Aylesbury took a well earned three points against League newcomers & second placed Hartley Wintney with a brace from Jeanmal Prosper.

On a day where Storm Brian blew over the south of England and made conditions difficult, it was Aylesbury that blew away the opposition with an almost faultless display, two goals from Jeanmal Prosper and the first clean sheet of the season.

With James Weatherill out for what looks like most of the season and Ashley Jenkins suspended, Manager Davis Haule turned to the club's youth and drafted in U18s keeper Isaac Richmond for his first senior game. Joe Fitzgerald returned at right back with Garry Jones starting on the left and Craig Carby replacing the unavailable Ben Stevens in the heart of the defence. Also on the bench was Alfi Touceda. another young Mole with a



great future ahead of him.

It was Aylesbury, against the wind, that had the perfect start. Jeanmal Prosper picked the ball up mid way in the Wintney half and dribbled towards the area. with nothing else on he then struck a twenty five yard shot which flew past Paul Strudley in the away goal for an FC lead. The away side though almost struck back immediately when a ball into the box bobbled around, wasn't cleared and fell to a Wintney striker but Isaac Richmond was on hand to block the shot from

close range and the ball was cleared.

The goal seemed to give the team confidence and although conditions were difficult it was the home side that were in control. On twelve minutes Aston Goss playing in the centre of midfield, found Harry Scott on the left with a probing ball, Scott cut inside past two defenders but his thunderous shot was palmed away for a corner by Strudley. Soon after it was Prosper with a raking pass out to Scott on the left, his ball inside found Ty Deacon in the area who

eventually passed the ball into the onrushing Prosper but his shot was again blocked for a corner.

On thirty five minutes young Richmond was again called into action when a through ball into Jake Baxter found the Wintney forward one on one with the young keeper but he was more than a match for the striker and smothered the chance. Just on half time and there was another opportunity for FC, a ball in from Deacon found Brian Haule in the box but he just couldn't make a full connection and the opportunity was spurned.

The wind was starting to get stronger as the second half began and now with the wind at their backs there was an air of confidence that was flowing through the home side, Aston Goss, making full use of the wind fired in a free kick from fully thirty five yards which was tipped round the post, then a minute later the marauding Harry Scott, who was giving Callum Eagle at right back a game he'll want to forget, thundered in a right foot shot which was brilliantly turned over by the away keeper.

Then on sixty minutes Aylesbury got the second goal that their play deserved, an Aston Goss corner was met at the near post by Prosper who flicked it home for his second of the game and what the fans hoped would be the winner.

The away side were struggling with the conditions but did have a couple of half chances against the run of play ,Adam




Everiss beat Joe Fitzgerald and Davis Haule and his ball to the back post wasn't quite met by Adam New at the back post. Garry Jones then cleared off the line after a speculative strike but the chances were few and far between as FC found a new resiliance at the back. Alfi Touceda got a couple of minutes at the end of the game and immediately showed why he is thought of so highly with a lovely bit of interplay in the middle of the park. It ended in a deserved win for the home side and we now go to Beaconsfield on Monday evening for another game against a top six side.

We take a look at our FA Trophy opponents today, The Hawks, the first meeting between the two sides in any competition.

The Essex side gained promotion from the Ryman Divison One North in the 2015/16 season, finally overcoming their play-off hoodoo in the final defeating AFC Hornchurch in front of a home growd of 1655

The Hawks finished strongly in their first season in the Ryman Premier with a 10th placed finish and 67 points to their name, a finish to proud of indeed as many struggle to adapt to life at Step 3 football.

Harlow are managed by Danny Chapman, who has made over 200 appearances for the Hawks having first signed for the club in 2003. Chapman left the club in December 2008, but returned in February 2010. He was appointed as the club's manager in February 2011 leading them to the Ryman Division One North Play off Semi-Final and eventually winning the play-offs in the 2015/16 season.

