

(edited from Wiki) Mile Oak FC was formed in 1960 and started in Division Eight of the Brighton, Hove & District Football League and won the division at the first attempt, and promoted to Division Six. Further promotion followed in the 1963–64 season when the club finished as runners up in Division Six and the club was promoted again the following season. The club's first attempt at Division Four saw them finish as champions, however four seasons later and the club was back in Division Five. A season later they were back in Division Four and the 1971–72 campaign saw them finish as runners-up and promotion to Division Two. The club had instant success in Division Two finishing as champions, a feat they repeated the next season in Division One. The 1980–81 season saw the club become winners of the Brighton League.

In 1986 made the decision to leave the Brighton, Hove & District Football League to become a senior club in the Sussex County League, and an application was made to join the Southern Counties Combination League, which was a feeder into the Sussex 'pyramid'. After just one season, the club won promotion to Division Three of the County League as champions.

After five seasons, promotion was gained to Division Two in 1991–92, as runners-up to Hassocks, and then to Division One as champions in 1994–95. They stayed in this division for three seasons, and were relegated back to Division two in 1997–98

In 2005–06 The won some silverware after defeating Sidlesham 1–0 in the Final of the Division Two Challenge Cup.

In the 2008–09 season the club again gained promotion to Division One but only survived one season back in the top flight of the Sussex League. They have been ever present at that level since then having a best finish of 4th in the table in season 2016/17.

On this day...

Littlehampton Town 0-4 Oakwood Saturday 19 November 1994 Unijet Sussex County League Division One Attendance 56

(Crawley News) Zak Newman scored twice to help his side to an emphatic victory over Littlehampton on Saturday. A 4-0 scoreline would have seemed unthinkable in the opening stages as Littlehampton dominated and created many chances. A combination of poor finishing and good goal-keeping that kept the scores level until mid way through the half. But Oaks began to find their form.

From a long ball Newman turned and shot them into the lead. As the first half drew to a close it was the Crawley side who were dominating the match. Oaks came out for the second half aiming to pick up where they left off. Keith "Kipper" Hurren hit a beautifully weighted through ball to Newman who lobbed the advancing keeper from 20 yards. Littlehampton seemed inspired by the second goal and pushed to get back into the match. Keeper Sean Collins did well to block a fine drive from the home sides forwards with his legs and Richardson put it round the post for safety. That was Littlehampton's last chance of scoring as Oaks took control. From a Collins goal kick, Paul Crimmen headed into the path of Kevin Ball and the nippy forward beat one defender before slotting the ball past the keeper to make the score 3-0. Oaks were cruising by now and when Kevin Ball scored his second and Oaks fourth it was just rewards. Ball received the ball on the edge of the area and beat a defender to shoot past the 'keeper. It was an almost identical goal to his first.

Oaks manager Alan Gould said: "In the first half they were in control but didn't make the most of their chances. As soon as Zak scored we were in control and we dominated the game in the second half."
