After the Moles' mid-week exploits in the B&B Cup (the less said about that the better), the last place you'd want to go was free scoring, table toppers Moneyfields. A few hardy souls travelled down to the Portsmouth coast with relatively low expectations, however, an almost full-strength team featuring the likes of Brian Haule as the lone striker and Ben Stevens back to bolster the defence gave travelling supporters hope.

However, we seem to have started where we left off on Tuesday night, as after just four minutes the home side took the lead. Ben Stevens' clearance looked to be straight forward, but was scuffed away only to Steve Hutchins who delivered a killer ball to the back post where Dan Wooden was lurking to tap home for one-nil.

This early setback shook the Aylesbury players into life, and just a minute later



the Moles could quite easily have been level, Aston Goss used his speed and skill to beat his man on the right flank and crossed a front post ball into Jeanmal Prosper who headed just over the bar.

The Moles continued to pile on the pressure, and soon struck a deserved equaliser courtesy of Ty Deacon. Aston Goss delivered a dangerous corner, the Moneyfields goalkeeper Stephen Mowthorpe did very well to punch away under pressure from big man Brian Haule, but he could only

clear as far as Ben Stevens whose goal bound header was helped on its way by Ty Deacon. All square.

The away side continued to press and looked goal hungry, Harry Scott's speculative effort from 25 yards mid-way through the half drifted just over the bar as he looked to lob the keeper. The Monies always looked a massive threat on the counter though, and on the stroke of half time a long ball caught the Moles' defensive line out, Jordan Jenkins coming to the rescue with an acrobatic

goal line clearance from a Steve Hutchins header to maintain parity at the break.

The goal added a fiery dimension into the game, with Moneyfields players becoming somewhat frustrated, with their unbeaten record at risk. On 58 minutes, the home side had a great opportunity to equalise, Joseph Briggs burst into the FC box but blazed wide. This was somewhat of a warning as to the barrage to come.

On 66 minutes, the equaliser arrived. The FC's defences' Achilles Heel – defending set pieces; a deep free kick was delivered to the back post, where Steve Hutchings was all alone to head home past the sprawling Ash Jenkins. Just minutes later the Moneyfields goal scorer saw the red mist, and in turn brandished a red card, an unnecessary high foot in midfield meant a second yellow for Steve Hutchings. With 20 minutes to play surely at least a point was secured?

Unbelievably, the dismissal gave the hosts a new lease of life, and an onslaught was about to commence. Following an Aylesbury attack which led to a rather tame shot from striker Brian Haule, Moneyfields quickly look to break, the ball found its way to the hosts' top scorer Ryan Pennery who weaved his way through the FC defence, and chipped the ball over the onrushing Ash Jenkins to give the hosts the lead. On 83 minutes, a goal of the same ilk as Prosper's early in the half arrived, an unbelievable strike from Dan Wooden



could only be tipped onto the post by Ash Jenkins, the ball then crashed against the opposite post before finding the back of the net.

At two goals down, Davis Haule opted for a back three, which meant more space for the Monies to exploit on the counter, Dan Wooden again finding himself with acres of pitch around him, his low shot parried away well by Ash Jenkins, but Marley Ridge was on hand to mop up the rebound.

To add insult to injury, the final nail in the coffin was struck late on in injury time, substitute Kerran Lataille had been on the pitch for barely 5 minutes when he delivered a rash two-footed challenge, the referee with no choice but to show a straight red.

Our opponents in the Evo-Stik South East are Hartley Wintney who have so far settled comfortably to life at Step 4 after promotion.

The Row have taken to Step 4 football well after promotion last season from the Combined Counties League Premier Division. After winning the league the year before that as well and unable to take promotion, due to The Memorial Playing Fields not being up to the ground grading regulations for Step 4 football, Hartley Wintney have this year stepped into the Southern League, and boy have they enjoyed it so far.

Anthony Millerick and Dan Brownlie together have led Hartley Wintney to promotion to the Southern League, and with such a tiny population in the small village and the resources available, they look to push on for promotion to the Southern Premier League.

