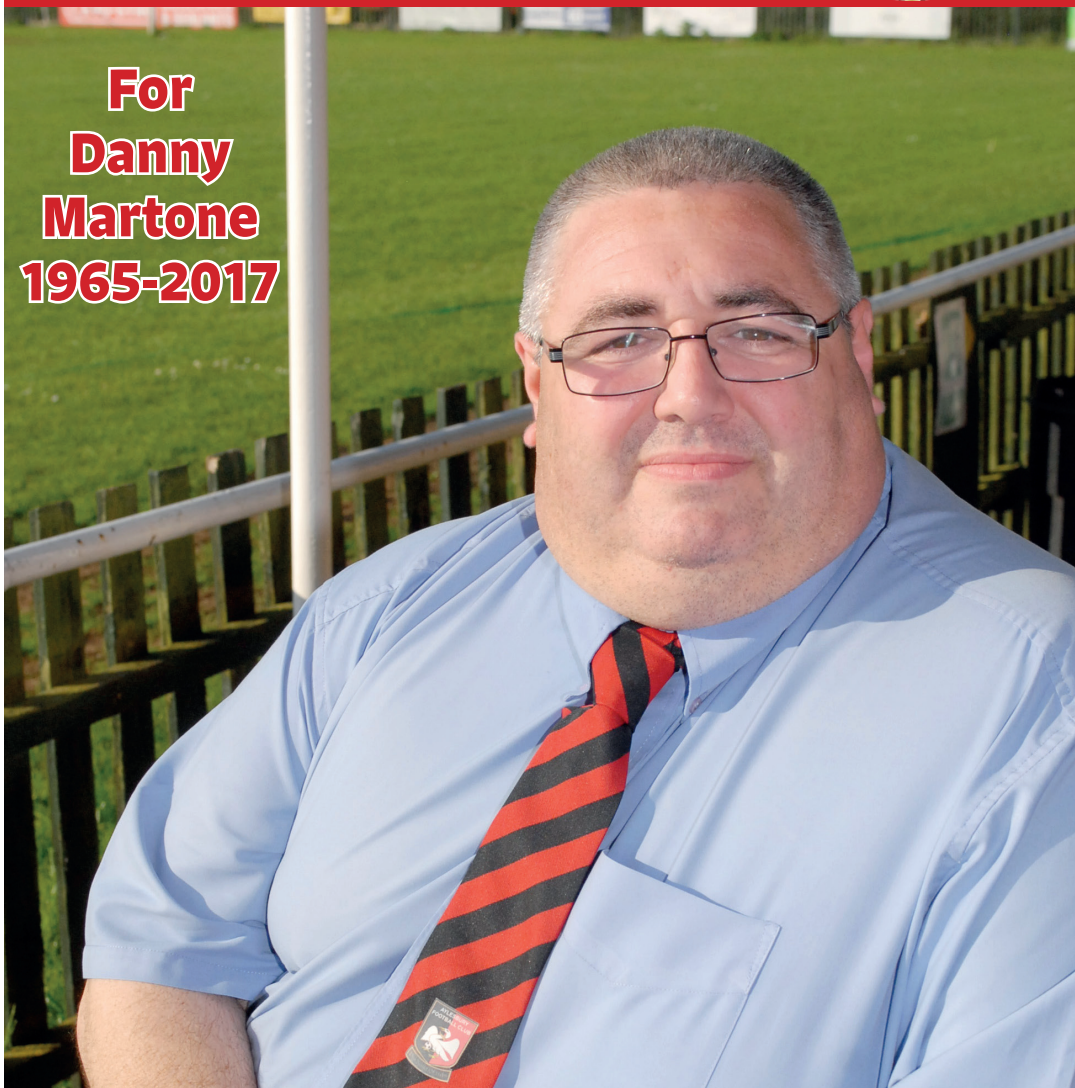

AYLESBURY FOOTBALL CLUB GROUND REGULATIONS

1). All persons entering the ground are subject to the Rules and Regulations of the Football Association and Aylesbury Football Club.

2). The Club reserves the right to eject or prosecute any person(s) who within the club premises is considered by the management of the Club and to be or have been behaving in the following ways;

- a - entering the field of play before or during the game
- b - using obscene, abusive or racist language
- c - being intoxicated by drinks or drugs

Further, persons will not be allowed entry to Aylesbury Football Club if in the opinion of the gate-men, stewards or any member of the management committee if they are deemed to be intoxicated.

3). NO bottles or metal cans, glasses or weapons of any kind are allowed in the ground. The stewards have the right to search a spectator if they have grounds to believe that the person is in possession of any item that is deemed to be a danger to other spectators.

