CLUB STRUCTURE

Lewes Hockey Club is one of three sports clubs forming the Southdown Club – the others being Tennis and Squash. When joining the Hockey Club, you become a member of the Southdown Club and membership opportunities exist for playing across further sections. The Southdown club also hosts fitness classes, Lewes Netball club, a gym and personal training all details available at Reception.

All our Junior memberships (U18 & u12 Puma) provides membership of all sections enabling Juniors to also play Tennis and Squash at the Southdown Club.

The Hockey Club is divided into the Adult and Junior sections each catering for Ladies and Men. The Junior section operates with its own structure and like the rest of the club relies on volunteers to function. We actively encourage Parent Volunteers within the Junior Section and the more volunteers we have the greater the variety and scope of our offer to the Juniors.

Our partners Lazzatis run the Catering and the Bar at the club and you will be assured of a warm welcome in the club house.

We cater for the following ages groups and genders within the junior section:

Philip Brown runs our Sunday morning programme and each age group is run by a Manager (Parent Volunteer) (eg U12 Girls Manager) who will act as the main point of contact between Parents and their Children. These will be introduced to you at the beginning of the season. This year we will be playing more games (see later) and we are also introducing a Match Manager role who will be responsible for running and managing the children at a particular match or tournament – we will rotate these roles so that the burden doesn't fall on a small group. Our u8s and u6s are very popular and we do ask for additional help from Parents on a Sunday morning and that you remain pitch side should your child require help.





KIT & EQUIPMENT

Each junior requires the following equipment:

- Outdoor training shoes or astro trainers (no football boots with studs)
- Training any suitable clothes warm and waterproof during winter!
- MOUTHGUARDS AND SHIN PADS ARE ESSENTIAL Reception holds a supply of Mouth Guards (£3)
- Water bottle
- Hockey sticks are available on the day

U12s club kit

- Green shirts are available at Intersport (these will include our new sponsors and we have also dispensed with shirt numbers this year) in Cliffe High St. Black shorts/skort and club socks (Club Socks can be brought for £5 from the club)
- We have selected O'Neills as our new kit supplier and they will be stocking further club kit (hoodies, training tops, etc) via the Club website which we are anticipating will be live in October
- For Matches the club will be providing team match day shirts sponsored by our 2 new Club Sponsors Lewes Estates and Liam Russell Architects in the same designs as the adult shirts in Green and Black. The existing green shirts will be used whenever we have more that 2 teams playing.
- Other equipment for matches (Goal Keeping and Face masks) are provided

U14s/u16s club kit

- All u14 and u16 sides this year will play in our new kit sponsored by our 2 new Club Sponsors Lewes Estates and Liam Russell Architects - which is supplied by O'Neills and is the same design as the adult kit. This will allow older juniors to move between Junior and Adult games without having to purchase different shirts and ensures that all u14/16 teams are playing in the same affordable kit.
- As part of your membership you will receive a new shirt (contact the club to arrange this ASAP), skorts, shorts and socks will be stocked at the club or available from O'Neills via the club website (expected October)

COACHING

Each training session is supported by dedicated Coaches, including specific Goal Keeper coaching, and this year we have a large team of Juniors who will be organising and running the Junior Coaching. **Kate Brown** and **[Rosie Hall]** are our joint **Heads of Junior Coaching** and they will be developing session plans and organising the Junior Coaches to deliver the training. The Parent Volunteers (Age Group Managers) will support with this.

We are keen to develop our Coaching resources in the club and this is giving our older juniors the opportunity to develop their own coaching expertise and the club will be supporting them with this. We run our own Coach training programme and are active in the England Hockey Coach training with the club being used for national coach training. We will continue to welcome Parent Volunteers (both players and non-players) to help with specific sessions/practices/games etc under the guidance of The Coach.



Junior Hockey at Lewes



Our key objectives for **all** the Juniors is that they:

- Have fun and enjoy themselves
- They are able to participate in all of the activities and learn new skills
- That each of them develops the skills to allow them to play in team games and matches

JUNIOR DEVELOPMENT

We are running a Junior Development Programme currently focusing on over 14s were we aim to support individuals in developing their personal hockey development plans.

