On this day...

Oakwood 2-2 Portfield Saturday 12 September 1992 Sussex County League Division One

Oakwood 'keeper Kevin Robbins fell foul of the new back-pass rule for the third week running on Saturday - but Oaks still maintained their unbeaten league record. Robbins handled a back pass in his six-yard box after Just six minutes and idle Miles put Portfield in front. And when Miles, the visitors' lone forward, added a second four minutes after the break, Oaks looked condemned to their first defeat of the season. But cometh the hour, cometh the man. Striker Paul Green immediately came off the bench and he pulled one back on 54 minutes from close range after Darren Stone had headed Tony Ropke's centre back across goal. Then eight minutes later Oaks levelled when Paul Crimmen scored his first of the season with a brilliantly struck angled volley from the edge of the penalty area. And Oaks might have gone on to win the game with Green and George Smith wasting good opportunities. Not that Oaks deserved to win.

Oaks were due to face Pagham in the Floodlight Cup last night (Tuesday) but Dave Armstrong (pulled groin muscle) and Gary Chandler (twisted ankle) were struggling to be fit in time. Chandler has little chance of being ready for Saturday's league trip to Wick but Armstrong may return. But Marshall has a bigger squad at his disposal these days and more options as a result. Dave Savage, their new signing from Redhill, was on the bench against Portfield and he may figure in Saturday's line-up from the start. Meanwhile Oaks' promising start to the season has been recognised by the Sussex FA who have selected Robbins, Chandler and George Smith for next week's game against the County League.

(Wiki - edited) Bexhill Town - Initially known as Allen West, the club won Division One of the Brighton, Hove & District League in 1922–23 and moved up to the Sussex County League in 1923–24 before becoming Bexhill at the end of the 1926–27 season. After the war the club changed their name again this time to Bexhill Town Athletic ready for the 1946–47 season in the Sussex County League.

In 1950 the club merged with local club Bexhill Amateur Athletic club, maintaining the Bexhill Town Athletic name. The Sussex League gained a second division in 1952, with the club placed in Division One. They won the League Cup in 1955–56, and the following season saw them win their first Sussex County League title. In 1957–58 they finished as runners-up the following season and won the Sussex Royal Ulster Rifles Charity Cup. The club would go on to win back-to-back league titles in 1965–66 and 1966–67 before finishing as runners-up in 1968–69.

In 1969 the club split from Bexhill Amateur Athletic club and changed their name to Bexhill Town. They then spent the next twelve seasons in Division One, winning the RUR Cup for a second time in 1973–74, before being relegated to Division Two at the end of the 1980–81 season, in which they finished bottom of the table. They were relegated again after finishing bottom of Division Two in 1984–85, but were promoted from Division Three at the first attempt as runners-up in the 1985–86 season.

After winning Division Two in 1989–90, the club returned to Division One. However, the club were relegated to Division Two again at the end of the 1993–94 season and then to Division Three at the end of the 1997–98 season after finishing bottom of Division Two. In 1999–2000 they won the Division Three Cup.

In 2002 the club merged with Bexhill Amateur Athletic again and changed their name to Bexhill United.

In 2004–05 the new club finished as runners-up in Division Three, earning promotion to Division Two. However the following season saw the club finish

bottom of the table, after which they were relegated back to Division Three. The two clubs de-merged again in 2005, but Bexhill United retained their name.

In 2007–08 Bexhill finished as runners-up in Division Three, earning promotion back to Division Two. They also won both the Division Three Challenge Cup and the Sussex Intermediate Cup. Although they were relegated back to Division Three at the end of the following season, they returned to Division Two again after finishing as runners-up in Division Three in 2009–10. In 2011–12 they won the Hastings Senior Cup with a 4–3 win over Sidley United

A previous meeting...

Bexhill 0-2 Oakwood Saturday 13 November 1993

Crawley Observer: Alan Gould's reign as Oakwood manager got off to a winning start after two second half goals sunk Bexhill on a heavy Polegrove pitch.

In a fairly even first period, Lee Mobsby twice went close before breaking the deadlock two minutes after the break when he stooped to head home Dave Savage's corner kick from close range. Oaks got a second on 58 minutes when Andy Webster found the corner of the net from eight yards following a goalmouth scramble. Bexhill applied considerable pressure in the closing stages and young keeper Matt Heasman, who was making his league debut, made a good save and generally commanded his area well.

Heasman, who stood in for the unavailable Duncan green, kept his place for last night's home match with Hailsham. But defender Peter Brackpool was sidelined with knee trouble, Stuart Lovegrove was his likely replacement.

Crawley News: Oakwood gained their first "away" points of the season in Alan Gould's first game in charge. Second half strikes from Lee Mobsby and Andy Webster finally gave them some relief after a difficult week for the club. Mobsby headed in Dave Savage's corner early in the second period and Webster completed proceedings with a good finish from an acute angle late on. Webster's goal looked to have struck the side netting according to new boss Gould: "Everyone else was jumping up and down celebrating and I didn't realise it had gone in. I just stood there." Paul Green went close with a left foot drive and Mobsby had a chance that he put behind when it seemed easier to score. Matt Heasman, in place of regular keeper Duncan Green who had to work on Saturday morning. made two vital one-on-one saves to deny Bexhill a share of the spoils.