4). Alcohol must only be consumed within the confines of the Aylesbury FC Clubhouse/Bar - NO GLASSES may be taken out of the bar. Should you wish to consume alcohol in the stand, please ask the bar staff for a plastic glass. PLEASE NOTE - that for FA Cup and FA Trophy fixtures, NO alcohol may be purchased or consumed within sight of the pitch.

5). The climbing of fences or floodlight pylons and all buildings within the ground is strictly forbidden.

6). All vehicles parked within the boundaries of the Aylesbury FC Car Park must be parked within a designated place. No responsibility is accepted for any mishap that may happen in the car park or for any goods that may be left in vehicles in the car park. ALL VEHICLES ARE PARKED AT THE OWNERS' RISK.

Danny Martone

Mr Aylesbury FC

1965-2017



The Club was sad to announce that former Chairman and 'Mr Aylesbury FC' Danny Martone passed away on May 4th 2017.

Many of you will know of his recent struggle against illness and Danny was admitted to the John Radcliffe Hospital where he passed away with his family by his bedside.

Danny was the face of Aylesbury FC, without him the club would not exist. With his larger than life personality he could never be ignored. Players and officials alike would be told of their faults when they entered the boardroom, but always with good humour and grace, followed by tales of his playing career.

Danny has been involved in football all of his life, playing in goal as a scholar for Oxford United and eventually after a number of injuries curtailed any thoughts of a professional career,

in the green and white of Aylesbury United's reserve side in the late 70s and early 80s.

Danny became involved with the club at the start of the 2000/2001 season when the senior Belgrave FC team was renamed Haywood United following an amalgamation with Stocklake FC, with Danny being voted in as Chairman of the new club.

Haywood United joined the Spartan South Midlands League and won promotion into Division One after two seasons. Notable achievements during the 2001/2002 season included league awards for the best kept and most improved ground; this included the erection of floodlights and perimeter fencing, which Danny and his hard working committee fought hard to establish.

The club gained another award for the match day programme in recognition of how much it was developing under Danny's stewardship.

Haywood United became Aylesbury Vale FC in 2006 as Danny moved forward in his ambition to see the club represent the town and to bring on good local players to play for the side. May 2009 saw a major development in a new semi professional side as Aylesbury Football Club was formed. Great success was to follow, masterminded by Danny, with the team having a fantastic run in the FA Cup, finally being knocked out of the competition by Wealdstone in a close game. A brave and superb display was witnessed by a bumper crowd of 800 plus.

In 2015 the club won its first major trophy, beating Chesham United in the Berks and Bucks Cup Final, something Danny was so proud of.

Aylesbury Football Club prides itself on clear ambitions that were founded and driven by Danny, to progress to higher league football and to achieve higher league status with squads from local talent. The club hopes to continue the work started by the former Chairman with other local community groups and enhance the clubs facilities to benefit the people within Aylesbury.

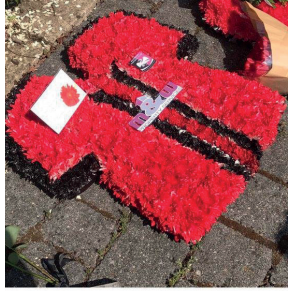
The thoughts of everyone at the club are with his family at this time, Danny will be missed by everybody.

Friends and family celebrated the life of our former chairman a week later as his funeral was held at Milton Keynes crematorium, after the man known as 'Mr. Aylesbury FC' passed away a few weeks ago.

It was packed, over 250 people in red and black, there were ex players, ex managers, chairman of other clubs as well as friends & family. Followed by a celebration at Haywood Way and again the club was busy till closing time.

Mourners attending the service and celebration planned afterwards at Haywood Way from 12.30pm were invited to attend both events in the club's colours on Friday in a statement announcing the funeral arrangements.

Fans of the EVO-STIK League Southern Division One Central's Moles and many other people from throughout the game who knew 'Mr Aylesbury' have flooded social media with tributes since his sad passing at the John Radcliffe Hospital.

Cambridge City

It's been a summer of transition for Cambridge City after relegation from the Southern Premier League last season, with a number of players departing the club.

FC face relegated opposition from the Southern Premier league for the second game in a row, with the visit of the Lilywhites. Cambridge City enter Step four football after a heartbreaking end to last season, as they were relegated on the last day despite winning their game, their 5th win in 6 games that had seen them take a possible 16 points from 18 and not concede in the process.

However Kings Langley's 1-0 win against Cirencester meant Cambridge were only relegated by goal difference.

