Manager Davis Haule resorted to a traditional 4-4-2 formation, playing himself and Harry Scott in the striker positions, replacing Brian Haule and Ty Deacon who was beginning his three-match suspension, whilst Davide Pobbe also returned to the team, replacing Alfi Touceda.

With just eleven minutes on the clock Davis Haule used his experience, strength and vision to hold off his opposite number, and poke the ball through to Harry Scott, who used his lightning pace to break the defensive line of Uxbridge, finishing with great composure to chip the ball past Paul McCarthy to find the back of the net via the far post.

Ashley Jenkins had another solid game in the Aylesbury goal, however, he wasn't offered a prayer with the equalising goal, when Luke Maguire leapt high above Craig Carby and Garry Jones to convert Kearney's pinpoint cross with a strong header at the

back post.

On 33 minutes a period of Uxbridge pressure finally told. Joe Fitzgerald was unable to cope with Cole Brown's tricky feet and pace, and the winger was able to work his way to the byline, before picking out Kevin Warner who was on hand to give Uxbridge the lead with a tap in from mere yards.

Before the half time whistle, Davis Haule found space for himself at the back post and Garry Jones picked him out with a delightful ball, who in turn hit a sweetly struck volley which had McCarthy beaten all ends up – the far post this time came to his rescue and rebounded straight into the grateful keeper's arms

A great second half defensive display from the FC back line, in particular man of the match Derek Feyi deputising competently for Ben Stevens, meant that the normally free scoring Uxbridge front line were kept relatively quiet. Aylesbury came away from the match frustrated and empty handed despite the spirited performance.

It's been a rollercoaster ride of a season so far for The Moneys despite not having seen the bottom half of the table, with a phenomenal start, a blip and now back to some form.

The 2015-2016 saw Moneyfields manager Miles Rutherford resign after 12 years and he was replaced with Dave Carter from Horndean take over as manager in October then finishing eighth in the Wessex Premier league and seeing Moneyfields reaching the fourth round of the FA Vase and saw the reserves finish second in the Wyvern Combination Football League Premier Division .

2016/17 Moneyfields finished top of the table in the Wessex Premier for three days after the fa took three points away for playing an illegal player giving the title to Portland Utd. Moneys still got promoted to Evo-stik Southern league East division for the 2017-18 season.

The Moneys form of late has been lacking, with only one win in five coming away at Chalfont St Peter, although don't let the form guide deceive you as Moneyfield have played promotion contenders in 4 of those five games!

Moneyfields still sit only 7 points off of the playoff spots with promotion still very much a possibility, owing to the fantastic start to the season for the southern league newcomers, and come into todays game off the back of a 1-1 draw against promotion rivals AFC Dunstable.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to a disappointing saturday afternoon down on the south coast as the Moles went down to the ten men of Moneyfields.

October 14th 2017

After the Moles' mid-week exploits in the B&B Cup (the less said about that the better), the last place you'd want to go was free scoring, table toppers Moneyfields.

However, we seem to have started where we left off on Tuesday night, as after just four minutes the home side took the lead. Ben Stevens' clearance looked to be straight forward, but was scuffed away only to Steve Hutchins who delivered a killer ball to the back post where Dan Wooden was lurking to tap home for one-nil.

The Moles continued to pile on the pressure, and soon struck a deserved equaliser courtesy of Ty Deacon. Aston Goss delivered a dangerous corner, the Moneyfields goalkeeper Stephen Mowthorpe did very well to punch away under pressure from big man Brian Haule, but he could only clear as far as Ben Stevens whose goal bound header was helped on its way by Ty Deacon. All square.

Blink and you missed it, the second half started in spectacular fashion. Straight from kick off Jeanmal Prosper found space on the right-hand side, picked his spot and with pinpoint accuracy curled his effort into the top left-hand corner of the Moneyfields goal. Keeper stood no chance. The Moles led two goals to one.

On 66 minutes, the equaliser arrived. The FC's defences' Achilles Heel - defending set pieces; a deep free kick was delivered to the back post, where Steve Hutchings was all alone to head home past the sprawling Ash Jenkins. Just minutes later the Moneyfields goal scorer saw the red mist, and in turn brandished a red card, an unnecessary high foot in midfield meant a second yellow for Steve Hutchings. Following an Avlesbury attack which led to a rather tame shot from striker Brian Haule, Moneyfields quickly look to break, the ball found its way to the hosts' top scorer Ryan Pennery who weaved his way through the FC defence, and chipped the ball over the onrushing Ash Jenkins to give the hosts the lead. On 83 minutes, a goal of the same ilk as Prosper's early in the half arrived, an unbelievable strike from Dan Wooden could only be tipped onto the post by Ash Jenkins, the ball then crashed against the opposite post before finding the back of the net. At two goals down, Davis Haule opted for a back three, which meant more space for the Monies to exploit on the counter, Dan Wooden again finding himself with acres of pitch around him, his low shot parried away well by Ash Jenkins, but Marley Ridge was on hand to mop up the rebound. In his first season the Moneys finished 8th in the Wessex Premier League and reached the fourth round of the FA Vase. The next year Moneyfield finished top and gained promotion to the Southern League.