Harlow, much like Aylesbury, made a slow start to their league season, with four losses and one win from their opening five games. Results picked up around the beginning of September with victories in the league and cup, but the drop in form returned as they stayed just above the relegation zone.

Harlow have had a tough season so far and currently sit in the 22nd place with 12 points from 14 games. They lost recently in the league to the leaders Dulwich Hamlet at Champion Hill, 4-0 to the boys in pink and blue. A 1-1 home draw against Margate on saturday put one more point on the board for the Hawks, and an Essex cup game on tuesday went to penalties, with Harlow winning 5-4 eventually.

Dangermen to look out for at the moment are definitely Alex Read and Reece Dobson up front who have been banging in the goals.

Club History

The club's first match was played on 18 October 1879 against Saffron Walden. In 1898 the club merged with Netteswell and Burnt Mill and were renamed Harlow and Burnt Mill F.C and rejoined the East Herts League. The merger was reversed in 1902.

In 1954 the club joined the Premier Division of the London League. In 1960 they won the League Cup, and moved to the newly-built Sportcentre on Hammarskjold Road. In 1961 they switched to the Delphian League. In 1963 it merged into the Athenian League and the club were placed in Division Two. After finishing third in 1963-64, they were promoted to Division One. Due to Harlow's facilities at the Sportcentre, the club attracted well-known teams to the area during this period. In July 1966 Harlow Town arranged a friendly match against Uruguay, who were staying nearby in preparation for that summer's FIFA World Cup. Uruguay defeated Harlow 6-1. In 1968, S.L. Benfica reached the European Cup final against Manchester United at Wemblev Stadium, and prepared for the final at the Sportcentre; their team included the 1966 World Cup Golden Boot winner Eusébio. In 1971-72 the club won Division One, and were promoted to the Premier Division of the Athenian League. In 1973 the club switched to Division Two of the Isthmian League, renamed Division One in 1977. In 1978-79 they won Division One and were promoted to the Premier Division

The 1979–80 season saw the club make its best-ever run in the FA Cup. They entered at the preliminary round, beating Lowestoft Town, Homchurch, Bury Town, Harwich Parkeston and Margate to reach the first round proper for the first time, where they defeated Leytonstone/Ilford 2–1. In the second round

they drew 1–1 away at Football League side Southend United before winning the replay at the Sportcentre 1–0 in front of 5,000 spectators. The club were then drawn away to Second Division leaders Leicester City. After a 1–1 draw at Filbert Street, Harlow famously won the replay at the Sportcentre 1–0, watched by a club-record attendance of 9,723. In the fourth round Harlow were drawn away to Watford, Iosing 4–3.

In 1981–82 the club were relegated, but returned to the Premier Division after a single season in Division One. However, two consecutive relegations in 1984–85 and 1985–86 saw the club drop into Division Two North. In 1988–89 they won the division and returned to Division One.

The club's plans to leave the Sportcentre for a new stadium on Roydon Road collapsed during the 1991–92 season, and the Isthmian League closed the Sportcentre after it no longer met league requirements. The team fulfilled the remainder of their home games at local venues including Sawbridgeworth, Bishop's Stortford, Ware and Aveley. The club dropped out of football for the 1992–93 season.

Upon being voted back into the Isthmian League for the 1993–94 season after upgrading the Sportcentre, the club were forced to drop into Division Three. In 1997–98 they were promoted to Division Two, and the following season were promoted to Division One. In 2004 the club were transferred to Division One East of the Southern League, but returned to the Isthmian League in 2006.

In October 2006 the club moved to its new ground at Barrow's Farm. After finishing as runners-up in Division One North in 2006–07

they won the promotion play-offs and were promoted to the Premier Division after defeating A.F.C. Sudbury in the final. However, they were relegated back to Division One North at the end of the 2008-09 season. In January 2010 new owners took control of the club, with former manager Tommy Cunningham returning to the club alongside business partner John Barnett. 2010-11 saw Kevin Warren become the Hawks manager, but a run of defeats led to Danny Chapman replacing him at the helm. Chapman then turned the tide and took the club to the Division One North play-offs after finishing fourth, but failed to reach the final after being defeated by Wingate & Finchley.

