The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

The Brewers also broke many other records throughout the season – taking more than 200 fans away to Armthorpe Welfare on a cold Tuesday night where they went on to win 10-0.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

Visitors' History



Retford is an ancient market town on the banks of the River Idle in north Nottinghamshire, England. It is situated just off the A1 to the north of Newark and Robin Hood's home, Sherwood Forest.

Retford United Football Club represents the town of Retford within the world of football. The Club are currently members of 4 Leagues with the 3 Senior teams competing in the Northern Counties East Premier Division, the Central Midlands Reserve Premier League, and the Nottinghamshire Senior Ladies League. The Under 19's in the North Midlands Under 19 Football League, the Under 18's in the Lincolnshire Intermediate Football League, the Youth teams in the Mid Lincs Youth League.

Retford United FC was founded in 1987 and at the time consisted of one Senior team that competed in the Gainsborough League and one Youth Under 10's team in the Retford & Worksop League's. In 1989, the Club's Director of Coaching Dave Hickin introduced a 2nd Youth team as U10's and, along with the U12's, began United's association with the Mid Lincs Youth League.

The Club place a massive importance on Youth football and ever since 1989 the Club have introduced a new Under 10's team each season. With the FA's introduction of small-sided football in 1999, the Club now consists of 27 youth teams ranging from Under 8's to Under 16's, an Under 18's, 19's and three senior teams (First team, Reserve team and Ladies team) all of which wear the Club's famous Black and White stripes. This includes 2 Girls teams.

Retford United are committed to providing football for the entire Retford community. The Club is a "Football Association Licensed Mini-Soccer Centre" and provides football for Boys and Girls between the ages of 4 and 11.

The Club have owned land on Leverton Road for about 9 years where development has seen many changes to 'Cannon Park' over the last few seasons. The Club's future plans are to develop Cannon Park in to one of the best facilities in local football.

The 2003/04 season will go down in the clubs history with an unprecedented "treble" seeing the Badgers winning the Central Midlands Supreme League, the Phoenix Trophies Floodlit Cup and the Humber Inspection Services League Cup. Their first season in the FA Vase led them through to the 2nd Round proper and they reached the Notts Senior Cup Semi Final only to be defeated by Unibond Champions Hucknall Town 3-2 after extra time.

2004/05 saw them play in the Northern Counties East League with a season of consolidation, before the promotion push under new manager Mark Shaw in 2005/06 saw a second place league finish resulting in promotion to the NCEL Premier Division, and winning the Wilkinson Sword Trophy over two legs against Yorkshire Amateurs. The new and exciting side will be looking forward to their new challenge.

The latest development of the new stand was erected in spring 2006 which makes Cannon Park one of the best footballing facilities in the area.

The Club truly believe that Retford United FC has a lot to offer the local Retford community and hopes that the people of Retford and the surrounding villages will will continue to support their team and join us in putting the town back on the footballing map.

Tadcaster Albion and Retford United first met in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) in the 2004/05 season, when the Badgers moved up from the Central Midlands League.

In that season, United won their home game 1-0, whilst the return fixture, a few weeks later, was a 2-2 draw.

The 2005/6 season saw the Badgers finish second in the NCEL Division One and earn promotion to the Premier Division. The Brewers finished one point behind, in third place, but did complete an impressive double over their promotion rivals - winning 1-0 at home and 2-1 away.

Having finished bottom of the Northern Premier League (NPL) Premier Division in the 2010/11 season, the Badgers resigned from the NPL and joined Albion in the NCEL Premier Division.

Retford went on to be Premier Division champions in the 2011/12 season and beat the Brewers 3-0 at Ings Lane in front of 226 fans - the biggest crowd for any game between the clubs.

The Badgers inflicted another heavy defeat on Tadcaster Albion in the following season - 1-4 at Retford.

In the 2013/14 season, both league games ended in 1-1 draws, with Carl Stewart scoring both of the Tadcaster goals.