The Moles will be pleased by the news that The Rows top striker Sam Argent left the club a few weeks ago to play for Basingstoke

Town in the Southern Premier League. Argent was one of the top scorers in the league this season, and the absence of the prolific goalscorer is an undoubted boost for FC today.

Hartley Wintney also made more history a couple of weeks ago making their first appearance in the FA Trophy defeating Slimbridge 1-0 to go into the 1st qualifying round.

Sitting currently in second spot behind Moneyfields, the early predictions are looking at a title race between the two newly promoted sides if they can both keep up the momentum, and FC will be looking to pull off a surprise today against this strong side.

The Row have drawn their last two games against Chalfont St Peter and Bedford Town and will be looking to get back to winning ways.

Club History

Hartley Wintney Football Club was founded in the North Hampshire village of Hartley Wintney in 1897 and played in an area adjacent to the village's golf and cricket clubs, the facilities not quite being up to today's standard, with only a horse trough or the pond to remove the heavy mud from a sub-standard pitch. The Club's nickname of 'The Row' comes from 'Hartley Row', a former hamlet within Hartley Wintney. In 1953, the club moved to its present ground in Green Lane, known as 'The Memorial Ground'. A pavilion was erected and the team played in the Basingstoke League and, later, in the Aldershot League.

In 1973, an influx of players under new manager Glynn Howell put the club firmly on the local football map. In his six year reign, the team won the Aldershot Senior League three times in succession, and the Aldershot Senior Cup.

After several seasons in the Aldershot Senior League, Hartley were admitted to the Combined Counties League (previously Surrey Senior League). After the first couple of seasons and two changes of management, the club appointed Ian Bedford, and once again an influx of senior players brought Hartley success. Within his three years in management, they gained trophies including the League Title (1982-1983) and Runners Up (1981-1982), Aldershot Senior Cup Winners (1980-1981), and George Allen Cup Winners (1981-1982). They were also Runners Up in the League Cup (1982-1983) and Aldershot Senior Cup (1981-1982).

The club gained promotion from Division One of the Combined Counties League in 2007-08 under manager Mike Scott, but 08-09 began poorly and, despite a change of management, the season ended in relegation by a narrow margin. Under the management team of Pete Gray and John Condon, the first team rallied in 09-10, finishing 5th in CCL Div 1, and 7th in season 10-11 under manager Louis King after Pete Gray had stepped down for family reasons.

The 2011-12 season under manager

Neville Roach, Assistant Mick Wollen and Coach Scott Tarr was a notable one for the club as they again achieved promotion to the Combined Counties League Premier Division, as well as having a fine FA Cup run that took them to the Third Qualifying Round. However, end-of-season celebrations were dampened when the coaching staff left to join Thatcham Town. The entire squad bar two players departed, so new manager Dave Tuttle was faced with the task of rebuilding a squad competitive enough for the CCL Premier. A string of poor results led to a second change in management in less than 4 months, with 24 year-old ex-Hartley player, Ben Dillon, given his first managerial position already deep into the 2012-13 season.

Once again there was an almost total outflow of players from Tuttle's squad, and Ben, with assistants Jason Minton and Joe Lawler, set about rebuilding the squad, but by this time with Hartley set well adrift at the bottom of the table. The introduction of a talented group of players restored the spirit around the club, and in what became known as the club's 'Great Escape' season, Hartley Wintney's place in the CCL Premier was secured against all the odds after a truly remarkable second half of the season.

Ben further strengthened the squad for 2013-14, with Steve Saunders and player/coach Dan Brownlie brought in to the coaching setup alongside Jason and Joe. The season started well and there were notable wins in the FA Cup on a run that took the club to the 4th Qualifying Round for the first time in its history. The cup run took its toll on league form but the club finished a creditable 7th in the Premier Division.

