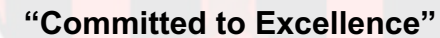

## On this day...

**Oakwood 2-1 Shoreham**  
**Saturday 13 November 2004**  
**Sussex County League Division Two**

MARK Heavens' double gave Oaks their third successive league victory. They had beaten Shoreham in cup action only last month but knew from that game this was going to be a tough fixture.

Oakwood weren't really at the races for the first 25 minutes, by which time they were a goal down. Shoreham nearly opened the scoring in the first minute when Darren Annis had a header cleared off the line by Ian Gardner following a corner. Shoreham took the lead after nine minutes, the ball fell kindly to Martin O'Donnell following a defensive tackle 25 yards out. The midfielder let fly and Michael Wood had no chance in the Oaks goal. Shoreham should have been 2-0 up ten minutes later – Connor McCurdy released Annis who put the ball wide from a one-on-one with Wood. Zak Newman headed one chance inches wide, then saw Matt Ades make a fine save from his header. The Tinsley Lane club levelled six minutes before the break, Martin Comper found Heavens in the area and despite 'keeper Ades getting two hands to the ball, it bounced into the goal.

Wood denied Annis Just 12 seconds after the break with a fine save. Oaks then had a succession of chances as Heavens, Ian Gardner and Comper all failed to hit the target. Their winner came in fine style with ten minutes to go. Liam Buchan found Heavens from long range, who then bent the ball into the top corner past the helpless Ades.

Wick FC were founded in 1892 and became members of the West Sussex Football League in 1896, joining the Junior Division.

Wick joined Division Two of the Sussex County League in 1964–65 and then spent the next eighteen seasons in Division Two, eventually winning promotion in 1983 after finishing as champions. They then spent three seasons in Division One before being relegated but bounced back the following season (1985–86) after winning Division Two for a second time. From then until the end of the 2002–03 season, Wick were ever-present in Division One of the County League, winning the League Cup in 1987–88.

In 1989–90 they lifted the Division One title, as well as the RUR Charity Cup. In 1992–93 they won the Sussex Senior Cup for the only time, beating Oakwood at the Goldstone Ground, 3–1. The 1993–94 season they won the championship for the second time, finishing 14 points clear of runners-up Whitehawk.

The league cup was won in the 1996–97 season and finished runners-up to Burgess Hill Town. The following season under manager Jimmy Quinn, Wick finished third in the League, but reached the semi-finals of the Senior Cup, and won the RUR charity Cup, which they retained in the following 1998–99 season

In 2000–01, the club finish third, but two seasons later in the 2002–03 campaign the club was relegated to Division Two.

The club finished as runners-up to Crowborough Athletic in 2004–05 to move back into the top division of the Sussex league.

Carl Stabler joined as manager in 2006–07 with the remit of rising Wick Football Club out of the County League and after 3 seasons stepped up to Chairman and handed over the reins of the football side of the club to

manager Vic Short.

Prior to the 2013–14 season, they merged with near neighbours Barnham and became members of the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division.

However, the clubs split again at the end of the 2015-16 season, with Wick taking the place of the first team in the Premier Division. The following season saw them relegated to Division One for the 2017-18 season.

### Previous meetings

Most famously we met 27 seasons back in the 1992-93 Sussex Senior Cup final with Wick running out 3-1 winners at the Goldstone Ground. Ironically we then drew each other again in the second round the following season, this time the Oaks getting a 1-0 away win.