Last season it was all about Josh Greening. In the game at i2i Stadium in September 2014, Josh scored four goals in a 5-1 victory - it was 5-0 after just 34 minutes! Last April, despite the league game at Retford being 1-1 after 74 minutes, the Brewers eventually recorded a comfortable looking 4-1 win. Josh Greening scored two more goals and was joined by Liam Ormsby and David Brown on the scoresheet.

Earlier this season, Josh Greening was again the hero, after an 89th minute winner in a 1-0 win at Retford. The Brewers were the better team for much of the game but struggled to turn their supremacy into goals.

In the 13 NCEL encounters between the clubs, the Brewers have won six and there have been four draws. Albion have scored 21 goals and conceded 17, in those league games.

There have been several meetings in a variety of cup competitions over the last ten years.

In the first round of the Wilkinson Sword Trophy in the 2005/06 season, Albion were beaten 1-3 at Retford.

In the following season, when the Badgers were on the way to becoming the NCEL Premier Division champions, they defeated the Brewers 6-0 in an FA Cup extra preliminary round tie. All the goals were scored in the first 66 minutes, in front of a crowd of 157.

There was further disappointment for Albion in the 2011/12 season, when they lost 1-3 in a League Cup second round tie between the clubs.

The Brewers did eventually have some success in cup competitions, last season, when they thrashed a struggling Retford team 6-1 in the fourth round of the League Cup. Goals from Danny Gray, Vincent Dhesi, Paddy Miller, Carl Stewart (2) and Calum Ward rescued the Tadcaster side, after the home team took a surprise 1-0 lead.



Josh Greening & Gregg Anderson the heroes of the first half and Gary Stevens the hero of the second as Taddy see off Barton and stay top of the league

Tadcaster Albion bounced back from their fourth loss of the season with a dogged victory over Barton Town Old Boys at the i2i Stadium.

Goals from Josh Greening and Gregg Anderson gave The Brewers a comfortable lead at the break before Gareth Barlow pulled one back with eighteen minutes to go. It was a somewhat nervy ending however Gary Stevens was once again in fine form as Taddy held on to stay two points clear at the top of the NCEL Premier Division.

Manager Billy Miller made just the one alteration to the side that lost to Staveley in the week with Dan Clayton coming back in at left-back replacing Adam Baker, Liam Ormsby moved back into his familiar central midfield role.

It was Taddy's second outing at home in 2016 but it was the visitors who should have taken the lead inside two minutes. Jonathan Greening's over confidence almost cost him as his square pass fell straight to Barton captain Gareth Barlow whose prodded shot was brilliantly kept out by Gary Stevens.

After the early scare, Taddy had to wake up and shrug off the nervous energy around the i2i Stadium and a Barton defender almost calmed the nerves. Henry Gill came very close to sweeping Josh Greening's driven cross into the back of his own net, luckily for the Swans, it whistled out for a corner as Conor Sellars waited at the back post for a tap in.

The resulting corner was taken short between Josh Greening and Sellars and after the initial cross was blocked, the former Worksop Town attacker retrieved and fired high into the danger area. The high cross was knocked downwards by Andy Milne which then dropped to Josh Greening who volleyed venomously off the crossbar. Goalkeeper Robert Zand was well and truly beaten.

With twenty minutes gone, The Brewers were finally starting to play their usual fast flowing attacking football and should have been a goal to the good but Conor Sellars' low finish was disallowed after being adjudged to have fouled Henry Gill, it looked extremely harsh.

However, two minutes later the home side did in fact take the lead as Josh Greening netted his 17th goal of the season putting him joint top scorer at the club with Adam Baker. Jordan Cooke horrendously sliced a bouncing through ball which sent panic stations into the Barton back line as Taddy looked to pounce. Jimmy Beadle controlled the miscued clearance, held off his man and turned to face the goal before shifting to Greening. Greening then intelligently chose to roll the ball to Sellars whose shot was saved but Josh Greening got his just reward as he tapped in the rebound from three yards.

The Brewers were really finding their feet in the match now as less than sixty seconds later Josh Greening came within a whisker of doubling his lead and his goal tally for the afternoon. Jonathan Greening rolled it to his younger brother who executed a sublime 90 degree turn and with the whole goal gaping, the striker curled the ball just the wrong side of the post.

