		Frequent cleaning and disinfecting of objects and surfaces which are touched regularly, particularly training aides such as cones etc.  Equipment should be kept to a minimum. 		Applicable to all activities  During Breaks  Anyone involved in rugby activity should maintain social distancing during all breaks in activity and post activity.  Players are advised to bring their own water bottles and towels that are clearly identified and stored away from others. Sharing of water bottles towels or clothing must be avoided.	Coaches should:  Consider how to instruct, demonstrate, observe and feedback to players in a way that adheres to social distancing guidance;  Design sessions that follow the current guidance and regulations.  Only use equipment relevant to the stage of the return to rugby roadmap for community activity.	All attendees to be briefed by coaches on social distancing before every training session.



	Remind participants to maintain social distancing in the transition between activities or during rest periods.  Clean any equipment after each use.  Refrain from shouting where possible.	
Spectators  From 19 July there will be no caps on capacity for participants or spectators at rugby club events.		
Toilets  Ted's Shed will be open and the toilet facilities there may be used on a strictly one-in one-out basis.	Toilets to be sanitised regularly.	Sanitising materials to be made available.
Changing rooms  Players are encouraged to come ready to play. The changing rooms will be available to use for those who cannot come ready to play but this should be considered the exception rather than the rule. No more than 6 players at any one time in any one changing room. Social distancing must be maintained, and a mask should be worn when inside the building. Take the minimum time possible to change. Showers		
Players are encouraged to shower at home after rugby activities. For those that are unwilling or unable to shower at home, the showers will be made available, but this should be considered the exception rather than the rule. Do not shower next to another player – only every other shower head to be used. Take the minimum time possible to shower.	Showers to be cleaned before and after every rugby event. 		technical preparation, skill refinement and reconditioning work before returning to full contact match play.  Internal training games are allowed between Monday 19 July and Saturday 7 August.  Training games should include an incremental approach to scrummaging and coaches should rotate players every 20 minutes.  Clubs should not return to match intensity full contact 15 a-side training games immediately.	
A, B, C	A record is to be kept of all attendees who must provide their name and contact details for track and trace.  Prior to attending training and matches, all players, officials, volunteers and spectators should undergo a self-assessment for any Covid-19 symptoms.  No-one should leave home to participate in any type of rugby activity if they, or someone they live with, has any of the following Covid-19 symptoms:	Attendees to report feeling unwell immediately.  Coaches are to report to the Board any infections potentially affecting attendees immediately.	Ongoing



NB These have increased in number due to the Delta Variant.
A high temperature;
A new, continuous cough;
A loss of, or change to, their sense of smell or taste;
A headache;
A sore throat;
A runny nose.
All attendees are required to confirm that they currently do not display any symptoms of COVID-19 infection and have not within the last 14 days come into contact with anyone displaying symptoms.
If any attendee presents with Covid symptoms, they are to be sent home and advised to follow stay at home procedures.
