

"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Gary Stevens GOALKEEPER

Gary Stevens – Gary is a vastly experienced and competent goalkeeper who first came to Tadcaster Albion's attention when he played against the club for Highworth Town in the Quarter Final of the FA Vase. Gary, who previously played for Cardiff City Academy, Radstock Town and Purton FC, kept an impressive 23 clean sheets last season and has recently relocated to the Yorkshire area.



Danny Stimpson defender

Danny started his career as a striker before switching to Centre Half and has been on the books at Leeds United, Huddersfield Town, York City, Ange IF (Swedish Professional) and Harrogate Town. Standing 6ft 4ins, Danny is a kick boxing black belt who is a formidable player for TAFC.

Josh began his footballing career at Leeds United before moving to York City FC as a teenager where he remained until he was 16. Josh, who has also previously played for Dunnington, is an explosive winger who joined The Brewers in 2013. On his day, Josh is unplayable. He scored nine goals in the 2014/15 season.



Paddy Miller defender

Paddy is a versatile defender who can play at Left Back, Centre Half or on the left side of midfield. He has previously played for Farsley AFC and won the NCEL Premier with Scarborough Athletic in 2012. He joined Tadcaster in 2014 and played an impressive 47 games for the club last season – scoring three goals in the process.



Nick Thompson MIDFIELD

Former York City player Nick is a Steven Gerrard-esque player who is popular with fans for his box to box displays in the centre of midfield. Nick was captain of the York City youth team until 2010 when he joined Tadcaster. He was the Player and Supporters' Player of the Year in 2011-12 and has scored over 30 goals in the last four seasons.

Tom is a tough-tackling, combative midfielder who has previously played for Goole, Scarborough Athletic, Whitby Town, Ossett Town, Bradford Park Avenue and Farsley AFC. He is currently captain of the Combined Forces team and also plays for the Royal Air Force.



Matt Heath DEFENDER

Matt played in the Premier League with Leicester City before signing for Leeds in 2006 – where he went on to make 52 appearances, scoring four goals. Matt has also played for Brighton & Hove Albion and Colchester United, and spent the 2014-15 season playing under Billy Miller at EvoStik Division One side Harrogate Railway.



Jimmy Beadle MIDFIELD

Jimmy is a goal-scoring midfielder who has previously played for York City, Whitby Town and Scarborough Town, and has also had spells abroad in Sweden and Norway. Jimmy joined Scarborough Athletic in December 2012 and went on to help the club win promotion from the NCEL in his first season. In the 2014/15 season he scored 20 goals in 37 starts for Scarborough.



Jordan Armstrong DEFENDER

Right Back Jordan started his football career with Preston North End Academy before going on to play for Shrewsbury Town and Cadiz CF in Spain's Segunda Division B. Most recently, he played for Harrogate Railway before opting to follow his former manager Billy Miller to Tadcaster



George Conway MIDFIELD

Former Huddersfield Town professional George is an outright traditional speedy winger. He is a former Scotland Youth International who has also played for Workington Town and Shaw Lane Aquaforce.

Josh Greening STRIKER

Josh is a pacey striker/winger who left Pickering Town to join Tadcaster in 2014. He has previously played for Leeds United Academy, Scarborough Athletic and Bridlington Town, and has a great eye for goal, which saw him make Taddy history last season when he scored three hat-tricks in three games. Last season's top scorer with 30 goals.



Danny Gray STRIKER

Danny, who describes himself as a big number 9 striker, signed from Selby in December 2014 for what is now his second spell with the club. Danny gives the team another option up front because of his size and presence.



Carl Stewart STRIKER

Carl first joined Tadcaster Albion before going on to have spells with Pickering Town, Bridlington Town and Ossett Town. He returned in 2013 and was the club's top scorer in the 2013/14 season, scoring 32 goals (a club record).



Nick Black STRIKER

Nick is a strong-running forward with close control skills and an eye for goal. At more than 6ft tall, Nick is a major presence in the air and isn't afraid to battle with the back line. Previous clubs include Selby Town and Garforth Town where he scored 12 goals last season from the right wing.



Adam Baker striker/midfield

Adam was a Leeds United youngster who moved to Bradford City where he stayed for eight years – signing as a professional at 18. Adam was in the 2013 Bradford City squad that reached Wembley twice and is hoping to replicate that success with Tadcaster Albion in the FA Vase. Most recently, he has played at Harrogate Railway where he scored 12 goals in the last four months of the season



Dan Clayton STRIKER/MIDFIELD

Dan is a goal scoring left winger who can also play as a striker. He is a fast and powerful player who is at his best when running at defenders. Dan has previously played for Hartlepool United, North Ferriby United and Gainsborough Trinity. He has also had two spells at Harrogate Town and was most recently at Scarborough Athletic.

