

Today's Opposition - London Cornish RFC

London Cornish RFC is a rugby union club which was originally formed for Cornish expats in London, England. It was established in 1962 by a group who met in Fleet Street's Cock Tavern, and were originally known as the Cornish Exiles. The club changed its name to London Cornish shortly thereafter and played occasional fixtures in a variety of locations until moving to the current ground, the Richardson Evans Memorial Playing Fields just off the A3 and the current venue for the Rosslyn Park 7s. These grounds have been rented to the club ever since by Wimbledon and Putney Common Conservators. The club moved their once a week training venue to Rosslyn Park FC's all weather surface at the start of the 2016-17 season, and their post match venue to the Roehampton CC Clubhouse at the same time. With no direct and sustainable sources of income, players at LCRFC have to pay £200 per annum to play for the club. The advent of the League system saw London Cornish join the Middlesex Division and there they stayed until the season of 1997–98 when the club transferred to Surrey 3. After one season in the new league, London Cornish saw improvements, achieving four promotions in seven years. A decade at Level 7 followed, but following 2 Play-Off defeats when finishing 2nd in London 2 South West in 2014-15 and 2015-16, London Cornish stormed to the title in 2016-17, registering the league's first ever 22 match unbeaten season in the process. In 2017-18 and 2018-19, with the club playing at its highest ever level, the Level 6 London 1 South, Cornish finished in a creditable 8th place, before a late winning run saw the club retain their status with an 11th-place finish in 2019-20. The 2020-21 season was cancelled as a result of the COVID-19 pandemic. London Cornish run 3 teams, all of which compete in leagues. The current Director of Rugby and Head Coach, Redruth born Dickon Moon, took on the role at the start of 2003-04, having joined the club from Old Patesians RFC. Dickon was voted Middlesex RFU Volunteer of the Year in 2014 and was awarded the Paul Smales Medallion for 'Services to Cornwall from a Cornishman living outside Cornwall' in 2015, the citation given for 'Outstanding service to Cornish rugby'. From Dec 2021 he is supported by Head Coach Paul Spivey.



CAM MAINTAIN PUSH FOR TOP SPOT WITH 6 TRY WIN AT FARNHAM

Following both sides outstanding wins last week this game was always destined to be a disappointment for one of the clubs and in the end the black and ambers side just had too much power for their local rivals in a very scrappy derby played in bright sunshine but with a cold breeze blowing directly down the pitch making kicking in particular very difficult.

With both sides forced to make multiple changes in this rearranged fixture we saw Cam starting with a new 9/10 combination plus changes in the pack and threequarters, it was clear to the Watchetts faithful that this game was a definite banana skin but despite making hard work of things, particularly in the first 40, the black and ambers eventually did enough to claim their 5 point maximum and maintain their pressure at the top of the table.

The game saw the home side kicking off into a stiff breeze which H took advantage of by putting the ball into touch on the Farnham 10m and with Cam pinching the Farnham throw things looked promising but despite the first scrum collapsing Farnham managed to get the ball back into the Cam half. Cam again stole the ball and we saw H make a thrilling 40m break only for the final pass to go forward when it seemed easier to score than not.

Farnham then threatened briefly but great D and a couple of pens saw Cam move back into the Farnham 22 and a great drive from the lineout saw the ball suddenly played out wide with Liam setting up George for the first try on 13 mins.

Cam were soon back on the attack following a break by Fireman George and a clever kick pass by Liam almost made it to Oyoni but play moved back to halfway with Cam conceding far too many penalties but when The Warrior's smash tackle created a turnover we saw Jaid pick a great line and take the ball deep into the redzone before Birdy claimed his first of the afternoon with just 19 mins played.

The rest of the half saw both sides struggling to settle into the game with far to many silly errors with new combinations on both sides struggling for some sort of fluidity and with the black and ambers clearly not managing the official at all they were forced to play the last 8 mins with 14 men.