At the start of the 2014-15 Harlow Town launched The Harlow Academy, a youth set-up which incorporated 21 youth teams playing at The Harlow Arena. After a tightly contested league campaign, Harlow missed out the league title and automatic promotion by one point, finishing behind Needham Market. Another play-off campaign beckoned, but Harlow lost 4-3 to Thurrock in the semi-finals after extra-time.

2015-16 saw Harlow Town go on a club record streak of 12 consecutive wins between 19 December 2015 and 13 February 2016, propelling themselves into the play-offs, finishing the season in third place, setting up a third consecutive appearance in the play-offs. The Hawks hosted A.F.C. Homchurch in the final at the Harlow Arena, where 1,655 spectators saw Harlow claim promotion to the Premier Division with a 3-1 win. 2016-17 saw Harlow achieve a new club record highest league finish of tenth in the Isthmian Premier Division, their first campaign at this level since 2000.

The manager

Danny Chapman, an experienced Defender who has made over 200 appearances for the Hawks having first signed for the club in 2003, after spells with the likes of Barnet and Wingate & Finchley. Chapman left the club in December 2008, but returned in February 2010. He was appointed as the club's manager in February 2011 leading them to the Ryman Division One North Play off Semi-Final. He led Harlow to a play-off finall victory the year after, winning promotion to the Ryman Premier league.

Hughes started his career at Thurrock FC, coming through their youth set-up, and became a first team regular at the Ship Lane outfit in 2010-11. Hughes was awarded the Supporters' Player of the Year in 2016-17 following the Club's first season back in the Isthmian Premier Division.



Ben McNamara

Signed on dual registration with Dagenham & Redbridge.

The Australian keeper has also featured between the sticks for Concord Rangers, Northampton Town, Nuneaton Town and Hendon.



James Baker

Baker signed for the Hawks in June 2017 from AFC Sudbury, where he had played 302 games for the Suffolk club, scoring 97 goals in the process. Originally a forward target man, Baker made the successful switch to centre back during the 2014-15 campaign. He was awarded the Sudbury Supporters' Player of the Year on three occasions, in 2014, 2015 and 2017.



Charlie Dickens

Charlie Dickens signed for the Hawks in November 2016. He can play at either centre back or left back. After some impressive initial performances for the Hawks, the young defender had played his way into a regular starting place in the team, featuring 19 times by the end of the 2016-17 season.



Craig Pope

A solid right back or central defender, Craig Pope joined the Hawks from AFC Sudbury in February 2015.

He is strong and powerful with plenty of experience in the upper levels of the non-league pyramid, and was made Harlow Town captain at the start of the 2015-16 season.



Jimmy Shepherd Jimmy Shepherd joined the Hawks from Dagenham

Jimmy Shepherd joined the Hawks from Dagenham & Redbridge in July 2017. Shepherd worked his way up through the Daggers' academy, impressing at Under 18's level before earning a full-time contract and breaking into the first team towards the end of the 2015-16 season. Jimmy can play at right full-back or centre-back, and can also provide cover in defensive midfield.



Jey Siva

Jey Siva is a Danish defender who plays at left back. He signed for the Hawks in October 2017.

He was a member of the Isthmian Premier Division title winning Wealdstone side of 2013/14, and he has also featured for Tonbridge Angels, Enfield Town, Grays Athletic, Leatherhead and Cray Wanderers.

Fabion Simms

Signed for the Hawks in March 2014 from Potters Bar Town. The 25 year old was a regular in the starting line-up for bar. Can play in Midfield and is just as happy in the Centre Half position. Was last season's Players Player of the year.



Jared Small



Syrus Gordon

Joined The Hawks in August 2015, 24 year old midfielder who previously played for Cheshunt.



