

We have some festive events planned and a huge New Years Eve Party that I am sure you will support. Tickets are available from behind the bar so please come along and support the club


I wish you all a fun, festive and

In a contest that saw a catalogue of chances for both sides, a first half effort from Davide Pobbe was enough to separate the two sides to bring the three points back to Buckinghamshire for a third successive away trip.

The deadlock was almost broken by City when the division's top scorer Ryan Sharman rose the highest from a Ben Robinson cross, but saw his strong headed effort ricochet off the bar to the relief of Ashley Jenkins and the Aylesbury faithful.

Jack Vasey saw his bullet header heroically saved by Ashley Jenkins, and then for the second time in the space of a quarter of an hour the Lilywhites had another effort rattle the frame of the goal – Vasey again with the header.

The hosts would live to rue these misses as on 29 minutes the breakthrough came. The ball broke fortunately for the alert Davide Pobbe, who showed great skill to wrong foot his marker before curling the ball past the outstretched arm of Niall Conroy.

Four minutes from time Ashley Jenkins was called into action again. Jordan Williams must have thought his looping header was destined to see the net ripple. However, Jenkins was determined to keep his clean sheet intact, performing a Christmas miracle to tip the attempt onto the upright.

The board went up for six minutes of added time followed by a sharp intake of breath from the away following, however the yellow and blue wall stood strong and the three points were secured.

Joe Fitzgerald at right back won the Man of the Match plaudits, special mention to Ash Jenkins with some wonder saves in goal.





Since relegation last season from the Evo-Stik Southern Premier league, Hayes & Yeading are sitting just below the play-off spots.

Hayes & Yeading enjoyed their glory years in 2009 after promotion from the Conference South to the Conference Premier where they stayed for three seasons before relegation back to the Conference South in 2012. Yet in 2016, Hayes & Yeading finished in 20th and dropped down to the Southern Premier League. Paul Hughes joined the club in 2016, however was unable to keep the side up and United saw their second successive relegation to head down to the South East division.

United have had a mixed start to the season with their form dipping and struggling with consistency to stay in the play-off spots. Manny Duku is a key threat for the FC defence. Duku was an integral member of the Kings Langley side from two seasons ago that won promotion from this league under Paul Hughes.

Duncan Culley was also a great signing for the club from National League South side Duncan Culley, scoring a hat-trick on his debut against Barton Rovers in the FA Trophy preliminary round, scoring 7 goals so far this season.

The vistors enter Haywood Way this afternoon on the back of a 3-0 victory against Marlow and losing their previous three.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to day one of the season as we faced Hayes & Yeading at the SkyEx Stadium.

August 12th 2017

After a testing pre-season with some pleasing results, the Moles kicked off the 2017/18 season with a trip to the SkyEx Community Stadium to take on a Hayes and Yeading side which had sufferedrelegation from the Southern Premier last year, their third relegation in five years.

Hayes began to find their way into the game midway through the first half, with the first shot of note falling to Manny Duku on 17 minutes, whose goal-bound effort was blocked superbly by Jordan Jenkins. This was a shock to the FC system, who had controlled the game prior to this, and on 30 minutes the attacking impetus was back with the Moles. Aston Goss stole the ball deep in midfield, beat a few defenders with his tricky feet, before drilling a low shot at the Hayes stopper Jack Smith.

The second half saw the game kick into life. Hayes and Yeading took the lead on 52 minutes after Derek Feyi mistimed his clearance, slicing it to Danny Blanchett who was waiting at the back post who cushioned a header down to Ismael Ehui who coolly tapped home from a yardout, sending the home fans into raptures.

However, the lead was short lived. On 56 minutes, a corner whipped in by Aston Goss was poorly cleared, the ball fell to the 'FC engine room' Jonny Montgomery, who delivered a sublime ball into the unmarked Jeanmal Prosper who chested down and smashed home past a stranded Jack Smith. Game on. The Moles had their tails up at this point, however, rarely tested the Hayes goalkeeper.

