The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



Visitors' History





Pickering Town Football Club were first established in 1888, for many years the club competed in the local football leagues. One of the local leagues they competed in was the York Football League which they joined Division Two, in 1953–54. They were promoted to the league's top division after only one season.

In the early 1950s, the York League was heavily contended between York Railway Institute, Market Weighton and Pickering Town. Indeed these were the teams in the top three when Pickering Town first won the York League in 1955–56.

The club dropped in form for the rest of the decade in comparison (although they did always finish in the top eight). During the 1959–60 season, they finished as league runners-up to Dringhouses.

Pickering eventually joining the Yorkshire Football League Division Three in 1972. They started well in the league, and during their second season were promoted to Division Two as champions. Pickering Town finished as runners-up to Bridlington Town in the 1974–75 season and thus were promoted to the top division of the Yorkshire League.[1]

They dropped in form a couple of seasons later, getting relegated in two successive seasons. For the rest of the decade Pickering lingered around the mid parts of the Yorkshire League Division Three. In 1982 they became founding members of the Northern Counties East Football League and were in the NCE Premier Division from 1992. It was around this time that the club first entered the FA Challenge Cup, they knocked out Penrith before losing to North Yorkshire rivals, Northallerton Town in the next round.

A few seasons later in 1996–97, they knocked out Pontefract Collieries 2–1 in the competition, but lost to Bishop Auckland in the next round. In terms of the draw, the club has had very bad luck in the competition, as every time they reached the 1st Qualifying Round, they were forced to play away from home. In 1999 Pickering were relegated to the NCE First Division. This was to last only two seasons and promotion back to the Premier

Division came in 2001.

The club underwent a great transformation with manager Jimmy Reid and his assistant Steve Brown in charge. Reid was a former player with St. Johnstone and York City and Brown a former "Pikes" player and coach at the Leeds United Academy. At the end of 2001–02 season Jimmy Reid left the club and Steve Brown took control.

At the start of the 2002–03 season 5 first team regulars were lost for a variety of reasons which left the club struggling for much of the season. The hard work and dedication of Brown, his management team and the players was rewarded towards the end of the season as it all started to come together and with only 4 defeats in the last 15 league games the club finished the season in 13th position.

2003–04 season was an exciting one for the club as they were in the top half of the league table all season and for much of it, with games in hand, looked possible championship contenders. However with a glut of fixtures, and possibly with the knowledge that promotion to the re-structured Northern Premier League was not an option due to ground grading, at the season's end the club were not able to capitalise and finished in a creditable 5th position.

Early into the season 2004–05 owing to ever increasing business commitments Steve Brown stepped down as Manager to be replaced by ex-lpswich Town and Newcastle United striker Alex Mathie, veteran of over 200 league games and 20 years as a professional.

After much ground improvement work in recent years, including the erection of floodlights, a new 120 seater stand, covered standing accommodation and more recently an additional 100 seater stand behind the "scoreboard end" goal, the club now possess one of the best grounds in the league.

In the 2005-06 season the club reached the quarter finals of the FA Vase the furthest in the $\,$

club's history. The team eventually lost out to Nantwich Town.

After an encouraging start in the 2006–07 season, results took a turn for the worse over the winter period, and a run of one win in eleven games led to the resignation of Mathie as manager on 6 January 2007. Within a week, the board announced they had appointed ex-Pickering player and Mathie's assistant Mark Wood as the new manager.

The 2007–08 season saw the club finish in third in the NCEL Premier Division, their highest league position in over a decade. Off the pitch the club saw significant change and Pickering applied for promotion to the Northern Premier League. The club erected a removable fence for the cricket pitch side and improved the existing exterior toilet facilities. Ground development has continued with the club resurfacing and floodlighting the car parking facilities, adding new goals, corner flags and dugouts and improving the drainage of the pitch.

Mark Wood stepped down as manager early in the 2010–11 season and he was replaced by Scarborough FC legend Mitch Cook. Cook oversaw a change in philosophy mainly focussed on youth and passing football. This approach had mixed success but the club eventually finished in a very respectable 7th. Cook resigned just before the end of the season to take up the vacant managerial role at rivals Bridlington Town taking with him much of the playing squad.

Following Cook's resignation the club invited applications and eventually offered the job to former York City player and coach Peter Vasey.

They reached the Second Round Qualifying of the FA Cup 3 times (1999–00, 2001–02 and 2003–04).

On 30 April 2013, the club won the North Riding Senior Cup for the first time in their history following a 3–0 win over Marske United. The goals were scored by Liam Shepherd, Liam Salt and Joe Danby in the second half. The game was played at the headquarters of the North Riding County FA in Stokesley in front of 439 spectators.

The Pikes saw the 2014/15 season commence under the guidance of Mitch Cook, sadly results did not go the way the club aspired to and in November they parted, Tony Hackworth was brought in and saw some great improvement, the side finishing mid table.

Tony decided he wished to spend more time with his young family, and left the club at the end of the season. Paul Marshal (ex Tadcaster Albion) was appointed Manager in May 2015.

He quickly moved to bring Denny Ingram with him from Tadcaster, appointing him as player/Coach. Players brought in for the season were Denny Ingram, George Bissett, John Heads, James Bennett, Stuart Rice, Callum Ward, Aran Reid, Peter Lowrie.

