

Panshanger FC Covid-19 Risk Assessment

The FA have produced a Football Restart Guidance along with specific guidance for different parties, including coaches, which can be downloaded from http://www.thefa.com/about-football-association/covid-19

The FA have advised the following during the reintroduction of football training: social distancing should be maintained, the sharing of equipment should be kept to a minimum and strong hand hygiene practices should be in place before and after each session.

This risk assessment details the current controls in place and what further action is required for Panshanger FC to re-start coaching sessions during COVID-19. This assessment, the existing control measures and further actions required to be Covid-secure will be shared with the coaches and parents. What are the hazards?	Infection from the Coronavirus disease (Covid-19)	
Who may be harmed and how?	 The COVID-19 virus spreads primarily through droplets of saliva or discharge from the nose when an infected person coughs or sneezes The virus can survive for up to 72 hours out of the body on surfaces which people have coughed on, etc. People can catch the virus from others who are infected by breathing in the droplets or by touching contaminated surfaces and then touching their eyes or mouth. Anyone can be affected.
