INTRODUCTION

Founded in 1946 post World War II on a borrowed pitch by the Old Boys of Darlington Queen Elizabeth Grammar School, Mowden Park is a historic club from the North East of England that is on a truly remarkable journey.

1971

The club moved to Yiewsley Drive in 1971 and chnaged its name to Darlington Mowden Park RFC. Mowden played at the ground for 32 years and enjoyed a number of promotions as they began to climb the leagues.



2013

In early 2013 Mowden Park in the Community was officially founded in line with the club's ambitious vision. The Community team began delivering sessions in local schools and clubs and has grown to engage over 50,000 people since its foundation.



1946

In 1946 the Old Boys of Darlington Queen
Elizabeth Grammar School – mostly ex-forces
– played some scratch games at the end of
the 1945/46 season, and began the 1946/47
season as a properly constituted Club.



2012

In late 2012 Darlington Mowden Park Rugby Football Club (DMPRFC, or "the Club") sold their outgrown ground at Yiewsley Drive to a housing developer and with the proceeds opportunely bought the empty Arena for £2.6 million.

The Club played its first game at the Arena in March 2013 and set about unlocking its vast potential with a pioneering plan.



2014

On Saturday 3rd May 2014 Darlington Mowden Park were promoted to National League One

A league high 6,000 supporters watched on as they defeated Ampthill in extra time to secure their 2nd promotion in just 3 years.



MOWDEN PARK IN THE COMMUNITY

Mowden Park in the Community was founded in 2013 and has delivered programmes and initiatives to over 50,000 children, young people and adults in 75+ schools, colleges and community groups across the North East.

Mowden Park in the Community exists to utilise the passion and family ethos of the Mowden Park brand, to provide opportunities and build brighter futures for people in our communities. Mowden Park in the Community is building a legacy for sport, health and social cohesion across our community. A range of programmes are delivered that help reach all members of the community from primary schools all the way up to adults.

Funding which is generated, funds the delivery of the community programme, staff and community events. Mowden Park in the Community aspires to become a registered charity within the next 12 months to generate further funding to support the work being delivered within the community.

RUGRATS RUGBY

Mowden Park in the Community works in partnership with Rugrats Rugby within the North East. Rugrats Rugby is children's Rugby classes for boys and girls aged between 2 and 7 years. Sessions are fun, energetic and engaging. The programme is specifically designed and will take children on a journey teaching them how to pass, catch, kick and run as well as taking turns and working as a team.



BRONZEPATRON

SECONDARY SCHOOLS

Mowden Park in the Community delivers rugby and other sports within secondary schools, introducing new sports or building upon the existing skills of the pupils. The coaching can be focussed upon a specific age group or open to the whole school within an after-school club setting.



PRIMARY SCHOOLS

We deliver a wide range of packages to suit the educational needs of primary schools. From rugby specific programmes to multi-sport packages, we cater programmes to suit the school. The packages allow schools the opportunity to introduce rugby and other sports into the school for the first time or to help build upon the existing skills of the pupils. The packages incorporate several items, ensuring that all pupils get the opportunity to experience rugby and other sports in some capacity. Our packages enhance learning, making school life happier and healthier, whilst improving behaviour and attainment.





RUGBY CAMPS

The Mowden Park in the Community Rugby camps sit proudly as one of our core rugby programmes which caters for those wishing to try rugby for the first time to those who play to a high community level and wish to develop their skills and game play. With the core values of rugby – teamwork, respect, enjoyment, discipline and sportsmanship at the heart of everything Mowden Park in the Community do, along with our Mowden Family ethos, the rugby camps will be an experience not to miss!

Our player centred sessions are active, purposeful, enjoyable and safe for the participants regardless of their age or rugby experience. We offer a variety of different Rugby camps that offer a wide range of different training opportunities, which is accessible for a range of ages and abilities. The Rugby camps are delivered by our players, club volunteers along with our Community Coaches.

ACCESS THE ARENA

The Arena Tours showcase the world class 25,000-seater Arena, which sits on an inspiring 40+ acre site including, the main Arena pitch, additional floodlit pitches and training facilities, gym and leisure spaces, commercial offices and resident businesses, along with our fantastic hospitality and conferencing spaces. Tour attendees will be given an insightful tour into the daily regime of what it takes to be a professional rugby player, a meet and greet with our players and coaches, along with an opportunity for a Q&A session with a special guest! All attendees are also given a match ticket to a 1st XV match day.





OUTDOOR ADVENTURE

Mowden Park in the Community is delighted to be working in partnership with Outdoor Ambition on the delivery of our Outdoor Adventure Camps. The camps are designed to introduce young people to the thrills of outdoor adventure. The activities provide young people with the opportunity to try new activities, develop team building skills and have a vast amount of fun all at the same time!

BRONZE PATRON

The Mowden Park in the Community Men's Health Programme is a lifestyle programme aimed at men aged 35+ and with a waist size of 38 inches or more. The concept was originally delivered at professional football clubs, participants get the chance to learn about diet and nutrition, healthy lifestyle choices and take part in gentle physical activity. Each programme runs one evening a week for 13 weeks at the Arena, with participants building up their ability to take part in some rugby related activity.

The aim is to reduce male obesity, improve life expectancy and reduce health inequalities. Wider benefits to the programme participants are: increased knowledge of diet and nutrition, improve lifestyle choices, increase physical activity, reduce weight and waist circumference, increase engagement in other physical activity and improve mental health and self-esteem.

