FC halted their losing streak with this hard fought point against Kempston Rovers. The home team will feel slightly disappointed that they were unable to gain all three points but on the balance of play and on chances, then a draw was indeed a fair result.

FC were quick out of the blocks with Ben Stevens seeing his powerful right field shot scrape the top of the bar before going behind for a goal kick. This was followed by a Kieron Schmidt miskick, which fortunately found the head

of Jordan Jenkins who glanced his header wide. FC could have taken the lead on 9 minutes. Shayne Almond had a particularly good game and his delicious pass found Schmidt who beat the keeper but not the onrushing defender who swept the ball from the goal line.

Josh Sturniolo linked well with Ben Shepherd resulting in the midfielder just missing out as keeper Ash Jenkins raced from his goal to cut out the danger. A low shot on the half hour by Jake Newman gave Jenkins a little trouble as the away side started to create a few chances. At the other end, Ty Deacon stabbed a ball goalwards but Rovers' keeper Martin Conway managed

to gather easily enough. The final move of the half was a jinking run by Almond with the keeper finally managing to gather under pressure.

The second half was when the game really came to life. Jenkins won a one on one race with Conway as early as the 46th minute before the away team took the lead. Jamaine Ivy met a cross with a flicked header, which found its way past the despairing Jenkins and into an unguarded net.

A lofted Shayne Almond shot hinted that FC could drag themselves back into the game and this pressure was rewarded as FC grabbed their equaliser on



on 54 minutes. A corner into the danger area saw Kyal McNulty failing to clear thereby giving Jorden Jenkins just enough time and space to prod the ball into the net from just a few yards. Even better was to come as the home team gave the SRD Stadium something to really cheer about with a goal of great perseverance. Ben Stevens found a great deal of space on the right hand side and his surging run and cross found the industrious Almond who had to head home from within the six yard box.

Aston Goss was back to his imperious best and on 67 minutes unleashed a low shot that Conway gathered at the near post. Jeanmal Prosper also played a vital role in

the second half and he broke into the box before seeing his shot deflect away for a corner.

This was really FC's final chance of the game as Rovers clawed themselves back into the game to claim a point. The away team broke the offside trap and in one smooth motion, Sam Johnson controlled the ball and hit a smart shot past Jenkins for his side's equaliser. Jake Newman had a chance to win the game for his side with six minutes remaining as he raced clear with just Ash Jenkins to beat. Ash narrowed the angle and this forced the striker to sweep his shot wide in the final attacking move of the game.

We take a look at our opponents today from Bedfordshire who have also had a tough start to the season.

Barton have had an extremely tough start to the season thus far, sitting just below FC in the table, a stark contrast to last season when they finished 3rd in the table, only losing out on promotion in the play-off final to eventual winners Farnborough. Led by former St Albans legend Jimmy Gray, the Mighty Rovers lost out to a fine Farnborough side on the day.

After Gray stepped down, Mark Boyce stepped into the managers hot seat and despite getting a couple of wins early in the season against Egham Town and Aylesbury United, Barton have now not won a game since beating the ducks on August 26th. That poor run of form saw Boyce step down from the managers post and

in stepped assistant manager Tony Fontanelle to try and help Barton stave off relegation, something unimaginable last season.

Having recently got some hard fought draws against Northwood and Thame United at home they have approved after shipping five goals to Rushden and Diamonds, and then seven against Hartley Wintney.

The last time the two sides met at Haywood Way was in August of last year when the mighty Rovers hammered us 4-1, and then in the return leg the struggling FC side managed to hold on to get a 3-3 draw.

Last time we met

A look back at the last time we met, FC first met Barton last season on a cold tuesday night in October.

As has happened so many times this season the opposition took the lead, a well struck shot was saved by Jenkins but the ball fell loose in the area and in trying to clear, Ben Stevens was adjudged to have brought down a Barton player and Dan Hutchins dispatched the resulting penalty to make it 1-0.

Barton then scored their second which killed the game. An error by Ben Stevens on the left hand side, let in Coughlan and he fired a cross from the by line which Eliot Bailey flicked past Ash Jenkins to double the away sides lead.

Ten minutes into the second half and Aylesbury looked like they might get back into the game. Vinny Greco picked the ball up on the right hand side of the Barton box, twisted and turned the defender, fired in a cross with his right foot and a Barton hand deflected the ball away. James Faulkner stepped up and calmly slotted the ball home.

