"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Visitors' Club History



Parkgate F.C. was formed September 1969 out of the Parkgate Steelworks Wire Department who were four times winners of National Wire Drawers Cup. They joined Division Two of the Hatchard League, losing the first game away to Telephone Sports 3-0.

In 1971 joined the Sheffield & Hallamshire County F.A. Senior League then two years late in 1973 joined the Yorkshire League as B.S.C. Parkgate F.C., which, is now the Northern Counties East Football League in which they compete today.

The club was winners of the Rotherham Charity Cup in 1983/1984, 1998/1999 and runners up in 1996/1997. They were runners up in the Mexborough Montagu Hospital Cup in 1979 and 1987 and again in 1991/1992 when they lost 2-1 to fellow Northern Counties East League team Brodsworth Miners Welfare.

In 1992 the Club installed floodlights at their Roundwood home ground and David Bassett, then the Manager of Sheffield United, brought along a team for the switch on.

The 1997/1998 seasons saw the Club reach the final of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup Competition, where they lost 3-0 to Emley. They also finished fourth place in the League, their highest place for a number of years.

1998/1999 saw the Club reach the final of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy, where they lost to Yorkshire Amateurs. After Challenging for Promotion all season they finished in fourth place again.

2001/2002 saw Russ Eagle take over as Manager with a lot of new signings the club were hoping for a good season.

In March 2002 Russ left to become Assistant Manager at Belper Town. Stewart Evans stepped in to be Manager.

Stewart was again appointed Manager for season 2003/04 after a good finish to 2002/03 Season.

Season 2003/04 saw the Steelmen finish in eighth place. Manager Stewart Evans and his assistant Vinnie Brady were appointed for season 2004/05 but after a run of bad results Stewart resigned leaving his assistant Vinnie Brady in charge.

During the 2005/2006 season the Steelmen finished in sixth position just missing out on a promotion place and lost 2-1 in the final of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup to an injury time goal

The 2006/2007 seasons saw Parkgate win the Wilkinson Sword Trophy and the Division One Championship, which saw them promoted to the Premier Division.

The great surprise was the resignation of Team Manager Vinnie Brady after a successful season; Parkgate appointed Assistant Manager Russell Eagle to the position of Team Manager ably assisted by his Assistant Manager Darren Grady.

2007/2008 Parkgate were semi finalist in the League Cup and County FA Senior Cup and finished 8th in the League.

Manager Russell Eagle resigned as Manager, as did Assistant Manager Darren Grady at the end of the season to concentrate on business commitments. Parkgate appointed Sean Hutchinson as Manager and Wilf Race as Assistant Manager but at the end of the season Wilf Race resigned his position as Assistant Manager and was appointed the Manager of Hallam FC, Mark Smith was appointed as Assistant Manager at Parkgate FC.

Due to a string of poor results and an 8-3 defeat at Hall Road Rangers FC in October 2009 Sean Hutchinson ten-

dered his resignation.

The Steelmen moved swiftly and appointed Russell Eagle as Team Manager for his second stint at the Club and Darren Bonnington as Assistant Manager but in June 2010 Russell Eagle resigned as Manager at Parkgate FC to take over as Manager of newly promoted Division One side Handsworth FC.

The Steelmen moved swiftly and appointed Douglas Shelley from AFC Celtic, who appointed Wilf Race as his Assistant for Season 2010/2011. The season proved to be the most successful in the clubs history, a new look squad saw the Steelmen finish second in the NCEL Premier and reach the Final of the Sheffield & Hallamshire Senior Cup Final at Hillsborough.

Last season Parkgate enjoyed another successful campaign with a solid top half finish and a good run in the FA Vase. The Steelmen will be looking to progress from last season with Doug bringing in several exciting new players and appointing former Macclesfield Town manager Gary Simpson as his assistant.