After a comfortable 9th place finish in 2014-15, Ben Dillon stepped down and Dan Brownlie and Anthony Millerick were appointed Joint First Team Managers, alongside coaches Joe Lawler and Luke Tufts. With strong additions to the playing squad, it was an eventful 2015-16 season. After a memorable 1-0 win away at Southern League Merthyr Town in the 2nd Qualifying Round of the FA Cup,

Hartley took Conference South Eastbourne Borough to the wire, losing out to an injury time winner. In the FA Vase, a longstanding club record was broken by reaching the 5th Round Proper played in front of a sell-out 1,300 at Green Lane against the eventual finalists, Hereford FC. And despite the cup commitments, the club topped the CCL Premier Division for most of the season and claimed the 2015-16 league title. Promotion, however, was denied due to ground grading issues.

Faced with huge challenges on and off the pitch - to achieve back-to-back title wins and put in place the necessary ground improvements to take advantage of any second opportunity for promotion - the 2016-17 season was perhaps the club's best yet, topping the Combined Counties League Premier Division for the entire season, reaching the semi-finals of the Hampshire senior county cup and the final of the Aldershot Senior Cup, and securing the required ground grading to allow the club to take its place in The Evo-Stik (Southern) League South; the first time in its history that the club has made it to Step 4 of the English football pyramid.

To top off a wonderful 2016-17 season, our young Youth team won the Hampshire FA Youth Midweek Floodlit Cup, winning on penalties against a strong Aldershot Town U18.


Hartley Wintney FC has come a long way, from 'village side' in every sense of the term, to today's 7 days a week modern football club. Under longstanding Club Chairman, Luke Mullen, the football club has established a clear line of progression for young players with the establishment of an U18 Youth setup, currently playing in the Allied Counties Youth League, a Reserve team playing in the Suburban League, and an A Team playing in the Aldershot & District Football League.

When you think of a circus, what comes to mind? The Big Trapeze? Lion Taming? How about last night's Berks and Bucks Cup performance? After picking up the Berks and Bucks cup plaudits two seasons ago, the Moles travelled across the county border to Berkshire to take on Hellenic Premier side Bracknell Town. Playing a team from a lower division and with one eye on the trip to league leader's Moneyfields on Saturday, Davis Haule gave a start to some of his fringe players including Kerran Lataille and Hafid Bounyafe.

On the well kempt plastic surface at Larges Lane the home side didn't hang about in opening the scoring. Adam Cornell's low driven cross wasn't dealt with by the FC centre half pairing of Derek Feyi and Jordan Jenkins and Seb Bowerman was on hand to tap in at the back stick.

It could have been two just a few minutes later, on six minutes Bowerman was afforded too much time and space outside the area, unleashing a drive from 20 yards, with the helpless Ash Jenkins watched the ball whistle past his far post.

The dominant start from The Robins had taken the Moles by surprise, and it took the visitors until the 17th minute to really get going. A beautifully weighted through ball from Jeanmal Prosper bypassed the Bracknell back line with Kieron Schmidt opting to take the ball on the volley, blazing just over the bar.

Just three minutes later Aylesbury were on the ropes again, another flowing passage of passing football saw Bracknell Town have it in the FC net, however a rather dubious offside flag handed the Moles a get out of jail free



card. At this point the half rather ground to a halt. Brian Haule had it in the net on 41 minutes, but he also was flagged for offside.

It in all, a relatively dominant first half from Bracknell, however, nobody anticipated what the next 45 minutes would bring...

As the players came out for the second half we expected the Moles to find a new lease of life, and push on for an equaliser, however, like on many occasions this season we were effective still in the changing rooms. As on the 47th minute an almost carbon copy of Bracknell's first goal made it two. This time Joe Grant smashing home TJ Bohane's cross from mere yards.

At this point manager Davis Haule called on the big guns, the man of the moment Shayne Almond. Straight away making an impact, finding Derek Feyi from a corner, the big man pummelled a rocket at goal, stinging keeper Chris Grace's palms. It was looking slightly

rosier until we found ourselves up the proverbial creek without a paddle. As on 66 minutes, Ash Jenkins was harshly dismissed for handling outside the box. With no goalkeeper on standby Jordan Jenkins donned the purple jersey. At this point defeat was assured, it was just a question of how embarrassed are we getting tonight? The answer – very.

