P6 now have a squad of 23 players with a mixture of very experienced players (Finn, Jake & Ben P have been with us from P1) and very new players joining this season (Isaac, Matt M, Logan, Lewis A). With such a large squad of varying abilities and experience the 4 coaches (Scott, Ben, Keith & Andy) do find it a challenge to plan training sessions and keep everyone enthused and learning.

However, the biggest challenge comes when trying to get enough competitive game time for everyone, given that we play 8 aside and most tournaments restrict squad numbers to 12. Let's face it, kids don't learn much standing on the touchline watching others.

It's a real balancing act and some of the things the coaches have been juggling with are:

- Kids develop quickest when playing against teams of a similar ability. Neither team develops when the score line has been 10 – 0 or the big guy just runs through the little guys.
- Good players develop quicker when playing with other good players. We've seen our more experienced players get frustrated when team
 - mates won't tackle or keep dropping the ball and the team descends to the lowest ability. The developing players also hide behind the better players so to speak, allowing them to do all the tackling and attacking.

- We split the squad in to 2
 - teams on a Sunday for matches. Squad morale is higher when we split in to 2 equal teams (although the better players want to play with the other better players) rather than a firsts and seconds.
- It is genuinely all about fun and developing the players and not about the results. However, we develop the players so they can be a better rugby TEAM and win more games, so I suppose the ultimate aim is to win games.

Our conclusion is that we mix it up depending on the opposition. We give everyone equal game time and try where ever possible to make this against players of similar experience. Sometimes it works, sometimes it doesn't but trying to keep a big squad of varying experience and ability happy, is a challenge. An even bigger challenge is keeping the parents happy, who after all pay the same money, drive the same distances and want to watch their kids play and develop. Thankfully we have a very supportive group of parents.

Our results so far this season have been pretty good overall. We win some, we lose some but I have yet to come across a squad as big as ours and with the strength in depth that we have. Our aim is to develop the whole squad so we are prepared for the 15 aside games to come.




