The club is believed to have been formed in **1892** as John Smith's FC. It wasn't until **1923** that the Tadcaster Albion AFC name was adopted. In the early years the club played in the local York League. In **1948** Albion won the York League. They continued competing in the York League during the **1950's & 60's**.

Tadcaster Albion, in the early days, played home games on the site of the cricket ground on Station Road, before moving to the Ings ground, near to where the present Samuel Smith Brewery Packaging Block now stands.

Changing facilities were in the town, at the rear of the Falcon Public House on Chapel Street, and it was a common Saturday afternoon sight to see nets, corner flags, buckets, oranges, players and officials trekking through the town.

Down the years the club has played in several leagues. In early times, Barkston Ash and later still the Yorkshire and Northern Counties East Leagues.

Football continued on the Ings ground until **1960**, when the club moved 100 yards up river to its present home at the Park.

In **1973** the club joined the Yorkshire League Division 3 and were promoted in **1975 & 1977** to reach Division 1, relegation was to follow in **1979 & 1980**.

In **1982/83** they became a founding member of the Northern Counties East League, originally in the NCEL Division Two North before league reorganisations led them to Division One in **1991**. They rarely finish in the top half of the league in the **1990's** and finished bottom in **2001/02 & 2003/04**.

At the start of **2004/05**, Jim Collis became manager and at this point fortunes on the pitch started to improve dramatically. In his first season, Albion finished 5th in the league, the following year a 3rd place finish meant promotion was missed by one point.

Jimmy Reid took over as manager in **2006**, but his time was blighted by off the field problems. An attempted hostile takeover by dissident committee members took a massive amount of money to fight. Then in Nov **2007**, an attempted arson attack on the clubhouse caused a lot of damage.

Paul Marshall took over at the start of **2008/09**, in his first season he played mostly local players and the team struggled and finished 17th.

In **2009/10**, with an influx of a few new key players, Albion won the NCFL Division One title.

In **2010**, Rob Northfield, took over as Chairman of Tadcaster Albion (2010) Ltd, and the club became a company limited by guarantee.

Albion finished fourth in their first season in the NCEL Premier Division and won the NCEL President's Cup, beating Farsley AFC 5-1 in the final. That was followed by an 8th place finish in **2011/12** and 6th in **2012/13**.

In the **2013/14** season Rob Northfield resigned a few days before the start of the season and i2i Sports Ltd agreed to take effective control of the club and company, with Matthew Gore becoming the new Chairman.

In **2014/2015** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season, but a poor run of games in March led to them finally finishing in third.

An excellent run in the FA Vase saw them make history by making it through to the Quarter Final of the FA Vase where they drew a record breaking crowd of 1,307, but were narrowly beaten by Highworth Town.

At the end of the season, the club opted not to renew their contract with manager Paul Marshall, and two weeks later former Harrogate Railway boss Billy Miller was unveiled as the club's new manager.

In **2015/2016** the Brewers lead the NCEL Premier for most of the season once again, but this time they held their nerve and finished Champions with a 2-1 home win over Armthorpe Welfare.

They also made it to the League Cup Final, but were beaten in a thrilling 3-2 game against Cleethorpes Town.

In **2016/2017** the Brewers will start their first ever season in the Evo-Stik First Division North. With a mix of old and new players Billy is back in his old stomping ground and his experience and knowledge of this division will come in handy to help TAD have a great first season.

Good afternoon everyone and a very warm welcome to the management, players, officials and fans of Burscough Football Club. We hope you enjoy your stay with us and wish you a safe journey home after the game.

We must start with the news Josh Greening will remain with us despite Scarborough trying to tempt him to play for his home town club. The news comes as no surprise to the management team who were in constant dialogue with Josh throughout.

Going into the Kendal game I think we all knew the outcome but had to go through the motions. Josh is one of three players who the management team inherited still playing at the club. He is a big part of what we want to achieve with this group of players and his statement on Wednesday was extremely positive and mature. I had no hesitation last week in my programme notes highlighting I thought Josh would be available for selection for today's game. Unfortunately what Scarborough could not tempt him to do, looks like tonsillitis might well have done, keeping him out of today's game. At the time of writing he is trying to recover tucked up in bed, fingers crossed.





Burscough FC





The first Burscough Association Football Club was formed in 1880, playing in Liverpool & District League football before folding in 1900.

In 1905 Burscough Rangers were founded and moved to the present Mart Lane ground in 1908. They established many of the traditions carried on by the current club, playing in green and known as the Linnets.