As on 70 minutes Seb Bowerman's cross was dispatched past Jordan Jenkins by Adam Cornell. FC were then down to 9 men, when the man in form Shayne Almond got his marching orders for a stamp on Bracknell full-back Phil John, much to the delight of the Bracknell 'ultras' behind the goal. Much like the rain, the goals just kept on coming, the fourth from TJ Bohane on 74 minutes, followed by five and six in the 86th and 87th minutes respective, with Joe Grant and Seb Bowerman both picking up their braces.

A night to forget for the Moles.

THE MOLES UNDER 18's



Since our last programme, the young Moles have played three times with Cup and League action.

With last week's defeat to the same opposition still fresh in the mind, Aylesbury FC were keen to set the record straight and do themselves justice against Harefield United on Thursday 5th October.

Still hampered by injuries, Aylesbury made a few changes to the squad for this game as Alfi Touceda returned from injury, whilst first starts were handed to Perry Tuck, Daniel Ball and Archie Clarke.

Similar to last week's fixture Aylesbury started the game positively, but this time made it pay as they took the lead within the opening three minutes. A free kick just inside the Harefield half was played into the box, evading all defenders but finding Cian Banert yards from goal who made no mistake in side footing the ball home.

Despite this they did manage to equalise just before half time. Daniel Ball shepherded the Harefield winger out wide, leaving him no other option but to play a hopeful cross into the box. His luck was in as the FC defence were caught napping and provided an easy header at the back post for the equaliser. A very poor goal defensively from FC's point of view.

Despite being the better side Aylesbury were unable to find the winning goal to get them over the line, despite going close several times.

Playing their second game in the space of four days, Dan Turney would most likely have had squad rotation in mind for their opening County Cup fixture of the season. However, with several players still carrying knocks Aylesbury were only able to field a squad of fourteen for this tie.

With seconds remaining on the clock before half time Tattenhoe were awarded

a corner following some hesitation from Burberry in the Aylesbury goal. The corner, whilst not perfect in execution, caught the FC defence napping and allowed a free shot inside the box the give the hosts a surprise lead at half time.

Midway through the half the reintroduction of Jamie Jellis, playing his final game for FC before joining up with Wolves Academy this week, turned the game firmly into the hands of FC.

Within minutes of re-entering the field he created a goal for George Scott, impressive on debut, as he cut a ball back from the left hand side into the path of Scott who rifled his shot home to equalise.

This chance triggered Aylesbury back into action and they went in search of more goals. They were soon rewarded as that man Jellis again popped up with an assist, this time setting up Harry Scott at the back post to finish comfortably to put Aylesbury in front.

The visitors weren't done there and soon had clear daylight between themselves and their resilient hosts. A clever corner taken by Jellis was floated in to Harry Scott on the edge of the box who made no mistake in scoring on the volley to make it 3-1 to the Young Moles.

With little of the game remaining FC won a penalty following some good work from Cian Banert who was brought down having beaten his man and getting a run in the box. The ball was handed to Jellis who was able to complete a fairy tale ending by sending the keeper the wrong way to make it 4-1.

Efforts by both Ty Deacon and then Shayne Almond within the first couple of minutes hinted at the entertainment to come. FC will argue they should have had a penalty on 6 minutes as Almond was tugged back when clean through on goal. The visitors' Ashley Lodge had their first opportunity of the game soon afterwards but a combination of Ben Stevens and Jordan Jenkins blocked the effort.

It had been a very bright start from the Aylesbury Moles and it was no surprise when the team took the lead in the 14th minute. Good pressure resulted in a diagonal low cross through the penalty area and lurking at the far post was Ty Deacon who bundled the ball home from a matter of yards.

The following few minutes were nip and tuck as each side tested each other. Craig Carby threw himself at a goalbound effort from the visitors and Almond went close with a flashing shot across the penalty area. This was the prelude to the outstanding goal of the game. Deacon pushed the ball past his marker and ran round the other side before crashing an exquisite shot into the top corner of the net to double his side's lead.



