Wick became founding members of the West Sussex Football League in 1896, joining the Junior Division.

Wick joined Division Two of the Sussex County League in 1964–65 and then spent the next eighteen seasons in Division Two, eventually winning promotion in 1983 after finishing as champions. They then spent three seasons in Division One before being relegated but bounced back the following season (1985–86) after winning Division Two for a second time.

From then until the end of the 2002–03 season, Wick were ever-present in Division One of the County League, winning the League Challenge Cup in 1987–88.

In 1989–90 they lifted the Division One title, as well as the RUR Charity Cup. In 1992–93 they won the Sussex Senior Cup for the only time, beating Oakwood at the Goldstone Ground, 3–1. The 1993–94 season they won the championship for the second time, finishing 14 points clear of runners-up Whitehawk.

The league cup was won in the 1996–97 season and finished runners-up to Burgess Hill Town. The following season under manager Jimmy Quinn, Wick finished third in the League, but reached the semi-finals of the Senior Cup, and won the RUR charity Cup, which they retained in the following 1998–99 season.

In 2000–01, the club finish third, but two seasons later in the 2002–03 campaign the club was relegated to Division Two.

The club finished as runners-up to Crowborough Athletic in 2004–05 to move back into the top division of the Sussex league.

Carl Stabler joined as manager in 2006–07 with the remit of rising Wick Football Club out of the County League and after 3 seasons stepped up to Chairman and handed over the reins of the football side of the club to manager Vic Short.

Prior to the 2013–14 season, they merged with near neighbours Barnham and to become members of the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division.

However, the clubs split again at the end of the 2015–16 season, with Wick taking the place of the first team in the Southern Combination Football League Premier Division. The following season saw them relegated to Division One for the 2017–18 season. The club's best finish since then was fourth in the truncated 2019-20 season.

On this day - thirty years back

Oakwood 0-4 Crawley Town Thursday 22 April 1993 William Hill Challenge Cup Final, First Leg Attendance 120 (approx)

Crawley virtually guaranteed themselves a cup double with a comfortable 4-0 win at Oakwood in the first leg of the William Hill Challenge Cup final on Thursday night.

Both sides had their chances early on. As early as the fourth minute Oakwood tested keeper Colin Caulfield when he dived full length to tip over Mark Dunk's curling 20 yard free kick. At the other end Jack Dineen spotted Duncan Green off his line and his lob from 25 yards was just over the bar.

On the half hour Oaks' Paul Green was unlucky not to score when he capitalised on a mix up In the Red's defence but his low drive ricocheted off the far post. It proved a costly miss. Crawley took the lead in the 37th minute when Steve Powell's cross found Micky Turner in space just inside the box and he fired home a fierce shot that Green never got his eyes to, let alone his hands.

Caulfield pulled off two fine saves just before the break, one a reflex stop from a Marcus Cooke volley, and again when Andy Webster skipped through three tackles and shot hard and low.

But the second half was dominated by Crawley, and two goals in five minutes killed the game.

Joff Vanstitart bagged Crawley's second when his sliding tackle robbed Green, who was caught pussy-footing with the ball after a back-pass.

And on 68 minutes Whitington made it 3-0 when he netted from close range after Vessey headed back into the box from a deep corner. Fishenden made the second-log a formality when he scored the fourth in similar circumstances, rifling his shot home when the ball broke to him from another comer three minutes from time.
