Hello all, thank you for the opportunity to speak to you about why I should be your treasurer for the upcoming year. I will start by discussing what makes a good treasurer and then talk about my experiences and commitment to the team.

There are three key skills a good club treasurer must have. They are: be capable of handling figures, have good communication skills and have good attention to detail. I have a great affinity with numbers and mathematical models, experience acquired in my years as a researcher at the University of Bristol, University of Nottingham and University of Birmingham. I applied statistical and mathematical models daily as a Post-doctoral fellow. Additionally, I managed grant money and budgeting for the research projects I worked on, being familiar with standard procurement procedures and financial reporting for the funding bodies. These skills can be transferred to managing the finances of a rugby team.

As a scientist, I have been prone to have attention to details throughout my career. When designing and conducting experiments, paying attention to all the small details is crucial to avoid errors and waste of resources.

In my current work position, I am a Training Manager for an NHS trust. In my job, I manage the training budget for my department. I forecast yearly expenses, write fund release requests, control annual expenses and produce quarterly expenditure reports. I also have to communicate complex data that I analyse to stakeholders through reports and presentations to guide decision-making. This part of my job gave me essential experience that can be applied when reporting the yearly financial summary to the club members and the next AGM.

Finally, to work in a dynamic environment such as science and healthcare, I need to learn new applications, programs and processes quickly, so if the system used by the club is not one that I am familiar with, I am sure I will be able to learn it quickly.

Above all that, I have been with the team for a while and always showed eagerness to help as much as possible. I volunteered to help with social media posts, volunteered to staff stalls on Pride for two years, and participated in team events as much as my job and life permitted. When I heard about this position opening, I saw an excellent opportunity to contribute with something more within my set of skills.