TAFC Match Preview

The Brewers today welcome the fans, players and officials of Brigg Town to Tadcaster for this NCEL Premier League game. The Zebras have had a tough 2015 to date as they were relegated from the Northern Premier League at the end of last season after playing in that league since 2004. They have also found the NCEL tough going as they have lost their first 3 league games and also went out of the FA Cup at Cleethorpes Town. The Brewers come into this game in fine form after the 5-0 win at Athersley Recreation on Wednesday and the FA. Cup win last weekend at Hebburn Town. Brigg Town finished their last season in the NCEL Premier in 2003/4 in 3rd place, whilst the same season, The Brewers finished bottom of NCEL Division 1.

Elsewhere in the NCEL Premier this afternoon, Cleethorpes Town face a tricky trip to Albion Sports whilst Worksop Town are away at Pontefract Collieries. Current leaders Clipstone, recently promoted from NCEL Division 1 are at home to Barton Town Old Boys. After today's games, the pack should start to form at the top of the table so it is important that we stay with the front runners. The midweek win has lifted us up to 2nd place in the table with 6 points from 3 games played. I believe The Brewers will have enough to beat Brigg Town this afternoon, although no game is easy in this league. I will go for a 3-1 Brewers victory.

Visitors' History



Brigg Town FC, known as the Zebras, are the oldest surviving club in Lincolnshire, and one of the oldest clubs in England, having been formed in 1864. In the non-league world only Sheffield (1857), Harefield Utd (1858), Hallam (1860) and Cray Wanderers (1860) are older.

Brigg football was said in early 1870 to have become a recognised institution in the town, and members were practicing hard to take part in some important matches at Lincoln, Hull etc. From 1875 to 1888 Brigg Town was a strong and resourceful side, and at the end of 1883 it was reported that for two seasons Brigg had been runners up for the Lincolnshire Challenge Cup, in actual fact, losing to Spilsby in the final of the first County Cup competition. Brigg thereby gained the reputation of being the premier club in North Lincolnshire, scoring victories over Grimsby Town, Hull Town and Lincoln City - a few years later Grimsby Town and Lincoln City were in the Football League second division.

Thus the town of Brigg was one of the main centres of football in the latter part of the 19th century, with the club secretary, Harry Storm, being a leading light in the formation of the Lincolnshire FA. Of the original 16 clubs in the association no less than four of them were from Brigg itself.

The club played for many years in the Lindsey League, using the Old Manor House Convent playing field in Station Road. The club had many glory days at the Brocklesby Ox, where a record ground attendance of 2000 was noted, before moving to their present ground in Hawthorn Avenue.

In 1948 Brigg Town became founder members of the Lincolnshire League. In season 1949/50 the Zebras won their first League title and this was to be repeated a further seven times, before the team was elected to the Midland Counties League in 1976

At the end of the first season in the Midland League the club finished in third place and took the title in the following season, losing only one game in the process.

At the formation of the Northern Counties East Football League in 1982, Brigg were placed in Division One, as their ground did not meet the grading requirements of the Premier Division, but did gain promotion in 1985. New floodlights were installed during 1989/90 to ensure Premier

Division status was maintained. Improvements have continued, and the ground and facilities now meet the requirements of the UniBond League.

From 1996, Brigg finished fourth twice, third and second in the NCEFL Premier Division. In season 2000-2001 however, the Zebras went one better to win the title by a massive ten points. Unfortunately promotion to the UniBond League was denied, because the necessary ground improvements were not complete by the due date. In seasons 2001/02 and 2002/03 Brigg again finished in runners-up spot, and they were also memorable for FA Cup and Vase runs.

The 1995/96 season was the best in the clubs long history, when the Zebras lifted the coveted FA Vase, beating Clitheroe 3-0 in the final at Wembley Stadium. Brigg Town are now well known for their exploits in national FA Competitions reaching the 6th and 5th Round of the Vase in 2000/01, and 2001/02.

In season 2001/02 however, Brigg put themselves firmly on the map when they reached the 1st. Round Proper of the FA Cup, for the first time. After starting in the Extra Preliminary Round, and beating Northern Premier League opposition in subsequent rounds, Brigg visited Conference Champions Boston United, in the 4th Qualifying Round and came away with a famous 1-0 victory. This set up the trip to 2nd Division Tranmere Rovers, where despite losing 4-1, Brigg won many plaudits for the quality of their football. For this tremendous run Brigg were awarded the title of FA Cup Non-League performers of the season from the sponsors AXA.

Season 2002/03 was yet again a wonderful success story, when Brigg repeated their 1995/96 feat, by winning the FA Vase for a second time. The Final was staged at Upton Park, the home of West Ham United, and the Zebras put on an excellent display to win 2-1, and beat favorites AFC Sudbury. To win the Vase once is a dream come true for many clubs, but to win it twice is an achievement that Brigg Football Club and the Town itself can be justifiably proud.

A third place finish in the NCEFL Premier Division, following the re-structuring of Non League football, was enough to give them promotion to the Northern Premier League Division 1, for season 2004/05.

Creditable 8th places were achieved in their first two seasons, but continued success at the higher level has been difficult to achieve.

