


Good afternoon everyone and welcome to todays game. Also I would like to welcome the players, staff and fans of Hanwell Town to Haywood Way.

LAST TIME WE MET

A look back to a cold and wet afternoon at Reynolds Fields as the Moles came away with a vital win.

December 2nd 2017

Despite falling behind to a Hanwell goal, FC recovered well and responded with three goals of their own. An injury time goal for the home side caused one of two moments of concern but in the end, the Moles had done enough to earn the win.

FC brushed the outside of the post with the first move of the match as Kerran Lataille hit a decent enough strike from around 15 yards. Aston Goss then swung in a cross shot which home keeper Sam Bunting was grateful to hold onto. Town's Alfie Cain could have had a little more luck with a snapped effort on 12 minutes before ex Mole Glen Yala saw his blast blocked bravely by Jordan Jenkins.

Charlie Mitchell is one to watch judging by today's performance. FC keeper Ashley Jenkins somehow prevented a Mitchell goal with his shins. There was nothing Jenkins could do to prevent the winger giving his side the lead a few minutes later, as the winger broke into the box before hitting a rasping shot into the net.

Lataille's blocked shot hinted at a comeback. Garry Jones was the next FC man to have a strike and the full back was unlucky to see Bunting push his effort round the post. Lataille then snatched at the ball when he really needed to compose himself as his effort sailed over the bar. In the 39th minute however, FC did receive their reward for their hard work. Ty Deacon was adjudged to have been tripped. A penalty was awarded and up stepped the ever reliable Brian Haule to casually sweep home the equaliser.

The second half's first chance fell to home captain Oliver Duffy who was perhaps a little too casual when sidefooting the ball the wrong side of the post rather than on target. A delicate guided shot from Peter Dean also drifted wide as the home side made a positive start. All was in vain nevertheless when Ty Deacon scored a worldie of a goal. With his back to the goal, the striker swivelled and lifted the ball over the keeper from the outside of the box and into the net. The goal's quality was that good that





the deserved applause came not only from the FC contingent but also from the home fans too.

FC further extended their lead on 70 minutes. Hanwell had employed an offside trap to good effect but the trap was blown wide open as Brian Haule played an inch perfect pass to the galloping Aston Goss. Bunting advanced but Goss saw a chink of light and coolly tapped the ball under the keeper's body and into an empty net.

A home free kick deep into the minimum of four minutes added time saw Joe Chandiram rise at the far post to head past Jenkins and reduce the arrears. Further pressure from the home team resulted but a combination of defending and good luck allowed FC to ride the game out and claim all the spoils.

League roundup

With Evo-Stik League South East leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds once again inactive due to a waterlogged Hayden Road pitch, second-placed Beaconsfield Town took full advantage to close the gap at the top to five points on Saturday.

Beaconsfield won 5-0 at Holloways Park against Ashford Town (Middx), with the game being virtually all over bar the shouting at half-time with the hosts 4-0 up, thanks to Lee Barney after 23 minutes, Reece Yorke after 35 minutes, Alex Cathline 4 minutes later and a Bajram Pashaj penalty just before the break.

The inevitable quieter second half saw just Tony Mendy score a fifth as stoppage time approached.

Third-placed AFC Dunstable are two points further back after winning 2-0 at Creasey Park against Northwood. Nathan Frater's 28th minute effort separated the teams at the break, with BJ Christie adding a second for the hosts 10 minutes from time.

The remaining sides in the top six all drew.

Two of them, Chalfont St Peter and Hayes & Yeading United, shared a 11 draw with both goals coming within a minute of each other in the 4th and 5th minutes – Louis Stead for the Saints and Manny Duku for the visitors.

Hartley Wintney were held to a 2-2 draw by the team who came up with them, Moneyfields. Steve Duff gave visiting Hartley a 16th minute lead that Sam Pearce cancelled out right on half-time. Paul Hodges restored the visitors' lead just past the hour-mark, but Steve Hutchings levelled 2 minutes from time.

All that was good news for Cambridge City, whose 2.1 win at Honeycroft against Uxbridge moved them to within three points of the play-off places with games in hand. Ryan Sharman's 11th minute opener for City was eventually cancelled out by Cole Brown after 69 minutes, only for new signing Ebby Nelson-Addy to win it for the visitors 11 minutes from time.

Elsewhere, Fleet Town moved well clear of the drop zone after a 4-2 Calthorpe Park win over Thame United, coming back from being a 5th minute Liam Tack goal down to win. Toyosi Olusanya equalisedon the half-hour mark with Ashley Lloyd putting them in front 7 minutes later and then Chris Wales after 51 minutes and Brad Wilson on 65 minutes taking the game away from Thame, whose Lynton Goss had the last work in the 70th minute.

A 20th minute Olly Hogg goal proved enough for Aylesbury United at the Meadow against Marlow in the day's other game.

The gap at the top of the Evo-Stik League South East table is down to five points after Hayes & Yeading United moved into second spot following a hard-earned 1-0 win at leaders AFC Rushden & Diamonds.

The majority in the crowd of 433 at Hayden Road left disappointed when the visitors' goal a minute before half-time from former Spurs youngster Laste Dombaxe from 25 yards eventually proved decisive.

In the second half, Ryan Robbins beat Hayes 'keeper Zaki Oualah with a fine strike but not the post and it was going to be 'one of those night's for Diamonds.

Second-bottom Barton Rovers were hit for six at the New Eyrie by county neighbours Bedford Town.

It was 3-0 at the break, with veteran Paul Benson opening the scoring after 26 minutes followed by James Peters on 39 minutes and Lee Roache 3 minutes later.

Roache bagged his second and the Eagles fourth in the 56th minute, with Devante Stanley and Bradley Woods-Garness adding two more in the final few minutes.

Thame United beat third-bottom Hanwell Town 3.1 at home, coming back from being a 10th minute Joe Chandiram penalty down to win, courtesy of Dan West after 33 minutes, Aston Goss 3 minutes later and Liam Tack a minute from time.

Uxbridge and Egham Town shared a 11 Honeycroft draw in the evening's other game in which Sarnies sub Brendan Matthew grabbed an 82nd minute equaliser after Dylan Kearney had broken the deadlock to give the Reds the lead on the hour-mark.

A game each in the Evo-Stik League South West and South East on Wednesday night.

In the South East, Aylesbury United saw off fellow lower mid-table outfit Northwood 2-0 at the Meadow. Two goals in 3 minutes around the hour-mark from Aaron Berry secured the points for the Ducks.




