"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



A Late Josh Greening Goal Finally Breaks Down 10 Man Retford.

Tadcaster were the better side throughout the match's entirety on non-league day however the winning and only goal of the game finally came in the 89th minute courtesy of Josh Greening.

Brewers boss Billy Miller made four changes from the side that lost to Goole in the County Cup in midweek with Gary Stevens, Jordan Armstrong, Nick Black and Josh Greening all back into the starting line-up.

It was clear from the outset that The Badgers were looking to frustrate the league leaders by gathering numbers behind the ball and making the pitch as congested as possible.

Adam Baker was the man to have the first sights at Retford United's goal as Nick Black's cross was controlled by the winger and hit powerfully towards goal but a good block by Craig Laight denied the strike hitting the target and testing goalkeeper Richard Watson.

The home side tried to hit Taddy on the break and they came close after quarter of an hour as Brad Kerr's audacious volley whistled just over the crossbar.

However it was the visitors who were still in complete control and came close again five minutes later as Matt Heath, who already has four goals this season from centre half nearly made it five but his header bounced just the wrong side of the post.

The best chance of the half fell to Josh Greening after 25 minutes as Liam Ormsby curled a ball over the top to Greening who cut back inside onto his favoured left-foot but his close range shot was well saved by Watson in the Retford goal.

Taddy were huffing and puffing but that one Josh Greening chance was the only clear cut opportunity created as defender Andy Milne wrestled with his man and also headed over with half-time approaching.

There was one final slice of noteworthy action in the first half as midfield veteran Mark Wilson appeared to quite clearly stop Adam Baker's strike with his hand however the officials didn't see it.

The second half started in the same vein as the first with Taddy pushing forward to break the deadlock and just five minutes into the half that man Greening was set free in behind down the right but his shot was right at the keeper.

Mark Waters spurned a rare half chance for the Badgers just two minutes later as the midfielder spun and shot in one movement however the effort was comfortably wide of the mark.

Eleven minutes into the second half and Retford's chances of getting anything from the match became even slimmer as they were reduced to 10 men. Josh Greening pounced upon a ball played in behind Retford's back-line and when the attacker touched the ball away, he was completely wiped out by Craig Laight (you could say he was Laight.....) and as Greening was last man the referee had no choice but to issue the red card.

Credit to the home side though they kept plugging away and could have taken the lead on the hour mark but Gary Stevens made himself big and thwarted Jason Bradley's one-on-one strike to keep it goalless.

I promise you I am not a parrot but as The Brewers pushed harder to take the lead it was Josh Greening again who had a good chance to find the net. Adam Baker charged in from the right flank and rolled it sideways to Greening fifteen yards but his shot was far too tame to trouble Watson.

Into the final ten minutes and the travelling Taddy fans behind the goal were starting to think 'is it our day?' Jordan Armstrong knocked a cross in towards substitute Carl Stewart who rose and flicked a header goal wards unbeknown to him that the goalkeeper was coming flying out who in the end got nowhere near anything however Stewart's header trickled agonizingly wide as the TSC watched on with hope and nervousness.

There was to be late drama at the Jones & Co Stadium with 89 minutes on the watch as Taddy finally wore down Retford's back-line and found the back of the net. The ball was flicked up in the air, Carl Stewart headed downwards into a dangerous area and yes, you guessed it, Josh Greening popped up and slotted it into the bottom corner to keep Tadcaster top of the league.

TAFC Match Preview

This afternoon we welcome the fans, players and officials of Nostell Miners Welfare. So far this season, The Welfare have gained 12 points from 14 games played to stand in 17th place in the table. Away from home, they have taken 8 points from 9 games played with wins at Bridlington Town and Cleethorpes Town back in August. They have played 2 league games in October drawing them both against Parkgate and Pontefract Collieries. This ended a losing run as they had lost their previous 6 league games.

Last season in the corresponding game at Tadcaster, The Brewers won 4-2 with 2 goals each from Calum Ward and Josh Greening. The game played on a Tuesday evening attracted a crowd of 176. Nostell were to end the season in 15th position to continue their run in the NCEL Premier as they have been members of the premier since 2007-08.

Last weekend in the NCEL Premier League, Worksop Town won 3-1 at Rainworth Miners Welfare, Barton Town Old Boys won 1-0 at home to Brigg Town and Cleethorpes Town won their 6th consecutive league game with a 4-0 home win against Parkgate,

Other games today in the league include Worksop Town at home to Barton Town Old Boys, so points to be dropped there by the pack. Cleethorpes Town travel to Pontefract Collieries and Athersley Recreation host Handsworth Parramore. A game that needs winning to stay on top of the table and keep the pressure on the pack below. I will go for a 2-0 win for The Brewers.

