

Formed in **1892**

The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's** & **60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the lngs ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In 1982/83 they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in 1991. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the 1990's and finished bottom in 2001/02 & 2003/04.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th. In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCEL Division One title. In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**. In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new chairman.



In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games. in March led to them finally finishing in third. An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history

by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA
Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd
of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town. At the end of the season, the
club opted not to renew their contract

with manager Paul Marshall, two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers started their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy Miller was back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division was needed.

The Brewers started the season well and were in the play-off spots, then injury problems hit the team and the season seemed to run away from them.

They finished 19th in the league. The
Brewers had a great chance for silverware in the West
Riding County Cup Final, the game finished 1-1 but they lost out to Farsley Celtic 4-2 on penalties.

At the end of the 16/17 campaign the Directors made the tough decision to change the management team from Billy Miller and Matt Heath to Michael Morton and Simon Collins bringing it more in-house. In the 2017/18 season the new-look management team took a couple months to adapt to the league and mould the squad that they wanted. However it didn't take them long to find their feet as the fortunes took a turn for the better after the new year with Michael & Simon steering the club to its highest ever finish reaching the Evo-Stik League play-offs after a dramatic final day. This once again brought massive excitement amongst the club and town but unfortunately it ended in semi-final defeat 2-1 at Bamber Bridge despite taking the lead and putting in a valiant performance

There's no doubting that the club is going in the right direction as the 2018/19 season sees the Brewers move into the Evo-Stik East Division after the league switched from a North/South divide to an East/West split. Can the club improve again this year...



Brighouse Tow



The club was originally formed in 1963, as a representative side of the Blakeborough Valve Company of Brighouse and their home games were played on the Woodhouse Recreation Ground, with the side competing in the Huddersfield Works League. The club gained various league honours over the years, the most successful coming in the 1968/69 season, when they won both the League Cup as well as the Halifax District Cup.

Following this success, the club took the huge step of obtaining its own ground at Hove Edge. Whilst at Green Lane, where they played for more than a decade, they achieved two more league titles before taking another major step, in applying for and achieving West Riding County Amateur League status in 1975.

The club thrived there, until their Green Lane ground was developed for housing, upon which they moved to their present ground, just round the corner, on St Giles Road. There followed a period of stagnation, competing mainly in the lower divisions of the WRCAL until 1988 when the demise of the Blakeborough Company resulted in a new outlook, as well as a new name. This change proved to be the catalyst for the most successful period in the clubs history so far.

The newly named Brighouse Town AFC won promotion to the WRCA Premier Division in their first season, as well as winning the WRCAL Division One Cup. In 1991 the Premier Division Championship was won for the first time and in 1992 soon followed the West Riding County Challenge Cup. In 1994 Town won the Premier Division League Cup and were runners up in the County Challenge Cup, and they were Premier Division Champions again in 1995.

Season 1995/96 was perhaps the most successful season in the clubs history so far. Brighouse Town once again won the WRCAL Premiership title and also completed the double by winning the WRCA League Cup. They also won the Bob Wedgeworth Memorial Trophy.

Season 2008-09, saw the club make the significant step into Semi-Professional football by entering and being accepted into the Northern Counties East League Division One. After only two seasons in NCEL Division One, the Club won promotion to the NCEL Premier Division under the guidance of Mark Brier and Daz Attwood. 2011/12 Season saw the appointment of Paul Quinn as Manager and after 4th and 2nd place finishes in his first two seasons, the NCEL Premier Title was achieved with a record points total in 2013/14 the Clubs 50th anniversary season.

Promotion to the Evo-Stik Northern Premier League Division One North brought the highest level of football in the history of the Club only six years after leaving the West Riding County Amateur League, and a new and exciting challenge lay ahead. A very respectable 15th place finish was achieved in the Club's inaugural season, and with valuable experience gained, solid foundations have been laid for playing football at this level.

Another 15th place finish but with a far higher points tally for Paul Quinn's side in season 2015/16 brings optimism the Club is still heading in the right direction and coming to terms with

the demands of the NPL. The Club's development side winning the Lancashire League East Division for the first time and supplying a steady stream of players to the First Team, brings hope for further progress in 2016/17 season.

In what ultimately became his final season, Paul Quinn cemented his legacy at the Club with a 9th place 2016/17 finish, the highest position achieved in the Clubs history and a fitting reflection of the tremendous job Quinn and his Assistant Mark Booth have done for Brighouse Town.

2017/18 Season brought a new era with Manager Vill Powell and Assistant Nat Brown taking over the reins and starting to rebuild the squad after a player exodus following Paul Quinn's departure. Powell's appointment just before the start of the season meant that squad rebuilding had to be done as the season went along, never an easy job in such a competitive League. Despite spending time in the lower part of the table during the 2nd half of the season, Town hit top form in the run-in to finish the season in a very respectable 17th position.

