post. FC took the lead just two

into the second half. Shavne Almond cleverly attacked down the left. drew the keeper from his goal and passed to partner Tv Deacon who had just to sidefoot the ball into an empty net. Ty was on form by now. His effort on 62 minutes was tipped around the post. Jordan Jenkins was also in the hunt for a goal and the big defender was unlucky with a clipped header that just grazed an opponent's head before flying to safety.



Of course, the home fans had a right to be nervous after recent performances and therefore it was with great relief that Deacon grabbed his second of the match and FC's third with 18 minutes to play. Jeanmal Prosper's run on goal brought out a great save from Grant.

There was little the Marlow keeper could do about the follow up however as Deacon hit the rebound into an unguarded goal. It was nothing less than FC deserved for their hard work and despite a few late scares, the referee blew his whistle to a few handbags from the visitors but more importantly cheers and applause from FC fans who could finally celebrate a league victory.

## **Uxbridge FC**

Our opponents today are Uxbridge, who come to The SRD Stadium on the back of a 6-0 thrashing to Fleet on Tuesday night.

It's always a question on the lips of fans, after a big defeat, is it better to play that team or worse? Arguably after a heavy 6-0 defeat to struggling Fleet on tuesday, Moles fans could be forgiven for thinking that this is the perfect time for FC to face Uxbridge and get a potential 3 more points on the board. However the more experienced and wary of fans will know that this isn't how football works, and that Uxbridge will now be looking for a good performance to bounce back from that mid week game. Fleet themselves faced a thrashing from AFC Rushden & Diamonds earlier in the season so this shows how form and results mean nothing in this league.

Uxbridge have had a tough start to the season, much like FC. After winning their first two games, a 3-1 victory over Bedford town and

## Last time we met...

First time out last season took place here at The SRD Stadium on August 13th, resulting a 2-2 draw.

FC went into the game minus Jonny Montgomery who was suffering from a neck injury and Jack Brooker who was away. Dave Carty replaced Monty in the middle of the park and new signing Ashley Jenkins replaced Brooker in goal.

FC should have taken the lead on 16 minutes, a ball out of defence by Jordan Jenkins found Aaron Couch, who took



a good first touch and fired low from all of 30 yards, but the luck was yet again against Aylesbury as the ball hit the inside of the post with the keeper well beaten and ran to safety. Then on 29 minutes the inevitable happened, Uxbridge had a couple of shots which were half cleared by the defence but the ball fell to Mitchell Wiseman who rifled the ball home from outside the area with Jenkins well beaten.



Then just as the whistle was about to blow for the break a corner was partially cleared by McCarthy & the bar but only to the head of Mark Lambert who made no mistake for the equaliser. Were FC going again to rue all the missed opportunities? It seemed not on 62 minutes when an excellent driving run by left back JJ Lofthouse-Smith was halted as he was up ended in the box and this time the referee had no hesitation in pointing straight to the spot. Mark Lambert converted and that should have been that but with fifteen mutes to go a free kick from inside the Uxbridge area found substitute Matt Woods with just Victor Ocansey to beat, the defender appeared

to have done well to dispossess Woods but then tried to dribble the ball out of the area, was robbed off the ball by Woods, who struck the ball past Jenkins who had no chance 2-2.

The return fixture at Uxbridge took place just a couple of months later on November 19th, with Uxbridge getting a 1-0 win.

# Where are they now? Ricky Miller

FC fans may remember a young striker called Ricky Miller who spent a season down at Haywood Way before he made it big. In the 2010/11 season Miller scored 15 goals from 34 appearances during the Mark Eaton reign. This was enough to catch the attention of Wealdstone who signed the promising striker in 2011.

Miller re-signed for Stamford in 2012–13 and scored the winning goal in the play-off final against Chasetown to help the club win promotion to the Northern Premier League Premier Division. He then re-signed for Conference North club Boston United in June 2013, and finished 2013–14 with 46 appearances and 28 goals, as the club narrowly missed out on the play-offs with a sixth-place finish. He was named the Conference North Player of the Year and was also named in the Team of the Year.