The final chance of the game came on 87 minutes, where some good defensive work from Montgomery saw FC regain possession, and counter attack with Prosper, who looked to be through on goal, but an unfortunate slip saw Hayes regain their shape and Prosper's rushed, curling shot was agonisingly wide. The game finished honours even. FULL TIME 1-1





THE MANAGER

Paul Hughes will be familiar to FC fans during his impressive time at Kings Langley. In 2012, Hughes was appointed joint manager at Kings Langley alongside Ritchie Hanlon. The pair led Kings Langley to back to back promotions, finishing 2nd in the Spartan South Midlands Division One in 2014, and then winning the Spartan South Midlands Premier Division title in 2015. Following a third consecutive promotion that saw Kings Langley FC become champions of the Southern Central Division and took the club to the Southern Premier Division, Hughes, alongside Hanlon, moved to Haves & Yeading United in November 2016.

The pair were unable to keep Hayes & Yeading in the Southern Premier League however last season, dropping into our division for this season and with Paul Hughes now the sole manager of the club

Who are the men from Hayes & Yeading to watch out for this afternoon? We take a look here.

Jack Smith

23 year-old goalkeeper who joined Hayes & Yeading during the summer of 2017 having impressed against United last season for Dunstable Town. Jack started out in the youth set up at Watford before moving to Swindon Town and then Hemel Hempstead Town.



Former Hayes & Yeading under 18 goalkeeper who returned to the club this summer from Ashford Town (Middlesex) to act as back-up to Jack Smith. Made his United debut early in October 2017, coming on as a half-time substitute for the injured Jack Smith. Aged 24.

Toby Little

28 year-old left sided defender or midfield player who returned to Hayes & Yeading United from Bostik Premier side Kingstonian in October 2017



Xavi Comas

29 year-old Spanish goalkeeper who joined Hayes & Yeading in November 2017 from Hanwell Town having starred against United last season at Kings Langley. Came to the UK due to work commitments and signed for Hemel Hempstead Town in 2015 before being loaned out to Kings Langley.



Danny Hutchins

Experienced 27 year-old left-back who joined Hayes & Yeading during the summer of 2017 from Barton Rovers where he was vice-Captain of a Rovers side who narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern Premier last season after finishing third.



Tom Smith

24 year-old central defender, and twin brother of goalkeeper Jack, who joined Hayes & Yeading during the summer of 2017 from Barton Rovers where he was the defensive rock of a Rovers side who narrowly missed out on promotion to the Southern Premier last season after finishing third



Ryan Kinnane

23 year-old tall, strong and composed central defender who joined Hayes & Yeading in December 2017 from Aylesbury United after impressing against United a few weeks earlier. Started out with Harefield United, making almost 100 appearances before moving to Hanwell Town.



Darnell Shakes

20 year-old defender who joined Hayes & Yeading in November 2017. Made his United debut in a 3-1 victory over Slough Town in the BFB Challenge Cup, has also played for Shoreham and Whitehawk.



Keano Robinson

19 year-old versatile defender who joined Hayes & Yeading United in September 2017, making his debut the following month as a substitute against AFC Rushden & Diamonds. Pacey defender who came through the youth ranks at Peterborough United.



Priestly Farquharson

20 year-old versatile defender who re-joined Hayes & Yeading in September 2017 having made a single appearance for the club at Hitchin Town last season. Formerly captain of the Brunel University side, Priestly started the current season with Bishop's Stortford in the Bostik Premier division.



Danny May

28 year-old defender who joined United in the summer of 2017 having spent two successful years with Royston Town where he was an integral part of their promotion campaign last season.



Komal Llewellyn-Reid

23 year-old central defender who joined Hayes & Yeading United in October 2017 from Cockfosters, making a successful debut in a 1-0 victory over AFC Rushden & Diamonds.



Scott Donnelly

Experienced 29 year-old ball playing central midfielder who joined Hayes and Yeading in late October 2017 from National League South side Chippenham Town who he had joined during the summer. Started out with QPR, making his debut against Preston aged just 16 in October 2004.



Ola Olajubu

23 year-old defender who joined Hayes & Yeading at the end of September 2017 having started the campaign with Southall. Previously with local side AFC Hayes before leaving to play in Northern Ireland with Glentoran followed by a spell playing in Andorra prior to returning to play for Southall.



