"the brewers mith's FC 1892

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.



A Brace From Baker & Greening See Taddy Cruise to Victory at Handsworth

Two goals in each half from attackers Adam Baker and Josh Greening saw Tadcaster comfortably see off third place Handsworth Parramore on another happy trip to Sandy Lane.

Manager Billy Miller made two changes to the side that drew with Albion Sports last week as Gary Stevens recovered from illness and Gregg Anderson was handed his debut for the club, Leon Wrigglesworth and Nick Black dropped out.

Prior to kick-off, a minutes silence was held in honour of Remembrance Day which was respected by all in attendance.

Going into the action and it was the home side who had the first effort at goal as Daniel Buttle blazed a shot comfortably over the crossbar.

However just a minute later Tadcaster really should have broken the deadlock. Liam Ormsby dinked a ball down the right-hand side to Josh Greening who cleverly let the ball run across his body which fooled the Parramore defender. Greening then looked up and pulled it back to Adam Baker who skied his shot over the mark from 12 yards.

On 19 minutes Jimmy Beadle saw his powerful 30 yard free-kick comfortably held by Handsworth stopper David Ratcliffe but just six minutes later and Tadcaster did open the scoring. Adam Baker drove down the right wing and carried the ball at least 30 yards before coming to a halt and crossing to Josh Greening who wasn't challenged by Captain Richard Adams which allowed Greening to step back and fire into the bottom corner.

The Brewers netted a second a couple of minutes after breaking the deadlock and it was 2-0 until the

linesman threw his flag up in the air, the official had seen an infringement somewhere. Dan Clayton did brilliantly to beat his man and whip in a deep cross to which Jason Mycoe rose highest and nodded into the back of the net but the linesman believed the midfielder had pushed a defender in the back to gain an advantage. Looking back at the incident, it looked like the defender was tripped up by an amber shirt and not fouled by a white one.

The home side weren't creating any chances when they did attack The Brewers, they were struggling to break down Taddy's solid and sturdy back-line.

Just past the half hour mark in the first half and Tadcaster should have found the net again. Josh Greening did superbly to keep the ball in play and deliver an inviting cross with his weaker right foot to find the unmarked Jimmy Beadle who headed narrowly over the crossbar from close range.

Taddy did deservedly score a second goal of the match two minutes before the half-time break. Adam Baker cut inside one black and amber shirt and absolutely hammered a rasping shot past Ratcliffe from 22 yards.

Into the second half and just like when The Brewers were 2-0 against Worksop Town at Sandy Lane not long ago, they sat considerably deeper inviting The Ambers to have a go at them. Although with that being said, Taddy's defence was still completely solid, Gregg Anderson making his debut alongside Matt Heath was s showing just why he was playing Conference North football a matter of months ago, the defender wasn't giving the deadly strike force of Froggatt and Wells a look in.

The Ambers may have had the majority of the ball in the first 20 minutes of the second half however they were still creating virtually no chances of note. When they did get to the by-line and deliver Jimmy Beadle was given another golden chance to put the game to bed half-way through the half as Josh Greening played a slick reverse through ball to strike partner Jimmy Beadle who sprung the offside trap but saw his snap shot well thwarted

by Ratcliffe.

However, just five minutes later and Taddy did score their third of the afternoon surely sealing the three points. Adam Baker ran at the heart of the defence, shifted it to Josh Greening who tried to chip the keeper but it bounced off Ratcliffe's shoulder and away from danger, or was it.

Baker then sprinted to the loose ball and audaciously went for a lob over the goalkeeper to which he executed to perfection, so much so that David Ratcliffe didn't bother turning round, a sensational piece of skill from Baker.

Parra did pull a consolation goal back with three minutes to go as Jon Froggatt guided in a rebound off a Gary Stevens save to make it a slightly nervy ending.

However if there was any chance of a late comeback, this was all forgotten shortly after as The Brewers scored a fourth goal in injury time. Substitute Josh Barrett, who was tearing the left full-back apart since entering the fray slotted in another substitute Carl Stewart, who was thwarted by the goalkeeper but Barrett fired it straight back to Stewart who cheekily back heeled past Ratcliffe in the Handsworth goal to Josh Greening who slotted it through the legs of the hapless defender on the line.