Junior Dadson

27 year old winger who re-joined the Hawks in December 2014 from VCD Athletic. A very quick player who can play on the left or right wing, he terrifies defenders with the ball at his feet.



Nigel Neita

Nigel Neita is a pacy attacker who can play as a forward, in attacking midfield or out wide on the wing. He signed for the Hawks in August 2017. Neita came through the Millwall academy before joinging Arsenal at youth level. He was unable to break into the senior side and signed for Dulwich Hamlet in 2013.



Andrea Mayasi

Andréa Kimpala Mayasi is a young French left back who first signed for the Hawks at the end of the 2016-17 season.

He re-joined Harlow Town in August 2017.

Ibrahima Sonko

He started his career in France before moving to Brentford. He then spent four years at Reading, helping the Royals reach the Premier League, before commanding a £2m transfer fee when he joined Stoke in 2008. Several more teams in England followed, before a 3-year stint in the Turkish top division. He has also represented Senegal at international level.



Nathan Livings

25-year-old midfielder who joined the Hawks in August 2017, spent the last 2 seasons at Enfield Town having had experience with Concord Rangers and East Thurrock. Prior to that, he was on the books of Chelsea, Bristol City, Sollefteå GIF (Sweden) and Bishop's Stortford.



Tommie Fagg

Tommie Fagg is a graduate of the Soccer Elite Football Academy, and played for Kent side Ashford United. The tall striker signed for the Hawks in February 2016 to bolster the attack, making six appearances as the Hawks eased to a mid-table finish in the Isthmian Premier Division. In June 2017 he signed a one year contract to commit himself to the Club for the forthcoming 2017-18 season.



Reece Dobson

Reece Dobson is a forward who can play through the middle or out wide on the left. He previously had spells with the Hawks between 2009 and 2013, but rejoined from Needham Market in July 2017. He played at Takeley, Bishop Stotford, Hertford Town and Royston Town before joining Norwegian professional side Flekkeroy in 2015. He then joined Needham Market where he was a vital player in their 2016-17 campaign.



Alex Read

27 year old striker who signed for Harlow in July 2013 from Essex neighbours Aveley. Now in his third season with the club after breaking the clubs goal scoring record in 2013-14 with a magnificent 52 league and cup goals, he rattled in another 42 in the 2015-15 season. Read has also scored over 50 combined goals for Tilbury, Brentwood Town and Aveley. Quick, tricky and certainly knows where the back of the net is.

After a quick pre-match visit to what can only be described as the best service station in the world, we made the long journey across the road to Holloways Park, only to be dealt some devastating news – the ref couldn't see the white lines, putting the game in jeopardy.

Cometh the hour, cometh the man, the Beaconsfield groundskeeper sacrificed his dinner to mark down some fresh lines, and thank goodness he did, as a second half Aylesbury FC masterclass was to follow.

Looking to build on their first clean sheet of the season two days earlier Davis Haule kept faith in the same back four as Saturday, with Ashley Jenkins also returning. A fresh-faced front three of Harry Scott, Ty Deacon and debutant Davide Pobbe ooked to inject some pace into the side.

Neither team started with any real conviction — we'll put that down to the prolonged warm ups. The first opportunity of any note fell to Davide Pobbe on 13 minutes, after Kieran Schmidt slotted a beautifully weighted ball between the two Beaconsfield centre-halves. Jamie Norris unleashed his inner Manuel Neuer to charge off his line to clear before Pobbe could shoot.

Chances were few and far between for either team in the first period – a very cagey affair in midfield, the Moles having a fair share of possession, but Beaconsfield countering very effectively, with Andre Costa causing Joe Fitzgerald issues down the left-hand side. However, Jordan Jenkins and Craig Carby were standing strong in defence making clearance after clearance from any crosses into the box. Wes Daly and Dan Brown resorted to pot shots which posed little threat to the FC goal. Later the latter went close on 33 minutes, Jordan Jenkins saving well with his legs from close range.