Then out of the blue on seventy minutes Barton's Keating fired in a shot which Jenkins saved well, parrying the ball onto the cross bar but the ball fell to Jason Blackett who fired home for a 3-1 lead. The Aylesbury heads then went down and two minutes later Orlando-Young fired home past Jenkins. **FULL**

League roundup

Moneyfields show no signs of slowing up in their quest for back-to-back promotions as their 3-1 home win over second-bottom Hanwell Town saw them maintain their four-point lead at the top of the Evo-Stik League South East table on Saturday.

Moneys led through Steve Hutchings' successful 35th minute penalty conversion at the break. Joe Briggs eventually doubled their lead after 68 minutes and Hutchings' second made the points safe on 84 minutes, with Oliver Duffy netting a consolation for Hanwell 3 minutes later.

Cambridge City remain in second after beating fellow top six contenders, Hartley Wintney on their own patch. Tom Knowles put City ahead after 23 minutes, but Rowan Vine pulled the hosts back on level terms just before the break.

Ryan Sharman's second for City 9 minutes into the second period eventually proved to be enough.

AFC Rushden & Diamonds are looking menacing in third, just a point behind City, after recording an ultimately comfortable 4-0 Hayden Road win over mid-table Northwood. It was ultimately comfortable because Woods held Diamonds to 0-0 at the break in front of 451, but once Richard Bunting opened the scoring in the 57th minute, there was no stopping the hosts. Ben Farrell added a second 10 minutes later, Sam Brown the third 5 minutes after that and Ben Diamond made it 4-0 with 8 minutes remaining.

Hayes & Yeading United are also looking dangerous now in fourth after winning by the same scoreline at home to Aylesbury United. Duncan Culley's early 8th minute penalty gave Hayes the lead and Manny Duku added number two in the 32nd minute. Culley's second of the game made the points safe on 65 minutes, with Scott Donnelly making it 4-0 in the 74th minute.

AFC Dunstable are fifth – a point behind Hayes, who have played a game less. AFC hammered mid-table Egham Town 6-1 at Creasey Park, although it was 1-1 at half-time after AFC's Jermaine Hall and a Brett Longdon own goal. But Terry Griffiths with a brace – the second from the spot – Nathan Frater, BJ Christie and Louis Bircham killed off the Sarnies in the second period.

Beaconsfield Town are now level on points with Hartley Wintney in seventh after a 2-1 win at bottom side Arlesey Town. The struggling hosts made a scrap of it though, equalising through Rafe Goodman in the 78th minute after falling behind to a 55th minute Scott Cousins effort. But Goldy Capela popped up to break Arlesey's resolve with a winner in the first minute of stoppage time.

Barton Rovers are third-bottom after losing 1-0 at Calthorpe Park to Fleet Town, who moved above them, courtesy of Patrik Ruzicka's 65th minute goal.

Chalfont St Peter were 2-0 home winners over Ashford Town (Middx), thanks to Ben Ward-Cochrane after 25 minutes and George Beattie on 57 minutes, while boss Mark West's son Dan again scored the goal that earned Thame United victory at home to Uxbridge.

Marlow produced a remarkable recovery at Oak Tree Road to salvage a point against Bedford Town. The hosts trailed to goals from Jemale McKenzie-Lowe after 10 minutes and Bradley Woods-Garness' penalty 8 minutes into the second half. Jordan Brown pulled one back with 8 minutes remaining, and then Jahson Downes equalised 2 minutes into time added on at the end of the game.

It also finished 2-2 between Aylesbury FC and Kempston Rovers, whose Jermaine Ivy broke the deadlock 5 minutes into the second half. But two goals in 2 minutes shortly afterwards from Jordan Jenkins and Shayne Almond took the Moles in front before Sam Johnson levelled for the Walnut Boys 12 minutes from time.

It's that time of the year when Donald Trump's chief foe – the mainstream media – starts taking notice of the semi-pro world.

As November opens its chilly, unwelcoming arms, Non-League clubs reluctantly begin to hand the FA Cup baton over to the lower feeders of the Football League who themselves, in a couple of months' time, will similarly largely surrender the competition to the game's top two strata.

Almost certainly, a couple of tigerish Non-League outfits will doggedly cling onto hopes of FA Cup glory for as long as they can – obviously that was quite a long time in the extraordinary cases of Lincoln and Sutton last season. And fair play to them for that. But as the national media reach for the thesaurus to find new ways of saying 'plucky outsiders', most of the Non-League world fixes their collective gaze on other, more meaningful knockout competitions.