In the 1920s they had tremendous success winning the Liverpool County Combination Championship three times. In 1926 Rangers purchased a grandstand from Everton and erected it on Victoria Park. The following year they joined the Lancashire Combination but never experienced the same level of success and began to run into financial difficulties, finally folding in 1935.

Following the Second World War the present Burscough club was founded in 1946, starting life in the Liverpool County Combination and by the end of the decade had made a major impact in the non-league soccer world. In only their second season, 1946/47, they achieved a unique treble, winning the Lancashire Junior Cup, George Mahon Cup and the Liverpool Challenge Cup.

Two years later they again claimed the Junior Cup and also won the County Combination title for the first time. In 1952 they won the Liverpool Challenge Cup for a second time.

In 1953/54 Burscough joined the Lancashire Combination winning the Second Division Championship in their first season and scoring 155 goals in the process. 1955/56 saw arguably the club's greatest ever achievement as they won the First Division Championship of a league containing giants of the non-league world such as Wigan Athletic. Another

milestone was reached in 1959 when they reached the First Round Proper of the F.A. Cup for the first time before going down 3-1 to Crewe Alexandra in front of a 4,200 gate at Victoria Park.

Another trophy winning spell commenced in 1966/67 season under manager Bobby Langton, the former England winger, as the club completed a hat trick of Junior Cup successes against South Liverpool at Wigan.

The Lancashire Combination First Division title was regained in 1969/70 season.

In 1970/71 Burscough joined the Cheshire County League, finishing runners-up to Rossendale United. The following season they won the Liverpool Non-League Senior Cup and in 1974/75 the Cheshire League Cup was lifted. The Linnets also reached the F.A. Cup First Round Proper on three other occasions.

In 1977, a 1 -0 defeat at Blyth Spartans, in 1979, a 3-0 defeat at Sheffield United in front of 14,000 spectators and in 1980, a 2-1 defeat against Altrincham.

In 1982 the Club became founder members of the North West Counties Football League and had the distinction of becoming the Leagues first ever Champions under Bryan Griffiths. A new grandstand seating 250 was built in 1986 to replace the old wooden stand which had stood for 60 years and no longer met ground safety regulations.

In 1989/90 season Burscough were to suffer their first ever relegation, however, the appointment of Russ Perkins as manager in 1991 was to bring about a change in the club's fortunes as Burscough reached the League Cup Final and gained promotion back to Division One.

In 1992/93 Burscough lost 2-1 to Conference bound Southport in the Liverpool Senior Cup Final at Goodison Park before 2,000 spectators. Success was achieved by winning the League Challenge Cup with a 2-1 victory over Nantwich Town.

1993/94 was one of the most eventful seasons in Burscough's history as three players, Gary Martindale, Kevin Formby and Alex Russell, joined Football League clubs for substantial fees. Further covered standing accommodation for 500 spectators was erected at Victoria Park during the close season.

In May 1995, Burscough appointed John Davison as Manager. In his first season Burscough went on to win the League Challenge Cup for the second time, beating League Champions Flixton 1-0 at Bury.

In 1996/97 season the club celebrated its Golden Jubilee with a dinner attended by nearly 200 former players and officials and also published a 320 page club history, 'Green Village Heroes.'

Frank Parr completed 50 years with the Club and was presented with The Football Association 50 Year Long Service Award.

The following season after finishing runners-up in the North West Counties League the club made history by being promoted to the Unibond League. They also won the League Floodlit Trophy and reached the final of the Liverpool Senior Cup against Liverpool.

Promotion to the dizzy heights of the Unibond League Premier Division in 1999/2000 season

exceeded most supporters wildest dreams as Burscough went through the season unbeaten away from home and lost only two games in total.

In 2000/01 season the Linnets won the Liverpool Senior Cup for the first ever time after beating Conference side Southport.

The club has a youth development programme second to none in the non-league game and one graduate, 19 year old Lee McEvilly, signed for Rochdale in December 2001 for a club record £20,000 fee. Within 116 days of signing McEvilly had won full international honours for Northern Ireland against Spain.

Following the resignation of John Davison the club appointed Shaun Teale as player/ manager in May 2002 and the ex-Aston Villa defender went on to sensationally lead the club to its greatest ever achievement as Burscough became the smallest club to ever win the FA Trophy following a tremendous 2-1 victory over Tamworth at Villa Park on Sunday 18th May 2003. Played in front of a crowd of 14,296 spectators and televised live on Sky it was the Linnet's twelfth game in an unforgettable cup run that had included one incredible result as the 400-1 outsiders shocked the non-league world by beating runaway Conference winners Yeovil Town 2-0 at Huish Park in the quarterfinals.

