Web Site Content Guidance

1. Introduction

- 1.1. This document sets out the guidelines to be followed by those contributing any material that will be published on the club website.
- 1.2. Permission to deviate from these guidelines must be sought from the Management Committee prior to publication.
- 1.3. Any content not complying with these guidelines will be removed from the website without notice.
- 1.4. The purpose of these guidelines is to ensure that the content displayed on www.panshangerfc.co.uk follows best practice for a youth organisation website and to promote an understanding of online security within the club.
- 1.5. Queries on these guidelines should be addressed to the Web site Administrator.

2. General

- 2.1. No child (Under 18) surname will be shown on the website.
- 2.2. Adults (Over 18) surnames will only be used with their permission. It is the responsibility of the person publishing the material to obtain that permission.
- 2.3. No information that could assist in the identity and location of a child being revealed should be published.
- 2.4. No content that, in the view of the Management Committee, could bring Panshanger FC into disrepute or adversely affect the club members or officers shall be permitted.

3. Images

- 3.1. Consent for the use of images must be obtained from a child's parent/guardian prior to publication. This will be sought as part of the Panshanger FC Membership Application process.
- 3.2. Still images must be uncaptioned.
- 3.3. Close-up images of an individual child must not be used.
- 3.4. Care must be taken to ensure that any soundtrack on video footage does not breach any of the guidelines in other parts of this document.

- 3.6. Images must only be used for the purpose for which consent was given.
- 3.7. If a parent/guardian is unhappy with an image of their child appearing on the site they should immediately contact the Panshanger FC Web site Co-ordinator or the Charter Standard Officer via the 'Contact Us' addresses on the website.

4. Match Reports

- 4.1. Match reports should be a positive summary of the game.
- 4.2. No players surname will be used. This includes those over 18 years old who are qualified to play youth football.

- 4.3. No criticism of match officials should be made or implied.
- 4.4. No criticism of the opposition should be made or implied.
- 4.5. Match reports involving U10 age group and younger teams must not reveal a result to the reader.