Visitors' History





Records exist that a team from Nostell Colliery won a Wakefield District football competition in the 1890's. The club has photographs of Nostell Colliery teams from 1915 & 1921. At that time the football field was not in the present location but on two sites fairly close by.

The Miner's Welfare was formed in 1928 after the purchase of the land by the Miners Trust Fund. The sum of £400 was paid to a local land owner for 4.5 acres which includes the land on which the present ground is situated.

A Miner's Welfare football team was formed and enjoyed early success. The club owns a medal donated by a former player from the 1930's and a photograph of the team who won the Wakefield & District League in 1938.

After the war, the Welfare provided much needed recreation for the local community and the football team was successful in several annual football competitions.

In the late fifties a team from the Welfare visited Belgium to compete against local opposition, a feat unprecedented at that time. The club are proud owners of the trophy won on that successful tour and press cuttings of the occasion.

In the late 60's the club had a period of sustained success, winning several Wakefield District competitions and eventually being selected to join the West Yorkshire League, lifting the Division 2 League and Cup double in the 1966/67 season. However, the successful team eventually broke up and the club went back to the Wakefield League in the early 1970's. Enjoying relative success the club began to develop again; two teams were formed, the first team joining the West Yorkshire League in 1982.

Following mining subsidence to the ground, fund raising of over £30,000 allowed the pitch to be levelled off, drainage installed and other ground improvements. However, Nostell Colliery was closed. The nearby colliery houses (1st to 7th street) were demolished and the Welfare struggled to survive.

The football continued through this difficult period. Promotions through the divisions of the West Yorkshire League, eventually led us through to our present NCEL Premier Division status.

The most successful period in the clubs distinguished history was about to begin, with the appointment of Alan Colquhoun as 1st team Manager in the late 1990's.

After initially struggling in the West Yorkshire Premier League - Alan Colquhoun actually scored two goals to save us from relegation- Gary Baker joined as Colquhoun's assistant and the team gradually improved. Eventually being crowned Champions of the West Yorkshire Premier League, lifting the corresponding Cup and appearing in 3 consecutive finals, 2 County Cup final appearances and lifting 6 Wakefield & District trophies among other successes.

Off the field the introduction of the Coalfield Regeneration Trust encouraged other funders to invest in the Miners Welfare. Renamed Crofton Community Centre approximately £1.5 million was secured to provide the present facilities with Sport England, Football Foundation and the FA providing substantial sums of money to help the football side of the developments.

With the improvements on and off the field a successful application to the Northern Counties East League was made, heralding a new and

exciting venture for the Club.

Gaining promotion to the NCEL Division 1, Nostell finished a respectable 4th in their first season 2006/7. Due to the Northern Premier League reforming its structure, along with one NCEL going to the wall for financial reasons, Nostell gained promotion to the NCEL Premier Division. A terrific first season in the premier league 2007/8 saw Nostell finish 5th, having led the division for the first quarter.

The following season 2008/2009, successful cup runs in FA Competitions caused an end of season fixture congestion. Playing every Saturday, Tuesday and Thursday for the last six weeks of the season, Nostell eventually finished 13th not losing to any of the top four teams home and away. However the Welfare, who were the underdogs, beat Scarborough Athletic over 2 legs to win the "Presidents Cup", probably the highest point of Nostell's recent history.

During season 2008/9 Nostell had their first player to be signed by a Football League club. Stockport County signed Oli Johnson who impressed during a friendly fixture. Oli made an instant impact for County who sold him to Norwich City, where he was involved in the League 1 Championship winning team. Nostell got a percentage of the transfer fee and with appearances monies eventually banked over £20,000

Since the success of the Presidents Cup, the following season Nostell just avoided relegation and Gary Baker decided to stand down. Alan Colquhoun continued with various assistants but the team continued to struggle at the wrong end of the table for several seasons.

Following a disastrous start to the 2013-14 season Alan Colquhoun left the Club after 15 years in charge. Darren Holmes and Gareth Hamlet were appointed; they managed to save the Club from relegation by one point and looked forward to improving the following season. Unfortunately, Hamlet had to leave because of work commitments.

Drainage work on the pitch ensured that there were no home games till the start of October, the team only managed to gain two league points during this period and lost in the first game of both FA competitions.

Darren Holmes worked extremely hard to make a success, bringing over 60 new players to the Club. However, the team continued to struggle, deep in relegation trouble and losing to the teams around them Darren Holmes was asked to stand down in November 2014.

