In order to work in line with the current COVID-19 guidance this document has been drawn up to document the measures the club is putting in place to manage and minimise the risk posed by COVID-19, in relation to club training activities. It is important to stress that the risk posed by the virus cannot be eliminated completely. Whilst the club can put measures in place to manage and minimise the risk posed, it is the collective responsibility of everybody involved with the club (coaches, players, parents etc) to ensure that they follow the guidance in place. In addition, it is the responsibility of each individual to give consideration to their own specific circumstances (i.e. if they are high risk, shielding or live with/have contact with others who are high risk) and assess for themselves whether they are happy to engage in the activities offered by the club and the potential risk this may pose. As already stated, the risks posed by COVID-19 cannot be eliminated completely and a decision to be involved in club activities constitutes acceptance of this risk. Parents will be required to sign a specific consent form in relation to COVID-19 prior to their children being allowed to attend training. It is mandatory to notify your team coach if you are attending training and matches.

In order for training activities to resume in as safe a manner as possible the following measures will be put in place:

CODE ON ENTRY. THIS IS A LEGAL REQUIRMENT FOR ALL.

Person Responsible Coach	 Coaches to arrive 15 minutes prior to training to ensure all COVID-19 precautions can be in place prior to players and parents arriving. In the event that the session and safe areas are not fully set up when players/parents arrive, they should remain in their cars (or a safe distance away if on foot) and wait for the thumbs up from the coach before approaching the training area. Assess the area for potential dangers as per usual training practice. Any obvious debris (bottles on the ground etc) will be removed by the coach and disposed of. The coach must wear gloves and sanitise his/her hands once the task is completed. Another coach will take responsibility for disinfecting all equipment to be used prior to the session. The coach must wear gloves for this task and sanitise his/her hands once completed. THE ABOVE TASKS MUST BE COMPLETED BY TWO SEPARATE PEOPLE IN ORDER TO AVOID CROSS CONTAMINATION. IF THIS IS NOT POSSIBLE THEN THE SAME PERSON CAN COMPLETE BUT THEY MUST USE DIFFERENT GLOVES FOR EACH TASK AND 		
	 SANITISE THEIR HANDS IN BETWEEN TASKS Set up player safe zones using hoops/cones and ensure they are two metres apart Organise a clear first aid area. Organise a clear parents area. Set up and organise the session. Sanitise hands prior to players arriving. 		
Parent & Child	 Each child must be accompanied by a parent or adult from their household/bubble or have an identified adult responsible for them at training who is taking responsibility for them. This must be agreed with the coach prior to training. Please follow Travelling to training required actions presented on Page 6 of FA guidelines attached at Appendix A This adult must remain for the duration of the training. ONLY 1 ADULT PER CHILD. Tie shoelaces. Coaches cannot help with this task, if help is required a parent or accompanying adult must assist. Parents/carers should walk their children towards the coach but remain at a safe distance (5-10m). Once the coach has given the player the thumbs up to move to their safe area (each player will

	 have their own area), parents can withdraw to the parents area, maintaining social distancing at all times. Players should put their personal belongings in their safe area and apply hand sanitiser. No unnecessary items should be brought onto the training pitches we encourage people not to bring bikes to training field and if they do, they should be left in the car park area No dogs should be brought to training pitches

Responsible Players	 Do not touch the equipment with your hands Remain three steps away from everybody else Use a tissue or your sleeve when you cough or sneeze NOT your hands. Sanitise your hands afterwards If you require first aid, go to the first aid area. Players who can manage their own first aid needs with verbal prompts will be supported by their coach to do this. If parent/carer assistance is required the coach will signal for parents/carers to approach. In case of emergency, the coach will wear PPE and support parents with first aid. Players will be asked to return to their safe areas.
Parents /Responsible Adult	 Observe matches from the parent hubs If you need to attract the attention of the coach, please do this verbally or with hand signals whilst maintaining social distance. If you cannot attract their attention, ring their mobile. Only approach the pitch or first aid area if indicated by the coach to do so and if you can maintain social distancing.
Coach	 Sanitise hands at the start of the session and if touching equipment. Maintain social distancing throughout the session.

	modifications – in matches (and training	 Team talk huddles should not take place. Team talks can take place, as long as social- distancing is observed and held outdoors where possible;
	where	 Warm-ups/cool-downs should always observe social distancing;
	applicable)	 Coaches, other team staff and substitutes are allowed, but must also always observe social distancing on touchlines/dug-outs. Social-distancing must also be observed during interactions when a substitution is being made;
		 Match preparation meetings by officials should be held by video call;
		 Set plays – free kicks: referees and coaches should encourage players to get on with the game and not unnecessarily prolong set play set-up, such as defensive walls;
		 Set plays – corners should also be taken promptly to limit prolonged close marking and goal posts should be wiped down before matches, after matches and at half time.
		Goal celebrations should be avoided;
		 Interactions with referees and match assistants should only happen with players observing social distancing;
		 Small-sided football should be modified to provide more regular hygiene breaks in activity. Players should be discouraged from touching boards at any time, with tackling against boards discouraged. Referees should consider stopping play when this happens.
		 Youth football coaches are encouraged to limit persistent close proximity of participants during match play (where young participants may be more likely to cluster around the ball) and provide regular hygiene breaks in activity.

Parent and Child	 Child returns to safe area and sanitises hands. Collect belongings together and remain in safe area. Parent and child give each other a thumbs up
Coach	Ensure each child returns to their parent/carer one at a time to maintain social distancing
	 Verbal check with each parent/carer at pick up to confirm they were happy with training arrangements for that session. Any issues raised about the safety of training arrangements to be documented and raised with the club safeguarding officer.
	 Complete the Training / Matchday attendance Register on the TeamApp. IT IS MANDATORY THAT ALL COACHES OR NOMINATED TEAM ADMIN SHOULD COMPLETE THIS AFTER EVERY TRAINING AND MATCH.
	 This will be checked by a committee member and if not completed the coach will be notified. If this is not adhered to then teams will not be allowed to train or play any matches.
	Disinfect equipment following the session and pack away.Complete post training check sheet to identify any issues.

This plan should be operated in a supportive and collaborative fashion.

If as a parent, coach or player you notice anything that should be done differently, please support your team by highlighting this in a supportive way and ensuring that all measures, as detailed above, are carried out on a consistent basis.

Remember that all coaches are volunteers doing their best for your children in challenging circumstances at the current time.

Some of the clubs coaches are young (16 - 21) so parents are reminded to be considerate in their approach.

In addition, everyone needs to understand that children in particular may struggle with social distancing at times – it is everybody's responsibility to support each other to get this right! Managing the risk posed by COVID-19 is everybody's responsibility.