Josh Greening was looking incredibly hungry for goals after being bitterly frustrated in midweek as ten minutes later he came agonizingly close once more. Liam Ormsby drove out of midfield and at the heart of Barton's defence before playing it to Greening who performed that same turn again and struck narrowly wide again, deja vu anyone?

With nine minutes to go until half-time, Taddy were absolutely bossing proceedings with Barton having no answer and it seemed only a matter of time until the home side doubled their lead. I am sure Jonathan Greening is still kicking himself after missing this golden opportunity as Conor Sellars drove a terrific pass over the top to pick out the onrushing Greening who broke clear of the Swans' defence having just the goalkeeper to beat. Robert Zand in the Barton goal came galloping off his line and out of his area only to see Greening nick the ball past him. The former West Bromwich Albion midfielder clearly didn't feel that comfortably taking the shot first time on his weaker left foot so decided to cut back inside the traipsing Lee Fisher only to see Fisher deflect his shot off target. Greening's left foot can't be that bad, can it?

However, with all that being said Taddy did eventually score their second goal of the half. Josh Greening turned provider this time as his in swinging corner was glanced in by the towering figure of Gregg Anderson who rose brilliantly at the near post to double their lead.

Half-Time:

Straight from the kick-off of the second half The Brewers carved out an opportunity as Conor Sellars' craft and creativity allowed him to deliver into Beadle who headed over the target.

Barton were being given the opportunity in the second 45 to

have a go at Tadcaster and came close to pulling a goal back five minutes into the half. Ash Lattimore's deflected shot fell kindly out to the left to substitute Corey Mortimer whose fierce shot was saved superbly by Stevens.

The league leaders were struggling to create any chances at all in the second half, even half chances as Jason Mycoe's wild strike was the only shot from The Brewers in the first half hour.

What followed shortly after was a moment of controversy in the match. A back pass to Gary Stevens in the Tadcaster goal was closed down by Gareth Barlow and as Stevens waited to pick up, it was clear it wasn't going to beat Barlow therefore Stevens opted to handle the ball just outside the penalty area leaving the referee with a big decision to make. The referee called Gary Stevens over with the men in blue urging for a dismissal. The referee decided to show Gary Stevens just a yellow card which sent the Barton bench mad and the official had to go over and calm down the visitors.

The resulting free-kick was struck by Ash Lattimore but well deflected out for a corner by the yellow wall.

After The Swans were incensed to see only a yellow card shown to Stevens, they did however pull a goal back from the corner kick as Gareth Barlow headed in at the back post to set up a nervy final twenty minutes.

And a nervy finale it certainly was as the watching on home fans urged for their side to hold on as Gary Stevens was doing just that in the Tacdy goal. Alex Sherwood ran through on goal down the left hand side for the Old Boys and struck cleanly only to be kept out by a magnificent save from Stevens. The stopper already seemed to be grounded and it looked as though it was heading for a level game until an outstretched right hand denied the midfielder and kept Taddy ahead.

The visitors obviously pushed more men forward in the final five minutes which meant space in behind was always an option and this is what substitutes like Nick Black thrive upon but this time the striker lashed wide.

The Brewers had an opportunity to seal the three points but subs Carl Stewart and Josh Barrett couldn't combine to find the net but time eventually ran out for Barton and Tadcaster held on for the three points keeping them two points clear at the top of the league.

TAD'S History

By Ian Tyssen

The NCEL Years 2010-2011 Season

The Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) increased in size by two clubs for the 2010/11 season, with 20 teams in both the Division One and the Premier Division. Rainworth Miners Welfare had been promoted to the Northern Premier League (NPL) Division One South and were replaced by the newly formed Farsley club.

After promotion in the 2009/10 season, Tadcaster Albion made their debut in the Premier Division. They were joined by Brighouse Town, who were also promoted, replacing Brodsworth Welfare and Shirebrook Town, who were relegated to Division One. Handsworth and Louth Town made the step up to the NCEL Division One from the Sheffield and Hallam County Senior League and Central Midlands League, respectively.