A cry for help, both on and off the pitch, was made in the local media. Paul Lines and Simon Turfrey agreed to join the Club has first team manager and chairman respectively. The pair have vast experience of the Northern Premier League, having worked together at Ossett Town and Wakefield FC. They hope to turn the fortunes of the Club around, ensuring the Club becomes competitive again at this level.

Here, we look back at previous meetings between Tadcaster Albion and today's opponents, Nostell Miners Welfare.

The clubs first met in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) in the 2006/07 season, when the Welfare were new members of the league. The away teams won both fixtures in that season.

This afternoon's visitors to the i2i Stadium were promoted to the NCEL Premier Division in their first season and the clubs didn't meet again until after the Brewers were also promoted in 2010.

The game at Crofton in the 2010/11 season ended in a 3-3 draw, with Albion scoring two goals in the last few minutes.

The 2011/12 season saw the Brewers win 6-1 at home, including two goals from defence by Ryan Qualter, and pick up a 3-0 away win, when another former York City youth team player, Jamie Hopcutt, scored a hat-trick.

Danny Critchlow scored the winning goal for the Welfare in their 2-1 home victory in the 2012/13 season. In the following season, Critchlow netted twice for the Brewers during a 5-0 win in the corresponding game. Calum Ward also scored a brace of goals in the same match.

Last season brought a pair of 4-2 successes for Albion, despite being 0-1 down in both games. In the first week of the season, a crowd of 176 at the i2i Stadium saw Calum Ward and Josh Greening both claim two goals. In the penultimate game of the season, all the Brewers' goals were scored by players who moved to Pickering Town this season - George Bissett, Calum Ward (2) and Denny Ingram - in front of a crowd of 92.

In the 12 NCEL games between the clubs, Tadcaster Albion have won nine and Nostell Miners Welfare have won just two. The Brewers have scored 38 and conceded 17 goals in those games.

The teams also met in an NCEL League Cup quarter final in the 2012/13 season, which was won 1-0 by the West Yorkshire club.

TAD'S History

By Ian Tyssen

The membership of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) remained at 36 clubs for the 2005/06 season.

Goole AFC had been promoted to the Northern Premier League (NPL) at the end of the previous season and Teversal joined the NCEL - moving up from the Central Midlands League.

Borrowash Victoria were relegated from the Premier Division, with Sutton Town and Garforth Town moving in the opposite direction from Division One.

After finishing sixth in the 2004/05 season, the Brewers started the new season well, with a 3-1 home win over Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare, followed by two more victories.

A 2-3 loss was then suffered at Borrowash Victoria, with a last minute goal, after leading 2-0. A couple of away wins followed before losing 0-3 at home to the eventual champions Carlton Town.

The Brewers then put together an eight game unbeaten run, including seven wins. That sequence ended with a 2-1 victory at second placed Retford United, having been 0-1 down with 20 minutes to play, in front of the biggest league crowd to watch Albion that season - 111.

The run also included a 3-2 success at Hall Road Rangers, having been 0-2 behind with seven minutes remaining - Rob Youhill getting an 89th minute winner.

Five reverses came in the next seven games, including a pair of 0-3 home losses against Parkgate and Borrowash Victoria, but the season would finish on a high note.

Seven victories were picked up in the last eight games, which included 4-0 home wins over Rossington Main - with a Steve Ward hat-trick - and South Normanton Athletic. That run also saw the Brewers' biggest home league crowd of 89 for the 1-0 triumph against Retford United.

League doubles were completed against nine clubs, including all of the bottom five teams - Yorkshire Amateur, Teversal, Hall Road Rangers, South Normanton Athletic and Rossington Main.

The Brewers finished in an impressive third place with 64 points from 30 games. There was an average crowd of 59 at Ings Lane for NCEL games.

There were no victories for Albion in any of the six cup competitions.

NPL Division One strugglers Chorley won 2-0 in an FA Cup preliminary round replay after a 2-2 draw at Tadcaster, in front of a crowd of 110.

In the FA Vase first round qualifying, the Brewers lost 0-2 at Parkgate, one week after winning there 2-1 in the league.

Retford United won 3-1 in the Wilkinson Sword Trophy first round tie, whilst lowly Premier Division club Maltby Main picked up a 2-1 win at Tadcaster in the League Cup.

Halifax Town, who finished fourth in the Conference Premier, won 5-1 at Ings Lane in the West Riding County Cup second round.

Finally, newly promoted Garforth Town were victorious 2-1 in the President's Cup first round to knock out the Brewers.

This afternoon's opponents, Nostell Miners Welfare, finished third in the Premier Division of the West Yorkshire League, after being champions in the previous season. Along with AFC Emley, the Welfare were then promoted to the NCEL.