After a temultous start to

the season with new manager Dan Gleeson, who had taken over from long serving manager Gary Roberts, results had not gone the Lilywhites way and Gleeson left the club after an away defeat at Biggleswade Town, their 15th league game without a victory.

However the appointment of Robbie Nightingale soon after was not enough to help Cambridge stay up.

The Lilywhites come into this season after having to rebuild much of the squad wfrom last season. They have been bolstered by the re-signing of Ben Robinson

who played regularly in defense last season, and a number of youthful signings.

After an opening day home 2-1 defeat to Ashford Town however, Cambridge will be aiming to get their first points on the board tonight to kick start their campaign.

Cambridge will be looking to go straight back up into step 3 again this season and with a number of signings arriving at the club, many will be keeping an eye on Cambridge throughout the season as they look to tackle life in the Evo-Stik South East.

CLUB HISTORY

Early years

The club was formed in 1908 as Cambridge Town, the direct descendant of the earlier Cambridge St Mary's club which had folded at the end of the 1907-1908 season following a dispute with the local Cambs FA.

Cambridge Town amalgamated with an earlier Cambridge United club in May 1914, joined the Cambs FA for the first time and in turn gained entry into the FA Cup and the FA Amateur Cup for the first time, whilst retaining their AFA links. The club's best ever run in the Amateur Cup came in 1928 when they reached the semi Final only to lose to Leyton at Fulham's Craven Cottage ground. The club moved to the Town Ground in Milton Road in April 1922.

A rivalry developed with Ipswich Town during the late 1920's and mid 1930. Huge crowds attended these games at Milton Road, peaking at 11,916 in 1929. Both clubs' success in the Southern Amateur League prompted invitations to join the newly formed semi-professional Eastern Counties League in 1935. Ipswich accepted, but the Cambridge Committee declined on account of their commitment to amateur football, so the two Towns went their separate ways. Within three years Ipswich had been elected to the Football League leaving Cambridge fans wondering what might have been!

City finally left the amateur game in 1958 and joined the Southern League, gaining a place in the Premier Division of the Southern League ahead of local rivals Cambridge United in their first season.

Aylesbury FC vs Cambridge City

City won the Premier Division in 1962/63, edging out United in an enthralling title race with the local derby at Milton Road being witnessed by over 11,500 people. Nevertheless, City were regular challengers for the title and had the highest attendances in non-league football up until the mid-1960s. But City lost their way and were relegated to Southern League Division 1 in 1967/68. Promotion back to the Premier Division followed in 1969/70, but this was the same season Cambridge United were elected to the Football League.

City finished Southern League runners up in 1970/71, but the latter years of the decade were dreadful. Relegation in 1975/76 saw crowds dwindle and the Club fall into decline. In 1977, Directors decided to return the Club to amateur status by joining the Isthmian League but, in scenes that would be repeated 30 years later, subsequent fans' protests forced most of the Board to resign.

Better times

After the redevelopment of the ground in the mid 1980's, City gradually improved and a new generation of fans mobbed their heroes after the 1985/86 Southern League Southern Division championship was won on the last day of the season.

Recent seasons have been a roller-coaster ride for the City faithful. City's best season for 30 years saw them finish runners up in the inaugural Conference South season in 2004/05, going on to lose in the play-offs. Off the field the ground had been sold to pay off mounting debts and matters took a turn for the worse in 2006 when the then Board announced an agreement to allow City to be absorbed into Cambridge United. With City on the brink of extinction, supporters were galvanised into a campaign which eventually forced Directors to resign, to be replaced by members of the Cambridge City Supporters' Trust.

New era

A new era for the club commenced in August 2013 with a temporary base at Histon FC. City once again reached the play-offs last season but once again tasted semi final defeat, this time at home to St Albans City. After two seasons at Histon, City played their home games at St Ives Town FC for season 2015-16 and are doing so for season 2016-17. Last season proved to be the most difficult season since the 70s. The wettest winter in memory and cup commitments of other clubs lead to 28 fixture rearrangements and our season being extended to fit in the away game to Stratford which was postponed on the penultimate Saturday of the season. The difficulties continued during last summer when all senior players departed.

Followed by the shock resignation of long serving manager Gary Roberts on June 30th, Dan Gleeson was appointed as manager on July 12th, with no players registered but the ever loyal Neil Midgley continuing as assistant manager/coach. Dan's reign ended in late November with the club staring relegation in the face. Robbie Nightingale was appointed as new manager and he retained Neil Midgley and brought Dave Theobald with him as coach.