Yes, there's both the Vase and the Trophy which, combining for the third year in

a joint finals day at Wembley, continue to enthusiastically fly the flag for our beloved part-timers. But I'm here to salute and praise the innumerable local cup competitions that get into gear right around the time that the changing of the clocks plunges us into premature darkness.

Our initial despair at that lessening daylight is gratefully neutralised by the steady stream of Tuesday night football that will see us through winter until at least spring, when the first green shoots begin to emerge through frostbitten ground.

The names of these competitions are gloriously prosaic and provincial. There are those that are merely geographically functional, that do what they say on the tin – the likes of the Middlesex Senior Cup or the Surrey County Cup. There are those with leftfield sponsors (see here the Esoteric Records Division One Challenge Cup) or those whose name commemorates a dedicated servant of the game from yesteryear (Peter Bentley down in Sussex, or the enigmatic E Armstrong in England's most northerly counties). Or there are those who just sound exciting. My

new favourite of these is the laden-with-potential Velocity Cup.

What these cup competitions provide is a reason to slip on the boots midweek for players whose clubs are stuck in the quagmire of mid-table obscurity. Even in early November, their league destiny is already determined. Competent enough to avoid the drop but insufficiently sharp to be challenging for promotion, these teams are becalmed by mid-season with very little to play for. So, with no chance of a sniff of glory in either the Trophy or the Vase, these local midweek cup competitions take on a significance that's above and beyond their weight.

While performances in the league might drift into a succession of low-scoring draws that don't remotely alter their position in the table, the thrill of the cup – however prosaic and provincial its name – offers the drama that's otherwise lacking. And, of course, for the punters there's the chance of an extra 30 minutes of action (plus penalties!) should there be a stalemate at the final whistle.

Why it's worth watching Hyde United in the FA Cup

It's only ten miles from Ewen Fields to Old Trafford. But the differences between the football clubs that play at these two venues are better measured in astronomical units. Hyde United play in the eighth tier of English football, the Northern Premier League, which is sponsored by Evo-Stik. The United of Manchester do not.

But don't think, even for a second, that the differences between the two clubs mean that Hyde have no acquaintance with glory. They are due to play MK Dons in the first round proper of the FA Cup. The Dons may not be everybody's idea of languid, decadent aristocrats, but they play in League One (the third tier) and will make the trip to Ewen Fields wary of the underdog that bites. There's always one upset – at least – in every one of the early rounds.

Hyde will not win the FA Cup.
They may not win the Evo-Stik

North: they're a little better than midtable. So why support them? Why support any non-league side? Why not support MK Dons or Manchester United?

It's a question that sends me whirling backwards through space and time in a footbaling Tardis to the days when I covered non-league football for local papers: Redhill FC for the Surrey Mirror, or Tooting and Mitcham for Balham and Tooting News. The bite of a frosty afternoon, the ragged cheers of 100 supporters, the hogo of embrocation belching from the dressing rooms, and then the entrance of the 11 players of the home side: as hopeful and fearful as any that ever stepped on to a football pitch.

It's like that at Hyde, it's like that everywhere. Football doesn't require vast crowds and sick-making sums of money. If you don't go you won't understand, but everywhere the struggle continues, your lot against ours.

At a small club you matter. You can walk to the ground; you can get a nice drink afterwards; you can talk to the players. "Nice goal, Ron." "Cheers." You know people – hell, you know everyone. You belong. Miss a match and they'll ask if anything's wrong. You win and you lose and that's great, and you grumble about the players and the manager, and every now and then it's your day and you put three past your local rivals and God's in his heaven, all's

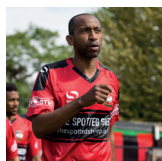
right with the world. Until next week. That's life, that's football.

And every year there's that teaser called the FA Cup. Managers mutter that it's a distraction from the serious business of the league. Chairmen talk about the money to be made from a glamour tie: "Win this one for me, boys, and I'll spend all the money on players."

The supporters understand, though. So do the players. You have an FA Cup tie against the big boys and win, lose or draw, it's like swapping a pint of lager for a glass and a half of champagne. Just how good are we? If we all play our best, and Jim puts himself about a bit, and Ron gets on the end of one... there's no telling what might happen, for no sport pampers an underdog like football.

"You won't be here next week when we've got Throstlethwaite Albion in the league!" Someone always says when you're a reporter at one of these ties. No, I won't – that's more or less your private business and you wouldn't have it any other way. But the FA Cup is something shared: when a club no one has heard of might topple the mighty, and the underdog has a faint but genuine chance of finishing as Best of Breed.
