


FC fell to a heavy defeat against leader leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds on a bitter night at the SRD Stadium. There can be little doubt of FC's enthusiasm in giving their high flying visitors a game but a combination of overall quality and goal scoring efficiency was enough to give Rushden the win.

It was during the opening first 20 minutes of the game that the game was lost. Within the first minute AFC had forced two corners, the 2nd of which saw Luke Fairlamb hit an effort that FC keeper Ashley Jenkins did well to palm away. The first goal came on 12 minutes. A cross from the left hand side found Tom Lorraine unmarked in the box and his guided header beat Jenkins without too much effort.

That vulnerability from crosses was exposed just five minutes as Joel Farrell poked his sides' second after a lobbed cross, this time from the right. Inevitably, perhaps, Rushden's third goal followed on 25 minutes and yet again it was a high cross that caused the panic ending with Liam Dolman nodding home with a stooping header.

Ty Deacon then launched a shot from an angle which whistled just wide of the post. The final minutes of the game belonged to the visitors however. Ben Diamond pulled his shot wide on 88 minutes and as the game entered injury time, Derek Feyi brought his man down just within the penalty area with the referee having no option but to award a penalty. Rushden captain Liam Dolman hit the spot kick with some force to give his side their 4-0 lead and all three points.

The Blues



After a poor season start to the season, the Blues seem to have stabilised and improved results to move away from the relegation zone.

After being moved around several divisions in the past few years, Fleet were moved back into the Southern League Division One Central for the 2015/16 season where the finished 17th, and 14th the year after.

Fleet had a very poor start to the season, picking up just points until they played Uxbridge in September and in some style beat the Red Army 6-0. However further losses continued and it wasn't until they defeated Marlow and Aylesbury FC that their fortunes seemed to improve. An impressive performance against FC led to two victories over Barton Rovers and Egham, and a draw with Kempston

to see them get some breating space over Arlesey and move up the table. Further impressive draws in December against promotion contenders AFC Dunstable and Moneyfields was further testament to the Blues revived success.

Fleet also secured the signing of stiker Patrik Ruzicka from Farnborough who had been on a temporary loan from the club. The forward caused nothing but trouble for the FC defence so will be a valuable asset to the Blues.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to a cold and miserable November afternoon as the Moles lost out to Fleet in the league a few months back.

November 11th 2017

Fleet's Patrik Ruzika guided in an effort as early as the 3rd minute which FC keeper Ash Jenkins gently shepherded out to safety. Shayne Almond responded in a moment of rare quality as he curled a terrific shot from the left, which just whizzed the wrong side of the Fleet post. Almond looked lively in the opening few minutes and soon afterwards, he again found himself in a decent position but he could slice his shot wide when composure was the name of the game.

Ryan Marklew beat Ash Jenkins hands up in the 21st minute and the midfielder must have been surprised to see his effort cannon off the post when a goal seemed a certainty. As the half ended, FC had their best chance of the game. Ty Deacon broke clear of his marker and as the keeper advanced, the striker poked the ball goalwards only to see it trickle past the far post.

Aston Goss had a half chance on 47 minutes in FC's first and more worryingly only chance of the half. This was followed by a smart Jenkins save from a Marklew stab. The home team then decided to turn the screw on FC. They frequently exploited FC's high defensive line and with rapid attacks, constantly exposing Ash Jenkins to danger. Town's Chris Dean tested Jenkins again before Fleet deservedly took the lead. FC had a number of opportunities to clear but failed to do so thereby allowing Ruzicka to fire the ball home from close range through a crowded penalty agea.

The one goal lead turned into two on 70 minutes. The high line was again blown wide apart as Luke Haskell raced clear of the FC defence to dink a cheeky ball over Jenkins into an unguarded net. After this lesson, it should have been clear to FC that playing such a suicidal offside trap could see them easily be punished yet on 87 minutes the defence was breached once again and only a combination of Jenkins bravery and a rush of blood to the head from Bradley Wilson prevented an even more emphatic victory.

Jools Thomas looks back at our Berks & Bucks County cup win of the 2015/16 season against a Chesham United side ending their own great season.

Each week an FC fan is profiled and quite a few mention the Berks and Bucks Cup final against Chesham as one of their favourite games. As a solid Southern League Division One side, our success has been built on consistency, survival and 'punching above our weight'. Cup highlights have been few and far between, so it may be worthwhile revisiting the day to see why it remains a highlight for so many.

FC had dragged themselves over the league line as they recorded three defeats and two draws in their final games and with this had gone the team's chance of a late run into the play offs. Still, the Moles finished the league in a very respectable 8th place.

