

BEXHILL UNITED FOOTBALL CLUB were formed in 2002 following the amalgamation of Bexhill Town and Bexhill Amateur Athletic Club, who finished as runners-up in the East Sussex Football League Premier Division in 2002, four points behind champions Hollington United. Bexhill Town Athletic were champions of the Sussex County League in 1957, and again in 1966 and 1967.

In 1970 the club became Bexhill Town and played in Division One of the County League until relegation in 1981. The following season they were relegated once again, but won promotion back to Division Two at the first attempt. In 1990 they finished as champions of Division Two and were finally promoted back to Division One after several near misses in previous seasons.

The club struggled, but maintained its place amongst the County League's top flight until relegation back to Division Two in 1994. Four years later Bexhill were relegated once more to Division Three, where they remained prior to formation of the new club.



A HISTORY OF OUR CLUB

Littlehampton Town Football Club was officially founded in 1896, but evidence suggests football was played in the town as early as 1891 and the club started in 1893.

In the early years games were played at Selbourne Road but in the early 1900s sport moved to The Sportsfield where matches continue to be played today.

Back then the team's colours were dark green and the club were known as the 'Greenbacks'. The colours were changed in 1911 to blue and then in 1931 to white. We changed to a gold strip in 1953 and the first reference to our nickname 'The Marigolds' was in the Littlehampton Gazette on 13 November 1953.

Littlehampton Town joined the Sussex County Football League in 1928 and the club stayed in Division One for 67 years. The first match in the new league was against Haywards Heath and we won 5-1. In 1949 we won the RUR Charity Cup and the Sussex Senior Cup.

Under the guidance of Terry Gill we were very successful in the late 1960s and we won the Sussex Senior Cup again in 1970. Littlehampton Town were Division One runners-up eight times until we finally won the title in 1991.

That year will never be forgotten. A draw

at Peacehaven & Telscombe in front of 1,400 fans meant Golds won the title on goal difference. The same year the club won through to the First Round Proper of the FA Cup. The highlight was a home match against Northampton Town, staged at The Sportsfield in front of 4,000 fans.

The Golds also reached the semi-final of the FA Vase, losing to Gresley Rovers. That year the team played more cup matches than league games and won the Sussex League Challenge Cup too. Littlehampton Town dropped to Division Two in 1995 and Carl Stabler came back as manager and took them back up in 1997, where they were again runners-up.

In 2003 we were relegated once again, but made a swift return with a Division Two league and cup double success. We fell out of the top flight again in 2008 and spent six years in Division Two.

Mark Bennett, a former player from the 1991 season joined as manager and oversaw the Division Two title in 2013, where we only lost four league games all season and were finalists in the John O'Hara Cup.

In 2015 we recaptured the Division One title - for the first time in 23 years - on the final day of the season and the last year of the Sussex County Football League.



SUPPORTERS NOTICE

We have been advised by the Sussex County FA that it is an offence for a spectator to enter the field of play at any time. Failure to comply may have serious consequences.

This restriction applies one hour prior to kick off, whilst the match is in progress, the half time interval and for one hour after the game's conclusion.

Only players, match officials, management, team mascots and grounds staff are allowed to enter the field of play during these times.

All persons entering the ground are subject to the rules and regulations of the England Football Association.

The club reserves the right to eject or prosecute any person who within the club premises is considered by the club committee or its employees to be or have been behaving in the following ways:

a) entering the field of play before or during the course of the game.

b) using obscene, abusive or racist language or persistently swearing.

c) intoxicated by drink or drugs.

Furthermore, persons will not be allowed entry to The Sportsfield if in the opinion of the gate, stewards, or any members of the committee they are intoxicated.

No bottles or metal cans, glasses, weapons, smoke bombs or flares of any kind are allowed in the ground.

The stewards have the right to search a spectator if they believe that the person is in possession of any item that is deemed to be a danger to other spectators.

Alcohol must only be consumed within the confines of The Sportsman bar. The climbing of fences or pylons and all buildings within the ground is strictly forbidden. Supporters are requested not to smoke in the main stand for safety reasons.

Littlehampton Town FC does not accept any liability for injury to supporters or claims of any kind resulting from incidents either inside or around the ground. Thank you for your cooperation. Enjoy your visit and please come and support us again soon.