Following a solid midweek performance and point against Fleet Town, the Moles went into this clash with Ashford Town with renewed vigour and confidence.

A sublime long ball from deep in the Ashford half by Garry Jones found the towering figure of Brian Haule to prod home at close range for his fourth goal of the season. Ashford continued to pile on pressure after the deadlock was broken, but the boggy surface in and around the penalty areas meant that their passing football wasn't paying off, with neither Sarnad Kazi or Max Webb able to take their chances.

Aylesbury would rue this missed chance, as on 34 minutes Jack Beadle powered home an equaliser. A defensive clearance had little power on it, Beadle was able to pick up the loose ball in the final third, before cooley slotting home to the bottom left of Jenkins' goal under pressure from Craig Carby.

On the half time whistle - drama. Ty Deacon

came to blows with his opposite number, quite literally, giving the referee very little choice but to brandish a straight red card.

Brian Haule decided to step up and grab his brace. A rare attacking spell for the Moles saw Harry Scott use good pace to break away from his marker, laid off Alfi Touceda who had very little space and time but still executed an exquisite eye of the needle ball through the Ashford defensive line, for the big man Brian Haule to control, take around the keeper and slot into an empty net. The 10-men were ahead...

...but not for long. The Moles were unable to hold onto the lead, as with a quarter of a hour left to play, Max Webb found acres of space out on the left wing, with Anthony Ball not wanting to challenge after an earlier booking, the Tangerine's wide man whipped in a powerful cross which wasn't dealt with and it was Samad Kazi who couldn't miss his headed finish from mere yards out.

League roundup

AFC Rushden & Diamonds managed to get their game at Hayden Road against play-off chasers Chalfont St Peter on and celebrated with a hard-fought 1-0 win in front of a crowd of just under 600. Drainage problems have caused issues with the pitch in recent weeks, but what turned out to be the only goal of the game came after 34 minutes when Tom Lorraine headed home.

Diamonds lead the table by three points from Beaconsfield Town, who beat Fleet Town 2-0 at Holloways Park. Wes Daly gave the hosts a 10th minute lead, but, like at Hayden Road, it wasn't a straightforward win and they couldn't relax until Tre Mitford's second a minute into stoppage time at the end of the game.

The top two hold a six-point lead over third-placed Hayes & Yeading United, with only five points separating them from seventh-placed Cambridge City in the race for the play-offs. Hayes & Yeading stretched that advantage after beating Cambridge 2-0 at St Ives, thanks to goals in the final 19 minutes from Scott Donnelly and Toby Little.

Hartley Wintney, AFC Dunstable and Chalfont occupy the slots in between.

Hartley Wintney inflicted a 4-1 defeat on rock-bottom Arlesey Town, who actually took the lead on the hour-mark through Billy Lannon! Paul Hodges equalised within 4 minutes and added a second on 75 minutes, with Adam Everiss and Jack French making the scoreline rather flattering on the home side with two more in the final 5 minutes.

AFC Dunstable drew 1-1 at Moneyfields, levelling 3 minutes from time through Jermaine Hall after Marley Ridge had put the Moneys in front 3 minutes into the second half. Biggest winners of the day were mid-table Ashford Town (Middx) who hammered Kempston Rovers 7-1 at the Robert Parker Stadium. Jack Beadle netted a hat-trick, James Cottee a brace and Alex Fisher and Romario Jonas singles in the rout – Jake Newman having levelled for the Walnut Boys.

Avlesbury United enjoyed a good 4-0 win against Egham Town at the Meadow, racing into a 3-0 interval lead through Jeanmal Prosper, Jack Wood and Greg Williams, with Ben Seaton adding the fourth 10 minutes from time.

Hanwell Town moved up to fourth-bottom after beating second-bottom Barton Rovers 4-1 at home, thanks to a Joe Chandiram brace sandwiched by Mergin Qarri and Harvey Killeen - Andrew Phillips replying.

A goal after 5 minutes from Curtis Chapple proved enough for Marlow at home to Northwood, while Luke Maguire and Kevin Warner scored after 22 and 32 minuets respectively after Harry Scott had given Aylesbury FC an 11th minute

And a penalty by veteran striker Paul Benson after 63 minutes sealed Bedford Town's victory at the New Eyrie against Thame United.

On Tuesday with Evo-Stik League South East leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds being thwarted again by a waterlogged pitch at Hayden Road, Hartley Wintney took the opportunity to move into third place in the table, six points behind Diamonds.

The Hampshire newcomers beat mid-table Marlow 3-0 at The Memorial Playing Fields, taking a 25th minute lead through Jake Baxter. Former Portsmouth striker Rowan Vine added a second on the hour-mark and Adam Everiss made the points safe a minute from time.

