

Today's Opposition - Cobham RFC

Cobham RFC was formed in 1930 as Old Surbitonians RFC by the first group of school leavers from Surbiton County School, as it was then called. The school, which added 'Grammar' to its title in the 1940s to become Surbiton County Grammar School, was always known for its excellence in sport especially athletics, boxing, cricket and, in particular, rugby. Throughout the 1930s and 1940s, Old Surbitonian teams had no home ground but often used the school's facilities in Somerset Avenue in Hook, as well as grounds in the Kingston area, including the Kingstonians' ground in Richmond Road. Several 'Surbitonians' lost their lives fighting for their country in the Second World War, close friends and old school chums of those Old Boys who, in 1949, bought the present ground in Fairmile Lane. Cobham. It was fitting that the ground was dedicated to the memory of those who had died: the Old Surbitonians' Memorial Ground came into existence - at a cost of £4.500, with ex-Army section huts put together as a pavilion. DIY skills provided brick changing rooms and a washing area, complete with a series of tin baths. Main drainage came a few years later. The members, who were, of course, also the players, worked hard to provide a very cosy atmosphere inside the building and 'Old Surbs' were well known for the warm welcome they gave to visitors. By 1968, the former army facilities needed replacing and a new pavilion had to be built. Regrettably, the condition of this newer building deteriorated badly over the years and the size became inadequate for the growing membership and activities. In 2007, work began on a new clubhouse which involved demolishing the previous structure, adding new changing rooms and completely re-vamping the inside layout to reflect the steady growth in membership of the Club, especially at Youth and Mini Rugby levels. The new clubhouse, named 'The Peter Marsh Pavilion' after a longtime Club member and benefactor, was officially opened in September 2008. In the 1960s, Surbiton County Grammar School was moved into the Surrey administrative area to Esher, to become, eventually, Esher College for mixed 6th-form students only. The popularity for team games on the curriculum diminished, thus ending the natural feeding of players to the Old Surbitonians. This provided the driving force for the Club to become one of the first in the country to set up a Mini-Rugby section in its Golden Anniversary year of 1980. The Senior teams enjoyed a highly successful history over many years, including the famous unbeaten season of 1963-64 and a Surrey Cup Final appearance in 1976, but the introduction of league rugby by the RFU placed Old Surbitonians RFC in the new Surrey leagues. Although Club membership was now open to non-Old Boys, it became increasingly difficult to recruit new players.

Consequently, the Club changed its name in 1989 to Cobham Rugby Football Club to identify more closely with the immediate area and to reinforce the change to an open club.

However, to keep former players in touch with the Club, The Braemar Club came into existence and within its ranks are the remnants of the Old Surbitonians who still have a special place within the new Cobham Club. The 1sts, under the stewardship of Director of Rugby, Billy Davison from 2006, continued to make steady progress up the leagues. This included with two consecutive promotions in 2006 and 2007 and in 2012 they were winners of the Surrey Trophy. In summer 2014, after eight sterling years as Director of Rugby at Cobham, Billy Davison retired from that role and the Club appointed Mike Cudmore as the new Director of Rugby for Cobham RFC for the 2014/5 season. In 2015/16 season, Steve Pope replaced Mike Cudmore as Director of Rugby and secured promotion for the first XV back to London South 1 for the 2016/7 season.



Power Cuts, Storm Eunice, Horsham - nothing can stop Cam claiming another 5 points by Roger Berry

This Saturday got off to a very inauspicious start with the hosts, Horsham struggling to organise some form of power at their clubhouse following the passage of Storm Eunice on Friday.

To their immense credit the Sussex club worked a minor miracle to ensure that the game would be played, acquiring 2 temporary and sometimes temperamental generators to support some of the basic functions required eg the pre match lunch was reported to have been delicious but eaten in semi darkness.

Despite this distraction the game was always going to present a major challenge to Cam for whom this was the 7th game on the bounce since the start of the year, knowing that any slip up would seriously dent their ambition to win the League.

So the side emerged from their dimly lit changing room to discover that what was clearly 'the son of Eunice' was upon them, heavy rain, which persisted for at least 40 mins, carried by a biting wind which cut through to the marrow of anyone foolhardy enough to be watching events from the touchline.

In the end, despite these poor conditions, we witnessed a full on clash between 2 sides both desperate to claim the honours and despite a fighting display by the green and whites, Cam, although nowhere near their fluent best, just had too much power up front and so claimed the 5 points and in doing so ended Horsham's recent good run while extending their own winning run to 13 games.

The game started with Horsham playing with the wind and from the off they moved to the Cam 5m line with an excellent 50/22 kick but despite a mean looking lineout drive the black and amber's defence stood firm and eventually the pressure was released and Cam slowly took play upfield however they suffered the loss of ever present Big Dom with and injured ankle but with about 15 mins played the black and ambers had a series of scrums in the Horsham redzone and it was clear that there was only ever going to be one winner in this area of play and after what seemed an age the official awarded Cam a penalty try and Horsham were temporarily reduced to 14.

Almost from the restart we saw a flash of Cam magic when, after driving the Horsham pack backwards at a scrum in the Cam 22 the ball came to Josh Wright who released The Fireman and he raced up the touchline before drawing the last defender before putting Ash over for an unconverted try with 20 mins played.

The second quarter saw Cam disjointed and lacking in concentration and this allowed the home side to come back into things with a successful drive of their own and on the stroke of half time they scored again to bring the scores level at 12 each.
