## "the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Former York City player Nick is a Steven Gerrard-esque player who is popular with fans for his box to box displays in the centre of midfield. Nick was captain of the York City youth team until 2010 when he joined Tadcaster. He was the Player and Supporters' Player of the Year in 2011-12 and has scored over 30 goals in the last four seasons.



## Paddy Miller defender

Paddy is a versatile defender who can play at Left Back, Centre Half or on the left side of midfield. He has previously played for Farsley AFC and won the NCEL Premier with Scarborough Athletic in 2012. He joined Tadcaster in 2014 and played an impressive 47 games for the club last season – scoring three goals in the process.



### Tom Claisse MIDFIELD

Tom is a tough-tackling, combative midfielder who has previously played for Goole, Scarborough Athletic, Whitby Town, Ossett Town, Bradford Park Avenue and Farsley AFC. He is currently captain of the Combined Forces team and also plays for the Royal Air Force.

Matt played in the Premier League with Leicester City before signing for Leeds in 2006 – where he went on to make 52 appearances, scoring four goals. Jimmy joined Scarborough Athletic in December 2012 and went on to help the club win promotion from the NCEL in his first season. In the 2014/15 season he scored 20 goals in 37 starts for Scarborough.



## Jordan Armstrong DEFENDER

Right Back Jordan started his football career with Preston North End Academy before going on to play for Shrewsbury Town and Cadiz CF in Spain's Segunda Division B. Most recently, he played for Harrogate Railway before opting to follow his former manager Billy Miller to Tadcaster.



## George Conway MIDFIELD

Former Huddersfield Town professional George is an outright traditional speedy winger. He is a former Scotland Youth International who has also played for Workington Town and Shaw Lane Aquaforce.

Most recently, he has played at Harrogate Railway where he scored 12 goals in the last four months of the season.

Josh is a pacey striker/winger who left Pickering Town to join Tadcaster in 2014. He has previously played for Leeds United Academy, Scarborough Athletic and Bridlington Town, and has a great eye for goal, which saw him make Taddy history last season when he scored three hat-tricks in three games. Last season's top scorer with 30 goals.



### Nick Black STRIKER

Nick is a strong-running forward with close control skills and an eye for goal. At more than 6ft tall, Nick is a major presence in the air and isn't afraid to battle with the back line. Previous clubs include Selby Town and Garforth Town where he scored 12 goals last season from the right wing.



### Carl Stewart STRIKER

Carl first joined Tadcaster Albion before going on to have spells with Pickering Town, Bridlington Town and Ossett Town. He returned in 2013 and was the club's top scorer in the 2013/14 season, scoring 32 goals (a club record).

## Visitors' History





Colne F.C. were formed in January 1996, by a group of like-minded people under the wing of now Chairman Dave Blacklock. The enthusiasts combined their strengths and knowledge of non-league football, and arrangements were made for a new club to use the vacant Holt House Stadium, once used by the Dynamoes in the North West Counties Football League Division Two.

Colne FC's first ever competitive game was on the 17th August 1996 against Middlewich and the result ended in a 1 – 0 defeat.

The team was then managed by Keith Mason, but after his resignation soon after, Denzel Hart was appointed to the hot seat. His first game was a 6 – 0 defeat away at Ashton Town, but just two games later Colne FC recorded their first ever victory thumping Bacup Borough 5 – 2. The highlight of the season, coming when the reserves won the BEP Cup at Clitheroe's Shawbridge ground.

The clubs fourth season was eagerly awaited, but in September 2000 manager Hart left the club by mutual agreement.

Player John Lister was placed in temporary charge and his appointment was made permanent a month later. Lister learned lessons from this campaign and in 2001/02 finished 14th.

In the summer of 2002 James Webster took control of the club, to become the youngest chairman in the league at the age of 24. James was a player

at the club with plenty of experience and along with his father who was vice chairman, had a strong desire to see the current side emulate the success of its predecessors.

Season 2002/03 started well enough, but in December 2002 John Lister resigned as Manager.

Paul Lynch took over as manager and the improvements continued, but in August 2003, Paul was offered the position of manager at Unibond side Rossendale United and subsequently left.

Webster responded immediately by appointing Nigel Coates as the new manager as well as player Gary Rishton as his number 2. Nigel had played for the Dynamoes, being in the FA Vase winning team and had experience of management at local rivals Nelson.

Season 2003/04 brought back the glory days to Colne with a string of successes. In the League Colne had to play catch up after a successful cup run, but ended the season 10 points clear in Division two, scoring 102 goals in their 38 games.

We completed the double by winning the Division Two Trophy 1-0 over Great Harwood.

The season was capped by an amazing run in the FA Vase for a North West Counties Football League Division Two club, they progressed all the way to

the semi-finals, (via an incredible 1 – 2 away win at AFC Wimbledon) before being defeated over two legs 4 – 3 on aggregate to AFC Sudbury.