Despite this we did see a great break by Ash supported by BLS but the flanker, fresh from his dose of Covid, just running out of gas a couple of meters short with official blowing for the break.

The second half saw Cam again conceding penalties and with 7 mins played an interception by the Farnham winger saw him out gas the Cam defence to score a converted try and bring the game to within 1 score.

However Cam reclaimed their restart through Shawa and the ball was moved out to Jaid who, spotting loads of space behind their backs cleverly chipped ahead for George, again taking play back into the Farnham redzone.

We then saw a series of scrums with the official deciding that the home side were offending and after several resets their prop took a yellow for the team.

Skipper Birdy opted for a scrum at each penalty award and finally the home side were driven back over their line for another touchdown for Birdy and even a smile on the face of that old, retired Camberley hooker who was still pacing around on the touchline with his kit in the car JiC, and with Liam's kick into the wind successful the score moved to 7-19 on 53 mins.

Things were still very scrappy overall and the penalty count was far too high but next we saw a simple move from a solid scrum, missed pass and winger Oyoni pinning his ears back on the home 10m line to cross in the corner. A magnificent kick by Liam, considering the very strong breeze in his face, saw the lead move to 19 points and the tbp claimed.

On a chilly but dry day, the team turned up to play their first waterfall cup match on the 1st XV pitch. An exciting prospect as they embarked on their first full 50 minute match.

From the very start the boys looked up for it. Good early pressure kept the play down in the opposition half and after 2 or 3 phases of good attacking play, Louis went over for the first try after a very good break by Will (E).

From the re-start, the intensity was still at a high level, Josh making a great tackle and strong rucking putting Camberley on the front foot again. A super cross field kick by Will dropped nicely and almost resulted in a try for Alex (T), whose chase was perfect, but just couldn't gather this time.

Play continued and another opening was marginally knocked on and resulted in a breakaway try for Whitgift's right winger, who showed good pace, despite valiant cover attempts by George and Will.

Not deterred by this minor setback, Camberley continued to play strong aggressive rugby, especially in defence and won key rucks in the middle of the field. As a result, the next few minutes, saw two tries scored, firstly Josh who took a pass in space and sped down the left wing, beating his man and leaving others in his wake and then almost immediately from the restart Rosko took advantage of a wayward Whitgift pass to go over.

With halftime approaching, Whitgift refused to go away. They were awarded a penalty on the halfway line and from the tap, their strong running right wing went though untouched, again their try felt slightly against the run of play, but it was a reminder to the boys, that they had some decent players, who could do some damage.

Once again though the response by Camberley was fantastic and a two scrums won against the head in our half saw Will take the ball as first receiver and he took advantage of gaps opening up with a quick and powerful run resulting in try. The second scrum saw Rosko go over for a another try. Wonderful intensity in the first half, typified by great rucking and counter rucking, with Christopher instrumental in a lot of this excellent, but often unseen work. Aggressive tacking led by Alex and backed up by everyone, never really let Whitgift settle and resulted in some very good tries.

In the second half the team changes made little difference to the intensity of Camberley's early play and almost straight from the start, Will (Billy) made a great break, but was slowed 5 or so metres from the line. Nice offload to Ben (H) who ran over for a try. It wasn't long before Camberley were piling on the pressure again. Another scrum won against the head resulted in a great run from George, quick re-cycling from Cillian and Beau went over for a nice try. Another try quickly followed with a quick sniping run from Cillian who showed good strength to force himself over. This try ended the match giving Camberley a 6 try lead. Both teams played on the remaining 5 minutes, Whitgift won a penalty and again, their strong running right winger went over to make the score. Camberley continued to play some good rugby and Billy made a wonderful tackle to stop another Whitgift attack. Whitgift did eventually run in another try. Then from a scrum, a nice passing move down the line, gave Josh some space and he used his pace to run to the corner for a try. Final score went to Whitgift who bundled over from short distance.