There were incredible scenes as almost 2,000 fans welcomed the team home to Victoria Park that evening but celebrations were dampened less than six weeks later as the club found it necessary to relinquish Teale of his managerial duties. Former Liverpool, Galatasary and West Ham United midfielder Mike Marsh was appointed manager but after a poor start to the season Marsh resigned and ex-Southport defender Derek Goulding took over in October 2003.

An incredible end to 2003/04 season saw Burscough finish with a remarkable run of victories that saw them claw their way out of the bottom three into the play-offs for Conference North. Despite playing all their games away from home the Linnets went on to reach the play-off final where they only went down at Bradford Park Avenue following extra-time. During the summer Frank Parr stepped down after 30 years as chairman with local businessman Chris Lloyd taking over at the helm.

The following season ended in controversy as the Linnets were denied a play-off place following a widely ridiculed decision to award three points for unplayed games against Spennymoor United who could not complete their fixtures.

Season 2005/06 was another historic one for Burscough F.C. as they went on to reach the Second Round proper of the F.A. Cup for the first time in their history. In reaching that milestone they defeated League One side Gillingham 3-2 on a never to be forgotten day at Victoria Park. Further excitement was to follow as a postponed 2nd round tie at Burton Albion allowed Burscough to appear in the Third round draw. That draw, should they have overcome Burton Albion, would have given the Linnets a home tie against the mighty Manchester United. Sadly that further dream never materialised as Burton Albion overcame the Linnets in the re-arranged tie.

Having started the season impressively, with Burscough being amongst the favourites for promotion, the season unfortunately never quite reached the heights of the F.A. Cup run and long term injuries to key players meant the team finished 7th.

Derek Goulding's tenure as manager ended in June 2006 when he was replaced by former Southport manager, Liam Watson.

The 2006/07 season was Burscough F.C`s Diamond Jubilee and one of the ways the club marked the event was by playing in a predominantly white kit with a specially designed badge. The season was one of the most successful in history when the Linnets won the Unibond Northern Premier Division and the Lancashire Co-Op Trophy, formerly the Lancashire Junior Cup, for the first time in 40 years when neighbours Marine were defeated.

The league success was only confirmed after a thrilling climax. On the last day of the season the Linnets won at A.F.C. Telford United in front of nearly 6,000 fans. The victory meant they overhauled the New Bucks Head side at the top of the table and won the title on goal difference by just 1 goal from Witton Albion. Further and final success came when Unibond First Division champions Buxton were defeated 3-1 in the Peter Swailes Memorial Shield to round off a great season and confirm Burscough as Treble Winners.

In their first season in Conference North, Burscough finished in a very creditable 8th position but manager Liam Watson and many of the players departed during the close season. Assistant manager Joey Dunn took over as manager in July 2008, but was replaced by Andy Mutch at the beginning of October.

Burscough finished next to bottom of the league and were relegated back to the Unibond Premier with Andy Gray taking over

as manager for the start of the 2009-10 campaign.

The season was completed under difficult circumstances after chairman Chris Lloyd stood down and withdrew all funding. The Supporters Club accepted the raising of funds to complete the seasons fixtures, and were successful in this objective.

During the close season the ground was sold to Chequer Properties Ltd who in turn leased the ground back to the football club at a peppercorn rent, at the same time the property company purchased Chris Lloyd's majority shareholding, but did not wish to be involved with the day to day running of the football side of the business, and asked Frank Parr to return as chairman and form a committee to carry out these duties.

New Chairman Gary Wright appointed at the end of the 2010-11 season to oversee the temporary move to ground-share with local neighbours Skelmersdale United. The ground-share however would be short-lived, and the club would move back to Victoria Park half way through the season.

One of Wright's first major decisions during his tenure was to find a replacement for manager Chris Stammers, who's tenure ended with his resignation after a poor start to the 2011-12 season. After many applications, former manager Derek Goulding would make a return to the club.

Goulding started to galvanize the side during the season, but his efforts would not be able to stop the inevitable, and despite a promising end to the season the Linnet's were relegated from the NPL Premier division.

