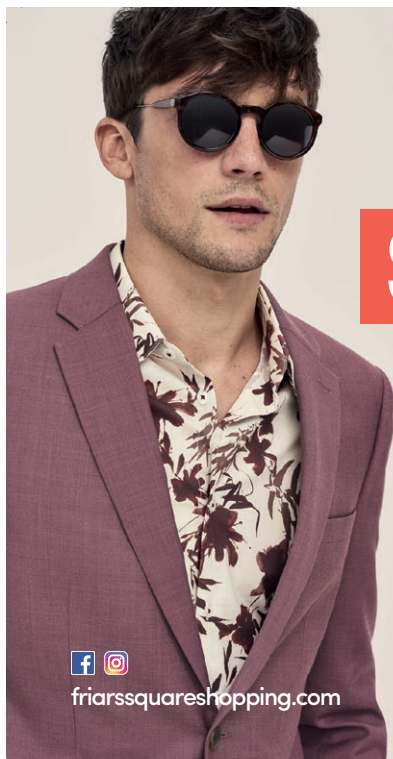

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to a cold November evening at the home of the Eagles as the Moles left with their tale between their legs.

November 14th 2017

Alas, a Bedford equaliser within one minute of the restart was merely the starter as the home team ran riot in what looked like for them like a light training session as FC collapsed in terms as a footballing unit.

Paul Brown and Ash Jenkins got in a mix up as early as the fourth minute and this almost allowed Town's Brad Woods-Garness. David Manu then hit the side netting as the home team really got into their stride.

On 28 minutes, Brad Auger hit a half volley that flew over the bar. Woods Garness was again in action, with Jenkins lucky to hold onto his shot as the home team piled on the pressure. Town should have taken the lead on 31 minutes. Mayo Balogun put in a terrific ball and although Woods-Garness made contact, Jenkins pulled off an incredible low save when a goal seemed certain.

Aston Goss had FC's first chance on 35 minutes with a shot that did little trouble to Kyle Forster in the home goal. Very much against the run of play, FC took the lead. Decent work on the right saw Davis Haule make an assist for Prosper who had just to sidefoot home into an unguarded goal.

That advantage was wiped out on 46 minutes. A high cross found David Manu whose looped header beat Ash Jenkins before nestling in the corner of the goal. Soon afterwards Josh Oyibo unleashed a powerful shot and Ash produced a quality save to beat away the effort. It was only a temporary reprieve as Ryan Auger gave his side the lead on the hour mark. Jenkins was off his line and the home midfielder released a pinpoint chip that beat the keeper and sneaked just under the bar.

FC had already been heavily outplayed but as the pressure escalated, the team ceased to offer any type of attacking threat, and Bedford stepped up their game even further. Auger was enjoying himself. He cut in from the right and unleashed a shot with such power that it deflected off Jenkins' knee and ricocheted into the net.



The final goal was a foray into the box by Manu from the left and after finding the optimum angle, he guided a right foot shot past the keeper and into the bottom corner of the net.

Following an uneventful Easter period, with both scheduled games falling foul to the great British weather, the Moles travelled to Kempston Rovers still looking for their first win under new gaffer Kevin Poole and their first since Boxing Day.

Jordan Jenkins returned to the Starting XI following illness, replacing Derek Feyi in the centre defensive role. Jordan Rodgers partnered Tony Ngogu in the centre of the park, whilst Kieron Schmidt also returned to the line-up.

The host's recent form would have suggested that they were a much-improved side from the one that visited Haywood Way earlier in the season, and that proved to be correct, with the balance of play firmly with Rovers in the opening minutes. Munashe Sundire was having great success on the left flank, with Alex Woodfine struggling to stick with the full-back's pace, a superb ball into the path of Jake Newman was begging for a clean connection, but his effort was stabbed wide of Ashley Jenkins' front post. Moments later Robbie Goodman stung Jenkins' hands with a low driven shot, which was almost fumbled over the line.

The deadlock was broken in the 20th minute. Another dangerous ball this time via a free kick from the right was delivered into the FC box by Goodman, which was diverted into the net by the unfortunate Jordan Jenkins at the front post.

From kick off the Moles' created their best chance of the half, Anthony Ball played a superb ball from the defensive third into the path of Ty Deacon, who 1-on-1 with the home goalkeeper, after turning the final defender really should have done better but blazed his shot high over the crossbar to the relief of the home support.

Munashe Sundire had the opportunity to put Kempston two to the good but could only divert his low strike into the side netting.

The Moles came out fighting in the second period and looked to cause the Walnut Boys problems. The half was just moments old when Shane Almond delivered a corner kick to the front post where Jordan Jenkins looked to make a mend on his earlier own goal, he towered over his marker but could only direct his header over the crossbar.

The Moles continued to pressurise but couldn't find the killer pass through to goal. On 63 minutes they were punished. Crosses have been an Achilles Heel for FC this season, which proved to be the case once more. Ben Shepherd delivered a delightful ball to Robbie Goodman who was unmarked and on hand at the back post to nod home to double Kempston's lead.

The introduction of Kai Stubbs late on saw the nippy youngster get in behind the Kempston back line, with Shayne Almond unlocking the home defence on multiple occasions with clever through balls, however, each time Stubbs failed to steady himself bearing down on goal, with his shots failing to hit the mark.

Kempston had the opportunity to compile the misery on the Moles in the dying embers of the game, but Anthony Ball showed great tenacity to acrobatically clear a goal bound effort from Jermaine Ivy.