Spyros Mentis

Skilful 23 year-old midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading in the summer of 2017 after a spending a few years at Royston Town whom he helped to promotion last season. Prior to joining Royston he had spells at St Albans City, making his debut as a sixteen year-old, and Takeley.



Joakim Ehui

Former United under-18s midfielder, and younger brother of striker Ismael, who signed for United during the summer of 2017 having ended the previous season with Northwood. Jo started out as a youngster with Fulham before leaving the Cottage and joining the youth ranks here at United.



Gurkan Gokmen

23 year-old Dutch midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading during the summer of 2017 from Slough Town having been with the Rebels for the past couple of years. Was a professional at Watford before playing professionally in Turkey for Muglaspor and Ankara Sekerspor



Luke Joyce-Dwarika

23 year-old wide midfield player who joined Hayes & Yeading in October 2017 from National League South side St Albans City. Impressed in the first half during his debut against AFC Rushden & Diamonds before a cynical trip saw him land awkwardly, damaging his shoulder in the process



Alex Atkinson

19 year-old midfield player who joined Hayes & Yeading on the eve of the current campaign. Played as a schoolboy with both Fulham and Wycombe Wanderers before moving to the Luton Town academy, signing his first professional contract with the Hatters.



Andrew Ofusu

23 year-old striker who joined United on the eve of the current season having previously played in Canada with the Victoria Highlanders in British Columbia. Andrew moved to Canada having been the main striker with Sheffield FC for three seasons.



Stephen Ellery

22 year-old accomplished midfielder who joined Hayes & Yeading in November 2017 making his first appearance in a Middlesex Charity Cup tie at CB Hounslow United where he was named the United 'Man of the Match'. Stephen has had spells at Tottenham Hotspur and Real Mallorca.



Duncan Culley

Experienced goalscorer who joined Hayes & Yeading from National League South side Hampton & Richmond Borough in October 2017. Came to prominance in 2013/14 while at Shortwood United netting 39 times in just 47 appearances.



Ismael Ehui

30 year-old French born striker who rejoined Hayes & Yeading from Chalfont St Peter in the summer of 2017. Started his career at Craven Cottage with Fulham gaining experience out on loan at League One Scunthorpe United and then at Carshalton Athletic where he scored three times in his first two games for the Robins.



Manny Duku

24 year-old Netherlands born striker who joined the club from Southern Premier side Banbury United in the summer of 2017. Was born and played his early football in Holland, most recently with VV Eemdijk and FC Breukelen, until moving to the UK for the start of season 2015/16.

THINK 'Magic of the Cup' for Non-League clubs and it's the FA Cup which naturally springs to mind.

And why wouldn't it? That once-in-a-lifetime opportunity for part-time clubs to pit their wits against professional outfits in front of big crowds and on the big stage. It's what clubs at our level live for.

Sadly, this year's FA Cup campaign proved something of a damp squib for Non-League clubs this year (Hereford, Woking and AFC Fylde aside), so with the Premier League big spenders left to battle it out for honours, our attentions can now turn to another proud national competition with equal prestige at stake.

This week, Step 4 minnows Hartley Wintney, Haringey Borough and Workington are preparing for, arguably, the biggest matches in their history when they play host to full-time National League outfits in the FA Trophy first round proper - just FOUR games away from gracing the biggest stage of them all at Wembley Stadium.

Similar in many respects to its most lucrative bigger brother, the FA Trophy has, for me, been in danger of losing a bit of prestige in the last 10-15 years. Statistics show that with five rounds to play on a Saturday and a two-legged semi-final to play before the final, the Trophy has often played second fiddle for the Conference big guns who have their eyes firmly fixed on the main prize of a place in the Football League.

This, coupled with the fact that many clubs don't include home FA Trophy ties as

part of their season ticket package, has a drastic effect on attendance figures and therefore loses the competition credence when it comes to the business end of the season with crucial league places up for grabs.

Thankfully, however, those days are slowly coming to an end and clubs are beginning to take the FA Trophy seriously again. Just ask Hartley Wintney, Haringey Borough and Workington, who will be staging their own Wembley final next Saturday with the respective visits of Bromley, Leyton Orient and Hartlepool United to their humble abodes.

