Oaks in the Cup

It's the 30th anniversary of Oakwood's debut in the FA Cup

Oakwood 5-0 Camberley Town Saturday 1 September 1990 FA Cup Preliminary Round

Oakwood marched on to the next round of the FA Cup after thrashing Camberley Town at Tinsley, Lane. Despite their opponents' obvious lack of confidence, Oaks must take great credit in going for the jugular and not allowing them to settle. The preliminary cup tie was due to be played at Camberley, but their ground was badly damaged in a recent fire.

And they found Oakwood too hot to handle, taking the lead in the 10th minute when Paul Crimmen picked up the ball on the edge of the box and fired a low shot into the corner. With Oaks having found some difficulty in finding the target so far this season, that was just the early tonic they needed to settle their nerves. It was 2-0 on 35 minutes, as Camberley's hapless keeper collided with two defenders and Lee Mobsby was left with the easiest of tasks to slot the ball home. The visitors enjoyed their best spell of the game as they tried to get back into the match. But with sweeper Dave Savage back in the side, the Oakwood defence looked far more solid than it has in recent weeks.

Crimmen all but killed off the match five minutes after the restart with his second and Phil Richardson netted the fourth with a fine shot midway through the half following a determined run and cross by left back Andy Webster. The best goal of the match came 10 minutes from the end and capped a classy display by Savage. He carried the ball to the edge of the box and let fly with a shot which went over the keeper and dipped just under the bar.

The club was formed on 5 November 1886 by villagers connected with the local coffee tavern; the local vicar offered to supply it with a football. In 1890, one of the club's players, Arthur Smith, died following injuries sustained in a match against Kingston Wanderers. The club affiliated to the Surrey FA in October 1892, and joined a local league. They played in the Kingston & District League, winning Division One in 1928–29 and 1929–30. The club subsequently transferred to the Surrey Intermediate League (Central), winning the League Cup in 1933–34 and 1935–36. They then moved up to the Surrey Senior League for the 1937–38 season.

During World War II Cobham temporarily merged with the Avorians Sports Club to form Cobham Avorians to ensure local football continued. After top half finishes in the two seasons before World War II, the club only finished in the top half on four further occasions until the league was transformed into the Home Counties League in 1978, finishing bottom of the league in 1953–54, 1955–56, 1961–62, 1963–64, 1970–71, 1971–72, 1972–73 and 1975–76.[10]

The Home Counties League became the Combined Counties League in 1979, and Cobham spent the 1981–82 season in the Eastern Division when the league was divided into two divisions, before reverting to a single division the following season.

In 1998–99 Cobham finished as league runners-up, and in 2001–02 they won the Premier Division Challenge Cup, beating Bedfont in the final. When the league gained a second division in 2003, the club were placed in the Premier Division. However, they were relegated to Division One after finishing bottom of the Premier Division in 2008–09. In 2017–18 the club were Division One runners-up, earning promotion to the Premier Division.

Oaks 4-0 Midhurst & Easebourne

Sussex League Division 2

Two goals by Paul Green helped Oaks maintain their superb start to their County League Division two season but once again it was a strong second half showing that left the Tinsley lane fans delighted as a tough Midhurst side were worn down by the home side's fitness.

Green's first came after 25 minutes when he took a square pass from Sean Smith to blast home a spectacular 24 yard drive. In a very poor first half, Green's effort really stood out as the only attempt on goal, and although Tony Reece's team always held the upper hand they could not rest on a solitary goal advantage.

They had to wait until the 67th minute to get the vital breathing space when powerful striker Neil Elson ran at the defence and slotted home number two past the helpless keeper.

With five minutes left Green made sure of the points with a third goal following solid work from Steve Thomas; Green was denied a hat trick seconds later when his first time shot was well saved, but in injury time

Oakwood hit a fourth after Nick Godfrey beat two men, drew the keeper and rolled the ball into the back of the net. Oakwood have yet to concede a goal in the league this season and on this kind of display it will need a special kind of performance to beat them. Reece refused to be drawn into talk of promotion at this early stage but admitted that side had had to earn their result.