League roundup

The title race in the Evo-Stik League South East took another twist on Saturday after the top two failed to win and third-placed Beaconsfield Town hit seven against all-but doomed Arlesey Town.

AFC Rushden & Diamonds' lead at the top is just a point after they failed to take full advantage of second-placed Hayes & Yeading United's defeat at Aylesbury United. Diamonds drew 1-1 at Chestnut Avenue against lower mid-table Northwood, whose Evans Kouassi opened the scoring on the half-hour mark. Joel Gyasi equalised 5 minutes after the break, but the visitors, whose fans boosted the crowd to over

300, couldn't find a winner.

And a penalty converted by Ollie Hogg gave the Ducks victory at Chesham against Hayes & Yeading.

Beaconsfield took the number of goals conceded by bottom-markers Arlesey to 102 with a 7-0 demolition job at Holloways Park – the Bedfordshire side's second consecutive seven-goal loss and the 20th goal conceded in three games! However, it was only 2-0 with goals from Tony Mendy and Andre Costa when the visitors went down to ten-men 15 minutes from time for which Lee Barney added the third from the resulting penalty.

Barney went on to complete his hat-trick against the ten-men with Bajram Pashaj and Wes Daly adding the others.

The others in the top six looks like being occupied by Hartley Wintney, AFC Dunstable and Cambridge City after seventh-placed Chalfont St Peter could only draw 1-1 at Short Lane against Ashford Town (Middx), for whom Scott Weight's 22nd minute opener was cancelled out by Louis Stead after 36 minutes.

Cambridge beat Hartley Wintney 4-1 at St Ives with James Hall bagging a brace either side of Jordan Williams and Ryan Sharman efforts – Jake Baxter replying.

AFC Dunstable were held to a 0-0 draw at the Runnymede Stadium by Egham Town.

Bedford Town maintained their outside hopes alive with a 3-2 New Eyrie win over Marlow in which Bradley Woods-Garness bagged a brace, with veteran Paul Benson adding the third after Kelvin Bossman and Tommy Hull had pulled Marlow level.

Elsewhere, Goldy Capela scored twice for Hanwell Town at home to Moneyfields but it was only enough for a 3-3 draw as the visitors scored twice in the final 4 minutes through Brett Poate – at the right end after he'd scored an own goal earlier – and Joe Briggs.

Top marksman Dan West helped himself to a hat-trick as Thame United inflicted a 5-1 home drubbing on Uxbridge at Honeycroft – Lynton Goss and Luke Ricketts adding the others – all after Kevin Warner's 21st minute opener led at the break.

A Michael Gyasi goal 6 minutes into the second half sealed second-bottom Barton Rovers sixth win of the season at Sharpenhoe Road against the team immediately above them, Fleet Town, while a Jordan Rogers own goal and Robbie Goodman gave Kempston Rovers a 2-0 Hillgrounds win over Aylesbury FC.

In front of a crowd of 469, Diamonds were held to a 0-0 draw by neighbours Bedford Town, who maintained their own outside play-off hopes alive.

It was a very competitive encounter but neither side were able to convert their chances.

Hartley Wintney moved to within three points of Diamonds after beating mid-table Thame United 2-0 at The Memorial Fields.

But similar to at Rushden, the Hampshire side were frustrated until the 87th minute when Jake Baxter broke the deadlock to score at the near post.

And in stoppage time, Paul Hodges made the points safe when he finished off a terrific through ball from James Tennant.

The games at Aylesbury FC, Hanwell Town and Moneyfields were all off, leaving the only other game on being between Marlow and Fleet Town which saw the visitors win 2-1, thanks to a Graeme Purdy penalty after the hour-mark and Brad Wilson 13 minutes from time, with Curtis Chaple replying 5 minutes from time.

MY MUM is annoyed. Not, this time, at one of my life decisions. This time, it's a former England cricketer who has got her goat. Phil Tufnell. You have a lot to answer for.

A few weeks back on Question of Sport, it came to the questionable miming/description round.

Look, of course Question of Sport is not a thing to be getting riled up about. There are far more important issues going on in the world (like, why do self-service tills give 20p of change in coppers?) but it was a little window into how Non-League is perceived at times.

Yes, players are at this level for a reason but we all know about the talent pool outside the Football League. Many have had long successful professional careers and are winding down their days for enjoyment, others have cottoned onto the fact they can earn their best money by combining a decent job with a part-time football gig in the EVO-STIK North.

Clearly the players at the elite level are operating on a different planet but you get an equally, if not more so, entertaining 90 minutes in Non-League football.

I think first-timers are often surprised at how good the quality of play is at these levels. Throw in the rest of the package – cheaper entry, better food, drink in the bar before and

after – and it makes for an enjoyable day out.

Maybe it's a chip on the shoulder effect, but do you often feel like you have to defend Non-League football? Like when the FA Cup rolls around and all the Butcher, Baker and Candlestick maker stories appear in the national papers. 'He works on a building site and can pass the ball to a team-mate – it's incredible!'

Last season during Lincoln City's FA Cup run, a press box colleague asked if the Imps were full-time and did I know what jobs some of the players had before. Less than 20 minutes later, they'd knocked out Premier League Burnley to reach the FA Cup quarter-finals.

More and more players are getting their chance in the Football League and beyond – even the managers are being given a chance now as League chairmen realise the game is played on the same size pitch with goals at both ends.

So, let's keep fighting Non-League's corner. Even my mum is!



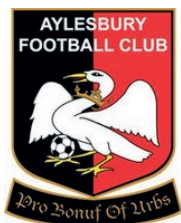
