On a frankly tropical Saturday afternoon in Central Bucks despite the grey sky, Moles fans looked ahead to the opening of a new era under the management of Kevin Poole to revive the fortunes on the pitch, with several new faces entering the side alongside some who stayed on, it would be a new test for many as they adapted as a squad. Ben Stevens moved back into his centre back role in the absence of the injured Jordan Jenkins, with newbie Rayon Hayes at right back, Derek Feyi alongside Ben and Anthony Ball at left back. Aaron Rogers and Alex Woodfine also made their Haywood Way debuts for FC. Schmidt also returning as captain.

however it was the away side Hanwell Town who bossed the game for the first half hour, with attack after attack and not much at all coming from FC. Just before half time a mistake by captain Keiron Schmidt led to the first goal. As Aylesbury looked to clear the ball from the box, Schmidt collected and ran with the ball rather than clearing, and

was punished for this as he was tackled by a Hanwell player, who passed the ball off to Callum Duffy to coolly slot the ball in to the bottom right hand corner, a fine goal. A minute later, more dithering in the Aylesbury box from a Hanwell corner led to the ball falling to Callum Duffy who slotted in at close range for his second.

The second half saw a revived Aylesbury side coming out for the attack, with the young duo Harry Scott and Alfie Touceda showing their skill to push through and cause problems for Hanwell for much of the second half. Yet Aylesbury were not shooting enough to trouble Sam Bunting in the Hanwell goal, and no goals or shots on targets came for Aylesbury. Late on Hanwell got a penalty as their man was brought down in the box, Joe Chandiram converting from the spot to make it 3-0. Hanwell held on for the clean sheet and FC look for their first goal and points under Poole.







Introducing Egham Town

The Sarnies have had an up and down season, with the departure of Chris Moore and introduction of former Northwood boss Simon Lane as manager, beating some of the top sides of late.

After a fantastic start to the season with six wins from the first two months, including beating us 4-1 on a rainy September afternoon, the Sarnies looked like early playoff contenders. However results did start to dip off and the playoffs looked more and more unlikely, and struggled through the next few months picking up the odd win. A very tough winless January did not look good for the new management team...step up AFC Rushden and Diamonds.

The phoenix club, favourites to win the league and big spends of the Diamonds turned up to Runnymede for what many would have thought would be an easy

game, however pulled off a shock and a fine result to beat them 2-1.

A week later they proved it was no fluke, beating another promotion contender in Hayes and Yeading at fortress Runnymede 2-1. Ignoring a loss and a draw in the next two games, Egham come to Haywood Way today on the back of a fine away win at Thame United to try and see off this new Aylesbury side.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to a cold and wet afternoon at Egham Town as the Moles came away with a thrashing from the Sarnies.

September 9th 2017

Davis Haule's Aylesbury FC side arrived at the Runnymede stadium with renewed vigour following a valiant performance against Tier 3 side Leiston in the FA Cup a week prior. After a solid start, the Moles embarked on a downward spiral in the second half.

The first five minutes hadn't produced any action of note – I confess that is a guess – I turned up slightly late today, apologies for that. Blame the traffic.

Obviously, the Moles had been waiting for my arrival before kicking into gear. As in the 7th minute Aston Goss rinsed his man for pace along the right touchline before delivering a powerful cross which Brian Haule connected with but couldn't beat the keeper on this occasion.

Egham responded a minute later when Louis Stead tried his luck from distance after spotting James Weatherill off his line. The FC keeper did well to scramble back and parry the ball over the bar for a corner.

This proved to be merely a hiccup for the Moles as two minutes later the man of the moment Jonny Montgomery opened the scoring. Some great trickery from Aston Goss beat his man, before unloaded a venomous strike at Patrick Ohman which was too hot for him to handle, the rebound fell to Montgomery who buried the ball in the net.

The Moles pressed for a second goal before half time – with most of the play going through Aston Goss, however, the killer ball FC desired just wouldn't come.

Egham may well have gone in at the break with a goal themselves – star man Brendan Matthew had a powerful header well saved by Weatherill. Whilst Craig Carby almost headed into his own net after he misjudged a Callum Webb cross from the right-hand side.

The second half was a whole different ball game – if you pardon the pun. Whatever the Egham Town manager had to say to his players at half time evidently worked, as FC's disciplined defence on show in the first half went AWOL in the second period. The first of Egham's goals came in the 56th minute where a simple over the top ball beat the Moles' offside trap, which gave Ryan Debattista the opportunity to saunter through on goal, round the onrushing Weatherill and give Egham their equaliser.

The dynamics of the game could well have changed in the 61st minute after Lewis Cole appeared to elbow Joe Fitzgerald – the view wasn't shared by the referee, and instead on 65 minutes the Sarnies took the lead. A Ryan Phillips cross to the back post wasn't dealt with and the



unmarked fox in the box Brendan Matthew headed home.

With seven minutes to play the Moles really didn't look like troubling the Egham Town goalkeeper, with Shane Almond's free kick barely stinging Ohman's palms. Somewhat predictably Egham got a third – again poor defending from a cross – this time a deep free kick from Louis Stead on this occasion found Mitchel Wiseman at the back post all alone to head home. Déjà vu.

The final nail in the FC coffin was hammered in three minutes from time – Ryan Debattista getting his second of the day – as FC defenders all left the ball to one another, Debattista pounced and slotted past the helpless James Weatherill.

Brian Haule did have an opportunity deep into injury time to at least restore some credibility to the score line after James Weatherill's goal kick made it all the way to the Egham penalty area but his low right footed shot whistled wide of the far post.