Visitors' History





Thackley AFC is known as "the club in the woods" because of its idyllic setting in the heart of the Bradford countryside. The club was founded in 1930 by the younger members of Thackley Wesleyan Methodist Church, which follows the trend of church affiliation set by Bolton Wanderers, Manchester City and Aston Villa among others .lt is rumoured that young men were encouraged by churches to take up football and thus refrain from frequenting Public Houses.

Progressing by way of the Bradford Mutual Sunday School to the County Amateur League by 1939, Thackley's has been a steady rise through the league systems – the West Yorkshire League, the Yorkshire League and the Northern Counties East League when it was founded in 1982. Thackley AFC has retained a Premier Division place in every season since (the only club to have done so).

There have been many successes during the Club's existence, County Amateur League winners 5 times, West Riding Challenge Cup 1964 and 1967, West Riding County Cup 1974 and 1975 and the Bradford and District Senior Cup 13 times, a competition record.

Recent achievements include, in the 2010-11 season, Thackley reached the Final of the West Riding County Cup, but lost in extra time to Guiseley having twice held the lead. The Club won the Toolstation NCEL League Cup in two consecutive years, 2011-12 and 2012-13

Players progressing to the Football League include Tony Brown, who played for Leeds United and Ian Ormondroyd, the former Bradford City, Aston Villa and Leicester City striker.

Thackley's nickname "the Dennyboys" refers to the ground, Dennyfield, which is named after our long-serving former groundsman, George Denny. Part of the clubhouse is named after Arthur Hylton who was Secretary of the club during the formative years between the 1940's until 1970. Arthur's contribution to the development of Thackley Football Club was greatly influential. Born and raised in Thackley, he remained the loyal and regular contributor to the club until his death.

Tom joined Thackley from Albion Sports last season. His pace and anticipation enables him to get into dangerous forward positions.

Last season Mike was the club's top goalscorer. He is a lively striker who converts a high percentage of chances that are created.

A powerful striker who has experience at Brighouse Town, Albion Sports and Liversedge. Joe played for Littletown last season.

Adam Fowler – Striker.

Promising young striker who played for Ilkley Town last season. Another Summer signing.

Head-2-HeadTAFC v Thackley

As Thackley have been members of the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Premier Division since the league was formed in 1982, they only met Tadcaster Albion in NCEL games after the Brewers were promoted to that top division in 2010.

In the last five seasons, the Dennyboys have enjoyed the better results in the 10 league games between the clubs - winning four and drawing four, whilst scoring 18 and conceding 14 goals.

The 2010/11 season saw the Brewers heaviest defeat, when they lost 1-4 at Thackley, despite being 1-0 up.

Tadcaster Albion had to wait until the seventh NCEL game between the clubs - at home in the 2013/14 season - before they claimed a victory. They won 2-0, with Vincent Dhesi and Dan Barrett scoring the goals.

Last September, goals from Liam Ormsby, Josh Greening and Terry Taylor sealed a 3-2 away win for the Brewers, in front of a crowd of 210, including a good following from Tadcaster.

The return fixture at the i2i Stadium, which took place a few days before the Brewers' FA Vase sixth round replay against Highworth Town, was one of the most lacklustre performances of the season. Andy Milne put the home team 1-0 ahead but Thackley came back to win 2-1 and damage Albion's promotion hopes. The majority of the crowd of 260 went home disappointed.

The clubs have met in the first round of the FA Vase on two occasions. In 1981, when both teams competed in the Yorkshire League, the Dennyboys won 2-0 in a replay. Sixteen years later, the Brewers were comfortably beaten 4-1.

Also in the 1997/98 season, the team's clashed in the West Riding County Cup - Albion losing 1-2 away in the third round. Since then, Thackley have knocked the Brewers out of the county cup on two more occasions - 5-2 in a second round replay in 2000/01 and 4-1 in the first round of the 2010/11 season

In the most recent West Riding County Cup meeting, Tadcaster Albion picked up a 2-1 away win in the 2012/13 season.



Onto one of the aforementioned sides, Cleethorpes Town, The Owls can't go unnoticed anymore as they are right in the mix. Still nine points behind the joint leaders, they hold one game in hand over Worksop and two games in hand over Taddy. Last Saturday they brushed aside the hapless Brigg Town 5-0. Effectively, it was all over at half-time as Cleethorpes went in four goals up thanks to an own goal from Anthony Bowsley, Jonathan Oglesby and a quick-fire brace from front man Brody Robertson. The second half was pretty much a dead rubber but the score line did increase to five courtesy of another Brigg Town man, this time it was Craig Mitchell who was the unfortunate one.