On 25 June 2014, Miller signed a one-year contract with League Two club Luton Town on a free transfer from Boston. On 2 September 2014, he joined Conference Premier team Dover Athletic on loan, before being recalled just over a month later after scoring five goals in ten appearances. Miller made his debut for Luton the following day in a 2–1 away victory over Hartlepool United. He scored his first goal for the club in a 4–2 FA Cup victory over Newport County, and this was followed up with his first Football League goal in the following match, a 1–0 win at home to Tranmere Rovers. Miller finished 2014–15 with 15 appearances and two goals for Luton.



On 27 April 2015, Miller and his Luton Town teammate Shaun Whalley were both arrested by Bedfordshire Police in connection with an alleged assault following the club's end of season awards night. Both were released on bail, but were suspended by the club pending a police inquiry. He later had his Luton contract terminated following his arrest. On 3 June 2015, Miller was charged with five offences in connection to the assault. On 8 December 2015, Miller was found not guilty and

was cleared of the charges.



He said: "I was hung out to dry by Luton and I lost my home and relationship – I was ready to guit football."

Justice prevailed six months later as a not guilty verdict was delivered and all charges dropped.

"When I managed to clear my name, my head cleared and my form improved. I was able to score a few goals in the second half of that season."

On 30 June 2015, Miller joined Dover Athletic permanently on a two-year contract, following his release by Luton. He scored the equaliser in a 1–1 draw away to Kidderminster Harriers on 23 April 2016, a result that confirmed Dover's place in the play-offs. Miller played in both legs of the play-off semi-final defeat to Forest Green Rovers, losing 2–1 on aggregate, despite scoring the opening goal in the second leg

to level the tie, and finished the season with 54 appearances and 22 goals. He scored a hat-trick for Dover in a 4–3 victory at home to Forest Green Rovers on 10 September 2016, before scoring ten goals in five matches in October 2016, including four goals in a 6–1 victory at home to Braintree Town. Miller scored two further hat-tricks in wins over Eastleigh and Barrow, and finished the season with 46 appearances and 45 goals.

# **Q & A time with striker Ty Deacon**

## League Roundup



## League roundup

Newly-promoted Moneyfields maintained their unbeaten start to the Evo-Stik League South East season, but were made to battle for a point at improving Hayes & Yeading United on Tuesday night.

The Sydenhams Football League (Wessex) champions found themselves trailing to goals from Manny Duku in the 15th and 34th minutes.

Steve Hutchings reduced the deficit 10 minutes after the restart and then Brett Poate equalised with what is becoming a trademark free-kick.

Fellow new boys Hartley Wintney are second after they won 2.1 at the Runnymede Stadium against out-of-form Egham Town.

Paul Hodges gave the visitors a 19th minute lead that he doubled 8 minutes into the second half.

Brendan Matthew replied for the Sarnies, but it wasn't until the 88th minute.

Ashford Town (Middx) won the derby at Chestnut Avenue against Northwood in emphatic fashion.

The Ash Trees ran out 7-1 winners, being three-up at the break with a Mark Bitmead hat-trick.

Bitmead added his own and Ashford's fourth 10 minutes after the break and, after Harry Newman had reduced the arrears on the hour-mark, a Jabir Laraba brace on 70 and 85 minutes made it 61, with Romario Jonas adding a seventh in stoppage time.

Northwood had been reduced to ten-men on 83 minutes when Marcus Rose was sent-off for two yellow card offences.

Kempton Rovers were comfortable 4-0 Hillgrounds winners against Aylesbury United.

Jake Newman bagged a quickfire brace after the break following a goalless first half and then goals in the final 7 minutes from Sam Johnson and Nathan Tshikuna wrapped up victory for the Walnut Boys.

Fleet Town went into their game against Uxbridge at Calthorpe Park having failed to win in seven games and having scored only 4 goals.

But they hammered the Reds 6-0 to earn their first three points.

Hero of the night was Farnborough loanee Pat Ruzicka, who netted a second half hat-trick.