August 2012 would see renewed optimism for Burscough. It would see the Supporters Club get back on board and help in the rebuild of the club. Goulding would spend the summer rebuilding the team on the pitch, and a hard working Football Club committee would start to rebuilt the club off it.

Burscough FC finished the 2012-2013 season in mid table in 11th place and the following season they again finished mid table, this time in 14th position.

The club continued to play in the First Division North for the 2014-2015 season under Derek Goulding until he left for Bangor City in October 2014. Mark Beesley was named Caretaker Manager till January 2015 when he was given the role of manager full time, he brought in Liam Blakeman as his assistant.

Manager Billy Miller made three changes to the side that played out a goalless draw with Goole in midweek. Michael Ingham missed out after injuring his foot against Goole so young keeper Charlie Murphy deputised.

Gregg Anderson returned from injury to captain the side and Josh Grant came in at left-back for his first start.

It was the visitors who struck first taking the lead after just six minutes. Stand-in goalkeeper Charlie Murphy flew off his line but could only clear as far as Sam Bailey who controlled and impressively fired into the corner of the net from all of 35 yards out.

Kendal were forced into an early change on a brisk Autumnal afternoon in Yorkshire as Charlie Bailey limped off with a groin injury after 12 minutes.

Two minutes later and The Brewers had their first meaningful attempt at goal as Josh Greening drove narrowly wide after sending a free-kick into the tall wall.

Despite being a goal down, Taddy were actually having the better of the play however the away side were looking much more dangerous going forward. Substitute Thomas Kilifin had a good

chance to put his side two up after sneaking in down the right but the forward stroked just wide of the mark.

With less than ten minutes to go until the half-time break Kendal doubled their lead.

Jason Mycoe tracked his man but was adjudged to have impeded the on rushing Thomas Kilifin.

Sam Bailey stepped up and struck the penalty kick with sheer power and precision to which Murphy got a strong hand to but could only push into the top corner.

It was clear from the start of the second half that Kendal were happy to soak up the pressure and hold onto their lead.

With that aside, The Brewers did begin the half with greater purpose and intent as Adam Baker and Josh Greening both saw their efforts held by goalkeeper Will Kitchen.

The second half was to be a case of if Taddy could break down the backline of Kendal who looked organised and strong.

As the attack v defence game continued, Andy Milne almost pulled a

goal back fifteen minutes into the half but saw his header/back effort stopped on the line by Kitchen.



Here we look back at previous games played by the Brewers on this day in;

On This Day By Ian Tyssen

1983 - After two draws and four defeats, the Brewers picked up their first victory in the Northern Counties East Football League (NCEL) Division Two North - 1-0 at Hall Road Rangers. Albion were just one place off the bottom of the league in 13th position, which is where they would end the season.

1988 - Tadcaster Albion lost 0-3 at Glasshoughton Welfare in an NCEL Division Two fixture. Prior to the game, the two teams were level on points but the visitors ended the day in ninth place. Welfare climbed to fifth position, which is where they would end the campaign.

1994 - In the FA Vase first round, the Brewers travelled to Oldham Town, who were flying high in the North West Counties League Division Two. The home side, who finished the season in second place in their league, won 3-0 in the FA Vase tie.

2005 - Second half goals from Andy Sunley and Andy Green helped Albion to a 2-1 win at Rossington Main in the NCEL Division One. A crowd of 28 saw the hosts briefly level the score,

before the Brewers scored a winner ten minutes from full time. With six wins from their eight league games, Albion were in third place in the table. The Doncaster club finished the season in 13th position.

2011 - The Brewers extended their unbeaten run to ten games (eight wins) in the NCEL Premier Division, with a 2-0 home victory over Lincoln Moorlands Railway. A crowd of 88 watched the home side score two first half goals - Ryan Qualter (15 minutes) and Danny Gray (34). Tadcaster were now third in the league, having recovered from losing their opening two games - against Hall Road Ranger and Scarborough Athletic. They would eventually fall back to eighth place by the end of the season.

2013 - Tadcaster Albion and Worksop Parramore, who would finish the season in third and fourth places in the NCEL Premier Division, met in front of 76 fans in Nottinghamshire. After a goalless first half, Sam Smith put Parramore 1-0 ahead in the first minute of the second period. However, two goals in the last ten minutes for Carl Stewart - his 10th

and 11th league goals of the season clinched a 2-1 victory for the visitors. The Brewers had now gone 17 league games without defeat (ten wins and seven draws) since losing against eventual champions Brighouse Town.