Within the club we aim to provide sessions to stretch the juniors as they progress up the club. By moving u14s (and over) training to the same night as Adult training, our juniors are able to experience what the next level looks like. Monday Night Hockey is also open to juniors once they have reached their 14th birthday. We have three criteria for inviting Juniors to the next level of training;

- 1. firstly, that the junior is keen to do so,
- 2. secondly, that the Coach is happy to support and
- 3. thirdly that the Parents are happy.

We ask Parents to attend a Junior's first session at each level to ensure that they are happy with everything.

We work closely with Sussex County Hockey and their junior development programme which starts at u13 level. In nominating juniors for this programme we work with coaches and parents to ensure that all objectives are aligned and that timings are right. We recognise that children develop at different rates and nominations are re-opened every year.

We have a club policy of not allowing any u14 Boys and u13 Girls (based on DOB) to participate in adult training or matches. Using the criteria above we encourage our Juniors to play Adult games and try to ensure that they will be playing with other Juniors. We actively stretch our Juniors and are recognized throughout Sussex as a Club that provides significant playing opportunities for Juniors.

TRAINING SESSIONS

In order to participate in any training session or match your child **must be registered** as a player on the club site – this will ensure that Parents have completed all the consents/emergency contact details/medical info that we require. For new players we offer 3 free sessions to ensure all are happy before we ask you to join the club. Registration should take less than 5 mins and can be done from any mobile device – see Junior Registration below for details.

JUNIOR - REGISTRATION

All our registration is online via the club website. For Juniors we require **Parents** to **registered first** as a Parent (just Name and Email required) and then follow the options for **adding children** (guide available on club website <u>here</u>). This is required to meet the Club's safeguarding (see below) and data protection policies (available on the club website). These require us to communicate via Parents with all information regarding their children. Most Parents find that downloading the Pitchero App onto their phone provides the easiest way to access Club information and reply to selection and availability requests.

Once our Juniors reach 14 they are able to register their own email address against their account and they will then receive the same information as their parents. Certainly, as Junior progress into the Men's and Ladies section we encourage them to do this in order to take further responsibility for committing to their availability and arrangements for matches.

MEMBERSHIP AND MATCH FEES

This season we are moving all our Membership fees online and they will be collected via Pitchero, which runs our club website. If you have an existing direct debit running with the club or are a member of other sections, then your existing payment method will remain – check with Reception if in doubt.

We will be sending requests for payment during September once you have confirmed that your child wishes to join. You will be asked to update your Child's details - emergency contacts, consent to play medical details etc and in addition agreement to the Code of Conduct and confirming membership for the season.

Membership fees are due by 1st October or, for new members, once 3 'taster' sessions have been completed. Membership can also be brought by going to the Payments section of the website and then 'buying' the appropriate membership where you will be guided through the process. For Junior players joining part way through the Season (November onwards) we will ask you to sign up to the monthly payment plan (as shown below) which will run until August.





Annual Membership fees are as follows:

- Puma member-Under 12 £110 (or 10 monthly payments of £12)
- Junior Member-Under 18 £145 (or 10 monthly payments of £15)

Member ship fees have been held at last years' level and the club is grateful for your ongoing support during over the last 2 seasons. In addition to playing hockey, both Puma and Junior Members can also play tennis and squash under these membership types.

ADDITIONAL COSTS / MATCH FEES

Hockey match fees also need to be paid for those playing in any matches. These will be 'pay as you play' with the money being collected after the match by via Pitchero. Match fees are £5.00 and include a meal 'Tea' after home games in the Club House. We do encourage all Juniors playing matches to stay for tea – it is a long standing Hockey tradition and encourages interaction with team mates and the opposition – we are lucky to have one of the best Club houses and best teas in the County.

Junior members playing in adult sides

For Junior members playing in a regular ladies or men's side, match fees are payable 'up front' in either a lumpsum of £80 or parents will be billed via Pitchero for games played.

All subscriptions are due by the 1st October

LEWES HC CODE OF CONDUCT

England Hockey is our governing body and they have published a **Code of Ethics and Behaviour** which covers all us involved with Hockey 'The Hockey Family. In addition, the Club has included its own **Code of Conduct** which covers specific rules pertaining to the club. - Stay off the pitch during training and matches. •
- Sign up to Lewes HC website and provide and maintain emergency contact details, medical consents and any • relevant information about your child including medical history.