These three clubs - plus the other 61 in the hat for the first round next Saturday (16) - need only look back to May 21, 2017 when fans of York City and Macclesfield Town joined those of FA Vase finalists South Shields and Cleethorpes Town in a memorable Non-League Finals Day showcase under the arc, watched by a crowd of over 38.000.

For them, that's the magic of the cup, regardless of what competition it's in.

Who are ya?

It may seem like we play the same old teams year after year so we have had a look at FC's very first Southern League season in 2010/11 to see where are they now? Including ourselves, there are just four sides from 2010/11 who have never moved. There are however a further three who have moved and returned. Only three are in a higher league, eight play in a lower league, three play in an equivalent league (Northern Premier or Isthmian) and one has gone bust.

1st Arlesey

Arlesey on the back of a bit of a cash injection were the champions that year winning the title by just a point. A 12-0 win over Atherstone helping them to the title. The Bedfordshire side could not kick on in the Southern Premier and were back in the 1st Divison for season 15/16.

2nd Hitchin

Hitchin were the promoted team beating Slough then Daventry in the play-off final and are now a decent Premier team reaching their own play offs in 16/17.

3rd Daventry

Daventry had a purple patch (literally) around this time reached the FA Cup 1st round proper a couple of times but after a move to the Northern Premier League, the cub imploded with managers and chairpersons resigning and now find themselves in the United Counties league, a division equivalent to Spartan League.

4th Biggleswade Town

Biggleswade are still in the Southern Premier.

5th Slough Town

Took the play off places. Slough have really kicked off. After winning the Division 1 play off in 13/14 in an exciting tie v Kettering, they have moved to a new ground, and are pushing for the Conference South.

6th Rugby Town

A club with good non-league pedigree now find themselves in the regional Midland Football League having lost their place in the Northern Premier League at the end of 16/17

7th Leighton Town

A great favourite of FC fans, the club had flirted with

relegation for many years and finally dropped through the trapdoor at the end of the 15/16. A revival is on the cards with good current form and FA Vase progress showing relegation isn't always bad.

8th Aylesbury FC

FC finished a very respectable 8th in their maiden season at Step 4.

9th Woodford Town

Famous for losing every one of their game in 2012/13, dropping firstly to the United Counties League and now playing truly local football in the Northamptonshire Combination, three divisions below the Southern League 1st

10th Bedfont Town

Unfortunately are no more. The club resigned from the league in 2011/12



Arlesey 2010/11 Champions

11th Marlow

Marlow are another favourite of FC fans and have suffered relegations to the Hellenic League and another shuffle over to the Division 1 West League although they will argue the East Division is their real home.

12th Barton Rovers

We have played Rovers in every one of our seasons and like ourselves have never really hit the heights. A Solitary play-off performance in our own play of year of 14/15 is their best performance

13th Uxbridge

Uxbridge are another side who have been doing the unspectacular with just one play-off appearance to their name in 11/12 and like Barton, they also lost to Bedworth.

14th Burnham

Won the Southern League Division 1 Championship a couple of years later in 2013 but after various managerial appointments including former FC boss Danny Gordon, the club has gone into freefall going from the Southern Premier, To the Southern 1st, then Hellenic Premier and only avoided relegation to the Hellenic East due to another team's resignation

15th Bedworth United

These were always a strong 1st division team, both physical and hard to beat. Two promotions via the Southern League Division 1 play offs and two relegations, one back to the Southern League Division 1 and the most recent, to the Northern Premier League 1st Division South

16th Ashford Town

Continue to ply their trade in the same division after a couple of successful in the Step 5 Counties League.

17th Soham Town Rangers

Was a real trek to the back of beyond. They only played the one season in the Southern League and were transferred to the Isthmian League Division 1 where they have remained ever since.

18th North Greenford United

Were perennial Division 1 strugglers. They received a reprieve despite finishing 21st in 2014/15 but couldn't escape the following year as they finished bottom and were relegated to the Combined Counties League.