WALKING RUGBY

Walking Rugby is a simplified version of Rugby suitable for all ages, abilities & genders and being a competitive passing game, suitable for ex Rugby players, injured and rehabilitating current players and those interested in Rugby without any experience! Those past retirement age can still indulge in their passion without the full-on contact or those wishing to keep up their activity levels can try a new sport. Walking Rugby is a great leveller and players do not need to be fit – we can work on that together.

TEAM TALK

Team Talk is a programme aimed at the over 50's to combat loneliness, social isolation and dementia across our local communities. The programme consists of weekly physical and social activities being delivered in the community. Working with people over the age of 50 and using the core values of rugby, Mowden Park in the Community will support participants to improve their health and wellbeing by engaging them in physical, social and volunteer activities. Furthermore, the programme aims to develop long term social networks.

HEALTHY HOLIDAYS

Healthy Holidays is a comprehensive multisport programme delivered during the school holidays targeting young people from within deprived communities. Working in partnership with local support agencies, families will be referred into the programme. Children and young people will benefit from fun based multisport activities along with being provided with lunch, supporting families on low incomes, ensuring children and young people receive one substantial meal per day.

13 million families live below the poverty line in the UK, with families going hungry every day and parents not being able to afford to pay for activities for their children during the holidays. More than a quarter of parents suffering from some form of food poverty say they are unable to provide food for all the meals their children need during the school holidays. The Healthy Holidays programme aims to alleviate the pressures faced by many families living in poverty during the school holiday period.

Leadership volunteering is a vital part of all these courses allowing young people and adults, to practice and build their skills to improve employability.

Mowden Park in the Community can develop a programme for young people and adults. Awards and qualifications include; Primary Leaders, Women, Get, Set, Go! Young Leader Award, Level 1 Award in Sport or Dance Leadership, Level 2 Award in Community Sports Leadership and many more!

LEARNING THROUGH SPORT

Mowden Park in the Community works in partnership with 123Teachers, helping schools across the North East to provide educational sports activities. Mowden Park in the Community and 123Teachers understand the importance of sport in schools, so we have teamed up to enhance the opportunities that young learners can have in the development of sport and education.

Making learning fun is a great way to help young learners absorb lessons that will stay with them and that's where Mowden Park in the Community can help. We deliver in partnership with 123Teachers, the Learning Through Sport days, the sport-themed, numeracy and literacy programmes for young learners across the North East. The programme aims to increase young learners understanding of numeracy and literacy, boost young learners' confidence and increase physical activity levels.



LEVEL 5/6 PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS IN PRIMARY SCHOOL PHYSICAL EDUCATION SPECIALISM AND SUBJECT LEADERSHIP (AFPE)

We are a Professional Learning Centre (PLC) with Sports Leaders UK, accredited to deliver these qualifications to delegates. Our programme has successfully been delivered to school teaching and support staff within the North East.

The Level 5 Certificate in Primary School Physical Education Specialism aims to upskill primary school teachers, HLTA's and TA's to become specialists. Delegates will be able to raise standards through high quality PE teaching within their school.

The Level 6 Award in Primary School Physical Education Subject Leadership aims to upskill primary school teachers to become PE subject leaders. Delegates will be able to lead the delivery of sustainable high-quality PE in their school.

CREATE DEVELOPMENT – REAL PE

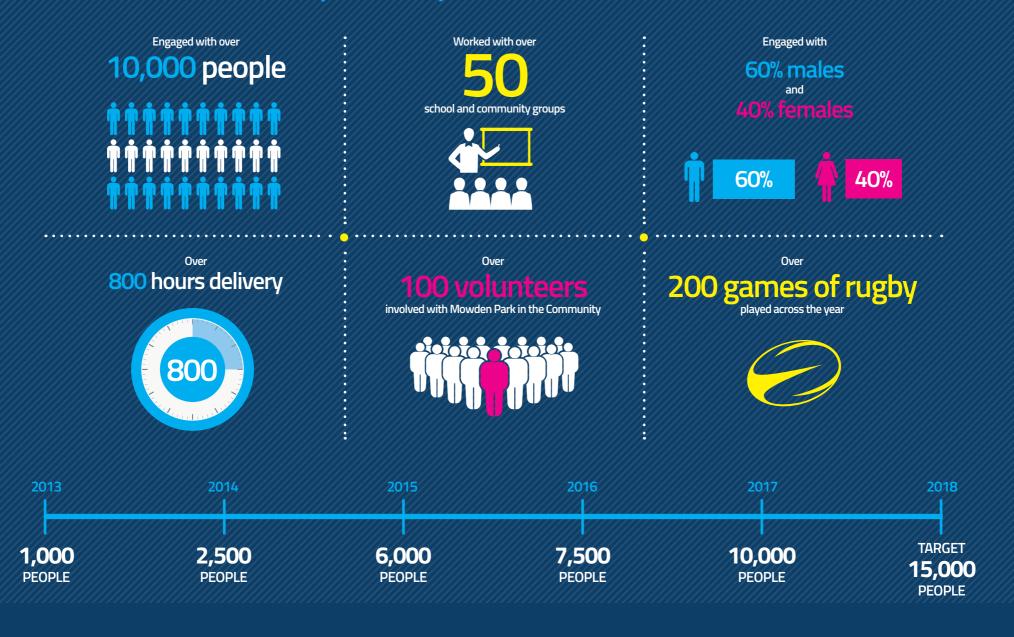