THE MANAGER

Robbie Nightingale took over as manager from Dan Gleeson in December 2016. Robbie was a City supporter as a boy and joined The Lilywhites at the age of 15 and was leading scorer and captain in their then successful youth team. He earned himself a contract and made his mark as a midfielder. He crossed the A14 to join Histon aged 22 and won the Southern League and Nationwide South championship medals with them.

The last time we met

The moles and Lilywhites have met once before, in the first round of the Red Insure Cup several years ago. FC came back from 2-0 down to win 3-2 against the Southern Premier side on a tuesday night, in front of a crowd of 62.

Craig Hammond opened the scoring for City on the 21st minute, with **James Brighton** doubling the lead in the 35th minute to make it 2-0 at half time.

FC made some changes at half time which paid off as **Jonathan Constant** pulled one back.

After a melee in the box, **Kurt Morlese** levelled for FC. In the 88th minute an unlikely victory was secured for FC as **Jamie Connor** slotted the ball home.



WHO'S WHO

Who are the men from Cambridge City to watch out for this afternoon? We take a look here.

Niall Conroy

Niall made his name locally with Godmanchester Rovers and then joined Histon in the summer of 2016. Things didn't go so well there so he moved over to Soham Town Rovers, then managed by the current City manager. Niall is a goalkeeper.

Mark Coulson

Mark is a former Peterborough United leftback. Since then he has had lengthy spells with Hemel Hempstead Town and Bury Town and last season with St Ives Town.

Ben Robinson

Ben is a full-back who likes to get forward. A former City Youth and Reserve Team player, he moved on to Haverhill Rovers where he caught the eye of Sudbury Town, where he earned the Manager's Player of the Year award last season. Returned to The Lilywhites in October 2016.

Ross Paterson

Ross was a star in the all conquering Fulbourn Institute team a few years ago before moving on to Newmarket Town and making a name for himself there as an all action midfielder. He made the step up from Soham Town Rangers to City in December 2016 and was soon made captain of the team.

Michael King

Michael is a midfielder or striker and has Football League experience with Colchester United and Northampton Town. He has recently played for Hitchin Town twice, sandwiching a spell with City. He also had a season with Biggleswade Town.

Jordan Gent

Jordan is a product of St Neots Town's youth setup from where he progressed to the first team and played his part in their back to back promotions into the Southern League Premier Division. He is a commanding centrehalf and joined City in December 2016 and quickly made an impression.



Ian Miller

Ian is a centre half who started life in non league with Bury Town before signing for Ipswich Town. Then after spells with Darlington and Grimsby Town he joined Cambridge United where, as skipper, he helped them to promotion in to The Football League and FA Trophy glory at Wembley.



Adam Capel

Adam learnt his centre half trade in Cambridge United's Academy. He had a brief spell at Histon last season. He is expected to have a bright future at City.



James Tee

James is a product of City's youth setup and plays at leftback. City boss Robbie nightingale believes James has a great future ahead of him.



Harry Farow

Harry is another product of our youth setup and plays centre midfield. He first tasted 1st team football last season when he came on as sub in our Cambs Invitation Cup semifinal and scored.



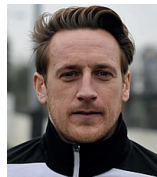
Harry Norman

Harry is a product of Southend United's Academy and generally plays centre midfield. He first joined City in March 2016 on loan and then signed non contract for the 2016-17 season.



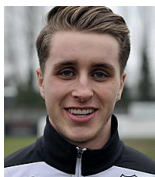
Buster Harradine

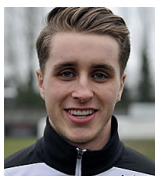
Ollie Snaith

After a testing pre-season with some pleasing results, today the Moles kicked off the 2017/18 season with a trip to the SkyEx Community Stadium to take on a Hayes and Yeading side which had suffered relegation from the Southern Premier last year, their third relegation in five years. There was an air of scepticism amongst the travelling FC supporters going into this curtain raiser. However, the new look FC team started the better of the two sides, seeing good spells of early pressure, territory and possession, however, Hayes and Yeading weren't giving FC an inch, defending well to cut out the killer balls that would unlock the red wall.

Hayes began to find their way into the game midway through the first half, with the first shot of note falling to Manny Duku on 17 minutes, whose goal-bound effort was blocked superbly by Jordan Jenkins. This was a shock to the FC system, who had controlled the game prior to this, and on 30 minutes the attacking impetus was back with the Moles. Aston Goss stole the ball deep in midfield, beat a few defenders with his tricky feet, before drilling a low shot at the Hayes stopper Jack Smith.