19th AFC Hayes

were regular opponents up until the 2014/15 season but again many unspectacular finishes finally saw them relegated out of the Southern League at the end of the 2014/15

20th Northwood

Like Barton, Uxbridge and Beaconsfield are the only sides we have played every year. They flirted with the play offs in 2015/16 but just finished short in 6th place. Otherwise, it has been mid to lower table finishes for the Woods.

21st Atherstone Town

(no, I do not remember them either) were one of several West Midlands teams in the Southern League Central at this time. Atherstone resigned from the league and have played in the Midland Alliance ever since.

22nd Beaconsfield SYCOB

Now renamed Beaconsfield Town. With one team going down that season, Becky were reprieved with Atherstone resigning. The club have really pushed on since then with two play offs reached in 2012 and 2013.

League roundup

Moneyfields ended a run of three successive defeats to re-kindle their promotion hopes in the Evo-Stik League South East after a 2-0 home win over lower mid-table Northwood on Saturday. The longtime leaders, who had dropped to fifth, returned to winning ways after goals from Gary Austin after 31

minutes and Steve Hutchings 12 minutes from time.

The top two weren't in action on Saturday - AFC Rushden & Diamonds' home game being postponed and AFC Dunstable having won on Friday night - but Cambridge City failed to take advantage and are now fifth after losing 1-0 at St Ives to lowly Aylesbury FC.

In a contest that saw a catalogue of chances for both sides, a first half effort from Davide Pobbe on the half-hour mark was enough to separate the two sides to bring the three points back to Buckinghamshire for a third successive away trip.



Dylan Kearney, Uxbridge

Hayes & Yeading United moved up to sixth after a 3-0 home win over Marlow. The only first half goal came from Ismael Ehui after 37 minutes, but Manny Duku added a second for Hayes on 71 minutes and less than 2 minutes later, Scott Donnelly added the third.

Egham Town saw off second-bottom Hanwell Town 1-0 at the Runnymede Stadium, but they had to play for virtually the entire second half with ten-men after striker Marcus Mealing was sent-off following a scuffle. The Sarnies had taken the lead a minute before the break through Jordan Frederick and held on to that, despite being a man light.

Barton Rovers - last season's play-off final losers - are really having a miserable time of it and suffered a 6-1 drubbing at Honeycroft by Uxbridge to leave them third-bottom. Dave Thomas gave the Reds an early 6th minute lead that Dylan Kearney added to 14 minutes later. Kearney added his second and Uxbridge's third just 3 minutes later before Andrew Phillips reduced the deficit 5 minutes later. Kearney completed his hat-trick 11 minutes into the second half and Anthony Thomas on 78 minutes and a second for Daye Thomas 2 minutes from the end took the final score to 6-1.

Bottom side Arlesey Town are six points adrift after losing 3-1 at home to Ashford Town (Middx), who are now tenth. Max Webb gave the Ash Trees an early 6th minute lead that James Cottee doubled 8 minutes later. Kameron English added Ashford's third just before the interval, with Nathan Fowler 'winning' the secand half for the hosts with an 89th minute consolation

DREAMS OF VICTORIA PARK FAFFING ABOUT IN THE NAME OF FOOTBALL

MEET THE MAN BEHIND @NONLGEPROGS

Chris Tuck is a name that may not be immediately familiar to followers of non-league football but mention his Twitter handle – @ NonLgeProgs (Non-League Programmes) – and realisation begins to dawn. Chris recently took time out of his busy schedule of travelling to non-league matches to talk about his rapidly growing Twitter site, his love for all matters programme and non-league and also about some exciting plans he has going forward. So first of all, how did the Twitter account come about?

'It started in May 2017, I had a three-month work break and had lots of things to do including a large list from my wife! One thing I wanted to do myself was catalogue my programmes. I then thought, rather than typing it all out on an excel spreadsheet I 'd take a photo of the cover and add them to a 'Flickr' photo sharing site. But then, I don't know what happened but I thought, 'I know, I'll tweet a photo of a few', and Non-Leaque Programmes was born.'

Initially Chris wasn't sure there'd be much interest. However, he was soon to realise that was not the case at all.

I guess I thought I was the only person on the planet with this strange taste in non-league programmes but I was amazed from the very first post at people's replies and encouragements which made me think that maybe I should keep going! Then people started sending in photos of their programmes and we were off and running!