As the season progressed attendances started to rise as the local population realised we were no longer the whipping boys of the league, and the famous RED ARMY was formed.

Colne took little time in adjusting to life in the First Division, another FA Vase run and a creditable 10th place was secured in 2004-/05.

Consolidation has followed and Colne FC's highest league positions to date have been 5th in season 2007-08 and the same again in 2010-11.

In November 2013 Colne's manager for the past 10 years stepped down from the hot seat and former Colne player Steve Cunningham was appointed manager, with another former Colne favourite Ted Cockett as his No.2 and Coach.

Steve and Ted have ambitious plans for the club and wasted no time in bringing in a few new faces to boost the playing squad, consolidating for the rest of the season but with big hopes and plans for the following seasons.

Season 2014-15 proved to be the best ever in terms of league placing, with Colne finishing a creditable fourth. No doubt the management team have ambitions to improve on that in 2015-16.

With all this going on, due to the fantastic efforts of a strong and loyal band of followers and officials including the resurrected "Red Army " and the continued support from our main sponsors XLCR Vehicle Management there is a bright future on the horizon for Colne FC.

## Non-League Clubs 'How far can we go?'

Since the end of the Second World War in 1945, seven non-league football clubs – that is, clubs outside the divisions of The Football League and, since 1992, the Premier League – have reached the Fifth Round of the FA Cup, to become one of the last 16 clubs in the competition. Each non-league side lost their Fifth Round cup tie, some heavily, and none reached the Sixth Round, or "quarter finals".

Perhaps the most remarkable FA Cup run of a non-league club since 1945 was that of Northern League club Blyth Spartans in 1977–78. Having started in the 1st qualifying round, and progressed to draw their first Fifth Round tie away to Wrexham 1–1, Blyth Spartans were "in the hat" for the Sixth Round draw. They were drawn to play Arsenal at home in the Sixth Round, but lost the Fifth Round replay 2–1 at home, played in front of a crowd of over 42,000 at St James' Park.

A long FA Cup run for a non-league club usually depends on avoiding matches against teams from the top divisions after they join the competition in the Third Round. The most recent example of a non-league team beating top-flight opposition in the FA Cup was Luton Town's Fourth Round victory away at Norwich City in 2013. The last time a non-league side beat top-flight opposition at home in the FA Cup was Sutton United's Third Round victory over Coventry City in 1989.



## TAD'S History

By Ian Tyssen

## Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) continued to have 36 members in the 2000/01 season - 20 teams in the Premier Division and 16 in Division One.

North Ferriby United were promoted to the Northern Premier League at the end of the 1999/2000 campaign. Gedling Town joined Division One from Central Midlands League.

Goole AFC and Glapwell had been promoted to the Premier Division from Division One, with Maltby Main moving in the opposite direction due to ground improvement issues.

As a result of the horrendous floods of late 2000, it would prove to be a testing season for the Brewers. After the home game against Mickleover Sports on 7th October, Albion then had to wait until 3rd March for their next home game, against Borrowash Victoria. Ings Lane hosted 12 games in the last two months of the season, as the club caught up on their

The Brewers finished bottom of the league, with 24 points from 30 games, but within three points of the three teams

The first win of the season came in the home game against third placed Mickleover Sports (1-0) in October. One one more victory followed during the five months without a home game - a 2-1 win at Rossington Main.

The return to action at Ings Lane, in March, brought a 1-5 defeat against the champions Borrowash Victoria but three wins and two draws followed later in the month. Those victories came against Winterton Rangers (2-0 at home and 3-1 away) and Pontefract Collieries (2-0 at home).

The final month of the season saw just one win in eight games - 3-0 at home against Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare and also brought a 1-5 loss at home against Parkgate. A season to forget finished with a 2-5 loss at Maltby Main.

In the FA Cup preliminary round, the Brewers won 2-1 at Evenwood Town, who would merge with Spennymoor United to form Spennymoor Town five years later. In the first round qualifying, another Northern League club, Horden Colliery Welfare, won 1-0 at Tadcaster.

Blackpool club Squires Gate knocked Albion out of the FA

In the NCEL League Cup, Premier Division club Harrogate Railway had a comfortable 5-2 home victory over the Brewers in the first round.

Tadcaster Albion were drawn at home against Pickering Town in the first round of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy but, due to the flooding situation, the game was switched to the Pikes home ground. In the third consecutive competition, the Brewers lost by a three goal margin (1-4).

In the West Riding County Cup second round, Albion again had to concede home advantage and switched the tie to Thackley to the opposition ground. After a 3-3 draw against the NCEL Premier Division club, the Brewers once more lost by three goals - this time 2-5 in the replay.

Just like the first team, the Brewers' reserve team fixtures were disrupted by the floods and there were no home games between mid October and early March.
