If people from the same household or support bubble travel together in a vehicle, they should: Share the transport with the same people each time; Keep to small groups of people at any one time; Open windows for ventilation; Face away from each other; Clean the car between journeys, especially handles and other areas that are touched; Ask the driver and all passengers to wear a face covering; Consider seating arrangements to maximise distance others in the vehicle – this may mean using more than one coach or minibus and the wearing of face coverings; Use regular hand sanitisation by passengers on a coach or minibus; Limit the time spent at garages, petrol stations and motorway services; Keep distance from other people and if possible, pay by contactless; Wash or sanitise hands often, and always when exiting or re-entering the vehicle or upon completion of the journey. They should not congregate by gates and in the car park and if communication is necessary, they must adhere to social distancing. 	3	Users Staff Players	2.8 CHANGING ROOMS & SHOWERS	Changing rooms and showers will only be available for matchdays and not for training sessions. As changing rooms provide a greater risk of transmission, they should be used for changing and showering only which should be done as quickly as possible. Staggering the use to minimise numbers will take place. Indoor spaces need to have maximum ventilation as possible (such as opening windows and doors) and a one-way system to be considered. Persons using toilets should spray the areas of bodily contact before and after use i.e. toilet seat and flush/door handle and then wash hands thoroughly. Use paper towels. Anti-bacterial sprays will be provided in the toilet cubicles. Avoid touching surfaces where possible. Toilets should be cleaned regularly and all surfaces cleaned thoroughly. Any tissues used should be placed in a bin which must be emptied after each session. Where equipment is handled by more than one person, those involved must wash their hands thoroughly on completion of the session. Players should provide their own PPE for training sessions if they feel the need to use it. Such items must be disposed of in bins provided. Players should bring their own bottles of water which are clearly marked with their name. Shared drinking bottles are not permitted. Players should be encouraged to bring their own hand sanitising gel in a clearly marked bottle. 	3	Users Staff Players	2.11 EQUIPMENT & SHARING EQUIPMENT	Touching equipment should be avoided where possible. Footballs should be kicked and not handled. Sharing of equipment with other groups should be limited. Ideally, other groups should use their own equipment but if sharing is necessary, hand hygiene (soaps or gels) should be utilised both before and after use. Bibs should not be used unless they are washed after EVERY session. All equipment must be cleaned after use. This includes footballs. A named person should be identified as being responsible after each session and not just assumed that someone else will do the job. Players are responsible for ensuring that any used / soiled kit is turned the right way round and put into the laundry bags provided. Separate bags provided for: Jerseys Shorts Socks Bibs The person washing the kit should then wash and sanitise their hands immediately after touching soiled clothing. Spread of Covid- 19	3	Staff Players	2.13 DURING A MATCH	 Pre-match handshake should not happen but players should sanitise before entering the field of play; Huddles should not take place. Team talks can take place in outdoor areas where possible but social-distancing should be observed: Warm-ups and cool-downs should always observe social distancing; Coaches, other team staff and substitutes must also observe social distancing on touchlines/dug-outs. Social-distancing must also be observed during interactions when a substitution is being made; Match preparation meetings by officials should be held by video call or weather permitting in an outside area. Team Sheets, no paper copies. Home club to scan to officials/opposition. Set plays - free kicks and corners should be taken promptly to limit prolonged close marking. Referees and coaches should encourage players to get on with the game and not unnecessarily prolong set play set-up, such as defensive walls; Goal posts should be wiped down before and after matches and at half time. Goal celebrations should be avoided; Interactions with referees and match assistants should only happen with players observing social distancing. Non-participants in the game should not retrieve an out of play ball. Shouting should be kept to a minimum as it has been proved that it creates an additional risk of transfer; 	Included in Player Risk Assessment, head coaches are aware. Spread of Covid- 19	3	Staff Officials Players	2.14 SOCIAL DISTANCING DURING BREAKS (e.g. HALF TIME)	All participants must remain socially distanced during breaks in play, with spaced areas for equipment and refreshment storage for each individual including officials and substitutes. Coaching staff and substitutes, should, for example, spread out and avoid sharing a dug out or bench if social distancing cannot be observed. Players and officials should also observe social distancing during sin-bin instances. Water bottles or other refreshment containers should in no circumstances be shared. Participants are advised to bring their own drinks or refreshments, in a named container or the Club may provide individual bottles of water. After a game or training session, participants must maintain social distancing for social interaction. This includes changing rooms, showers, clubhouse facilities or any other place within the ground. Any payments relating to the fixture (match fees, officials fees) should where possible, be made in a cashless manner.	Part of the Player Guide. 	3	Staff Players Officials	2.15 ADMINISTERING FIRST AID	Advise first aiders and physios to update themselves on the latest guidance when treating patients, whether players or members of the public, to protect themselves and others. The Club must ensure that they have the appropriate PPE to be able to deal with any circumstance which may put them into conflict with social-distancing guidance. I.e. face coverings, face shields, disposable gloves & aprons and sanitising gels. St John's Ambulance have put together advice for first aiders to help keep themselves and others safe. Cleaning protocols should then be put in place to reduce the risk of passing the infection on to other people. Any player who finds signs of Covid-19 symptoms whilst at home must inform a coaching staff or committee member and self-isolate, following current NHS guidelines. The Club will support any player or staff member who have concerns regarding personal mental health issues. The bar and catering areas usually have high levels of usage during normal matchdays creating much contact between staff and customers. Extra consideration must be given to ensure that social distancing remains in place. For example: Consider using Perspex screening to limiting user contact customers; At till points, encourage the use of contactless payments to avoid handling cash; Apply two-metre markings to ensure social distancing when queueing; Use disposable utensils to minimise the risk of infection but ensure appropriate bin locations and regular collections.
