Storrington 2-1 Oakwood Saturday 1 April 2000 Sussex County League

OAKS' run of five unbeaten league games came to an abrupt end with a dreadful second half performance against bogey side Storrington in Division Two. Storrington will be the first to admit they are no superstar outfit but work hard for each other.

Oaks started really brightly and for the opening 20 minutes or so looked like they were going to swamp all over Storrington. Within 70 seconds, Trevor Brown, who had an impressive match before being taken off later on, tested the home keeper from 25 yards. Oaks took the lead on 15 minutes. Brown started the move and when the ball came to Colin Garman he let fly with a stunning right foot effort from the edge of the box which flew past Kerry Harding. Garman should have added his second eight minutes before the break After picking up the ball on the half way line he raced past four defenders but hit his final effort at Harding. Gavin Bridle's effort was tipped onto the post while Paul Trower saw a shot blocked. Scott MacLacklan fired over from 12 yards after an excellent Stuart Lovegrove cross.

Oaks, to be honest, were awful in the second period and within seven minutes the scores were level as Ben Whitby slotted home. Oaks' Brown was denied by Harding but they fell behind on 68 minutes as Trower managed to find himself loads of room in the area. Lovegrove waited for the ball to come down and his header went just wide with a late Oaks chance.

Seaford Town FC joined the Sussex County League Division Two in 1952, and won promotion in 1963-64 after finishing as runners-up to Selsey. The next seven seasons were spent in the top division (finishing 4th in 1965-66) before being relegated back to Division Two in 1971.

In 1978 the club dropped out of the County League, but returned as founder members of the new Third Division five years later. In 1985/86 they returned to senior football as champions, and in 1988-89 took the Division Two title. However, their return to Division One was to last just two seasons before they were relegated once more in 1990-91. Worse was to follow, and in 1992-93 Seaford found themselves back in intermediate football again.

Things didn't get any better, and Seaford dropped out of the County League altogether after being relegated in 1997. They spent two seasons in the East Sussex League before regaining their place in Division Three. Seaford FC dropped Town from its name in 1999, following a merger with Seaford Seagulls Youth FC. It was reinstated in 2005.

Promotion back to Division Two was achieved in 2000-01, as runners-up to Rye & Iden United, with 6th place in 2004/05 their best finish since then. Prior to the 2005-06 season the Club's name reverted back to Seaford Town, as did the colours from red and blue, to all red. The club finished in the top eight for the next three seasons, and their 6th place finish in 2006-07 bettered a similar finish in 2004/05 by one point.

In April 2015 Seaford Town FC merged with Seaford WASPS Junior FC to create a strong footballing identity for the youth of Seaford. With younger players breaking into the senior teams Seaford is indeed a Community Club for the town.

(Edited from wiki) The club was established in 1892. Becoming members of the Mid-Sussex League, they were joint Division Two champions in 1951–52. After winning Division Four in 1959–60, the club were champions of an emergency Division Three competition in the weather-interrupted 1962–63 season. They were Division Three champions again in 1971–72 and won the Mowatt Cup the following season. In 1975–76 the club won the Division One and Mowatt Cup double. They won the Mowatt Cup for a third time in 1983–84 and the League Trophy in 1987–88.

After winning the Sommerville Cup in 1999–2000, another climb up the divisions began in 2000–01 when the club were Division Four champions. They finished third in Division Three in 2002–03, earning promotion to Division Two. The following season they were Division Two runners-up and were promoted to Division One. After a third-place finish in Division One in 2005–06, the club were promoted to the Premier Division. In 2010–11 they finished bottom of the Premier Division and were relegated to the renamed Championship division. They went on to finish bottom of the Championship the following season and were relegated to Division One.

The club were promoted back to the Championship in 2013–14 and were Championship runners-up in 2014–15, earning promotion back to the Premier Division. After a fourth-place finish in the curtailed 2020–21 season, the club were promoted to Division One of the Southern Combination League.

Forest Row play their home games here at Tinsley Lane.
