

"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.





Hungover Tadcaster Hit With Late Sucker Punch

Marc Cooper struck an 87th minute volley as Cleethorpes Town snatched all three points in an uninspiring match as The Brewers suffer a hangover from Wednesday night's terrific win at Worksop.

Manager Billy Miller was forced into making one change to the side that beat Worksop as Dan Clayton picked up a groin strain so Ryan Woodhead was given his first league start of the season at left-back.

It could have been another flying start for TADDY inside the first 60 seconds as Adam Baker was released in behind on the right hand side and beats a Clee defender but his cross was just too far behind the on-rushing Josh Greening.

It was a quiet start to the contest on a horrible day weather wise with constant downpours and gale force winds but the first effort at goal finally came after 18 minutes as a corner was cleared out only to Jimmy Beadle and his shot was awkwardly deflected but Miley Fenty adjusted well in the Cleethorpes goal.

A second TADDY corner moments later nearly ended up in there own net as The Owls broke away with pace as Brody Robertson was slotted in behind and just as the striker was about to pull the trigger, Andy Milne came flying in with a terrific last ditch tackle on his way back from the set-piece.

With the second half underway, the game unfortunately for the spectators stayed the same way, both sides giving the ball away far too cheaply and too often as well as both sides not hitting the target, even the shots at goal were few and far between.

Just past the hour mark and the travelling TADDY fans thought for a split second that they had taken the lead as Liam Ormsby's free-kick bent round the wall but unfortunately nestled into the

Marc Cooper was the man for the home side that looked the most likely to break the deadlock as he shot narrowly wide in the 67th minute.

With the match going nowhere, it looked absolutely nailed on to finish goalless as Gary Stevens had to make a decent save to keep out Jon Ogleby's curler.

It felt like one of them matches where both teams just weren't at the races however the home side did snatch the victory with three minutes to go. It was a move that was assisted by the referee believe it or not, the ball then fell to Liam Dickens 24 yards out who's strike was met by the charging bull that is Jason Mycoe and a combination of himself, Matt Heath and Ryan Woodhead blocked the shot however it then dropped to Marc Cooper on the edge of the penalty box who volleyed into the back of the net via a slight knick off Andy Milne and that was enough to see The Owls pick up all three points.

TAFC Match Preview

This afternoon we welcome the fans, officials and players of Albion Sports. The Lions are in 9th place in the table with 26 points from their 17 games played. They have played 11 games away from home winning 6 of them including a win at Barton Town Old Boys. Last season in the corresponding game at Tadcaster in November, The Brewers won 2-1 thanks to late penalties by Liam Ormsby in front of a crowd of 399. They were to end the season in 10th place. This is their 3rd season in the NCEL Premier and they have always been competitive whilst in the league.

Last weekend in the NCEL Premier League, Worksop Town won 3-2 at Pickering Town and they followed that up with a 6-0 home win against Liversedge in midweek. Handsworth Parramore won their third successive game with a 4-3 home win against Parkgate to be 4 points behind The Brewers with 3 games in hand in 3rd place. Barton Town Old Boys, Cleethorpes Town and Clipstone remain in the mix just a few points back.

There is a reduced NCEL Premier programme today with a number of teams being in FA Vase action, so it is a good chance for The Brewers to go back to the top of the table as they are currently a point behind Worksop Town.

Visitors' History





Albion Sports Football Club was founded in 1974 and initially played in the Bradford Amateur Sunday League.

After a brief spell in the lower divisions, gaining promotions on a regular basis and winning the Amateur District and Senior cups along the way, Albion Sports in 1995/96 won the Premier league title for the first time, this was to prove the catalyst for what was to come.

Albion Sports won a further five league titles, two County Cups, three District Cups and seven Senior Cups. Other highlights included reaching the final of the National F.A Umbro Sunday Cup on two occasions. The first in 2000 at the City Ground (Nottingham Forest) Albion Sports were beaten 1 -0 by Prestige Brighams (Hull). The second in 2005 at Anfield (Liverpool F.C), this time beaten 3 -2 by Gossoms End (London).

Albion Sports have been honoured by receiving three civic receptions from the City of Bradford as well as winning an award of 'Ambassadors of West Yorkshire' beating the likes of Patrick Stewart (Star Trek actor) and the late Richard Whitley (Countdown presenter) into 2nd and 3rd place respectively.

Albion Sports resigned from Sunday football in 2007 in order to progress up through the Football Association pyramid.

In 2007/08 Albion Sports joined the Telegraph and Argus league and won promotion in the first season as well as winning the League Cup.