And has he been surprised at the number of followers the account has?

'It's at around 2.5k at the moment so I have been surprised in some ways, but equally it's a great area of football, of non-league and so I've been encouraged about how many have been interested. Slightly surprised too though!'

So what is it that Chris thinks that people enjoy both about the Twitter feed and non-league programmes in general?

'First of all the covers of programmes can be attractive, particularly if you are into history or graphic design. Mostly though it's the memories they evoke. I love it when someone forwards a tweet to one of the players and says "That's you on the front – you're looking a bit tubby", stuff like that. So it stirs up a bit of banter and memories. People say things like "I was at that game and there was some trouble outside!"- a variety of things. So I think that's often what gets people. I asked on my Twitter feed what people thought about the Non-League Programme account; some one said it's memorable, delightful to see all these different interactions. One called it 'Football eye-candy' to see all these programmes and another, "It's just cracking good football nostalgia" because it's often looking back, although we also look forwards, to programmes coming at the weekend too. A mixture of those things really.'

And what does he feel is so special about the non-league programme as a specific genre?

I think, for me, the fact that they're prepared by volunteers. Premier League programmes, they are prepared by a team of people who have passion I am sure, but when a volunteer has put it together, when a volunteer commercial manager has got some of the adverts and it appears to be a labour of love, I think that's particular to non-league programmes.

Chris is a Southampton supporter, but was born in Barnstaple, and has a very good reason for remembering his first-ever non-league match

I was born in North Devon but my first non-league game would have been watching my dad after we moved to South Devon. He was a Baptist minister but used to play for Salcombe Marines and to me, it was just watching my dad in the park. I think they're known as Salcombe Town these days playing in the South Devon league. But there were no programmes issued there in those days, I'm still trying to source a programme involving Salcombe! He played for a junior team in Southampton too called Spartans and I was thrilled to get a cup final programme they were involved in recently. I then restarted watching non-league in 2009, I went to Stockbridge FC in Hampshire on a Tuesday night with a friend and I guess that kind of rekindled the non-league thing.'

And what rekindled that interest?

One thing was the prices of Premier League games. Non-league football meant for £5 you could get a programme and entry into the game. And sometimes it's stressful watching your own team! It was nice just to go to a game where you don't really mind who wins. I like travel and photography as well, so I love going to new places and grounds, getting a different programme and always a friendly welcome."

Programmes come in all sorts of different varieties depending on the resources of the home club. What is the most unusual programme that he owns?

'Recently it was an A4 piece of paper folded in four, half and half again, into an A6, and I hadn't seen one like that for a while. It was a very low league but it was brilliant to see that they'd done that. It shows that with volunteers you can always do something. It was small, simple but I was still pleased to have one.

'My favourite one is this one from Bridgewater Town v Barnstaple from 1967, it's got a classic 60s cover and my home town team were part of the match. Often my favourite though is the last game I've been to, the one I like to be looking through.

I was always someone who just bought a programme when I went to a game but this recent interest has made me get on ebay a bit more and now the envelopes keep arriving at home! But you can find programmes anywhere – my wife bought me some great programmes from a shop in Keswick when she was there at a convention recently. I'm currently trying to collect all the Hampshire and Southampton Senior Cup final programmes.'

And are there any exciting developments coming up for Non-League Programmes?

'Yes! So many! One thing is, we've made a proposal to sponsor a 'Programme of the Year award'. A collaboration of about 15 @ NonLgeProgs followers are involved. The idea would be that we would help choose the best programmes and contribute some much needed money into a club's coffers. I'm also keen to get young people interested so am putting together some small free bundles of programmes that our followers can give to their kids. I've started the Flickr site now which was the original plan! Excitingly too, we're in talks to supply match day programmes for an international tournament that's going to be in London next year. We've just sponsored a player and hope to link with a charity soon. Finally, we are also looking to provide some help to programme editors – not sure what yet but maybe content or a forum where editors can share things and encourage them in the great job that they do.'

All this from just one man looking to catalogue his programmes! Thank you Chris for taking the time to talk about your Twitter account. I'm sure we are all looking forward to exciting times ahead from @NonLaePross.






