(edited from Wiki) Mile Oak FC was formed in 1960 and started in Division Eight of the Brighton, Hove & District Football League and won the division at the first attempt, and promoted to Division Six. Further promotion followed in the 1963–64 season when the club finished as runners up in Division Six and the club was promoted again the following season. The club's first attempt at Division Four saw them finish as champions, however four seasons later and the club was back in Division Five. A season later they were back in Division Four and the 1971–72 campaign saw them finish as runners-up and promotion to Division Two. The club had instant success in Division Two finishing as champions, a feat they repeated the next season in Division One. The 1980–81 season saw the club become winners of the Brighton League.

In 1986 made the decision to leave the Brighton, Hove & District Football League to become a senior club in the Sussex County League, and an application was made to join the Southern Counties Combination League, which was a feeder into the Sussex 'pyramid'. After just one season, the club won promotion to Division Three of the County League as champions.

After five seasons, promotion was gained to Division Two in 1991–92, as runners-up to Hassocks, and then to Division One as champions in 1994–95. They stayed in this division for three seasons, and were relegated back to Division two in 1997–98

In 2005–06 they won some silverware after defeating Sidlesham 1–0 in the Final of the Division Two Challenge Cup.

In the 2008–09 season the club again gained promotion to Division One but only survived one season back in the top flight of the Sussex League. They have been ever present at that level since then having a best finish of 4th in the table in season 2016/17.

### Mist Breezes In - Crawley Observer: 18 March 2009

New Oakwood manager John Mist believes he can keep the side up with the boost of new players and a new confidence. The Reserve team boss was asked by chairman Stuart Lovegrove to take over the reins after existing manager Lee Butcher resigned.

The club have been on a poor run since the turn of the year and have slipped down the table to their current position of second to bottom. With three places likely to be relegated, the battle is on to stay up. Mist has wasted no time in bringing in new faces to bolster the side, which earned a useful 0-0 draw away to Selsey on Saturday.

He has brought in winger Stuart O'Hara from Three Bridges, goalkeeper Anthony Dipernardo from Worthing and former Crawley Town striker Gavin Gordon, who is returning to the club signed on dual forms from Merstham. Gordon was at Oakwood as recently as last season, when he became top-scorer before quitting to join the club which eventually won the league, Crowborough Athletic.

Mist has brought in reserve team coach Mark Lay and former Oaks' manager Bob Pyle is back to help with until the end of the season. Dave Harrison, the reserve team assistant manager, is stepping up to become reserves manager. Mist said: "I believe we can stay up. I took over the Reserves when they were bottom two years ago when they were in a similar position and after 15 games we finished fourth from bottom. "We just need some freshening up, confidence and self belief. We can add some good players from the Reserves and need to get a few draws."

Stuart Lovegrove said: "Lee has a lot to offer as a manager but he would need a club with more resources. "He lacked support from me and needed more effort from some of the players. John is one of my closest friends and I wish him good luck."

Butcher played for another of his previous clubs Division Three side Ifield Edwards as they lost 1-0 to Haywards Heath Town on Saturday.