Bridlington Town sit in 9th place after their 3-1 victory at Retford United. Brid were 3-0 up at half-time thanks to Joel Smith and a double from Tom Fleming. Adam Lee pulled one back for The Badgers with 10

minutes remaining but it was too little too late

Clipstone, rather surprisingly lost just their third game of the season last week at home to Athersley Recreation. Before this match Athersley had accumulated just 11 points from 16 games however they took a 3-1 lead into the break with Tom Copping, Adam Podmore and Ryan White all finding the back of the net. Alec Denton netted his 19th goal in all competitions from the penalty spot with a minute left but The Cobras failed to equalise in the dying second giving Athersley their fourth win of the campaign.

Elsewhere, Staveley ran out 5-2 winners away at Maltby Main thanks to a hat-trick from Courtney Hastings and Pickering beat Liversedge 2-1 with defender Joe Danby scoring the pivotal goal.

There was just the one match in midweek as Pickering Town picked up their third victory on the bounce as they dismantled Albion Sports on their own turf. Amazingly Albion were 2-0 up at half-time and somehow ended up losing the match 5-2 after The Pikes put on a stunning second half performance. Lewis Taylor and Ryan Cooper drew the visitors level just nine minutes into the second half before goals from Ged Dalton, Matthew Turnbull and a second from Cooper rounded off a tremendous comeback. TAD'S History

Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) membership grew by one club - from 36 to 37 - for the 2006/07 season. The Premier Division continued to have 20 clubs and Division One increased to 17.

Both Buxton and Harrogate Railway were promoted to the Northern Premier League's First Division at the end of the 2005/06 season, with no teams moving in the opposite direction. Carlton Town and Retford United had also been promoted within the NCEL, from Division One to the Premier Division. Again, no clubs were relegated to take their places in the lower tier.

Three new members joined the NCEL Division One from its feeder leagues - Dinnington Town (Central Midlands League Supreme Division), Nostell Miners Welfare and AFC Emley (both West Yorkshire League Premier Division).

Tadcaster Albion's league season started with 2-1 home win over Dinnington Town but this was followed by a 0-5 thrashing by Winterton Rangers, who went on to finish second in the league.

In September, the Brewers picked up two wins and two draws from five games. The highlight was a 7-1 win at Ings Lane against bottom club Rossington Main, when Steve Ward scored a hat-trick.

Albion strung together three consecutive victories in October, including home wins over South Normanton Athletic and Lincoln Moorlands, who finished the season in third and fifth place, respectively.

A run of six league defeats, which included back to back one goal losses against champions Parkgate, brought 2006 to an end.

2007 started with the Brewers going unbeaten for 12 games - seven wins and five draws. During this period of the season, there were 4-1 wins at Teversal, when Stefan Zoll scored a hat-trick, and at sixth placed Staveley Miners Welfare. Fourth placed Nostell Miners Welfare were also beaten 3-2.

Guiseppe Downing, who was Albion's leading goalscorer, in a 3-3 draw with Borrowash Victoria.

The unbeaten run came to an end with a 1-4 loss at South Normanton Athletic but the season did end on a high with a 3-1 home win against Gedling Town. Although the final day crowd of only 34 was the lowest of the season.

The season's biggest league crowd at Ings Lane was 87, for the clash with Pontefract Collieries in January, and the average attendance was 55.

The Brewers finished the season in seventh place, with 49 points from 32 games.

Albion failed to win any of their six matches in cup competitions but did hold the lead in five of the ties.

NCEL Premier Division club Carlton Town won 2-1 after extra time in the first round of the President's Cup at Tadcaster.

Former Sheffield United and York City striker. Peter Duffield, was on the scoresheet, as Retford United knocked the Brewers out of the FA Cup with a 6-0 extra preliminary round win.

In the Wilkinson Sword Trophy first round, Staveley Miners Welfare scored a last minute equaliser, before scoring two more goals in extra time to win 5-3.

The Brewers conceded three goals in seven minutes (71, 75 and 77) when they lost 2-3 at home against Easington Colliery in the FA Vase second round qualifying.

Albion led Halifax Town 2-1 after 30 minutes in their West Riding County Cup tie but went on to lose 2-7, in front of a crowd of 183. New Zealand international Shane Smeltz scored a hat-trick for the Shaymen.

Finally, in the League Cup second round, the Brewers were beaten 2-1 at Ings Lane by fellow NCEL Division One club Lincoln Moorlands.
