Now former manager Davis Haule started newcomer Joe Walls in right midfield, with some regular faces around the starting eleven. Three of the under 18s made up the bench.

Soon after came Moneyfields first real chance, with their attacker running towards the box, FC defender Derek Feyi brought down his opposing colleague and the referee gave a penalty. After much protestation from the Aylesbury players that the foul in fact took place outside the box, the ref consulted his linesman and a free kick was given, much to the dismay of the Moneyfields players. The resulting free kick was driven low and hard through the wall and was well saved by Ash Jenkins, who parried out the hard shot to be cleared.

Moneyfields first goal came from an unfortunate goalkeeping error, who by all accounts, Jenkins had had a fine game making many good saves. His goal kick only got so far as striker Hutchings, who gleefully

took the opportunity given to him and struck the ball home.

The second half resembled something more like the Royal Rumble, as players from both sides threw in the tackles. Davide Pobbé received a yellow after he tried to get the ball from a defender and went in too late. Moneyfields then caused more commotion after a rough tackle on Alfie Touceda who was through on goal, sparking mass protests from both sides as arguments broke out. Hutchings received a yellow card, generous after his persistent howling at the ref all game. The ref then inexplicably gave it as a drop ball...then realising it was actually a free kick to Aylesbury. Soon after a Kerran Lataille late tackle led to more midfielders congregations and eventually the game resumed.

As FC piled on the pressure late in the game to equalise from a free kick, Moneyfields countered when the ball came back out, and Howard Neighbour scored the Moneys second as Marvyn Watson was unable to clear the ball off the line.







Introducing Beaconsfield Town

Perhaps the surprise package of the season, the Rams of Beaconsfield are fighting for promotion into the Southern Premier League,

Gary Meakins Beaconsfield Town side sit in 2nd spot, an unfamiliar of recent years for Beaconsfield who are more used to sitting in mid table. However with the arrival of Meakins, formerly of Egham, the Rams have fought well and have surprised many by being serious promotion contenders.

A draw on monday night against Bedford Town saw the Rams lose the chance to go joint top with Rushden and Diamonds, who moved five points clear with their thrashing of Thame on Tuesday night.

With form dipping ever so slightly lately, with the home loss to Thame, a 4-3 loss to Kempston and the draw monday, Beaconsfield will be looking at todays game as an opportunity to get themselves back on par with Rushden and give some space between them and third place, to stay away from the lottery of the play offs.

League roundup

AFC Rushden & Diamonds managed to get their Hayden Road pitch fit for play on Tuesday night and were rewarded by hammering mid-table Thame United 6-0 to move five points clear at the top of the Evo-Stik League South East table.

In front of a crowd of 334, the game was virtually done and dusted by half-time with Diamonds 4-0 up.

Ryan Robbins gave the hosts a 14th minute lead that Joel Gyasi doubled on 32 minutes.

Ben Farrell made it 3-0 with 42 minutes gone on the clock, and a second for Robbins right on the stroke of half-time gave the Diamonds a commanding interval lead.

Farrell added his second to make it a nap hand for Andy Peaks' side just past the hour-mark, and when they were awarded a penalty 2 minutes from time, Robbins took the opportunity to complete his hat-trick.

The last time bottom-markers Arlesey Town won a league game was back on September 16th when they won 2-0 at Fleet Town.

They made it two away wins in hammering managerless Aylesbury FC 5-1 on their own patch.

It proved a great evening for the visitors' Tony Williams, who helped himself to a hat-trick in the 13th, 28th and 57th minutes.

Joe Steele on 59 minutes and, after Harry Scott had reduced the deficit for the Moles on 64 minutes, Arti Krasniqi on 73 minutes, completed the rout.

Hayes & Yeading United missed the chance to move into joint-third after losing 2-0 at the Runnymede Stadium to mid-table Egham Town.

The Sarnies, who beat Diamonds last time out, had a brace from Ryan Debattista in the 10th and 77th minutes to thank for the points.

In the evening's other game, Uxbridge sealed a 1-0 win at Chestnut Avenue against neighbours Northwood, courtesy of a goal 4 minutes into stoppage time at the end of the game from Luke Maguire.

BRestructuring of the National League System has been high on the agenda for Non-League football over the last 18 months with extra divisions to be introduced at Step 3 and 4 from next season. It will take the current Pyramid to four divisions at Step 3 and seven at Step 4. The Football Association have now released the provisional boundaries to give clubs and fans an idea of the changes.

As part of a partnership between The FA and The NLP to bring readers exclusive features and content relating to the Non-League game, this month's Football Matters focuses on how the decisions were made and what happens next.

Head of National League System Laurence Jones and National League System Manager Matt Edkins, explain all.

NLP: The changes have dominated the conversation for the best part of 18 months, but why now?

LJ: The world we live in is changing. The reconfiguration and reduction in divisional sizes is designed to create a National League System that reflects the challenges this level of the game faces.

There's no silver bullet. An incredible amount of work has gone into this. There's been a lot of consultation and discussion with a wide range of stakeholders involved in this level of the game.

There are some common and consistent themes coming through around travel time, reducing cost, player availability – particularly around midweek football. We've listened to,

and considered, all the feedback to look at how we can create this new structure.

NLP: What were the challenges in putting this together?

LJ: History is a challenge. Football doesn't always embrace change but, inevitably when you're introducing new divisions, there is going to be some movement. People have perhaps played in a certain league for many years and they are comfortable in that environment, I understand that.

But the National League System is just that. It is a structured Pyramid of football that covers the whole of the country and there has to be fluidity to enable clubs to move up and down.

The challenge is to look at the existing landscape and try to create a new one that doesn't make too much change but meets the needs of the world we live in.

NLP: Can you explain how the decisions for where the new divisions will be placed were made?

ME: It's important we have flexibility with the boundaries. At Step 4 we had a look at the key transport arteries. You have to start in the far north and work down the country.

We looked at the Dartford Crossing in the Isthmian area.

Historically it's been very difficult if there's a problem with the crossing – it's very hard to get around it. So for that particular reason the decision was made to keep the divisions north and south of the river.

There was a discussion around East Anglia and how that would fit in. There were alternatives but it was decided by the Leagues Committee that the boundaries we've put out are the best way forward.

At Step 3, it's often been dubbed as a Midlands Division – we feel that slightly differently and term it Central as it goes a bit wider than what you'd expect to call the midlands. That can all change depending on who gets promoted and relegated. We'll know more in the coming weeks.

NLP: You mentioned the Dartford Crossing and the M25 – three of the Step 4 leagues intersect it. That's obviously quite deliberate?

ME: What we've found – certainly in the two years since I've been here – is that people in the north don't fully understand the challenges in the south and vice-versa.

The committee have been very open and had those discussions to explain the problems in each part of the country. That's been very productive.

The Northern Premier League section of the map we've released will be split into two. The league will meet with their clubs to decide if they go with a north/south split or west/east.

Technically the Leagues Committee has the final say, but I think the views of those affected will be appreciated when making a decision about their competition.

There's been lots of discussion about getting more teams from the Northern League, for example, and the feedback from when we went to meet them in December.
