Captain's Corner

Helen Cue - Ladies Club Captain

Hello from Cuey!

Well I don't know about you all but I am finding the "Blue Notes" great for pulling lots of info together for us all - so thanks to all contributors.

Now onto What's on My Mind at this point of the season with around 5 matches left before Christmas. First a quick look at league positions in their divisions:

- 1s North Prem 4th P8: 4W 3D 1L 2s North Div 2 - 5th P8: 4W 1D 3L 3s Ches. Div 3 - 2nd P8 8W
- 4s Ches. Div 3 7th P8: 2W 1D 5L 5s Ches . Div 4 6th P8 3W 2D 3L

So from the point of view of what we what we agreed at the start of the season we are not doing badly The 3s are maintaining that top 2 place alongside Rhyl and just ahead of Wilmslow - which means that the strategy of pushing for 3s promotion is still there for grabs.

Alongside that we targeted top four (or better) finishes for 1s and 2s - challenging in those Divisions and maintaining good safe table positions for 4s and 5s. So I think we can all be pleased so far.

I think having these clear targets has helped us all - we (captains and coaches) have used it to help make some tricky decisions at times eg. One weekend the 2s played with a kicking back to allow the 3s to take a keeper. I was so pleased that at selection the captains and coaches were all in agreement with that decision as we could all see the bigger picture. Decisions like this are never easy but we had the confidence to know we were doing it for all the right reasons.

Alongside that I am really pleased that we have had good movement between teams and in doing so really have created strength in depth across the teams.

One thing that could scupper our best laid plans would be if we end up having to concede any game due to lack of umpires. We have had one or two instances where our oppo have got caught in traffic and it struck me recently that for some of the teams if our umpire was delayed at all we wouldn't have anyone qualified (or part qualified) to step up and umpire - which means we would lose precious points.



So each team is targeted with getting two people qualified - the first step is to take the online test. The good news is - the test is free and it improves your knowledge of the rules as well. The link is http://rules.englandhockey.co.uk/ and you just keep re-taking it until you pass.

That now brings me onto training. Training/coaches and league/affiliation are our biggest costs so we need to make sure we are getting as much as we can from the money we spend. The work we did over the summer and in the early part of the season with the coaches has stood us in good stead. But as we get further into dark cold wet nights (yes I know it's mild at the moment but this won't last!) then please do make the effort to get down. The more we train together and get common approaches through all the sides the more success we will get. I'd like all our opposition teams to come off against us saying "wow they were good - you can tell they train together ". If you are a regular player please do try and get down as often as possible - and as someone who falls into the over 50 category I can assure you that we can all learn new stuff (yes you can teach an old dog new tricks!)

As well as the League we also have the various Cup Competitions - and the 22nd Nov is a date to look forward to - we have U16 Girls, U16 Boys, U18 Girls, U18 Boys and at the other end of the age group the Women's over 45s (local derby against Bowdon). So check the rest of the newsletter for fixture times on the 22nd.

I mentioned Christmas earlier which of course brings me to the Christmas raffle - and the tradition of donating a Drinks Hamper. So please be ready to buy and sell raffle tickets - and donate bottles for the Hamper (or for those U18 ask your parents to donate). Over the next couple of weeks you'll hear more of this via Captains or Amy Cunningham our Social Secretary.

WINTER WEATHER & HOCKEY PITCHES!

We might be having unseasonal high temperatures but as we know a sharp frost and subzero temperatures play havoc with hockey!

Pitch inspections will take place for training and match days and the decision will be made by the Timperley Sports Club staff or the nominated Committee member (we are in the process of confirming who this will be) in consultation with the Club. Captains and players must not make the decision to play / not play.

WINTER

If matches are cancelled (home or away) team captains will also contact players via Teamer, text or phone

Apart from frozen pitches we will pretty much play in all weathers – all players (especially younger players) are reminded to dress for the weather. If there is adverse weather during training sessions the players may come inside to continue the session with a discussion or tactics updates



We'd like each to take ownership and start to "love" their team pages on the website. Other clubs do this really well and we can set up each team to have a couple of administrators who can load team reports, photos and updates.

We already have people with team admin rights so will get some guidance out on how to load content. Let's see which team can get the best team pages

CHRISTMAS DRAW

The Christmas Draw is a major fundraiser for the Club and all players and parents are asked to support it by selling tickets and making a donation to the prizes.

UMPIRING

We still need players, parents, explayers or supporters to take the umpiring challenge and help grow our pool of level 1 umpires – as with more people qualified umpires won't have to umpire as many games.

We have applied to host an EH Umpiring course at the Club in January. To go on the one day course you need to have completed the on line course and contacted Nick Burnett or Malcolm Tucker our umpire developers so that they can work with you to see you umpire.

If you completed the old EH one day umpiring course but did not complete the assessment you do not have to go on the new one day course. Let Nick, Malcolm or Kieran Jeffrey know as soon as possible if you have done the old course. You can then do the on line test and contact Nick and Malcolm so they can watch you umpire and get you assessed

The free EH on line resources and interactive on line test is easy to do and can be done in stages. Even if you don't want to umpire it will help a lot of player may understand the Rules better and how they are interpreted.

So test your knowledge as a player of umpire signals do you know what these mean!