Powell has used his first proper pre-season at Brighouse Town to strengthen his Managerial team; confirming Leon Wainman and Stacy Reed as his Assistants, and he has had the majority of his Playing squad already in place for the first training session of the new 2018-19 season. The planning and preparation have made for a positive feel throughout the Club and an anticipation to build on the previous seasons good work.

Connor Griffin - Defender

At the age of 14 Connor signed for Rotherham United academy, he was there for 2 years before leaving The Millers in favour of signing a scholarship at Lincoln City where he came up against Arsenal and won the Midlands Youth Cup.

Griffin then had spells at Frickley, Stocksbridge PS and Rainworth MW before arriving at Brighouse Town last season.

Callum Hall - Defender

Callum started out football with Howden Clough JFC where he won 6 Huddersfield district junior cup finals in a row. He went on to play for Halifax Town FC before spending a season at Burnley Academy U16. Hall suffered a serious injury in 2013 with a ruptured ACL which required an operation resulting in many years out of the game.

James Hurtley - Defender

James developed a love of the game from an early age, played over 1000 football matches both Saturdays and Sundays in west Yorkshire. He is currently in his second stint with Brighouse. His first spell with the club was part of the team that won the NCEL under previous manager Paul Quinn. Since his return James has fit straight back with the players and fans. He is looking to kick on this year and with aims to get the club into the playoffs as a minimum.

Sam Wright - Defender

Sam Wright is a loud versatile defender who loves a good old fashioned tackle. He started playing at Bradford City at the age of 15, making his first team debut at the age of 17.

Sam was released from The Bantams in June and is now looking to prove his worth at his new home, Brighouse Town.

Thomas Haigh - Midfield

Prior to joining Brighouse Town's Development squad, Thomas spent 3 years at Leeds United before moving on to Bradford City for 2 years.

At the age of 21, Haigh had collected over 100 appearances for Brighouse Town.

Iwan Heeley - Midfield

Until the age of 17, Iwan was a goalkeeper representing Huddersfield, Halifax and the West Riding representative side. Since then, Heeley started his outfield career at Hemsworth, before moving to Albion Sports, AFC Emley, Pontefract, Glossop North End and most recently Brighouse Town.

Rhys Jenkinson - Midfield

Rhys played for Wortley Boys from the ages of 6 up until he was 11 when signed for Leeds United academy. He spent 5 years there before unfortunately being release at the age of 16. At this point Jenkinson signed a scholarship at Bradford City and played there until the age of 18. He was lucky enough to play in the 3rd round of FA youth cup live on television against

December Could Determine Our Season Says Miller



This week we caught up with November's Player of the Month Paddy Miller to see how he's finding his second spell with the Brewers.

First of all, how are you enjoying your football in your second spell with Tadcaster Albion?

"Since rejoining Tadcaster I've really enjoyed being back at the club, settling in was never going to be an issue as I've got a lot of friends here. I had a frustrating start after picking up an injury during pre-season but I feel like I've come back stronger and fitter due to the rehab I was doing. The past six weeks I believe the boys have shown the quality we have and hopefully we can maintain those standards from now until the end of the season."

The lads are currently on a superb unbeaten run which has seen Taddy rise to 3rd, what do you put the upturn in form down to?

"We've recently gone on a good unbeaten run in the league and seen us progress up the table, we had a few additions to the squad in the summer, me included. This was always going to take time to adapt and incorporate the management team's style of play. During October and November this seems to have clicked, having said that, we are under no illusions that the hard work stars now. We've got a difficult month of games during December which could determine where we will be come April. For me, it's all about how we perform. We've got a very strong group of players, togetherness and team spirit."

The partnership between yourself and Harry Coates seems to be one that comes naturally to you both, would you agree with that?

The management team of Si, Killy and Nelly won't allow the boys to get carried away though, I know it's a bit of a football cliché but we just have to keep taking one game at a time."

Just looking back at last Saturday's win over Spalding, left it very late but how good was that feeling when Howey stroked home in the last minute?

"Getting all three points last week made the long trip

worthwhile, we would have been disappointed to come away with a point but Spalding played well and made it difficult for us. The celebrations when Howie scored were very funny, it's not often you jump into the crowd hugging a spaceman and Jesus just to name a few. If anything the lads were delighted with the win for the fans also, it was a long trip where they dressed for the occasion and cheered the boys on until the end, so we were delighted for them."

To give fans an insight into training, what role does Nath Kilby possess amongst the group?

"Killer is the assistant manager, he's UEFA B qualified and his sessions during training are of a very high standard. He challenges us within a fun environment and is a genuinely top guy, all the lads have massive respect for him. He is a huge part of our targets for the season and a big part of our dressing room." Finally, another tough game against Brighouse today, how much do you and the players want a big crowd to cheer you on?

"Like I have said previously and in other interviews, the supporters will play a huge part in our season from now until April. We are all in this together from the board, management, players and volunteers at the club. Us players know how much the football club means to the fans and people of Tadcaster and we will do our best to give them something to cheer and be proud of."

"Thanks to all the supporters for turning out today, I hope you enjoy the game."