Second-bottom Barton Rovers picked up a first point in five matches after sharing a 1-1 draw with Northwood at Chestnut Avenue. Evans Kouassi gave Woods a 37th minute lead they held until just shy of the hour-mark when Jack Keating pulled Rovers level.

The game at the Runnymede Stadium between Egham Town and Kempston Rovers was another weather casualty.

The term 'qualifying round' seems farflung from the current stage of the FA Cup, as it enters into the sixth round proper.

Of the 737 teams to have played in the competition this season, only ten remain with replays set to narrow that number down to 8.

In a season memorable for teams like Whitchurch Alport who played in the extra-preliminary round for the first time, the headlines for the next few days after Manchester City's shock loss to Wigan Athletic look set to dominated by Sergio Aguero's clash with a pitch invader.

The Argentinian claims the altercation was triggered by the invader spitting at him. Now if this is the case, how will the issue be dealt with when you consider Cleethorpes

Town were deducted 12 points for fielding an ineligible player for seven Evo-Stik South fixtures?

Two weeks ago in this column, I wrote how the FA put up with the ugly tasks of operating a sport while the Premier League lives a carte blanche lifestyle. But when it comes to punishment and upholding the game's reputation balance sheets have no relevance and it simply comes down to one question: do the punishments fit the severity of the infringement?

Almost three years ago, the FA fined Aston Villa £200,000 for a pitch invasion that overshadowed an FA Cup tie, with supporters 'jostling' with West Brom players. There are photos of the Villa Park pitch being blacked out by the sheer number of home fans on the grass.

Have you ever walked

to the away end before a match and seen home supporters be searched on their way into a stadium? I can't say I have.

The scope for society viewing such instances as 'despicable' really are not far away from becoming instances of 'horror' when a player gets hurt.

In my view, pitch encroachments are the most serious incidents that can occur in football. A chance for a controlled environment to turn into the unknown. Certainly, far more serious than a club mishandling the registration paperwork for a new signing or loan.

But would I be saying that if the FA took the measure of throwing a team out of the FA Cup rather than rely solely on fines and the courts to issue football banning orders?



The Mole spoke to Italian striker Davide Pobbe who has fought his way into the first eleven having arrived in October. Pobbe made his debut in a 3-0 away win against Beaconsfield Town, and scored the winner against Cambridge City.

Let's start off with the homeland, where abouts in Italy are you from and what was it like playing in Italy as a young player?

I was born in Vicenza, it's a nice city near Venice. Since I was really young I have had the football passion. My dad said that when I was 4 years old he found me alone in front of the tv watching any games of the world cup. When I was kid I remember we played football every day on the street with my friends.

Who was the first club you played for?

I started to play football when I was 6 years old for AC Torri, anyway my first senior club was Camisano, I was 17 years old. I was only a boy and the manager believed so much in me and it's been one of my best seasons, scoring a lot of goals and we got promoted into eccellenza.

What is the highest league you played in in Italy, and what club were you at?

"I played for Eurotezze in Serie D which is like the conference national"

I played for eurotezze in serie D (which is like the conference national), it was a really good team with experienced players who played pro and we finished 2nd in the table that season, we went on to the playoff's but we lost.

What is the difference you have found in the way that the game is played in Italy and England?

In Italy the football is more technical and very tactical, every team defends really well and sometimes you have to be patient to find the space to score. In england it's more physical and a lot of running, you have to be fit and then you can add the technicality. I really enjoy playing here.

In conversation

Who do you support?

I support Man United and I would like to go at Old Trafford soon.

Who did you first play for in Enlgand when you moved over here?

My first club was Harefield last year. As my first season in England it was really good, I scored 19 goals and we won the middlesex cup. I got manager's player award as well which was a nice touch.

Who is your favourite player of past and present?

Maradona in in the past and Cristiano Ronaldo now because of his hard work he became one of the best in the world.

"I give my best everytime, I play also for them (the fans) and i want to say a big thank you to everyone."

What made you want to come to Aylesbury FC?

I was recommended to Davis by Ray Nicholson, after a few weeks training Davis wanted to sign me and I started to play here.

What has been your favourite moment whilst playing for Aylesbury FC?

In December we won 4 games in a row and I remember the win away at Cambridge 1-0, it was a great day notbecause it was my first goal for Aylesbury but also because everyone was helping each other and we showed a great team spirit. It was brilliant.

Best mate or mates at the club?

I would say the two Jenkins brothers and Jonas but they're a good bunch of lads here and I get on well with all of them.

Favourite thing about the club?

The fans and all volunteers involved in the club. I give my best everytime, I play also for them and I want say a big thank you to everyone.

Fvaourite ground you've played at in Italy, and

also your favourite ground you've played at in England?

I remember the win against Chioggia when I was playing for Eurotezze, we've played in front of a big crowd and with that win we went on top of the table, it was so special.

In England I haven't played many games yet, this is just my beginning here and I hope to play in a nice ground soon. Anyway I'm going for Hanwell town because I've played with Harefield in the cup final there and I won my first cup in England and this year with Aylesbury we got a good win there as well.