Sam Pekun and Matt Bunyan had given Fleet a 2-0 lead at the break, Ruzicka then bagged his first two on the hour-mark and then 7 minutes later from the penalty spot, although he missed a chance to complete his hat-trick when Paul McCarthy saved his second spot-kick.

Eight minutes from time, Uxbridge sub Anthony Thomas was penalised for handball and was shown a red card as Fleet got their third penalty of the night.

This time, Ruzicka was denied the chance for his hat-trick and it was given to Josh Baines who scored and it was 5-0 to Fleet with 8 minutes left

But he wasn't to be denied and he took the matchball home with a third in the 87th minute.

It was a night of 'firsts' as Hanwell Town and Aylesbury FC mirrored Fleet's achievement by also recording their first three-point hauls.

Hanwell got off the nil-point mark away from home too, winning 1-0 at Chalfont St Peter, courtesy of a 25th minute Callum Wright effort.

The Moles were 3-1 home winners over Marlow, whose Allen Bossman gave them an 18th minute lead.

Shayne Almond levelled 2 minutes later and the a Ty Deacon brace after 48 and 72 minutes won it for the hosts.

Bedford Town won the derby at Arlesey Town 2-0 with two last-gasp goals.

Devante Stanley finally broke the deadlock in the 89th minute and Joel Norris wrapped up victory with the Eagles second 4 minutes into stoppage time.

Beaconsfield Town won 2-1 at newcomers Thame United, taking a 13th minute lead through Luke Neville and then winning it with a 70th minute Jordan Ajanlekoko goal after Ellis Hercules had equalised 5 minutes earlier.

A goal from Ryan Sharman after 10 minutes sealed Cambridge City's win at Sharpenhoe Road against Barton Rovers.





Last year was a very special year for the FA Cup, with the four teams contesting the semi-finals having finished in the top five of the English top-flight. Only once since the Premier League, or Premiership, kicked into action in 1992 has the last four been represented with such strength and quality (in 2008-09). The cup was alive and it seemed to mean something to the world's biggest and richest clubs... Or so we were told.

The truth of the matter is and this really isn't breaking news - all four of those clubs, Manchester City, Tottenham, Chelsea and most certainly the eventual winners. Arsenal. would have swapped that victory walk up those famous steps in northwest London for a top-four finish that opens the gate for Champions League football. They reached the last four through the sheer strength and depth they could call on, stripping back their playing resources and showing the competition little respect in the early rounds as they breezed past much-lesser opponents.

I don't blame them for this, but let's stop dressing it up; the FA Cup, while no doubt being a competition the biggest clubs still 'want' to win, is little more than a back-up plan for managers – like Arsene Wenger – to fall back on should the primary goal of top-class European football not be attained. Even then, for the most demanding of clubs, winning it will not be enough to save a manager his job.

Despite this, last season really was a very special year for the FA Cup, and the biggest success story came from Non-League football with Lincoln City reaching the quarter-finals. They talk about romance in the cup, and there was plenty of that as Danny Cowley's side became the first Non-League club in 103 years to reach the last eight.

For their efforts, and ignoring the TV revenue that was pulled in, they also picked up £395,000 for the six games they won. In the grand scheme of the FA's current pav structure and a pay pot that tips £15 million - this is probably about right, but the issue needs addressing in the earliest rounds. So let's shave a bit off the top and pile a bit more into the bottom. What difference does £1.8 million, the money picked up by the eventual winners, make anyway?

The FA would be doing a lot more for the game should they bump up the prize money in the first and second Preliminary rounds, which is currently just £1,500 and £1,925 respectively.

Forget the TV cash bonuses that 'may' come into it should smaller clubs proceed past the first round – give grassroots football the money it deserves

The FA have suggested they are going to address this, but actions speak louder than words and more cash is needed from the ground up. The £1.8 million that goes to the winner, most certainly a top-flight club and more than likely a top-four contender, will be nothing but loose change.

In fact, it probably won't even come close to covering the compensation package for the sacked manager who has the temerity to win the bloody thing!