A two-goal advantage at the break with FC kicking towards their favoured end and with a light breeze behind them should have made the second half a formality for the home side but it didn't quite work out that way.

On 59 minutes, Molesey were awarded a penalty for a kick out in the box. Jordan Jenkins steadied himself but Antonio Simeone kept his cool and slotted the ball just right of centre to halve the home team's lead. That deficit was wiped out completely in the next move of the match. A slip by Davis Haule allowed an attack to develop and from the right hand side Olu Akinsanya swept the ball high into the corner past a despairing Jenkins' hand.

This fightback jolted FC into life. The teams had been level for just six minutes before Jordan Jenkins rifled his shot home after the ball had pinged around the Molesey penalty area. Even better was to come as Aylesbury extended their lead still further. Just

four minutes had elapsed since JJ's goal when Shayne Almond added yet another. The ball was played into the path of the excellent Jeanmal Prosper and although he was unable to find a clear sight of goal, he did lay it off to Almond who had no mistake with a neat sidefoot.

Really, that should have been that but once again, the Aylesbury Moles allowed their visitors back into the game. With a minute or normal time to go, the home defence went walkabouts and Molesey substitute Ashby Charles was able to loop the ball over Jenkins for a somewhat soft goal. The referee announced a squeaky bum inducing five minutes of injury time and the visitors pressed for the equaliser. The fact that they didn't score was more good fortune than any good FC play however the Moles survived the onslaught with players and supporters mightily relieved to hear the ref bring the game to a close.



AFC Dunstable are third after Jermaine Hall's 23rd minute effort eventually proved enough at Honeycroft against Uxbridge.

Ashford Town (Middx) are fourth and they were comfortable 4-0 winners at home against Hayes & Yeading United. Jack Beadle bagged a brace in the 4th and 25th minutes. And then Max Webb matched him with goals in the 57th and then 3 minutes into stoppage time.

Kempston Rovers moved above Beaconsfield Town into fifth after winning 4-2 at Holloways Park. Nathan Tshikuna gave Rovers the boost of an early 2nd minute lead. But Town's Aaron Minhas turned that round with goals in the 12th and 20th minutes. Just past the hour-mark, Tshikuna added a second to pull the Walnut Boys level and Jake Newman put them in front 7 minutes later, with Luke Heneghan adding a fourth in the 84th minute.

Bedford Town and Northwood shared a goalless draw at the New Eyrie, while Marlow came from 2-0 down to salvage a home draw against Barton Rovers. Charlie Payne after 66 minutes and a Calam Gallimore own goal 4 minutes later broke the deadlock for Rovers. But Kameron English after 79 minutes and then Marcus Mealing in the 87th minutes earned the hosts a battling point.

On Tuesday night, Bedford Town and 2nd placed Hartley Wintney shared the spoils in Bedfordshire with a 1-1 draw. Hartley Wintney went ahead in the 12th minute with a Liam Eagle header, and in the second half the Eagles equalised with a shot from David Manu in the 60th minute.

Egham Town welcomed Aylesbury United to the Runnymede Stadium for this midweek clash, with Egham running out 2-0 winners after a 6th minute goal from Aaron Berry, and an 85th minute strike to seal the result from Matt Stockhill.

Struggling Hanwell Town got a valuable point at home to Cambridge City, with Hanwell opening the scoring from a corner. City's Ollie Snaith equalised soon after, however Hanwell regained the lead again from a corner kick. Cambridge man Ryan Sharman however pulled one back to make it 2-2.

Kelvin Bossman opened the scoring for Marlow against AFC Rushden and Diamonds, and Diamonds responded with 4 goals, two from Farrell and another two from Daryll Smith. Gallimore scored a consolation for Marlow late on.

In 2010, Zulte-Waregem's match against Lokeren in the Belgian Pro League was interrupted by a duck on the pitch.


One player very firmly got rid of the hapless bird by flinging it over the advertising hoarding.