This did not halt the Pikes making a 2nd round preliminary exit from the FA Cup 5-1 v Clitheroe Lewis Taylor coming off the sub bench to claim the consolation goal.

Here, we look back at previous meetings between Tadcaster Albion and tonight's opponents, Pickering Town.

Since both clubs became founder members of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) in 1982, they have met for league games in 13 previous seasons.

The Brewers have won 11 of the 26 NCEL encounters, with the Pikes being victorious in eight.

Five of the first eight NCEL games between the clubs, in the 1980s, were won by the lngs Lane club, with the other three being 0-0 draws. The Brewers scored 10 goals and conceded only one in those games.

The Pikes then gained the upper hand, winning six of the eight matches between the 1987/88 and 2000/01 seasons. That included the Brewers worst defeat - 1-4 at Ings Lane in the 1999/2000 campaign.

In the ten NCEL Premier Division meetings since 2010/11, Tadcaster Albion have won five and drawn three games. The biggest two victories coming in the 2013/14 season - 5-0 at home and 4-0 away.

Carl Stewart has scored five goals against the Pikes, which includes a last minute winner in a 3-2 victory at Pickering in the 2010/11 season.

Last season, the Brewers won 2-1 at the i2i Stadium in October. Josh Greening and Tom Chamberlain - an 81st minute winner - scored the goals, in front of a crowd of 523.

In March's return fixture, Tom Claisse scored a 66th minute leveller in a 1-1 draw, which was watched by 272, including a big following from Tadcaster.

The clubs also met in the FA Vase second round qualifying in 1997, when the Brewers won 1-0 at lngs Lane.

During the 2000/01 floods, the Pikes were triumphant 4-1 in a Wilkinson Sword Trophy tie, which had to be switched to Pickering from Tadcaster.

Finally, the clubs have met on three occasions in the NCEL League Cup. The Brewers won 2-1 in 1988/89 and 1-0 ten years later - both at Tadcaster. However, the Pikes had the more impressive victory - 4-0 at Pickering in the 2002/03 season.

Heath will continue to play for The Brewers, but will now also take on coaching responsibilities as Miller's right-hand man.


Heath has already made 13 appearances for the club this season, but sat out on Saturday's 4-3 defeat at Barton Town Old Boys as he began his new joint role.

TAD'S History

Season

Due to the creation of the Conference North, higher up the non league football pyramid, the number of teams in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) reduced from 38 to 36 clubs.

With several Northern Premier League (NPL) clubs moving up to the new league, three teams - Ossett Albion, Eastwood Town and Brigg Town - were promoted from the NCEL Premier Division at the end of the previous season.

In turn, three clubs - Shirebrook Town, Long Eaton United and Maltby Main - were promoted from the NCEL Division One to the next level. Only one new club joined the NCEL Division One from a lower league - Retford United from the Central Midlands League - which left just 15 other clubs competing with the Brewers.

Tadcaster Albion enjoyed a stunning start to the league campaign with seven straight victories, including away wins at Carlton Town (1-0) and Gedling Town (3-1), who would finish the season in third and fifth place, respectively.

The bubble appeared to have burst, when the Brewers only picked up one win in the next six league games - a 6-1 home win over Parkgate.

It was during that run of games that Albion drew 2-2 against local rivals Garforth Town, in front of a crowd of 1,350. The majority of the unusually large crowd had turned up to see the former Brazilian international, Sócrates, make a brief substitute appearance for the Miners.

The Brewers returned to winning ways in December by beating the eventual champions, Sutton Town, 4-0 at Ings Lane.

The final 14 games of the season brought four wins and seven draws and culminated in a five game unbeaten run. The best result of the second half of the season was a 4-0 home win over Staveley Miners Welfare.

The Brewers picked up the maximum six points in the league against Parkgate, Pontefract Collieries, Winterton Rangers and Worsbrough Bridge Miners Welfare on the way to inishing in sixth place. They accumulated 50 points from their 30 matches.

In the FA Cup preliminary round, Fleetwood Town, who are now an established Football League club, won 5-2 at Ings

Formby were beaten 2-1 at home in the FA Vase second round qualifying before Albion exited the competition in the first round at Silsden (1-2).

Interest in the Wilkinson Sword Trophy ended with a 1-3 loss at Winterton Rangers.

In the League Cup, Gedling Town held the Brewers to a 1-1 draw in Tadcaster before losing 0-3 at home in the replay. Unfortunately, Albion were then removed from the competition and Town were reinstated.

A little progress was made in the West Riding County Cup, with a 1-0 second round win against Eccleshill United. Ossett Albion then won 2-0 at Ings Lane in the third round.

Under the management of Alex Mathie, tonight's visitors, Pickering Town, finished fifth in the 20 club NCEL Premier Division.

The Pikes reached the fourth round of the FA Vase, beating Glasshoughton Welfare, Sheffield, Dunston Federation Brewery and Billingham Synthonia. They eventually lost 1-3 against Brook House.

In the FA Cup, they were knocked out in the first round qualifying by Gateshead.

Finally, the Pikes reached the semi final of the President's Cup, where they lost 1-2 in a replay against Buxton.