The best chance of the half fell to Ty Deacon who was fed through by Jeanmal Prosper following a poor clearance from Smith in the Hayes net, however, he atoned for his error, by saving Deacon's low, powerful shot. Deacon was then booked for an alleged elbow on the stroke of half time. The game lacked any real tempo, and the nil-nil score line reflected this.



The second half saw the game kick into life. Hayes and Yeading took the lead on 52 minutes after Derek Feyi mistimed his clearance, slicing it to Danny Blanchett who was waiting at the back post who cushioned a header down to Ismael Ehui who coolly tapped home from a yardout, sending the home fans into raptures.

However, the lead was short lived. On 56 minutes, a corner whipped in by Aston Goss was poorly cleared, the ball fell to the 'FC engine room' Jonny Montgomery, who delivered a sublime ball into the unmarked Jeanmal Prosper who chested down and smashed home past a stranded Jack Smith. Game on. The Moles had their tails up at this point, however, rarely tested the Hayes goalkeeper. The best chance of this period fell to Kieron Schmidt after another corner from Aston Goss, however his shot ballooned over the crossbar.

Hayes grew back into the game and had the ball in the FC net not

once but twice, however, both times Manny Duku had unfairly challenged James Weatherhill in the FC goal – who other than picking the ball out of the net had a relatively quiet day.

The final chance of the game came on 87 minutes, where some good defensive work from Montgomery saw FC regain possession, and counter attack with Prosper, who looked to be through on goal, but an unfortunate slip saw Hayes regain their shape and Prosper's rushed, curling shot was agonisingly wide. The game finished honours even. A point on the board for the Moles, and a solid performance which Davis Haule and his squad can build upon for Tuesday's home fixture versus Cambridge City.

MOTM: Jonny Montgomery – protected the FC back four all afternoon and picked up a superb assist.

My mental health issues have been something I have hidden away all my life. I hid it from other people but also myself. Now, however, I could not be any different. I am blogging about my mental health every week. Talking to people, having interviews with local media and of course holding this charity event.

I have chosen to talk about these issues a lot more openly for a few reasons. 1, Why should I hide away anymore? I am poorly but I didn't ask to be. It's not my fault. If I had a broken leg or had a heart attack no one would expect me to lie and hide it. Why should mental health be any different? 2, I have suffered a huge amount. To be honest still do at times and I do not want people to suffer as I have. I want people to be able to open up and not be judged. I want people to be able to access care with out feeling ashamed.

I chose to hold this event for Mind as I found them to be so helpful when I was at my worst. Not only the help they provided over the phone when I was let down by the NHS but also by the fantastic resources they have online. I printed so many of the booklets off and gave them to family to read so that they got a better understanding of my different diagnosis'. It really helped me and I know it has and continues to help others suffering.

I have wanted to hold a charity event or be a part of one for sometime but I had to wait until I was well enough. Physically and mentally. And Saturday



was the day! I chose a charity football match as my husband plays semi professionally and I knew he could help me with that side of things if I needed it. Oh and boy did I!

Majority of the planning was ok. I managed fine. It took a lot of hard work – a lot more than I ever anticipated – but I was enjoying it.

However, there were times that I found things really difficult. I felt like I was going to cancel it and forget it all. I struggled with my stress, anxiety and had a few periods of feeling very low. However, like I mentioned my amazing husband was my rock. He really kept me going. He kept reminding why I was doing this and even took over some responsibilities at difficult times. How lucky am I?

I was also absolutely petrified that it would be a complete flop! No one would turn up. It was going to be a complete failure! I was convinced of this! It was causing me weeks of sleepless nights, mood swings and severe anxiety. It was hard. But unfortunately that is the nature of mental illness. It attacks you when you are at most vulnerable and makes you believe those negative thoughts.

The day itself began in a pretty stressful way. I had a panic attack in the morning and was 100% convinced

I was not going to attend the event. I was telling my husband that he needs to do this alone or cancel it. I couldn't do it. Luckily I calmed down with his help and got my focus back and the event went ahead.

I am very blessed to have such amazing friends and family that helped on the day. Setting up, running stalls, face painting and more. All to help me not get overwhelmed and raise money for a very important cause. I did have moments where I began to feel like things were getting too much but I listened to my mind and body and took those times out to walk around and take it all in slowly. This was very important to me.

The charity event really was a success. We raised a total of **£1410!** Not bad for 4 hours work. Thank you to everyone who came down!

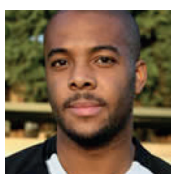