Mike Braithwaite, who scored the goal which promoted the Brewers at the end of the previous season, also scored their first league goal of the new season, in a 3-3 draw at Parkgate. After a 0-2 loss at Selby Town, the first league win of the season came at home against Hall Road Rangers (4-1). Seven wins and six draws followed in the next 13 league games, to put Albion in a strong league position by the end of 2010.

The unbeaten run included a 3-1 win against Bridlington Town, who had won six and drawn one of their opening seven games. There were also big wins at Maltby Main (4-1) and against Hallam (5-0). However, the highlight was a 1-0 victory at Farsley, who would go on to be champions.

2011 started with an excellent result - a 2-1 home win over second place Parkgate. Unfortunately, the Brewers found it difficult to string a sequence of victories together in the next few months.

After Selby Town completed a double against Albion, with a 2-1 win at Tadcaster in January, there were a couple of good wins against two struggling teams - 3-1 at Dinnington Town and 5-1 against Arnold Town. February and March's inconsistent results included a 1-4 loss at Thackley, a 5-1 win at Brighouse Town and a 0-3 defeat at Hall Road Rangers.

There were two 3-4 losses at home against Lincoln Moorlands Railway and Farsley in April before the league season ended with three convincing wins - 3-0 against Long Eaton United, 3-1 at Arnold Town and 3-0 over Dinnington Town.

The Brewers finished in fourth place in their first season in the Premier Division, with 68 points from 38 games - three points behind Bridlington Town in third place. Graeme Whitehead

was the top goalscorer, in all competitions, closely followed by Carl Stewart.

The average league attendance at Ings Lane increased by 9% to 109, boosted by crowds of 233 and 304 for the visits of Scarborough Athletic and Farsley, respectively. The lowest number of fans at a league game was 63 for the visit of Arnold Town in January.

The Brewers backed up their impressive league season with plenty of success in the various cup competitions. In the FA Cup, victories at West Allotment Celtic (2-1) and Garforth Town (1-0) set up a first round qualifying tie against the Northern League team, Shildon. A 90th minute equaliser by Nick Thompson in a 1-1 draw at Ings Lane set up a replay in the north east. Sadly, despite being 2-1 up with 20 minutes remaining, the Brewers lost 2-4 after extra time.

Albion enjoyed an excellent run in the FA Vase, which included a couple of big wins. In the first round qualifying, Prudhoe Town were brushed aside 5-0 at Tadcaster. A trip to Askern Villa brought a 2-1 victory in the second round qualifying, before a 2-0 triumph over Tow Law Town in the first round. Then followed a couple of away wins at Forest Town (4-0) and Formby (3-2). The run came to an end in the fourth round, when the Brewers lost 1-2 at Billingham Synthonia.

Albion had no joy in the West Riding County Cup, having suffered a 1-4 defeat at home against Thackley, despite being 1-0 up after 34 minutes. There was another dramatic turnaround in the League Cup, when Maltby Main visited Tadcaster. The Brewers led 2-0 but conceded in the 72nd, 83rd and 90th minutes to lose 2-3.

In the first round of the President's Cup, Albion had to rely on penalties to beat Barton Town Old Boys, after a 0-0 draw. They were taken to extra time by Hemsworth Miners Welfare in the second round and had to come back from 1-2 down after 92 minutes to win 5-2 - goals in the 102nd, 103rd, 110th and 114th minutes. Bridlington Town were beaten 1-0 in the semi final to give the Brewers a chance of some end of season glory.

Having played all the previous three rounds at Ings Lane, the President's Cup final against Farsley also took place at Tadcaster. As well as being the Premier Division champions, the visitors would also be the League Cup winners but they didn't complete the treble. Goals from Carl Stewart, Stuart Rice, Ryan Qualter, Graeme Whitehead and Terry Taylor, infront of 284 fans, brought a fantastic 5-1 victory and silverware for the Brewers.