And that ladies and gents, was half time – at this point, not worth the wait. However, the



FC beast was soon to be released. It took a mere 6 minutes for Aylesbury to find their feet and the back of the net in the second half – on 51 minutes Harry Scott showed skill, speed and composure to beat his man, picked his spot in the top right-hand corner and curled a beauty past the bewildered Jamie Norris in the Rams' net.

The hosts pressed for an equaliser, with FC leaking goals from set pieces recently a well delivered corner kick could have spelt trouble - on 58 minutes Dan Brown saw his first header cleared acrobatically off the line by defensive stalwart and ex-Ram Craig Carby before seeing his second effort ricochet off the inside of the post. Brows mopped, the Moles looked for a second goal, and that's exactly what they got. Somehow even better than his first goal, Harry Scott picked up a loose ball in midfield, twisted, turned and pulled the trigger from 25 yards, the keeper purely a spectator, sending the loyal FC supporters into raptures.

After this setback the home side resorted to long ball football – Scott Cousins picked out Aaron Minhas who really should have pulled one back for his side from close range, but his header was saved brilliantly

by Ashley Jenkins.

The hosts would soon rue this missed opportunity, as on 77 minutes Ty Deacon was played through by Brian Haule, who sent his marker for a metaphorical hot-dog (other snacks available from the tea bar) before coolly curling his effort past Norris – a torrid night for the home stopper. Lewis Putman had a late chance to spoil the clean sheet, but again returning keeper Ashley Jenkins remained alert to get down low to save his goal bound header.

All in all, a well-deserved three points – the first away triumph of the season. UNILAD should really pump some more money into Beaconsfield Town.







MY LOVE OF NON-LEAGUE FOOTBALL

IN THE BEGINNING

I've been watching Non-League football on a regular basis since I was 10 years old. What I like most is that the players, club officials and supporters are there for the love of the game. The true spirit of football exists at Non-League level.

I grew up in North-West London and I was taken by my family to see my local club QPR as a child in the 1970's.

I've always supported the R's as my Football League team, but when they were playing away from home I started going to see my local Non-League clubs – Hendon primarily, but also Finchley, Barnet and Edgware Town.

GROUNDHOPPER

From there, I decided to visit every Non-League club in London as my groundhopping bug began. By the time I was 17, I had visited all 92 Football League grounds and I visited all the Scottish League grounds whilst still a teenager.

Since then, I've continued travelling all around the country to visit Non-League clubs. Last season, I chalked up my 2,000th ground at FC United of Manchester.

WORLD RECORD

One of the best groundhops was being part of a world record in March 2004. I joined 250 other groundhoppers to watch five matches at five different football grounds in one day in the Central Midlands League.

This is listed in the Guinness Book of Records and we received certificates confirming the world record at the end of the fifth game.

INSIDE PRISON!

In December 2011, I set about watching a match inside Feltham Prison in Middlesex.

This featured a team called Phoenix FC, who had to play all their fixtures at home (for obvious reasons!) as inmates of the Young Offender Institution at Feltham.

I received special permission by email to attend a fixture, but I was told not to bring a phone or a camera with me. I was instructed to arrive in the main car park along with the match referee and the visiting players from Hanworth Villa Vets.

We were met by members of the

prison staff who escorted us all in together...via an airport-style metal detector, a body search, numerous locked gates and along a path to the changing rooms.

This process took 45 minutes. After the players and ref got changed, we were then accompanied through more locked gates out to the playing area.

A high mesh fence with barbed wire on top surrounded the foot-ball pitch. There were dug-outs along one touchline and I watched the match from there as the only spectator.

THE FUTURE

I have now been to 2,173 football grounds and have completed visits to the all the grounds in the top 16 divisions of English football down to Non-League step 4. Then at Step 5 I need 19 grounds and another 59 at Step 6.

There are endless possibilities at step 7 and below, where I've already visited many grounds. Also, I've been to 35 European countries plus the USA for football – so it would be nice to visit more countries.




