#### WHO ARE WE?

AFC (Amalgamated Football Club) Sudbury was formed on Tuesday 1st June 1999 from the amalgamation of Sudbury Town (founded 1885) and Sudbury Wanderers (founded 1958) making it then the newest senior club in East Anglia.

The first ever game was played at The Priory Stadium (the previous home of Town) on 17th July 1999 against a full Colchester United side in the Harwich Charity Cup Centenary Shield Semi-Final, and saw a 2-4 defeat after extra time in front of 397 spectators.

The club now plays at King's Marsh, Brundon Lane, Sudbury, which

Wanderers purchased in 1972 and were previously water meadows, from which two pitches and a training area were created. The clubhouse was opened in 1985 and the dressing rooms in 1991. Floodlights were added in 1992 and the following year a 200-seat



stand was built in addition to the two areas behind the goals being covered. In 2000 a new stand, 'The Shed', was opened and caters for 300 standing fans. In 2016 seating was added into The Shed stand as well.

AFC Sudbury's Academy was launched in 2015/16 and has very quickly become one of the best academy's in the region with numerous silverware in the trophy cabinet and players now studying in USA and playing professional football. AFC Sudbury Girls Academy was launched in 2019 and has proved an immensely popular option for girls interested in studying and playing sport post sixteen.

The AFC Sudbury Women's team has a rich and colourful history, the latest chapter of which begun in late 2018 following a restructure. Now under new leadership and guidance, the future of women's football in Suffolk looks very exciting at AFC Sudbury.

## ACADEMY OVERVIEW

We are the only Football and Education Post 16 Scheme that provides the unique 'player performance pathway' where players are taught together, coached together and play together.

Every one of our coaches is also trained to degree level and therefore fulfills the role of coach and class teacher and instructor.

Our four Academy League Teams, AFC Sudbury Reserves, A, U19s and U18s only consist of players who are members of the Academy, we do not draw upon players who attend a different school or work or who plays for someone else. Similarly all our players only play for AFC Sudbury and no one else. We feel this is the only way to ensure your son develops alongside his peers and with the same coaches.

This may sound common but is unique in schemes such as this.

This unique program exposes our players to a high level of adult football from 16 years of age weekly in two leagues as well as regular age group football in our U18s and U19s. Because we do not balloon players in from outside the program a suitable volume of game time is available to maximise your two years with us.

**Match Report: AFC Sudbury 4-0 Felixstowe & Walton.** The Velocity Trophy, a competition we have used to blood youngsters and test systems in. A filthy night, the rain lashing down. Our visitors Felixstowe ( aren't they always ) It doesn't make for the greatest advert however if you weren't there then you missed a trick.

AFC fielded almost a full strength team against Felixstowe, mainly due to our pending F.A Youth Cup fixture on Thursday night against... oh yes, that'll be Felixstowe..again. In the rain the lads kept moving the ball well. Joe Whight was active up and down the left flank in a way we haven't seen for a while. It took us a quarter hour to take the lead and that goal came from Tom Maycock who was fed by Baris down the right, skipped past his marker and from an acute angle ran in on goal. As the keeper advanced Tom slipped it past his flailing right hand and the ball hit the net after striking the base of the right hand post. # TODAY'S VISITING TEAM - CORNARD UNITED FC

Cornard United are believed to have formed in 1920, playing in the Sudbury & District League for four seasons. They then transferred to the Nayland & District League for the 1924/25 – 1927/28 seasons, winning the league in all four seasons they were in it. In 1928/29 they returned back to the Sudbury & District League. Nothing is known of the club between 1929 and when they reformed in 1964.

In 2014, Cornard United celebrated its Golden Jubilee, having been re-formed back in 1964. The club initially played in The Sudbury Sunday League, before joining Division Three of The Bury and District League in 1966.

They were promoted to Division Two at the end of their first season, and further promoted again at the end of the next season. In 1970 they transferred to Division Six of The Colchester & East Essex League and were promoted to Division Five in 1972. After winning all 26 matches of the 1973-74 season they were promoted once again, and over the next few seasons, further success brought more promotions so by 1975 they had reached Division Two.

In 1976 the club switched leagues again, this time to Division One of The Essex and Suffolk Border League. However, when this league was restructured two seasons later the club were moved

down to the Second Division. They remained in the Second Division until 1983 when they were promoted back to Division One. In 1985-86 they won promotion to the Premier Division, and in the 1988-89 season they won the league, the league cup and the Suffolk senior cup with a 1-0 victory over local rivals, Sudbury Wanderers.

As a result of this success, the club was moved to Division One of the Eastern Counties League. They won this division at the first attempt, and were promoted to The Premier Division, where they remained until 1996, when after a poor season they were relegated back to the First Division, where they have remained ever since.

Initially, the club played at the Great Cornard Recreation Ground, before moving to Great Cornard Upper School in 1975. It was not until 1982 that they moved to their current ground in Blackhouse Lane. The record attendance at this ground was set in 2001 when over 450 people watched a friendly match against West Ham United.

After many years running The Club, Chairman and Manager, Chris Symes, left the club during 2013 and Mark Hoskin took over the roles. He, in turn, has now moved on and the current Chairman is Harvey Doherty who took over in 2014 after spending 10

vears as chairman of Cornard dynamos.

The first team was managed by Paul Grainger, with Chris Tracy assisted by Jack Wignall taking over for 2015/16. Ry Lines & Liam Aves took up the reins partway through 2017/18 season which was very much a transition season. Family commitments have meant that Ry Lines stepped down ahead of the 2018/19 season. The team was managed for most of the 2018/19 season by player managers Matt Grove and Michael Schofield and Colin Athey as goal keeping coach.

2018/19 saw Cornard United make the final of the Suffolk Senior Cup, the first cup final in 30 years, unfortunately narrowly missing out to Achilles. First Team player managers Grove and Schofield decided to step down after the final.

2019/20 Cornard United Grassroots has been formed, chaired by Tony New. This consists of a number of teams from under 9s through to under 18s playing in Sunday leagues and based at the Delphi Sports Ground.

2019/20 sees another transition year for the first team following the resignation of joint player managers after the senior cup final and the majority of first team squad deciding to move elsewhere. The new first team management team of Dave Childs,

Micky Southee and Lee Web with Colin Athey continuing as goal keeping coach take up the challenge.

The reserves are managed by Steve Rogers with Ray Manser stepping down at the end of 2018/19. The under 18s are now managed by Mark Arnold and Chris Benham who are experienced youth coaches at Cornard Dynamos.
