## On this day...

**Oakwood 1-4 Oving**  
**Saturday 30 October 1999**  
**Sussex County League Division Two**

OVING dished out a beating to dire Oakwood on Saturday as the home side slipped to a fourth straight loss. Oaks managed creditable performances against Chichester City and last week, Burgess Hill but on Saturday, only one or two players came out with any credit from this Division Two clash. Steve Spencer in goal could not be faulted for any of the Oving strikes as they conceded another early goal, this time with nine minutes gone. Jimmy Hasler was allowed to tap home at the far post from Mick Seacombe's cross after Spencer's earlier save had denied James Mandry. Oaks stepped up a gear briefly although Oving looked to counter-attack. Pat Massaro had a shot blocked after Chris Young's good work while Steve Moore fired way over after a surge forward. Clive Muller then had a 30-yard effort curling away from the goal and from Justin Thornhill's cross, Mandry got in at the far post to see his header hit the woodwork. Massaro will feel he should have done better as he was released by Stuart Lovegrove but failed to test keeper Lee Conway.

The second half could not have got off to a worse start when Lovegrove headed into his own net from Muller's 47th minute corner. James Brown was unlucky with a shot while Turnhill put the game beyond Oaks with a solo effort with 25 minutes left. Oaks reduced the arrears on 82 minutes as sub Lee Mobsby's cross was fumbled by Conway and Steve Cook followed up for his first goal of the season in the first team. The resistance did not last long as Hasler beat the offside trap to force a save from Spencer a minute later. Despite the keeper's good stop, Robin Josephs followed up for the fourth. Oaks now have to lift them-selves for vital games with Broadbridge Heath (last night) and Lancing (Saturday) although they have bad news in the shape of Laine Eaton missing the rest of the season because of a pending groin operation. Steve Maier could return within the next month however.

Roffey Football Club were founded in 1901. The club's first success came in the 1920's. Twice winning the Horsham Junior Charity Cup. More success followed in the 30's, twice crowned Horsham League Division One Champions, and twice winners of the Horsham Senior Charity Cup.

In the 1954/55 season, the 1st Team were crowned Division One Champions with a 100% record, regaining the title the following season.

In 1969 the club joined the Crawley & District League. Winning the Premier Division in 1982.

In the 80's they were twice finalists in the Mick Hastain Cup before winning the Division One title in 1987. More success came in the early nineties, lifting the Les Searle Floodlit Cup and Runners-up in the Malcolm Simmonds Cup. 1993 saw the 1st team finish Runners-up in Division One. The following season the 1st team finished Runners-up in the Premier and lifted the Malcolm Simmonds Cup. In 1994-95 the 1st team won the Newton International Floodlit Cup.

Roffey FC joined the Mid-Sussex Football league in 2005. In 2008 the 1st team won Division Three, the Sussex County Junior Cup and were finalists in the Mowatt Cup. Two more top finishers and a Runners-up spot in the Premier Division saw them accepted by the Sussex County Football League in 2011.

Currently playing in the Southern Combination Football League, having been promoted from the Mid Sussex League Premier Division at the end of the 2010-11 season.

2012/13 saw the club get back to winning ways with a mid-table finish in County 3 and success for the reserves and 3rd teams in the Mid-Sussex leagues, it also saw the introduced of an U18 squad for the first time, who

narrowly missed out on the Arun & Chichester League title but won the cup and where runners up again the following year.

In recent seasons, the first team finished runners up in 2015/16 failing the ground requirements for promotion, the U18 teams going from strength to strength winning Central League in the Southern Combination League

2016-17 season saw the U18s win the Arun & Chichester Youth League Cup, whilst the senior U18 team won the Combination Central League and the League of Leagues.

The 2018/19 season brings our first season in our history of having a Ladies Team, this is part of our drive is to continue to develop the site to make it a true community hub for North Horsham, who had an excellent first season finishing 4<sup>th</sup> and runners up in their cup final.

Planning permission for floodlights and a stand was granted recently to open the next chapter in Roffey FC's history for the first time ever of moving into senior football for the 2019/2020 season.