Their opponents, Chesham, had finished 11th in the senior Premier Division but it was in the FA Cup that the team had made their mark. The club had reached the 2nd round beating Bristol Rovers 1-0 thanks to a Ryan Blake goal away before falling 4-0 to Bradford City.

The line ups made interesting reading as fans arrived at Stag Meadow, home of Windsor FC. FC fans were disappointed not to see old boy Brad Wadkins lining up for the Generals but the biggest shock was the absence of FC keeper James Weatherill who unfortunately suffered an injury in the warm up that we would later learn would keep him away from football for a while. His understudy, the unknown French teenager from the Under-18's side Mathieu Varnica filled in.



The game passed in a blur for FC fans, however, an abiding memory for FC fans was how well the team fought. It was one of those days where every member of the team was on top of their game and gave their all.

Brian Haule had a magic chance to give the Moles the lead after the Chesham keeper had fluffed a cross. The big man took his eye off the ball and blasted the ball wide. Still the FC faithful remained hopeful and cheered the team on regardless.



The winning goal came just after half time. Aston Goss delivered a cross from the right hand side and Danny Gordon jumped higher than his marker to head the ball home from just a matter of yards. The supporters behind the goal erupted into celebrations.

At the other end, Varnica was only really asked to make one real save from the dangerous Dave Pearce. As the game progressed, a penalty could have been awarded at either end but both sets of appeals were ignored.

As the referee blew the final whistle, supporters and players celebrated. Players hugged each other, fans cheered and then the photo opportunities as the celebrations continued into the clubhouse and on the coach on the way home.

Our successes at FC may be modest but for us this was a great day and one that is rightly regarded with fond memories.



ong serving club stalwart Ben Stevens has played over 500 games for Aylesbury FC, **The Mole** caught up with Ben ahead of the Fleet game at Haywood Way to find out more about his time at FC over the years.

You played for Aylesbury United from 2006 to 2009. What made you want to come over and join Aylesbury FC all those years ago?

At the time Mark Eaton was our manager and we had a good close team. When he said he was making the move to F.C to be manager and explained the vision the club had and how he wanted us to be a part of it we all decided that we would join him. However, for me personally my heart has always been at F.C since a young age so the decision was easy.

Growing up you were involved with the club before it's days as Aylesbury FC and played for Aylesbury Vale, how much of an influence was that on your development as a player in those early years around the club?

It had a huge influence and probably made me the man I am today. When I first played for the first team I

was only a boy but was playing up against and alongside men which certainly made me grow up quickly.

How do you feel about Aylesbury FC's season so far at the halfway stage?

You've usually played in defence but a few games this season you've played in midfield, is that a position you'd like to play in more?

Yes of course I love midfield, it's where the action is. I feel I have more of an opportunity to influence the game, whether that is protecting the back four or creating opportunities further forward. I'm so glad I have done enough to convince the Gaffa to play me there!

You certainly seem to be popular with the fans of the club, how much do you find the support of all the fans and volunteers at the club an important factor on a saturday afternoon?

For me the fans and volunteers make the club. Quite simply without them the club would not be where it is now. For that I thank each and every one of them. The way they stick by us through thick and thin is amazing, they make you want to play for the badge and I always try to give my all so as not to let them down.

That's an easy one - Brian Haule! He always seems to know where the camera is to capture his celebrations!

Who spends the most time on their hair in the dressing room?

I would say Ty Deacon, although it still always looks a mess!

Who's the bossiest in the team?

The bossiest has to be me! As captain I demand a lot from the team to keep us all on top form and on the



same page with the same attitude towards the game.

Who's got the best skills in the team?

The best skills on the team is the young Harry Scott. Some of the things he can do with the ball is unreal! But I guess after his paper round and catch up with Olly Murs he has plenty of time to practice!

What's been your favourite moment playing for Aylesbury FC?

My favourite moment of playing for Aylesbury F.C has to be the moment that we won the League and Cup double to cement our place in the Southern League.

League roundup

AFC Rushden & Diamonds moved back three points clear at the top of the Evo-Stik league South East table on Tuesday night following a comprehensive 4-0 win at Aylesbury FC.

On a bitterly cold night at the SRD Stadium, Diamonds took an 11th minute lead through Tom Lorraine and 5 minutes later were two-up through Ben Farrell.

Skipper Liam Dolman popped up to make it 3-0 to the league leaders after 25 minutes.

The lowly Moles gave a decent account of themselves in the second period before eventually conceding a fourth in the 2nd minute of time added on at the end of the game when Derek Feyi conceded a penalty Dylan Kearney, Uxbridge which Dolman duly converted.


