"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Visitors' History



The beautiful game has been played in Staveley for well over a hundred years and in 1883 a Staveley side beat Sheffield Wednesday 3-1 in the F.A Cup. In 1962 at nearby Barrow Hill under the name, Nag's Head FC, a Sunday side was formed, playing friendlies for three years before being accepted into the Mansfield League. In 1968 they transferred to the Chesterfield League, before a Saturday side was formed in 1989 at their current home of Inkersall Road, finishing runners-up in the Chesterfield Amateur League, and winning the Byron Cup.

In 1991 the club moved up to the Sheffield County Senior League and winning Division Three, then Division Two in consecutive seasons. Staveley by passed Division One and were welcomed into the Central Midlands League in 1993, finishing 4th, 12th, 5th and 3rd and, after passing the necessary ground grading requirements, continued their rise up pyramid by being accepted into the Northern Counties East Division One in 1997, and finished runnersup. and claimed their place in the Premier Division, joining the likes of Buxton and Sheffield. They also picked up their first piece of Northern Counties silverware, when winning the Wilkinson Sword Trophy, beating Harrogate Railway 8-3 on aggregate.

In 2000/01 season Staveley MW suffered the first relegation in their short history after finishing bottom, 67 points behind Champions Brigg Town, and then followed another disastrous season, finishing 2nd bottom of Division One, but surviving their status by re-election. Following a terrible run until Christmas with just one league victory and despite winning their last three away games the club still finished bottom of Division One, but were again duly re-elected. In 2003/04 the club finished 3rd bottom that year avoiding relegation somewhat fortuitously by re-election in the final minute of the season.

Things improved in the 2004/05 season with a creditable 9th place finish and in 2005/2006 and 2006/2007 finishes of 10th and 6th respectively were achieved.

In May 2007 it was reported that the clubs football committee had resigned on mass and the club was ready to fold before Terry Damms who was appointed as Chairman

and his team of helpers ,rushed through a rescue package to save the club from extinction in early June. In the weeks leading up to the start of the NCEL season things were frantic with urgent work to the ground and facilities, requiring a monumental effort to get the club ready for the season ahead.

The clubs ethos of youth football was evident from day one of the 2007/2008 season with no less than 7 first team regulars being eligible for the U19's. The club with what was basically an U19 team, managed a commendable 8th placed finish in the NCEL Division 1. The Under 19's gained promotion from division 3 to division 2.

In 2008/2009 the club went on a 23 game unbeaten run and collected 57-points from the last 25-games, finishing fourth, and added the Wilkinson Sword Trophy to the trophy cabinet being the only club to win it twice. The newly formed reserves came runners up in the Central Midlands Reserve League and the U19's gained promotion to the top division. A fantastic achievement by all 3-teams and the Staveley youth ethos was on it's way. In September 2009 the club was steered to a fourth place finish and again the Wilkinson Sword Trophy was won for the second year running with the reserves finishing 3rd and cup finalists losers and the U19's were division 1 runners up and cup finalists winners. The Chairman spearheaded the joining of Handley Wood Juniors Football Club in to the structure of Staveley MWFC. This was the huge piece to the Staveley ethos jigsaw and a great deal of hard work has gone in to securing a 25-year lease for the kids just down the road on Chantry Park where they can enjoy their football within a secure and pleasant surroundings. The club had strengthened its strategy of being a Community based club here for the benefit of the Community.

In 2010/2011 the club produced its best ever season with the first team having an array of youngsters in it winning the NCEL Division 1 Title, the reserves winning the Central Midlands Reserve league and the U19's finishing runners up and winning the Minishield. All sorts of records were broken during that season with us having the NCEL Top Scorer Ryan Damms who netted 38 times and surpassed 100 goals for the club, a record number of consecu-

tive and total clean sheets was achieved and a last 32 FA vase place was also achieved.

In 2011/2012 perhaps one of the clubs greatest achievements came when we came within a whisker of appearing in an FA Vase Final at Wembley eventually going out to the winners UTS Dunston by 3-2, a heart breaking experience if ever there was one. In early 2013 the clubs main sponsorship was lost and with the same all but a handful of players and the manager also left the club. The club mid-table. finished This exceptionally testing time for the club, but it's strategy remained and from where it started, its youth ethos, the club dusted itself down and set about re-building its model.