In October 2012 Doug Shelley resigned from his role at Parkgate, he was swiftly replaced by the returning Russ Eagle who returned for his third spell at the club. However, Eagle also resigned in the summer of 2013 to take a post at Worksop Parramore which led to the appointment of Steve Adams to take the Steelmen into the 2013/14 season and is now in his third season at the Club assisted by his Assistant Gary Middleton, Goal Keeping Coach Robert Poulter and Physiotherapist Shannon Brooks

TAD'S History

By Ian Tyssen

1997-1998 Season

The size of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) remained at 35 clubs for the 1997/98 season, with 20 in the Premier Division and 15 in Division One. Belper Town had been promoted to the Northern Premier League, Curzon Ashton were bizarrely relegated to the NCEL and Staveley Miners Welfare moved up from the Central Midlands League. Ashfield United also left the NCEL after being disbanded.

Tadcaster Albion would again finish the season in 13th position but on a higher number of points - 30 instead of 22. Although this can be attributed to the awful season suffered by Blidworth Welfare, who lost all 28 games, conceding 186 goals. The Brewers beat them 13-0 at home and 10-0 away, which are still club record victories.

The league season started well with a home win against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare but four straight defeats followed, before the home crushing of Blidworth Welfare.

The next stage of the season was a picture of inconsistency, with a mix wins, draws and losses.

Back to back defeats, 0-3 away and 2-3 at home, were suffered against the local rivals and champions, Garforth Town.

December and January saw no wins in five league games but the away win at Blidworth Welfare eventually brought that run to an end and sparked a three game winning sequence. This included an impressive 4-0 triumph over NCEL new boys Staveley Miners Welfare, who would finish second in the league, and a 2-1 win at tonight's opponents, Parkgate.

The final few months of the season brought too many draws and defeats, with just one more win - 2-1 against Winterton Rangers.

The Brewers enjoyed a little success in the cup competitions of the 1997/98 season. Although it didn't come in the FA Cup, with a 0-3 loss at home against Stocksbridge Park Steels.

North Yorkshire neighbours Pickering Town, from the NCEL Premier Division, were knocked out of the FA Vase in the second qualifying round. However, another NCEL Premier Division team, Thackley, proved too strong in the first round proper - winning 4-1 at Ings Lane.

second round but Glasshoughton Welfare ended hopes of Albion glory with a 1-4 defeat in the third round.

In the League Cup, Tadcaster Albion travelled to fellow Division One club Borrowash Victoria in the second round and won 5-1. Premier Division champions Hucknall Town were the third round opposition and it ended in a 4-0 home win for the higher division

Mid table NCEL Premier Division club, Selby Town were beaten 2-1 at Ings Lane by the Brewers in the West Riding County Cup second round. Thackley then knocked Albion out of a second cup competition, with a narrow 2-1 victory in the third round.

The Brewers' second XI didn't pick up a win in the Reserve Division until February and suffered some heavy home defeats in the opening six months of the season - 2-12 and 1-11 against Liversedge and champions Ossett Albion, respectively.

When the wins did come, they were in three consecutive games in February and included a 2-1 victory over second placed Ossett

Three more wins were achieved by the reserves in the final two months, including a 2-0 home triumph over bottom club Selby Town in the final game.

The Brewers reserves finished 14th in a 15 team Reserve Division with 21 points from 28 games, thanks to a strong end to the season.

In the Reserve Team Cup, Tadcaster Albion lost 4-0 at Glasshoughton Welfare.

Tonight's visitors, Parkgate, finished fifth in the NCEL Division One, with 45 points from 28 games. They enjoyed some cup success, with a couple of victories in the FA Cup before replay defeat against Belper. Staveley Miners Welfare beat Parkgate in the Wilkinson Sword Trophy semi final, on the way to lifting the trophy themselves. Finally, the Steelmen won through to the Sheffield and Hallamshire Senior Cup final for the first time but were beaten 3-0 by Emley at Hillsbrough.




