CAM MAINTAIN THE PRESSURE AT THE TOP by Neil Doody

Camberley travelled for their first ever visit to Oxford Harlequins taking a strong looking side. They faced the fourth placed team who had won their first five matches then the most recent three. Oxford kicked off in blustery conditions under floodlights on their RFU surface. But they soon were under pressure from Camberley as the pack secured an early scrum and from the resulting penalty kick to the corner followed by the line out drive over went prop Greg Franzel. But the hosts fought back after 9 minutes with an interception 30 metres out leading to a try in the corner.

Camberley soon returned to dominating the territory and were rewarded in 14 minutes with another line out after the penalty award and prop Greg was driven over again the try converted by Liam Prescott. Eight minutes later and another attack saw wing George Owen score the third try. Undeterred by these tries Oxford set up an attack leading to an unconverted score in the corner to give a 19 – 10 scoreline to Camberley in 25 minutes. The score by the hosts set the scene for immediate attacking by Cam and at 30 minutes with a massive forwards drive over went Greg for his third try and the bonus point secured. Oxford hit back and with Camberley defence magnificently staving off a series of assaults in their line. Camberley broke away and with the 22 in sight a fine kick to the left was duly gathered by George slotting down in the corner for his second try after 30 minutes converted by Liam and the score move to 31–10. This was the interval score.

With the kick off to Camberley starting the second half they remained in an attacking position with the reward after 3 minutes as over bulldozed right wing Josh Lewanituva. But brave Oxford hit back ten minutes later scoring after unshackling the intense pressure by breaking way to score a converted try. So at the 25 minute mark it was 36-17 to Camberley. But yet again the Cam pack drove forward aided by their fine backs. So in five more minutes the pressure was on the line and over went skipper Chris Bird and with the conversion by Liam it was 43-17. Camberley were not finished yet as with ten minutes remaining this time with the attack set up yet again the try scorer was lock Dom Sammut with Liam converting seeing the fifty points up at 50-17.

The match closed with a series of well worked attacks and good handling seeking the fourth try by gallant Oxford. But no further scores as the final tally was 50 - 17. Once more a fine Camberley win scoring 8 tries. The side was led by the consistent and outstanding pack and with the backs always pressuring the opposition. So Camberley remain in second place. They welcome Havant to Watchetts next Saturday keen to avenge the early season only loss





We mourn a Camberley legend

Words from Chris Gibson:

It's with great sadness that I share the news that former President and Captain of Camberley, Harry Gibson, passed away on the 16th November whilst on holiday in Mexico.

Harry, a tight head prop, joined Camberley in 1968 and played until 1980 with a short break between 1974-76 when he was based in Madrid working for Shell. Harry was Captain of the Club from 1971-1973 and led the Club to its first Surrey Cup triumph in March 1973 in a 12-10 victory over Guildford & Godalming scoring the winning points with a touch line conversion.

Harry was elected President of the Club in 1993 a term he held until 1996, which coincided with the Club winning the Surrey Cup for the 2nd time and a couple of league titles.

As a family we would like to thank everybody who has sent their condolences and memories of Harry, they have helped provide some bright moments as we come to terms with the shock of his sudden passing.

Stuart and our sons played together with several talented boys in an all-conquering under 6 team, that progressed through the ages. Peter was famous for organising mini-junior rugby festivals with military precision.

At under 12s, coached by Brian Phillips on the pitch and by Peter on the touch line, the team won all but one of 41 matches and tournament matches with a proud Peter recording a season best of 1,534 points for and 66 against! If Stuart was injured, prostrate and needing attention, Peter would be heard saying "if he's moving and complaining, he's OK"

Peter and sons were keen cricketers. The under 13 colts were joined by Ian Botham for Camberley Cricket Club's 50th anniversary with Peter, and good friend and coach Tim Chetwood. Peter was also a keen golfer, with Mike Courtness claiming he taught Peter how to play the game.

Peter was intimately involved with the Royal Grammar School and has been a Governor for many years, where both Stuart and Duncan attended. Peter was captured on video celebrating the 1st year side with Stuart winning the Rosslyn Park National 7 a-side competition – a very proud Dad.

Peter also travelled with the school and Camberley rugby teams on various rugby tours. To Helston in Cornwall with CRFC juniors, where Peter discovered the Blue Anchor pub and Spingo Beer. To Australia and New Zealand with the most memorable moment playing Māori Gisborne High School for boys. The 2nd team had lost 60-0 and with the 1st team at 70-0 with 5 minutes to go, Stuart intercepted a pass and scored the only try. You would have thought we won by Peter's celebrations v the opposition woeful disappointment.

Peter was active in many Camberley initiatives. As partner in Porter Garland, Treasurer of the Camberley and District Club, Camberley Cricket Club where Peter was often scorer, Camberley Rugby Club and an ardent Scruffs supporter.

Usually seen with a pint in hand, a beaming smile and great fun for all who knew Peter. A short cough would precede holding court with amusing stories - Peter will be sorely missed.