The 2013/2014 season started with a fair expectation, but ill-discipline and a string of poor results and performances followed and a mid-table finish was achieved.

For the 2014/2015 season the club went on an 11 game winning streak, but that was followed by the club taking just 18 points from the last 20 league games and a 9th finish was achieved. The U21 team however was starting to flourish and a top 3 finish and wining the HKLDFL Cup was a superb achievement.

We recognise here that it is the supporters who are as important if not more important than the players and managers themselves. Non-league football is here for a reason, to provide to a paying customer an enjoyable time at affordable prices with as good as facilities as each club can afford. We now have a group of people within our Press Gang, within our clubhouse, within our club structure that are all pulling together in one direction. It is not about the Chairman, the manager or any one player, it is about "the club" from tots at 3 and 4 year old through the juniors, ladies and U21 team to the first team. It's about our fantastic band of volunteers with whose help this club would not survive. We are a community club here for the benefit of the local people and kids. Yes we will recruit players from outside the region also where we compliment the differing people and groups so we are competitive. That must be done professionally, with discipline and respect for all concerned in our beautiful game.



TAD'S History

Season

Membership of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) increased from 33 to 36 clubs in the 1999/2000 season, thanks to the arrival of the reformed Goole AFC and Bridlington Town plus Mickleover Sports.

The Premier Division remained at 20 clubs, with Alfreton Town being relegated from the Northern Premier League and replacing Ossett Town, who were promoted despite finishing second behind local rivals Ossett Albion. Albion were denied promotion due to ground grading issues.

In Division One, there were now 16 clubs, with the three new clubs joining the NCEL. Pontefract Collieries and Pickering Town had been relegated to Division One, with Harrogate Railway and Brodsworth Welfare taking their places in the Premier Division.

The Brewers' opening two games were defeats against the reformed teams from Goole and Bridlington. Goole AFC would go on to become champions by a margin of 11 points.

Only two victories were picked up in the opening 15 league games - both 3-2 home wins over Hall Road Rangers and Louth United. During that opening half of the season, heavy losses were suffered against Winterton Rangers (1-7) and Parkgate (2-7 at home and 0-6 away).

The second half of the season started much better with a 2-1 win at Pickering Town and 3-0 success at home against third placed Borrowash Victoria.

Several further heavy defeats came before the end of the season, including a 0-6 reverse at second placed Glapwell. However, there were three more victories against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare (3-1), the bottom club Hatfield Main (2-1) and Rossington Main (1-0), which kept the Brewers off the foot of the Division One table.

Tadcaster Albion finished in 14th place, with 24 points from the 30 games and a minus 51 goal difference.

The Brewers crashed out of the FA Cup in the preliminary round, losing 0-6 at Tow Law Town in County Durham.

Another Northern League club, Guisborough Town, knocked Albion out of the FA Vase at the second round qualifying stage, with a 2-0 victory.

Tadcaster Albion failed to win any of their ties in the NCEL cup competitions. They were edged out 3-4 against Pontefract Collieries in the first round of the League Cup, before the same club completed a more convincing 5-0 victory in the first round of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy.

In a second round replay in the President's Cup, Hall Road Rangers won 4-3 at home after a 3-3 draw at Tadcaster.

There was a little success in the West Riding County Cup, which started in with a walkover against Yorkshire Amateur in the second round. NCEL Premier Division club, Harrogate Railway, were beaten 2-0 in the third round but another higher division club, Garforth Town, won 4-1 at Ings Lane in the semi

The reserves finished bottom of the 15 team Reserve Division, with only five points from 28 games and a minus 98 goal difference.

They had to wait until the penultimate match, on the 1st May, for the only win of the season - 2-1 at Brigg Town.

The biggest losses for the second XI were inflicted by Farsley Celtic (0-9 and 0-7), Glasshoughton Welfare (0-8), Liversedge (0-8), and Rossington Main (0-7).

In the Reserve Team Cup first round, Thackley beat the Brewers 2-0.

Today's visitors, Staveley Miners Welfare, finished 19th in the 20 club NCEL Premier Division but were spared relegation thanks to a controversial decision by NCEL officials. Instead, they relegated Maltby Main, who had finished one point and two places higher, as they didn't make required ground improvements.