Albion Sports F.C were elected to the WRCAFC in 2008, gained promotion in the first season and also won the District Cup. In 2009/10 Albion Sports finished runners-up in the Premiership and won the Divisional Cup. In 2010/11 they again finished runners-up and were then successfully elected to join the NCEL 2011/12 season.

Albion Sports missed out on promotion by a solitary point in their debut season but quickly rectified this the following season (2012/13) by gaining promotion to the Premier division as Champions.

Albion Sports finished in a very creditable 6th place in their debut premier League season (2013/14).

Here, we look back at previous meetings between Tadcaster Albion and today's opponents.

As this afternoon's visitors to the i2i Stadium, Albion Sports, have only been members of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) since 2011, there have only been a handful of meetings between the clubs.

They first met at Farsley Celtic's Throstle Nest ground in September 2013, when The Brewers came from behind to draw 1-1, thanks to a Carl Stewart goal.

Three months later, a crowd of 221 saw the visitors winning 1-0 at Tadcaster, with Liam Ormsby netting Albion Sports' winning goal. This result brought an end to The Brewers' 24 game unbeaten run in the NCEL Premier Division.

Last season brought two narrow victories for the Brewers.

The fixture at the i2i Stadium in November finished 2-1, despite Albion going 0-1 down to a 78th minute goal. Liam Ormsby, now a Brewer, scored two penalties in the final eight minutes, bringing huge relief to the

majority of the 399 strong crowd.


The return match at Throstle Nest, in April, resulted in a 1-0 triumph for The Brewers.

The top scorer for the 2014/15 season, Josh Greening, scoring the winning goal in the 64th minute.

If there is to be a first half goal this afternoon, it will be the first in any of the NCEL games between the two teams.

All of the previous seven goals have been scored in the second half, with the earliest being in the 58th minute.



As you will already know The Brewers suffered a hangover from the elation of the Worksop win as Cleethorpes pinched a 1-0 victory in a woeful match.

There were some huge score lines in the NCEL Premier Division on Saturday, it would have certainly been a day to utilise the 'Goals Galore' coupon at the bookies.

Starting with Rainworth Miners Welfare who thumped the hapless Liversedge, this was Sedge's tenth league loss on the bounce. It was effectively game over at half-time as the home side went into the break 5-1 in front. Another two were added in the second half to comfortably pick up the three points, Liam Morris the pick of the bunch scoring a hat-trick. Rainworth sit in 7th position.

It's been a good week for Thackley who recorded back to back league wins for the first time this season which has seen them rise from the pit of the division up to a much more comfortable 15th place. TAD'S History

The NCEL Years 2006-2007 Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) membership grew by one club - from 36 to 37 - for the 2006/07 season. The Premier Division continued to have 20 clubs and Division One increased to 17.

Both Buxton and Harrogate Railway were promoted to the Northern Premier League's First Division at the end of the 2005/06 season, with no teams moving in the opposite direction. Carlton Town and Retford United had also been promoted within the NCEL, from Division One to the Premier Division. Again, no clubs were relegated to take their places in the lower tier.

Three new members joined the NCEL Division One from its feeder leagues - Dinnington Town (Central Midlands League Supreme Division), Nostell Miners Welfare and AFC Emley (both West Yorkshire League Premier Division).

Tadcaster Albion's league season started with 2-1 home win over Dinnington Town but this was followed by a 0-5 thrashing by Winterton Rangers, who went on to finish second in the league.

In September, the Brewers picked up two wins and two draws from five games. The highlight was a 7-1 win at Ings Lane against bottom club Rossington Main, when Steve Ward scored a hat-trick.

Albion strung together three consecutive victories in October, including home wins over South Normanton Athletic and Lincoln Moorlands, who finished the season in third and fifth place, respectively.

back to back one goal losses against champions Parkgate, brought 2006 to an end.

2007 started with the Brewers going unbeaten for 12 games - seven wins and five draws. During this period of the season, there were 4-1 wins at Teversal, when Stefan Zoll scored a hat-trick, and at sixth placed Staveley Miners Welfare, Fourth placed Nostell Miners Welfare were also beaten 3-2.

Guiseppe Downing, who was Albion's leading goalscorer, netting 19 times in league games, scored a first half hat-trick in a 3-3 draw with Borrowash Victoria

The unbeaten run came to an end with a 1-4 loss at South Normanton Athletic but the season did end on a high with a 3-1 home win against Gedling Town. Although the final day crowd of only 34 was the lowest of the season.