Brigg finished rock bottom of Div. 1 South in season 2008/09, only missing out on relegation due to the demise of others. The following season it was a time of consolidation for Brigg. In season 2010/11, with The Zebras gaining in maturity, they had their best season ever in the Northern Premier League, finishing in a very creditable play off position in 4th place.

That season's successful manager Steve Housham, took up a full time position with Gainsborough Trinity at the end of the season, to be replaced by the experienced former Wolverhampton Wanderers player Pete Daniel. After a difficult start Brigg retained their Evostik League status, but towards the end of the season, assistant manager Mick Gray, took over the managers role.

Gray's first season in full charge saw the Zebras finish in 13th place in the Evo-stik League table, a marked improvement on the previous year.

However, the side struggled at the start of season 2013-14 and Gray resigned at the end of November. He was replaced by a management "trio" of first team players, Paul Grimes, Scott Hellewell and Michael Jacklin. This unusual arrangement proved to be short lived however as first Grimes and then Jacklin left to join Grantham Town. Hellewell remained and was joined as joint manager by former Rotherham United coach Scott Barlow (assisted by assistant manager Gary Paton).

The Zebras struggled in the league, winning just 9 Evo-stik League matches all season but still managed to finish outside the relegation zone. Good runs were enjoyed in the cup competitions though with the team reaching the final of the Lincolnshire FA Senior Trophy where Brigg were unlucky to lose on penalties to Stamford after a thrilling 3-3 draw in a match played at Lincoln City's Sincil Bank stadium.

Sadly in Brigg's 150th year we were relegated to the Northern Counties East League Premier Division, With top FA coach Andy Foster now at the Helm things are looking up.

TAD'S History

998-1999 Season

After a few years of stability, the 1998/99 season brought a reduction of two teams in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL). The Premier Division continued to have 20 clubs and Division One shrunk to just 13 clubs.

Three clubs left the NCEL at the end of the 1997/98 season - Hucknall Town were promoted to the Northern Premier League, Curzon Ashton were moved to a more geographically sensible league and Blidworth Welfare joined the Central Midlands League after their disastrous season.

Within the NCEL, Hatfield Main were relegated to Division One, whilst Garforth Town and Staveley Miners Welfare were promoted to the Premier Division.

During the first three months of the season, the Brewers only played six league games, with nine other fixtures being in five different cup competitions. In those six games, victories were picked up against third placed Glapwell (2-0), Yorkshire Amateur (2-0) and Borrowash Victoria (2-1).

One week after a 1-5 loss at Rossington Main, Albion won 4-1 against the same club at Ings Lane. The Brewers then lost seven and drew three of the next ten league games, including a 0-8 thrashing at Parkgate.

Tadcaster Albion then put together a five league game run with no defeats. It included home wins over Winterton Rangers (3-0) and Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare (3-2) plus a 2-2 draw against champions Harrogate Railway.

The league season came to an end with a pair of defeats against Louth United for the Brewers, which ensured an 11th place finish with 24 points from 24 games.

The season had started with a 1-0 home win over Ossett Town in the FA Cup preliminary round. Town would go on to finish second behind Ossett Albion, in the NCEL Premier Division. In the first round qualifying, the Brewers beat Armthorpe Welfare, also from the Premier Division, on penalties after a replay. The cup run ended in the second round qualifying, when Farsley Celtic won 2-1 at Ings Lane.

The FA Vase second round qualifying, NCEL Premier Division Selby Town won 3-1 at Tadcaster.

The President's Cup also brought an immediate exit for Albion with a 2-4 home defeat by Premier Division North Ferriby United.

As in the FA Cup. Farsley Celtic knocked the Brewers out of the West Riding County Cup - winning 3-1 at Tadcaster.

Another little cup run was enjoyed in the League Cup. This started with a 3-2 win at Division One club Hatfield Main. The Premier Division's bottom club, Pickering Town, were beaten 1-0 at Ings Lane in the second round. In the third round Armthorpe Welfare gained some revenge for their earlier loss in the FA Cup - winning 2-0 at home.

The Wilkinson Sword Trophy brought four games in the last few months of the season. Harrogate Railway were beaten 3-2 in a second round replay after a 0-0 draw. In the semi final, Yorkshire Amateur won 2-1 in a replay at Tadcaster following another 0-0 draw.

Tadcaster Albion's reserves finished bottom of the 14 team Reserve Division, with just 13 points from 26 games.

An 8-0 victory against fifth placed Thackley came early in the season and was followed by narrow wins over Harrogate Town, Eccleshill United and Liversedge as well as many defeats for the Brewers' reserves.

The heaviest defeat was 0-8 against champions North Ferriby United. Six goals were conceded in losses against Ossett Town, Thackley, Selby Town and Glasshoughton Welfare.

In the Reserve Team Cup, North Ferriby United beat Albion's second XI 2-0 in the second round.

This afternoon's opponents finished third in the NCEL Premier Division, just two points behind champions Ossett Albion. They also enjoyed a little success in the FA Cup before losing 0-2 against Tamworth in the third round qualifying.