League roundup

AFC Rushden & Diamonds' lead at the top of the Evo-Stik League South East table was cut to just two points on Saturday after they lost at Hartley Wintney and Hayes & Yeading United beat Uxbridge. Despite taking an early 2nd minute lead in Hampshire through Ben Farrell, Diamonds were undone by a brace from Dean Stow after 32 and 60 minutes.

Hayes won the derby against Uxbridge in front of 314 with a brace from Manny Duku after 20 minutes – from the penalty spot – and 79 minutes, with Duncan Culley on 74 minutes and Lasté Dombaxe 5 minutes

from time adding the others. Beaconsfield Town are level on points with Hayes in third and, like Diamonds, have played three fewer games.

They edged out Northwood by the odd goal in five at Chestnut Avenue, leading after just 2 minutes through Alex Cathline only for Jermaine Osei to level 10 minutes later. Osei then gave Woods the lead on 36 minutes, but Reece Yorke after 51 minutes and seconds later, Tony Mendy, won it for Town.

AFC Dunstable are two points further back in fourth after demolishing bottom side Arlesey Town 7-0, meaning the Bedfordshire side have shipped 13 goals in their last two matches and 95 in total. It was 5-0 at half-time with goals from BJ Christie and Jermaine Hall with two apiece and a Keanu Williams own goal. Hall completed his hat-trick on the hour-mark and Terry Griffiths added a seventh on 65 minutes. The only saving grace for Arlesey is that the visitors took their foot off the gas for the final 25 minutes!

The other play-off spot is currently held by Chalfont St Peter, who could only manage a 1-1 draw at Marlow, whose Jay Welch cancelled out Jake Cass' 47th minute opener in the 5th minute of stoppage time at the end of the game!

Cambridge City, Bedford Town and outsiders Kempston Rovers could still have a say in the top six race.

City are just a point behind the Saints after a 1-0 win at St Ives against Aylesbury United, courtesy of a James Hall goal after 27 minutes.

Bedford beat early season contenders Moneyfields 3-1 at the New Eyrie, but the Eagles left it late. It was 1-1 after Jimmy Hartley's 6th minute opener for Bedford was levelled on the half-hour mark by Sam Pearce. Veteran Paul Benson pounced to put the Eagles in front a minute from time and Bradley Woods-Garner added a third 8 minutes into time added on.

Kempston probably needed to beat third-bottom Fleet Town at Hillgrounds to keep in the race but had to make do with a point after trailing to an early 2nd minute Brad Wilson goal until Jake Newman equalised on the hour-mark.

Arlesey are still just about alive after second-bottom Barton Rovers lost to a goal a minute before half-time from Tom Howard for hosts Ashford Town (Middx).

Elsewhere, Hanwell Town won the basement battle at Aylesbury FC with a Calum Duffy brace and a spot-kick from Joe Chandiram, while Michael Kalu had a day to remember as he scored all three for Egham Town as they won 3-2 at Thame United, whose Lynton Goss and Dan West replied.

Cambridge City emphatically returned into the play-off places in the Evo-Stik League South East after a 7-1 demolition of lower mid-table Marlow at St Ives on Monday night. It was a bad night all round for Marlow, who were late arriving due to traffic problems and were forced to field several young lads because of injuries. And they found themselves 5-0 down by half-time! Ben Seymour-Shove grabbed the opener after 10 minutes and Jordan Gent doubled City's lead 5 minutes later. Seymour-Shove's second arrived 6 minutes after that and then Ryan Sharman got in on the act in the 39th minute. Charlie Barton reduced the deficit on the half-hour mark, with James Hall making it a first half nap hand for City 3 minutes later. It got even worse for the visitors just 5 minutes into the second half when City were awarded a penalty after Seymour-Shove was brought down by Alex Salmon. Marlow defender Jay Welch received two yellow cards for dissent over the decision and was dismissed, after which Seymour-Shove duly completed his hat-trick from the resulting penalty after a lengthy delay. Ryan Towner added City's seventh goal in the 62nd minute after which they took their foot off the gas, fortunately for beleaguered Marlow.

Leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds were left frustrated as they were held to a 1-1 draw at Hayden Road by mid-table Uxbridge in the Evo-Stik League South East on Tuesday night. In front of a crowd of 369, it was goalless at the break. But on the hour-mark, Diamonds recent signing, Spencer Weir-Daley, broke the deadlock when he picked up a half-cleared cross to fire home. However, they weren't able to drive their advantage home and were pegged back with 11 minutes to go when Cole Brown pulled the Reds back on level terms. The draw leaves Diamonds three points ahead of second-placed Hayes & Yeading United, who have played two games more, and of a Hartley Wintney side who are now level on points with Hayes in third after a 4-0 win at home against lowly Aylesbury FC.

Hartley Wintney, who beat the leaders at home last weekend, took a 1-0 lead into half-time, courtesy of a 26th minute Nic Ciardini goal. Steve Duff added a second for the hosts on the hour-mark and Ciardini's second came 5 minutes later, with Duff matching the former Farnborough striker with 4 minutes remaining.

Moneyfields beat Thame United 4-1 at home in the evening's other game.

Programme, offering youngsters a chance to learn from professional UEFA-licenced coaches such as Town gaffer Simon Weaver. Their inclusive weekly football sessions for sufferers of mental health are also breaking down boundaries and prejudice within the community.

These are just a couple of examples of teams switched on to the fact football clubs live or die by their work in the community, and so, like many of our awards, we need you to help us highlight the best of Non-League so we make sure to pick the most deserving winner come May.
